

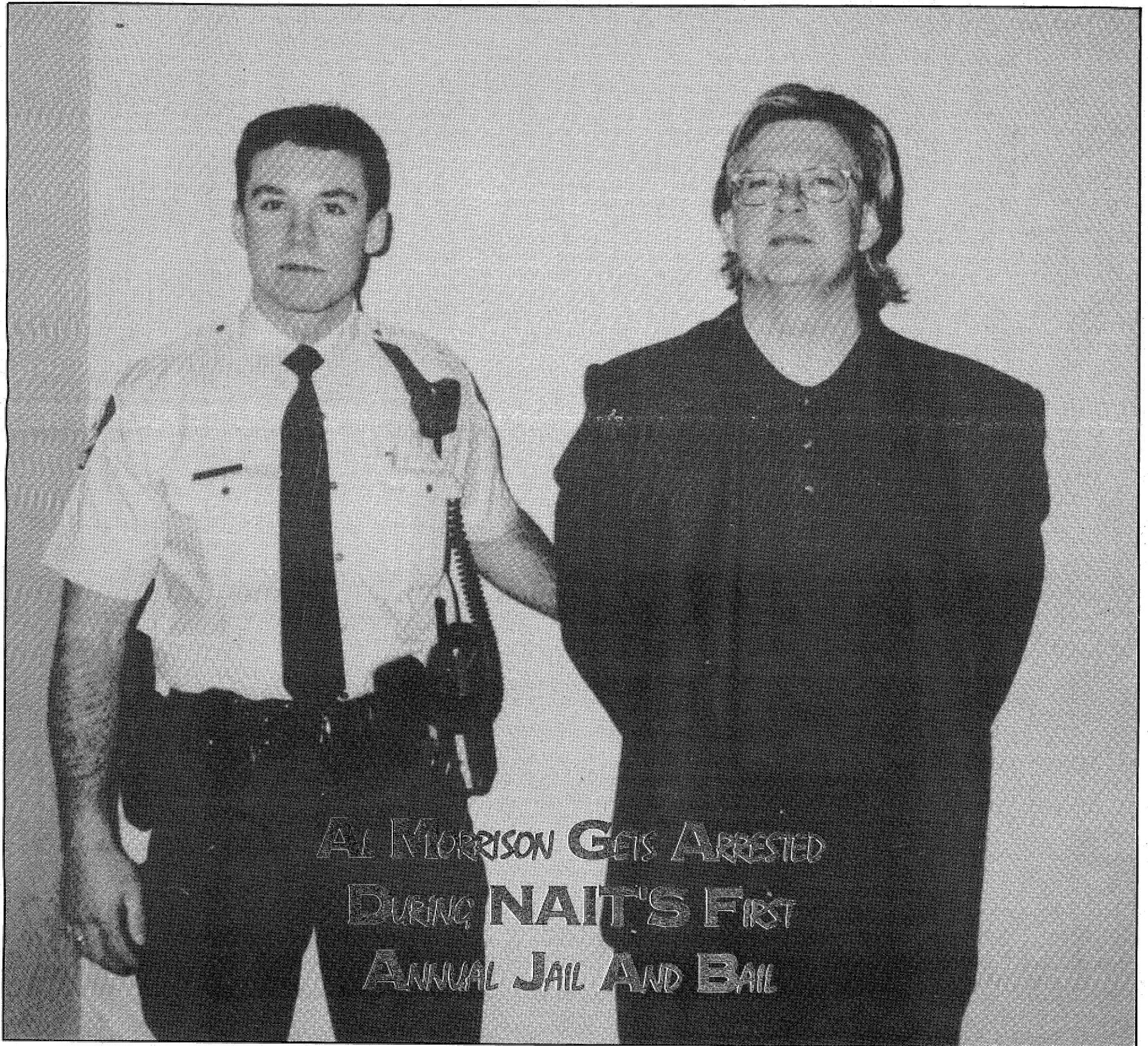

## Campus Personality

### From hitchhiker to CFRN Executive Producer

Andrew Smith is truly a free spirit. Making decisions on the spur of the moment he always lives life to the fullest. To Smith, "life is one big adventure."

Smith is an instructor for the Radio and Television program. He assumed the position two years ago after deciding he needed to live life at a slower pace. Instructing at NAIT gives Smith an opportunity to have a hand in raising his six year old son Taylor.

Smith is forty-four years young who offered to give me a lesson on interview skills while I asked him questions. He could teach me a thing or two, after spending twenty-three years in the news media.

Smith was born and raised in Calgary. After graduation he headed off on a cross Canada vacation . . . hitchhiking. "I went to Montreal via New York, Boston ... with twelve dollars in my pocket." That year he spent his birthday hitchhiking in the rain. He is a self-proclaimed loner.

Upon his return Smith relocated to Edmonton. He attended the U of A in the Business Administration Department for less than a year. Too boring. His quest to find an interesting career that he would flourish at led him to NAIT. He enrolled in NAIT's business

program for less than a year then decided to switch to Radio and Television Arts. He made a smart decision.

Smith says NAIT is not much different now than it was in the sixties. He explains this is mainly because, "NAIT's mandate has always been the same, to find people jobs." NAIT helped Smith find a job in his first semester.

While in first semester Smith landed the position of operator at CKUA. From there he moved up to announcer. At age twenty-two Smith became news director at CKUA. He remained there for six years. By this time Smith was twenty-eight, had been married and divorced with one child. He got what he calls the ten year itch and decided to move on. He gave his boss one days notice and hopped on a plane to Tahiti.

When he returned he freelanced writing and producing until the recession hit in the eighties. This brought him to CFRN. He climbed the ladder at CFRN starting in weekend radio news person and worked his way executive producer for television.

Smith says his greatest accomplishment was at CFRN. When he arrived on the scene he was put in charge of a news broadcast that, "was heading in the wrong direction." Smith, "wanted

to have the highest rated local news show in the country . . . and did it." He decided upon a goal and stuck to it.

Eventually the fifteen hour days began to drag. The ten year itch hit again. This time it directed him to NAIT. He finds teaching at NAIT challenging, and enjoys it. He enjoys passing on knowledge to others that they could not find elsewhere. Smith emphasizes, "instructors can have a profound, positive impact on peoples lives."

Aside from NAIT he owns a production company, runs a news consulting company and is working on getting a talent agency for the media off the ground.

How does he accomplish so much? Smith's advice to students, "be open to anything." He also quoted some advice he was given as a student. Most people only work at 5% of their capacity. If you are able to work at 10% of your capacity you'll be ahead of the game. Smith feels he worked at 90% of his capacity at CFRN. This is difficult to maintain for any length of time.

Looking back over his bold decisions Smith says he does not regret "a damn thing" except that he didn't have more children. May-be that's because until this last ten year itch, Smith would have been a difficult free spirit to tie down.

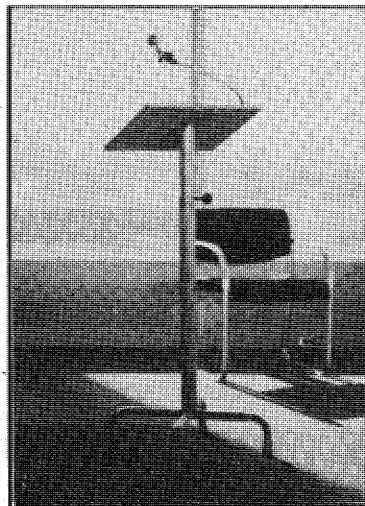

Last week my co-news editor, Doug Sydora wrote an editorial. This editorial is about the elections and the perks of running for a NAITSA position. To reiterate Doug's main point, let me just say the NAITSA staff gets a very nice wage, and gets their tuition paid and has other perks. Doug's article made it past the Assistant Editor, Chris Hayes. Editor-in-Chief, Chris Chelmick also edited it and deemed it fit to be printed. So, the story was laid down on the page and printed out.

## Freedom of the Press?

The story was in fact on its way to the printer until it was held back.

At this time the Communications VP, Lorraine Sitter walked into the office. She saw Doug's editorial and did not like it. In her opinion some of the statements in the editorial were misleading and wrong. Sitter wanted the Editor-in-Chief of the Nugget to pull the editorial all together. Keep in mind, Sitter is a member of the student government. I feel what she did is a severe conflict of interest and a violation of Nugget autonomy. The Nugget did not pull the editorial. However, Sitter demanded the article be altered to conform to guidelines that she follows Editor-in-Chief Chris Chelmick obeyed her request without consulting Doug Sydora. However, the Editor-in-Chief informed Sydora of what had happened after the editorial had been published.

Later, Sitter pulled Sydora into her office. She said she felt his article was inaccurate and the topic was not up for discussion. However, the facts of the matter are that Sitter managed to skirt the entire issue all together. That is, if she felt his article was inaccurate or misleading she should have written a letter to the editor after the fact. Instead, she infringed on the right of the press to freedom of opinion in an editorial and decided to take the matter into her own hands.

This leads into another debate, freedom of the press. As it stands right now the rules governing NAITSA's involvement with the press are at best, inaccurate. The Publication Guidelines state, "To maintain an acceptable literary standard, no bigotry, sexism, racism, discrimination or obscenity (profanity) shall be published. continued page 4 see Press

## TAX TIME!

Tax time is here and that means good news for students. Most students are happy to see the T4's and tuition and education slips come in the mail. Most students have the unique luxury of receiving rather than paying income taxes. Filling out the tax form is good news. The bad news is a usually long wait for a return. Most students need this money quickly.

Upon talking to numerous students the main reason for the urgency of their income tax return is to pay their May rent. The students who live at home are of course excluded from this. But the ones who are out on their own and cannot afford to work part-time while going to school are in dire

financial straits come May 1. For most, savings and student loans run out by this time.

A student who mails away his or her taxes around this time of year, can expect a wait of anywhere from 2 to 6 weeks. The reason for this, according to Revenue Canada, is the rush of tax forms received at this time of year. The deadline for mailing T4's is near the end of February, so most are not received until that time. This causes a massive influx of tax forms at one time.

Students do have a couple of options to speed up the waiting process. H&R Block offers a couple options for desperate students. The first is electronic filing. For a fee around \$15, you can take your taxes to H&R, and send them to

Revenue Canada electronically. This speeds up the process considerably. They have received returns via E filing as quickly as 6 working days. Another option offered by H&R Block is cash back returns. They will do your taxes for you, and pay you the money within a week. The charge for this service is 15% on the first \$300, and 5% on the remaining return. For example on a \$600 return you would be charged about \$60. Another option for students in need of a quick tax return is to go to Money Mart. Money Mart will offer you the same rate as H&R Block, and give you a cash return in 24 hours. All of these options are a quick, easy and effective way to speed up the wait for your tax return.

## Heritage Festival Scholarships

The Edmonton Heritage Festival is offering students the opportunity to receive scholarships for volunteering their time during the festival. Dennis Fahlman, the General Manager of the festival, hopes to encourage younger involvement in the festival, and feels scholarships are an effective way to do that. The scholarship was open only to University of Alberta students at first, and was \$1800. Fahlman felt, and correctly so, that opening the scholarship to all post-secondary students would be a more effective way to get the students out volunteering. The scholarship is now split into 6-\$300 individual scholarships.

By coming out and volunteer-

ing time, a post-secondary student provides him or herself with the opportunity to win these scholarships. For every 5 hours of volunteer time, a student will have their name entered to win. The draw is random, therefore the more hours a student puts in the better that student's chance of receiving a scholarship. Fahlman says that the festival averages about 200 student volunteers per year, and he hopes these scholarships will keep driving those numbers up. Fahlman also says that the Edmonton Heritage Festival treats their volunteers very well. "For every 5 hr shift of volunteering, students will receive meal tickets, caps and T-shirts." Fahlman goes on to say that his festival probably treats its

volunteers better than any festival in the city.

The Edmonton Heritage Festival is the world's largest 3-day multi-cultural celebration. Each year approximately 400,000 people flood to this excellent celebration. They admire crafts, arts, and food from other cultures. This festival is not only good for students but does a lot a good for the Edmonton food bank, it is Edmonton's most powerful food bank drive, with contributions getting as high as 153,000 items of food. This years festival runs August 5, 6, and 7. For further information on the Edmonton Heritage Festival or winning the scholarships you call the Edmonton Heritage Festival office at 488-3378.

## Press

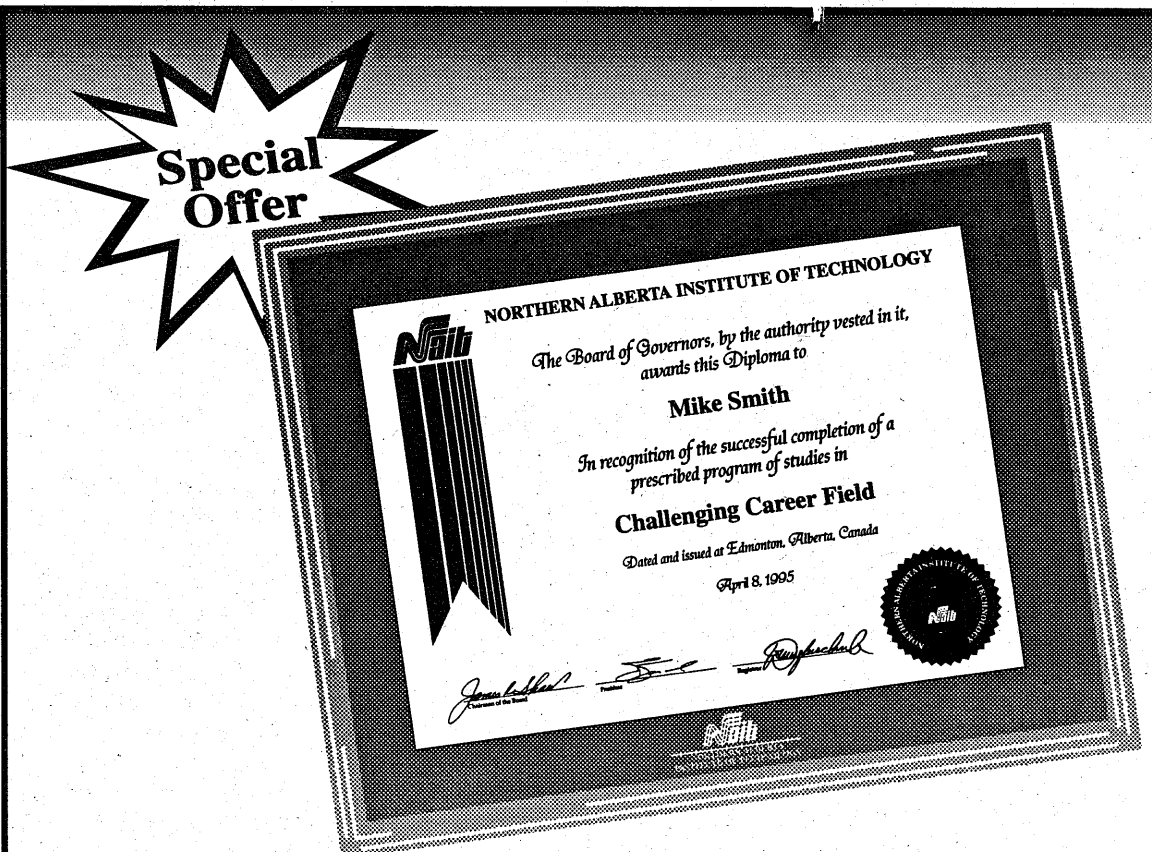
## Alcohol Alert

### Symptoms of Alcohol Poisoning:

1. Person is known to have consumed large quantities of alcohol in a short period of time.
2. Persons unconscious and cannot be woken.
3. Person has cold, clammy, unusually pale or bluish skin.
4. Person is breathing slowly or irregularly - usually this means less than eight times a minute or ten seconds or more between any two breaths.
5. Person vomits while passed out or does not wake up during or after.

### What to do?

1. Don't hesitate or worry about what the person will think when they sober up. It's your call. If you think she/he has suffered alcohol poisoning, than do something!
2. Call for help. Dialing 911 is always a good bet. If you are near a hospital get him/her to an emergency room as fast as you can.
3. Do not leave the person alone, and carefully watch his/her breathing. If it stops, administer CPR.
4. Stand by your decision. Even if the person ends up not suffering from alcohol poisoning, stand up for your act of friendship. You did the right based on your best judgment.
