## Shinerama

Once again students from NAIT and the U of A are supporting Shinerama to raise funds for Cystic Fibrosis Research.

Through research there has been incredible advances in CF treatment. Since the early 1960's the median age of survival of babies born with CF has increased from under 4 to over 30 due to new drugs and improved treatment.

This in itself is incredible considering CF takes the lives of more Canadian children and young adults than any other inherited disease; primarily attacking the lungs and the digestive system.

#### Some other facts about CF:

- 1 in 25 Canadians carries the gene for CF
- Those living with CF must undergo rigorous therapy programs just to stay alive
- · Most importantly there is no known cure for CF
- Thanks to advances in treatment and research, 35.2% of all people with CF are over the age of 30.

You can help fight this hereditary disease by volunteering for Shinerama, a national fund-raiser event involving more than 60 campuses across Canada representing 20,000 students. Through this campaign \$ 675,356 dollars was raised nationally to help fight CF. This year NAIT is striving to reach an ambitious goal of raising \$15,500 dollars.

Shinerama week is going to be from September 10-16, with a variety of events being planned the week beginning September 12.

WELCOME BACK! Just because your back in school doesn't mean the real world won't be there when you graduate. Remember all those student loan forms you filled out and mailed away, and how the money magically appeared in your bank account after signing your name a few times. You should because it will have to be paid back after graduation.

Did you know in the near future the student loan program is going to be privatized and administrated by the CIBC? Well its happening. What this means to you is that it "really" has to be paid back at terms agreed upon by you and the bank. Repayment can occur six months after graduation. In addition, 18 months of interest relief are available before you negotiate your repayment. You have a maximum pay back period of 9.5 years to pay back your student loans and you can select two basic types of interest rates:

a) a floating or variable rate of prime plus 2.5%

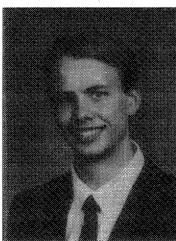
b) a fixed rate of prime plus 5.0%

(You are also allowed to change from a floating rate to a fixed rate once)

If you're curious or want to know more about the student loans and their privatization stop by the NAITSA offices in room E-133 and talk to Chris or Dean.
