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# The Axe Falls

Tuition increases and program cutbacks are what students could be facing in light of a recently announced provincial financial cutbacks. As part of an overall plan to decrease spending, the government has decided that grant support to post-secondary institutions will be reduced by as much as fifteen percent over the next three years.

In response, NAIT has set up a special committee to determine where cuts should be made, and how large they should be. This group, named Fiscal Options and Challenges Under Study (FOCUS), is facilitated by NAIT's Program Planning and Development Co-ordinator, John Knapp.

Knapp stated that the financial cuts being requested by the govern-

ment are unusually large: "A one or two percent cut we could [absorb], but five percent/year for 3 years..."

The committee has been set up to receive input from all students

and staff at NAIT, and Knapp encourages any interested parties to contact either Susan Tedder, or

Knapp's office at 471-7014 with suggestions.

Students are welcome to submit written suggestions, and individuals and student groups are encouraged to make a verbal presentation at one of the following forums: September 22, from 2:30 to 4 p.m. at the Patricia Campus; Friday, September 24, from 9 to 11 am on the main campus; Monday, September 27, from 2 to 4 p.m. at Westerra Campus; and Wednesday, September 29 from 9 to 11 a.m. on main campus. Students wishing to participate in these forums should contact Knapp's office for further information.

In short, it will be the responsibility of the committee to make recommendations to the Board of Governors in November. The proposals could very well affect the future of many NAIT programs.

## Financing Increased for Students in 1994/95

### Recent Changes to Alberta Student Loan Program

To accommodate increased borrowing, the lifetime loan limit at the undergraduate level has been increased from \$25,000 to \$30,000.

Consolidation of student support programs has given the Alberta Students Finance Board (SFB) the responsibility of administering training allowances to disabled persons (VRDP). As a result, SFB has been established as the "one stop shopping" source of provincial student support.

### Recent Changes to Canada Student Loan Program

The federal government is committed to improving accessibility to post-secondary learning for students most in need. Over the next four years in excess of \$4 billion in aid will be available to students, representing an increase of \$1 billion over the previous four years. The additional funds are to be disbursed in loans, interest subsidies and grants.

### Previous Changes:

- August 1, 1993 - the 3% administrative fee was removed.
- Interest on loans will begin to accrue upon completion of post-secondary education. However, a student is not required to make any payments, of principal or interest, for up to six months after completion of studies.

### Beginning in 1994-95 the following changes will be implemented:

Loan limits, for full-time students, will be increased from \$105 a week to \$150 a week for full-time students which translates to \$5,100 compared to \$3,570.

Part-time student loans will be increased from \$2,000 to \$4,000. Students will pay interest only during studies. Repayment of principal would begin 6 months after studies, as opposed to 30 days after loan was

issued.

Deferred grants for students most in need, similar to Alberta's Remission Program, to maintain debt loads at a reasonable level. Grants will be conditional on timely and successful completion of studies. Calculated at graduation on \$3,900 per year.

Expansion of interest-relief to low-income borrowers in repayment. Only the unemployed student was considered in the past. Graduates with low paying jobs or who are employed part-time will be targeted.

Special opportunity grants will be provided to students with disabilities, certain students "at risk" and women in doctoral studies.

### Proposed Lender Risk-Sharing

Under the present system, student loans (Canada and Alberta) are fully guaranteed both by the federal and provincial governments. While the loan is interest-free to students, interest is paid by the government to the lending institutions. There is, therefore, absolutely no incentive for the banks to actively collect payments from students. From the banks perspective it does not make business sense to spend time and money

trying to contact delinquent accounts when the government guarantees full payment of both principal and interest. With risk sharing lending institutions would have a vested interest in collecting student loan payments. The federal government proposes to impose a 5% risk premium of the value of all part-time and full-time student loans. Five percent is the average percentage of defaults/write-offs on part-time and full-time Canada Student Loans. Any defaults over the 5% would not be guaranteed by the federal government. Banks would, therefore have a financial interest in keeping in touch with student borrowers. The benefits to the bank is in attracting future clients who will need mortgages, personal loans, savings plans, RRSP's etc.

The government has identified three main advantages of risk-sharing with lending institutions which will provide fair costs to borrowers in repayment, lower costs to taxpayers and reasonable compensation for lenders.

Beginning in 1994-95 the new financing arrangement would be implemented, subject to passage of appropriate legislation and conclusion of lender contracts.

- significant savings will be reinvested in aid to individual students,
- onus will be put squarely on lenders to recover loans,
- borrowers will have the option of fixed or floating interest rates with interest ceilings built in for protection,

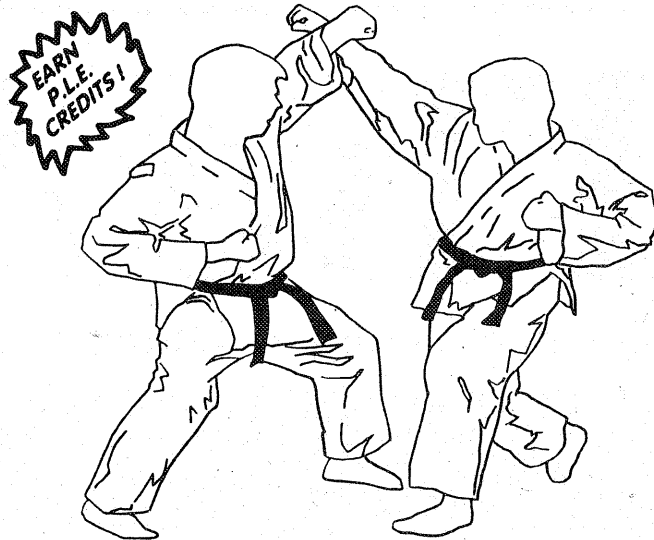
• current interest rate for borrowers in repayment is 8.625%

- lenders would bear the risk of loan defaults in return for the payment of a risk premium, prime-based interest rates and the opportunity to put-back to the Government a portion of their non-performing loans for income tax set-offs.

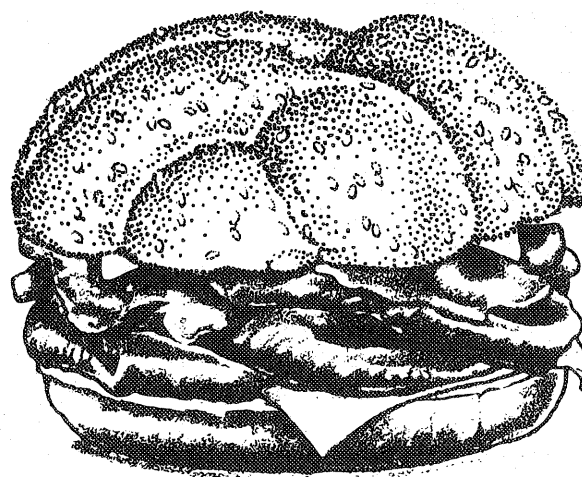
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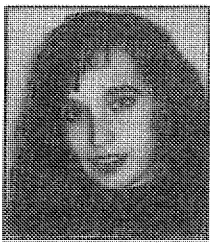
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# Reality Check

REALITY has set in here at NAIT and if you haven't caught on to it yet, keep reading. Of course, I'm talking about the multitude of possibilities facing each and every student here.

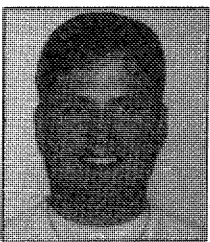

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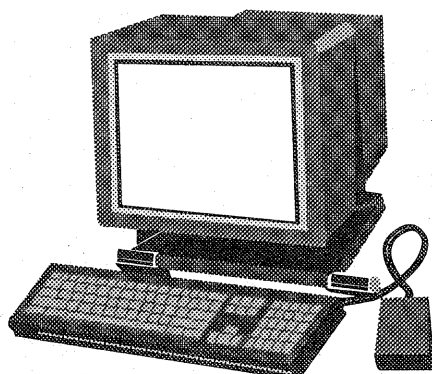
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# Soccer Ooks Move to Riel Park

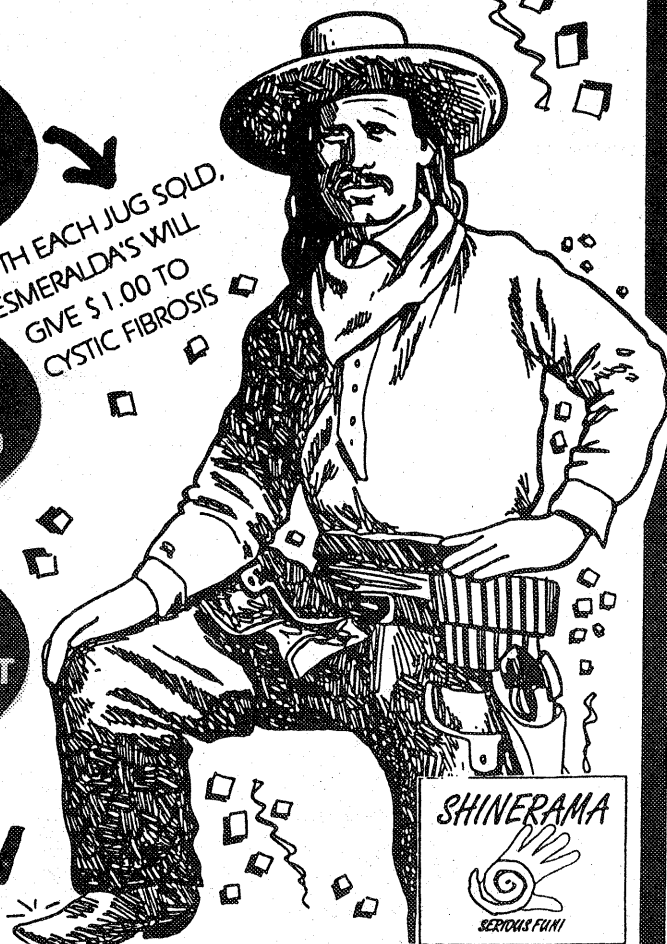

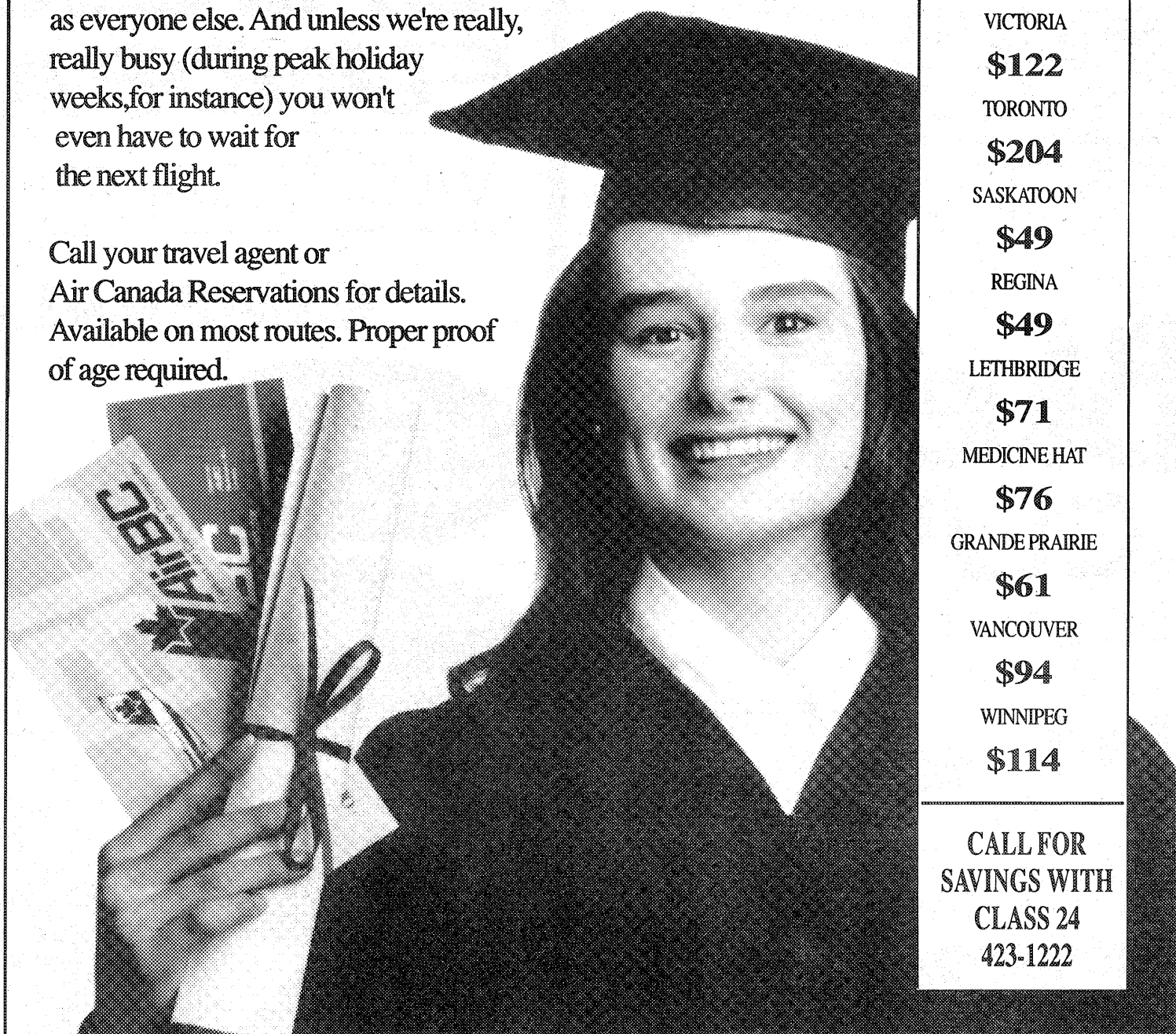
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# Zelda retires
