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\$2500 Alotted To Trip

\$2500 has been given to Dan LaChambre, former NAITSA President and Scott Johnston, formerly of Red Deer College by the students of NAIT.

The two men have been asking for donations from other institutions and organizations to go to Romania and assemble democratic student councils similar to those here in Canada.

NAITSA is the only independent institution, other than Red Deer College Student's Association, to donate money as yet. (The Federal Government is reviewing the project and may contribute depending on other available resources.) Red Deer College Student's Association gave \$1000 to Dan and Scott for the project. NAITSA has pledged \$2500.

On Tuesday, September 14 a motion was passed at the General Council meeting to give \$2500 to

Dan and Scott. At the next General Council Meeting on Tuesday, September 28, a motion was made by Electronics Technology to rescind the former motion. Forty-Five minutes of discussion and debate took place before a vote was taken on the motion to rescind. Various views were expressed during this time:

The Photography Technology Representative stated: "I talked to a few people in my department and they were astonished that we would give them that much money; they felt it was way too much."

Another point that was brought up was that no stipulation had been put on the two to answer for what they were spending the money on.

The Dental Lab. Tech. Representative stated "If we can afford it and we have the money, quit being such damn pansies about it. Just give it to them and they can tell

us what they spent it on whenever they get back." He also stated in response to some smaller techs. who were worried over their lack of funds within the school, "We're a smaller tech and we don't care about the twenty five hundred bucks one way or the other."

When the vote was finally taken it was a deadlock; 22 votes to 22 votes. All NAITSA executives eligible to vote, with the exception of one, voted to rescind the money. Once a motion has been passed by the General Council, it takes a 2/3 majority vote to rescind it. Therefore although 1/2 of the votes placed were for review of the situation, the original motion stands. The \$2500 was given out to Dan and Scott without any stipulation by General Council as to how it will be spent or what exactly what it will be spent on.

The Loan Dilemma

The deadline for Alberta Student Loan applications is May 31, but applications are still being accepted says Giselda of the Student Finance Board.

There are numerous student loans still pending & students must contact the board to confirm priority. Loans can take from 4 - 6 weeks for processing from the time the application is received. Many students are being turned away. These student loans are based on financial need, resources available, living expenses required, and pa-

rental contributions. If students don't meet the prerequisites, unfortunately their loans may be denied.

Giselda recommends that students stay on top of their loans & contact the Finance Board until they get confirmation on their loans. Although on average the board receives approximately 500 - 600 calls per day, students should remain patient & have their social insurance number ready when they do get through.

Repayment of student loans begin 6 months after the period of

study. Monthly payment schedules are arranged by the banking institution the loans are registered with. The Student Finance Board will give other financial options to those students who are denied their loans upon request.

If your loan is still pending, contact a financial advisor with the Alberta Student Finance Board at #427-2740. Remember to remain patient when trying to get through, and be prepared with your social insurance number.

quired from the participating techs is to sell tickets. Each tech will be given 75 tickets. 100% of those ticket sales will go straight to that tech. There is a possibility of making \$375 if all tickets are sold. This is ideal for the technologies that do not want to risk putting up the \$1,800 required to throw a cabaret.

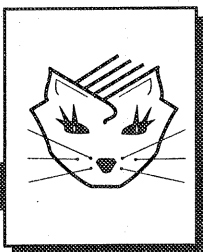
to two people and not even ask them for a piece of paper, signed, stating their intentions and responsibilities?

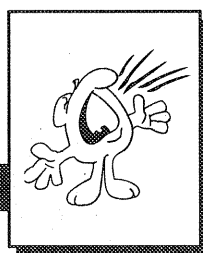

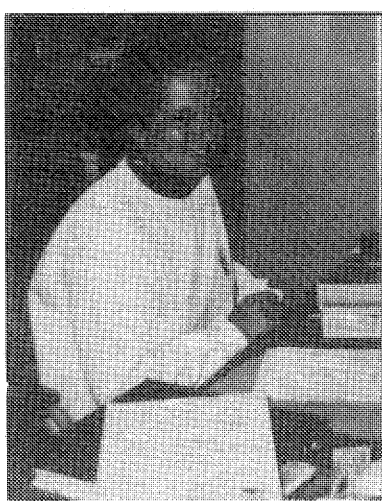

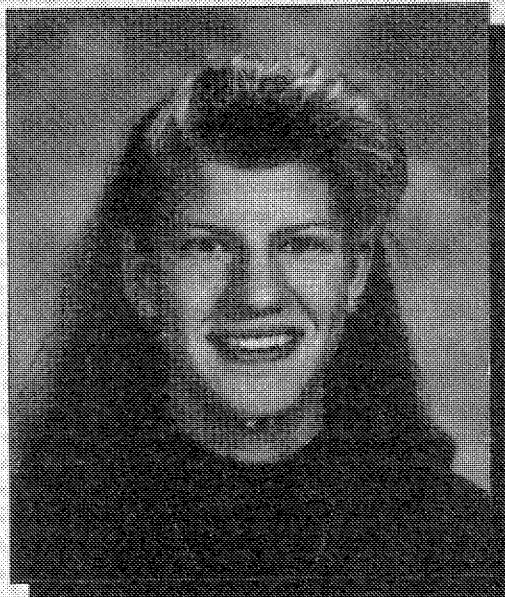

Above all, however, just being there in the room with so many successful journalists showed me more about the business in two hours than a whole day of classes. Ironically, I even met Glen Sather, who was catching the football game.

The Oilers, however, seem to think that NAIT isn't a real school, and that we shouldn't be taken seriously. 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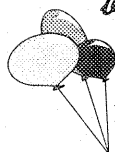

BBQ. All the teams brought are food item. One of the NAIT team members supplied the buffalo steaks at \$3 each (very appropriate for Elk Island Right!!)

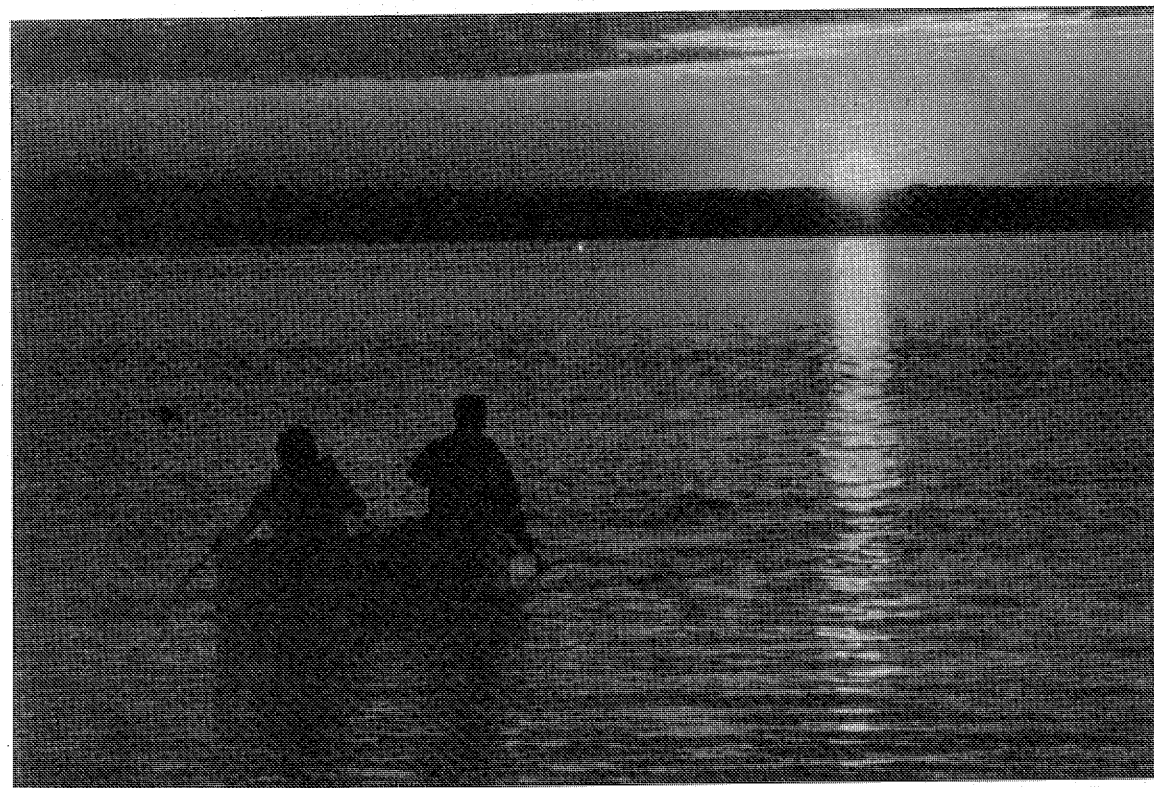
The BBQ was a great success. The coaches and team members had a great time. One coach said "there was great commardery" The other coaches thought it was a great season opener.

NAIT Wins at ACAC Golf Championships !!

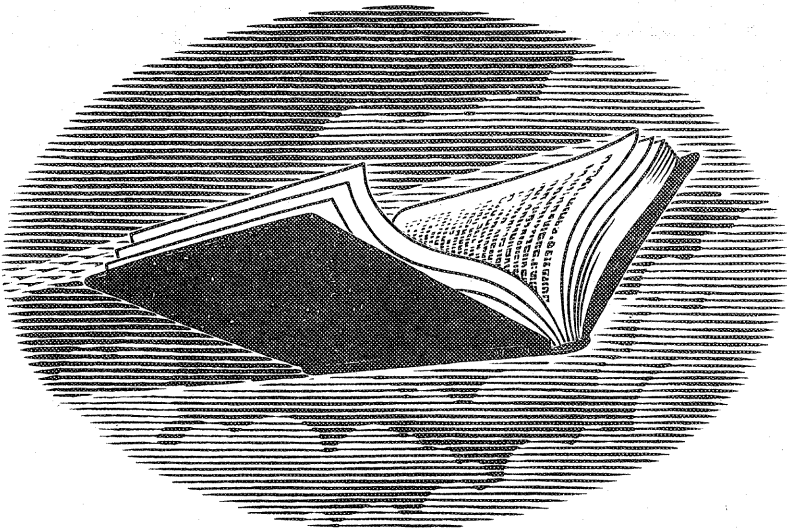

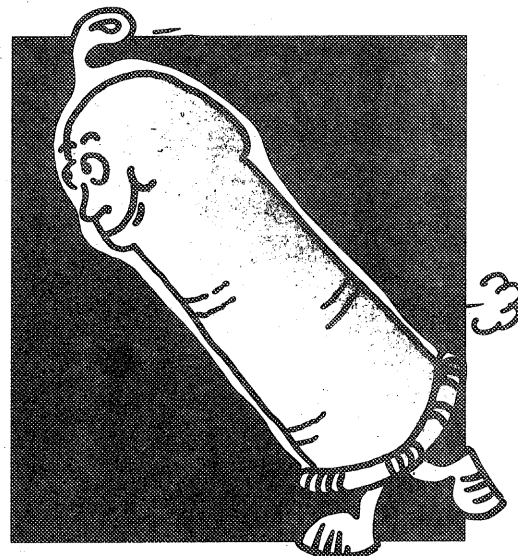
Only one person vomited out of the bus, and the drivers were really cool about hauling us around! I hope this becomes a NAITSA Shinerama Tradition!

Luckily I had told Mr. Y that he could crash at my place. He located me at BP's and ate a 1/2 order of tortelline at 3 AM.

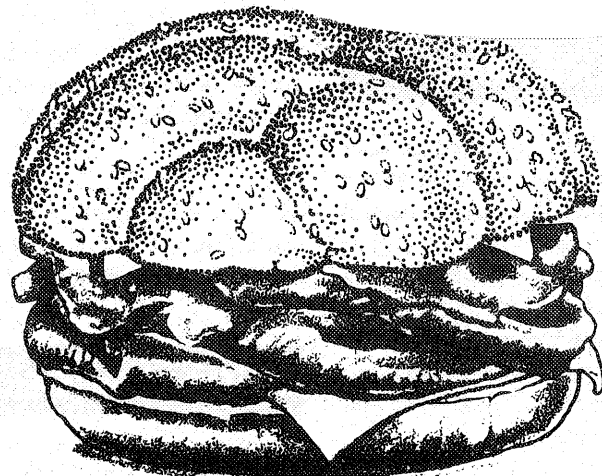
After a short walk (which was too long according to Mr. Y) He was able to get familiar with the carpet in my living room.
