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CRUEL COWBOYS?

Thousands of people packed the new Northlands Coliseum last week for the 1994 Canadian Finals Rodeo. For the avid rodeo fan it was a chance to see all the big names contending for the big titles and the big money. But even if you knew basically nothing about rodeos there was still plenty of exciting events.

However, some people just can't get into the rodeo spirit!

Do horses, along with bulls and other cattle appreciate life on the rodeo circuit? Or are the animals being

exploited, being made to feel fear, anger and anxiety for rodeo-goers' entertainment?

These are questions that are hotly debated between cowboys and those who feel rodeos are inhumane.

"It's the paying public who will decide the future of rodeos" says Joy Ripley, president of the Alberta Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. "I think there's a greater awareness and sensitivity to the needs of the animals. But rodeo is still rodeo."

The Edmonton SPCA gets several calls every year during the Canadian Finals Rodeo from people who are philosophically opposed to rodeos, says Constable Vern Tuttle.

The society tries to have an officer in the stands every evening,

monitoring the events for unnecessary violence or injury to the livestock. But Tuttle says like most large professional rodeos the CFR looks after its animals extremely well. The animals are well fed and sheltered for the 5 day event, not to mention healthy. "It's such a highly publicized event, it's well laid out, it's well

of ranching, many of the events are very stressful to the animals. And we don't feel they represent animal husbandry in Alberta."

Dr. Milton Ness, an Edmonton vet who is on call for the rodeos states that only barrel-racing and cutting cattle events are non stressful for the stock. "You're creating entertainment based on

the stress and anxiety of animals. An angry bull or frightened horse or calf. It just doesn't sit well with me as a veterinarian."

Rancher Harvey Northcott has

been breeding livestock for professional rodeos for about 25 years and he isn't convinced his bulls are seething with unhealthy anger when they leave that chute trying to shake a cowboy from their backs. Nothing is done when he raises them to make them meaner or tougher. "We aren't doing anything to make them mad. They get excited on their own. It's their nature. It's in their disposition. It's not because they're being tormented."

Northcott describes one of his CFR bulls as a contented pussycat. "How do they know they're scared? He's not mad either. He just bucks, that's all. He's bred to buck."

organized. We've never had a problem with anyone willfully harming an animal."

Tuttle's job is to enforce the laws in the Criminal Code and the provincial Animal Protection Act. The law states animals must have adequate food, water, and shelter and are not being intentionally injured.

The job of the society stops with the philosophical and moral debate over rodeos.

Although some may find the events bothersome, calf-roping, bull riding and bronc-busting are not illegal, says Craig Chanin, executive director of the Edmonton SPCA. Chanin says, "While the rodeos are romanticized as remnants of the old fashioned way

THE NEW POSTER POLICY

All right ladies and gentlemen, pay attention now. Here are the latest guidelines for cabaret posters. These are controlled by the ALCB, so try not to break the rules, or your poster will be denied.

For Cabaret functions, such as a hali party at the Silver Slipper, Polish Hall, etc., these are the things you may and may not do.

YOU CAN:

- Use "sponsored by Labatt, Molson's", etc.
- Use Corporate beer and liquor logos. This means you can have the nifty little Molson symbol on your posters.
- Use beer mugs, wine glasses, champagne bottles, etc., as graphic enhancements.
- Promote regular prices only.

YOU CANNOT:

- Use discount pricing
- Promote intoxication

eg. no use of:

- "discounts,"
- "specials,"
- "beat the clock,"
- "all you can drink," etc.

That is for special permit functions only. If you are having a cabaret at an already licensed

These rules became effective November 9th, 1994 and as was stated are controlled by the Alberta Liquor Control Board. Irregardless of what is on your cabaret or function poster, it still cannot be larger than 24" x 24". That's two feet by two feet for those of you

that aren't good with number conversion.

These measurements are only for cabaret and NAIT functions. They are not for off

campus non-NAIT related functions, such as the Canadian Finals Rodeo.

Hopefully this clears the air for those of you who are having trouble getting your posters approved. If you still have questions, you can contact Carolyn at the NAITSA office (E133) or contact Al Morrison, the Assistant Dean of Student Services (E134).

"For better for worse, till death do us part, I'll love you with every beat of my heart. I swear." This popular love song speaks of the classic, idealistic fairytale of what marriage should be like. Yet, the reality is 25th Wedding Anniversaries are getting harder and harder to come by. There almost seems to be more people celebrating divorces.

As a result, marriage counselors and therapists are looking to technology to reverse the rising trend of divorce. One of these useful tools is the "marriage lab."

Now, don't worry, you don't have to do anything in a petri dish, it's more like a friendly sleepover. Over the past few years, John Gottman, a psychology prof at the University of Washington has had 200 couples stay overnight in a laboratory apartment. They sat through interviews sometimes lasting up to six hours while they're wired for heartbeat and respiration rates.

And in 94% of the cases, Gottman was able to predict whether the couples would stay together over a four year period.

"What couples need is a way to get out of what I call 'negative effect reciprocity' which means one starts in and the other gives it back," Gottman said.

First, couples have to learn to calm down. In the marriage lab, that's encouraged by relaxation techniques and measured by heartbeat monitors.

The next step according to Gottman is to guard against criticism, contempt, defensiveness, and withdrawal. Couples often will attack each other verbally or with gestures of

contempt such as rolling their eyes. In the lab, couples learn to speak non-defensively and state their cases firmly. Even though they differ in opinion, they should be able to let each other know they understand.

But why are there so many divorces these days? Is it because it's now too easy to get out of a marriage? Or maybe it's easier to get one and so men or women who were in harmful relationships don't feel obligated to stay. Or is it

HEAD TO HEAD

Two young children who are joined at the head will be separated in a risky and rare procedure in a few weeks. If they don't get to the operating table, they won't survive more than 2 to 3 years in their current condition.

Two year old Nida and Hira Jamal are scheduled to be operated on in about 6 weeks. A doctor at the Hospital for Sick Children says the sister's brains are separated only by spinal fluid and a small ridge of brain tissue and blood vessels.

Children with this type of connection are the hardest to separate "because it affects the brain which affects how one thinks and how one functions." But if the operation wasn't performed (craniopagus separation) Hira's

heart and kidneys would eventually fail, killing both children.

Nida's kidneys are poorly developed and Hira is producing urine for both children. Her heart is also pumping blood for her and her sister. Nida will have to be put on dialysis after the surgery and may need a kidney transplant, possibly from her sister, in the future.

Doctors have already begun to prepare the babies for surgery by inserting tissue expanders to stretch the skin on their heads. And over the next few weeks, they will gradually block off arteries and veins connecting the girls before finally separating them.

Nida and Hira are actually two of a set of triplets and their sister Faryal accompanied their

parents, Anwar and Fatima to Canada to look after the girls.

The family is from Karachi, Pakistan, but Pakistani Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto last month ordered the girls sent abroad for surgery because doctors there feared one might die if the operation was done locally.

Anwar Jamal said he's glad the operation to save his daughters is going ahead. "Hopefully by the will of God, everything will be taken care of," he said.

There have been only 35 similar operation performed in this century. Both twins have survived in one-third of the cases. But Nida and Hira have a better chance of living if they risk the Toronto operation. Anything is better than zero.

quick and easy physical love and infatuation seen by most to be "true love?" Therefore, they get married and then realize it's not as easy as it looks.

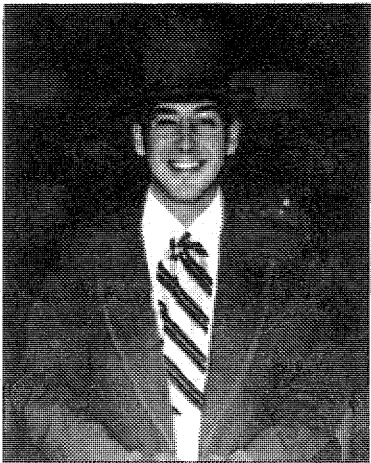
And you never know who's going to make it. Sometimes the oddest matches live happily ever after. And those couples who fit together like a puzzle and do everything together don't even last a year.
