

Government Wants Seals Killed

At the recent meeting of the Provincial fisheries ministers in Victoria there was unanimous agreement to ask Ottawa to help create new markets and promote the sale of seal products internationally.

The provincial fisheries ministers want the number of seals killed off the East Coast of Canada doubled to 100,000. It's

an attempt to cut down the growing seal herds and to supply a growing market for pharmaceutical products that are extracted from the seals.

The hunt would only involve adult seals the hunt would only involve adult seals. not the pups. The controversial killing of seal pups in the past all but ended the sale of seal products a few years ago.

Dr. Hulan, Newfoundland Fisheries Minister says there are now between 5 million and 6 million harp seals around Newfoundland, a population that

has been growing at an estimated rate of 500,000 a year. There's some debate and concern whether the seals have played a role in the decrease of the cod supply. Hulan believes the seals kill the fish only to eat the liver, which is high in the fatty acids they love.

The federal Dept. of Fisheries and Oceans currently allows for the hunting of 186,000 adult

seals a year but over the last few years hunters have brought in less than 50,000 because of poor markets for seal meat and leather. Sealers blame them market on anti-sealing campaigns by groups such as the Fund for Animal Welfare.

Officials from the group say there's no reason to expand the seal hunt which is cruel and unnecessary in the first place.

Federal Fisheries Minister Brian Tolin says he supports the idea of an expanded hunt if markets can be found for the products.

Watching Street Legal, L.A. Law and other legal "soap operas" gives you an interesting look at the profession of a lawyer. Surprisingly enough a lot of what goes on in those shows reflects some measure of reality. But from now on there will be a line to separate the sexual harassment from the good-natured joking in the court

room. For the first time, guidelines on sexual harassment and discrimination are included in the new Code of Professional

Conduct, which was formally passed by the Law Society of Alberta last week.

The updated 167 page code which comes into effect Jan. Alberta lawyers confirmed the 1st, was five years in the making. It clarifies that sexual harassment and discrimination of any kind amount to conduct unbecoming a

Four volunteers have been appointed by the law society to

assist and advise lawyers about sexual harassment in the workplace. It's free and confidential. B.C. and Alberta are the only provinces to offer this service.

Forty Alberta lawyers have also come forward and volunteered to be consultants to go to law firms upon invitation, to discuss any equality-related

Can we justify giving the players the scholarship anyway, just because it has a National Championship and that is part of the criteria?

Maybe we should consider giving a scholarship to Intramural Athletes. Afterall, more people can participate in intramurals and they usually participate for themselves and their technology, not for the money.
