Blowing lunch... Yacking on the big white phone... Praying to the porcelain god Probably 90% of you have done this on one occasion or another. They're all terms for throwing up after consuming too much alcohol.

AADAC and ACD (The Association of Canadian Distillers) have come up with a new anti-drinking campaign that's not only eye-catching, it actually makes people stop and think. In conjunction with college and university campuses across Alberta, AADAC and ACD are

hoping to get across a simple message... you don't need to get plastered to have a good time. It is not so much an anti-drinking campaign, but a campaign to ask postsecondary

students to refrain from over drinking.

The "if you drink... don't bowl" is well thought out and aimed at 18-24 year old students.

In a pilot project, a campuswide survey conducted following a poster campaign brought forth the following statistics:

91% of the students recalled seeing the ads.

96% agreed the posters caught the eye.

86% of the students enjoyed the humour in the ads.

65% indicated they could picture themselves or their friends in the posters.

84% of those surveyed actually thought about the consequences of over-drinking.

Perhaps the most telling percentage though was the actual response to the posters. 80% of the posters were removed by students for private collections.

Some of you may have already taken a few of the posters. There are seven weeks worth of posters, each week with a new slogan. NAITSA is holding

The campaign on a whole is designed to target post-secondary students over-drinking. This intense drinking results in such undesirable side-effects as interference with studies, hurting friends, behaving poorly in social situations, fights/violence, spending too much money, and even unprotected sex. These and other issues are what AADAC is trying to address with this "gutwrenching" poster campaign. So, if you drink... don't bowl.

Immigration Cuts

he federal government is taking a closer look at Canada's immigration policy, looking for weaknesses and opportunities for

Immigration Minister Sergio Marchi will announce his new policy plans sometime this week.

His plans will go against his party's campaign platform (liberal) which stated they wanted to "continue to target immigration levels of

approximately 1% of the population (290,000) with priority given to independent applicants and family class.

However, according to Marchi, those goals are no longer very realistic. The number of people applying to come to Canada is declining and the public is demanding skilled immigrants who can contribute to the economy.

The new proposals are bound to spark protest from immigration advocates who will find the plan too restrictive, and Canada's Reform party who wants even more immigration cuts and







The birth of the "education mortgage" is upon us, meaning students from backgrounds not accustomed to carrying such financial burdens will have to forego any form higher education. They simply will not be able to afford colleges or universities, and therefore will be targeting a lower income bracket. Not only will this hurt their job opportunities but they will also be less inclined in

OPINIONS

The provincial government's recently issued White Paper on post-secondary education has not come under as heavy fire as was first expected. Some critics are saying that while they may not agree with all of the goals and principles laid out in the document, they admit it's a close compromise.

But one of the biggest points in the paper is tuition increases, which fortunately have been

capped at an average increase of \$215 per year plus inflation expenses, to a maximum of 30% of their annual operating expenses. Also institutions must publish a three-year schedule of fees in their annual calendars. The 30% cap is not going to hit NAIT students too hard, but university students are looking at an eventual \$4000 annual tuition, on programs that go a minimum of 4 years.

What we need to concentrate on is real development. We are only hurting ourselves in the longrun by cutting back funding to education. It's really very simple. Why then is the government doing

EGG-SHARING

No it's not Easter, but many women are hunting for eggs.

A private fertility clinic in Toronto is allowing younger women undergoing in-vitro fertilization to give away half their eggs in exchange for getting their medical costs covered. Poorer, vounger women can have their \$5,200 medical costs for IVF completely or partially paid by other richer couples.

The agreement is usually made with couples where the wife is in her early 40's, is also infertile and trying IVF, but has poorer quality eggs because of her age.

The deals are completely anonymous, neither woman's name is revealed. About 50 pairs of women have been involved in the program so far. The basic idea behind the program is splitting one woman's eggs between the two women, the clinic then mixes each woman's eggs with their husband's sperm in a petri dish. The resulting embryos are then reinserted back into the womb. If they get pregnant, the older woman's offspring will only be half biologically related through her husband's sperm. But neither she or her child will ever know

who the real biological mother is.

But the idea of egg donation has met with alot of controversy her in Canada. Dr. Jeffrey Nisker says the program is similar to ones that sell human eggs in the U.S. for cash.

Nisker, head of the ethics committee of the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in Canada says, "A young woman is definitely socially disadvantaged or she would never agree to it." He's very concerned about the program. "This is an exploitation of poor women and there's no place for this in Canada," said

Nisker. "You have sociallydisadvantaged women who can't afford in-vitro fertilization. So what they do is sell their eggs to people to afford IVF. How does this differ to what is going on in the United States?"

Carole Craig, director of the Toronto clinic said there is a difference. "U.S. clinics pay poor, normal women who don't need IVF \$1,500 to take fertility drugs and then have their eggs surgically removed.

The American clinics then turn around and sell the eggs to



Cops Battle For Alberta

emember when you played cops and robbers? Who always won? The cops, right? Well, imagine if the police went up against each other. That's what's happening here in Alberta.

Back in July, former Justice Minister Ken Rostad said that eliminating the RCMP and merging municipal cops into regional superforces is one idea the province is looking at to slash \$19 million from it's policing budget by 1997.

But Canada's top mountie says the Alberta RCMP will gladly cut their costs to beat out a proposed provincial police force for the job of keeping peace in the province.

"We're certainly more than willing to change the way we deliver the police service so we'll remain the police force of choice here in Alberta," Commissioner Phil Murray stated. (Hmmm. Could that possibly include reducing the number of speed traps?)

Although merging the forces might save some money at this point, Murray said the RCMP will top any other proposal.

"Historically, the RCMP is very important in the history and development of the province of Alberta. I'm quite confident that at the end of the day, we'll continue to be the police force of choice for Albertans."

Alberta's police forces is already very qualified and very strong. Murray recognized four of Alberta's best and bravest cops including Constable Colin Quast from Edmonton. Colin Quast was awarded a Commissioner's Commendation, the national force's top honor for exemplary police work. He helped foil an armed robbery while off duty last

He was on his way to work when he saw two men robbing the Beaumont liquor store. He obtained their license number after being shot at and chased by the assailants. The men are now serving 6 year prison terms.


However, couples who are unable to have children should be entitled to experience the joys and

NEW DIRECTIONS

Education and Career Development, needs of the province. announced a new plan to meet the The plan is outlined in "New Directions for Adult Learning in Alberta." This paper sets out a new mission for advanced education and career development, four goals for the adult learning system and 22 strategies to achieve those goals.

What are the four goals for Alberta's adult learning system?

Goal 1 - Accessibility: Alberta's adult learning system will increase access for motivated Albertans to a diverse range of quality learning opportunities.

Goal 2 - Responsiveness: Alberta's adult learning system will become more responsive to the

Goal 3 - Affordability: Allearning needs of adult Albertans. berta's adult learning system will provide quality learning opportunities to the greatest number of Albertans at the lowest possible

> Goal 4 - Accountability: Alberta's adult learning system will become more accountable to Albertans for results.

The new plan for education in Alberta includes 22 strategies to reach the goals for the adult learning system. Among the strategies are five major initiatives.

1. Ministers Forum on Adult Learning - An annual forum where the Minister reports on the progress of the system and receives

ondary education.

2. A New Credential - Applied degree programs will be tested at public colleges and technical institutes. Applied degree programs will combine six semesters of formal instruction with at least two semesters of formal accredited work experience.

3. Tuition Fees - Tuition fees will be allowed to rise to 30 per cent of a public institutions net operating expenditures. The government will continue to regulate the annual maximum increases of fees. Institutions may increase tuition fees only within an annual limit averaging no more than \$215 plus inflation per year. Tuition fees cannot reach the 30 per cent ceiling until the year 2000.

4. Student's Ability to Transfer Courses - Transfers between post-secondary institutions On October 20, 1994, the Honorable needs of the individual learner and advice from Albertans on post-sec-will be improved. Methods will also be developed to increase recognition of prior learning and work experi-

> 5. Collective Agreements -Boards of public institutions are requested to examine and, if necessary, re-negotiate their collective agreements by March 1, 1995 to remove barriers to the termination of academic staff contracts for fiscal reasons or if programs become redundant. Academic freedom will not be affected.

More Speed Traps

ecently the City of

Edmonton Police Service decided they needed to increase their funding. The way they chose to raise this money, rather than approach Edmon-

ton's city council, is to increase the budget for fines collected from speeding tickets. Previous to this, their annual

budget for speeding ticket collection was 10.6 million dollars. That's a lot of fine collection.

Police Chief Doug McNally once again decided to more stringently enforce the Highway Traffic Act. He says he doesn't like to do it, but they need the money. Therefore, effective immediately, the Edmonton Police Service is going to collect an additional 1.1 million dollars in revenue, through speeding tickets. This puts the total annual collection at 11.7 million dollars.

Outshooting Concordia 46-36, the Ooks led 2-1 after the first and trailed 4-3 following two periods.


