# ALBERTA ABORTIONS STUDENT DEBT

There's only one hospital clinic in Edmonton that performs abortions. The Royal Alex has a month-long waiting list and has had to cut back on other reproductive services to meet the demand.

"Because of the lack of access in Northern Alberta, one of our new focuses has become pregnancy choices, including therapeutic abortion services,' says Cheryl

MacKay, director of the Women's Reproductive Health Centre at the hospital.

"There are so many women who want to have abortions and there's so little time to get them in

that patients dealing with infertility or sexually transmitted diseases are referred elsewhere." MacKay says the clinic is limited by provincial government cuts to staff and funding.

Statistics Canada figures show Alberta is in sync with the national growing abortion rate. Pro-life and pro-choice groups agree the increase is a result of high unemployment and a bad economy. They also worry that abortion is being used as a form of birth control.

In 1992, 100 497 Canadian women had abortions, a 5.7% increase from 1991. The national abortion rate almost doubled

between 1972 and 1992, to 25.3 for every 100 live births.

"This is a national tragedy," said Susan McNeely of Campaign Life, an anti-abortion group. "We should all be in mourning." MacKay said some women simply can't cope with the financial strain of an unplanned pregnancy, though most are easily able to pay for birth control. Many young women simply put off going to the

The Royal Alex limits abortions to women who are 12 weeks pregnant or less. But the waiting list means many women are out of luck by the time their name reaches the top. The Edmonton Morgentaler Clinic will do abortions up to 16 weeks.

> And the one in Calgary will do the procedure up to 19 weeks but the fee is \$800.

Susan Fox, the executive director at the Morgentaler

Clinic says money usually isn't a problem. "If someone wants one, they're going to do whatever they have to do."

"It's not up to us to judge whether abortion is being used as birth control or not, Fox said. "For most countries in the world, abortion is the only method of birth control they have. Nobody wants to have an abortion, but if it turns out a woman does have an unplanned pregnancy it's not unrealistic for her to look at abortion as an option."

Liz McCord from Planned Parenthood, suggests governments should provide free birth control pills and condoms to help curtail the rising abortion rate.

Alberta students might forget about University or College all together or be overburdened with debt when they graduate if a new federal proposal goes through, says provincial Advanced Education Minister Jack Ady.

"I don't think we should be moving in a direction that could cause students to be loaded up with \$50,000 and \$60,000 of debt at the end of their university. You're going to find them shying away and not wanting to attend," Ady said.

The federal government has proposed cutting the cash portion of its transfer payments to provinces to cover education costs, which in Alberta totals about \$260 million. Instead, the money would go to an expanded loan program for students.

Ady said that could mean more students eligible for more money to cover more of their education, saddling them with bigger debts. The federal government has suggested loan repayments be tied to income after graduation.

"I don't see it as a benefit to the students, I don't see it as a benefit to the taxpayer," said Ady, who wants to know how the money would be put back into the system.

The suggestion is part of a federal discussion paper released Wednesday about reforming social security in Canada.

The federal education proposals follow revelations last month that the province

plans to change its policies to let universities and college increase tuition fees.

The province would remove its cap on the percentage of education costs postsecondary institutions can take from students.

Social Services Minister Mike Cardinal said he backs many of the federal suggestions regarding social programs, which appear to mirror much of what Alberta has already done cut administration, put people into education and retraining and direct the money to those most in need.

Premier Ralph Klein said earlier that he's not concerned about a potential cut in federal transfer payments. "if we have to accept a cut in transfer payments, we will only do so if government can demonstrate that it's ready, willing and able to reduce costs on the administration side", said Klein.

Klein said the province isn't afraid of taking on new programs or relinquishing some to the federal government as long as they're administered by whoever can do them best and cheapest.

Interim Liberal leader Bettie Hewes said she favored some of the federal suggestions, such as a two-tiered unemployment system that would put frequent users into retraining.

But she shared some of Ady's concerns about introducing a student loan program that could force students to take out loans they can't afford to pay back.

## Computerized Car Pooling

An average of six hundred students at NAIT each year are turned away when applying for a parking space. This leads to a lot of congestion in the residential areas surrounding NAIT and numerous parking tickets. More and more cars are ticketed and towed each year around NAIT, and at Kingsway Garden Mall. What are we to do with all the people who need to drive and cannot find space to park their vehicles?

One answer to this annual dilemma is the recently instituted ride-share program, through NAIT parking and security.

Every year NAIT facilities management attends a conference with other western Canadian schools. Some of these include University of Calgary, SAIT, University of Winnipeg, Red Deer College and Simon Fraser University, from B.C.

In 1992, Simon Fraser University (SFU) started a computerized ride-share program, in which students enter car pools by entering their names and addresses on a central computer. They were then matched with

people living in the same area as themselves.

In the first year of operation, 100 carpools were formed using the new system. In 1993, 213 carpools were formed. Expectations are for even greater numbers this year.

Following the same general principle, NAIT facilities in conjunction with NAIT student services, purchased the software needed to start a ride-share program here. The software comes from a B.C. company and cost about \$2,500. Using equipment already available here, NAIT facilities then acquired the Canada Post software required to put all the pertinent postal codes on-line: This cost another \$500-\$1000.

The ride-share program matches students with other people in the same general area on a number of different options, including male or female only, if desired, smoking and nonsmoking, and whether or not you wish to be a driver, passenger only, or both.

By setting up a car pool of at least three people, NAIT

parking guarantees you a parking stall. To accommodate this they have leased an extra forty stall lost between NAIT and the municipal airport.

To date, there have been 112 car pools formed, which compares favorably with the numbers provided by SFU. There were no formal data collections made on the number of car pools previous to the implementation of this program.

In order to register for the ride-share program, a student uses his/her student ID card in the card reader in front of the registrar's office. Then follow the instructions on the computer

Hopefully this program will help improve the parking situation around NAIT, and it can only help the environment. By reducing the number of vehicles driving we clean up the air, and save on gas.

# CK SwampingStudents

As a NAIT student, when you finally enter the working world you will soon discover that companies today are encouraging group rather than individual work. This is the current trend in companies today. And a class of Business students found this out through a technique called "swampwalking".

Organizational Behavior is a course Business students know very well. It's purpose is to teach the complexities of the internal operations of a company and the interpersonal relations within it. Now, each instructor of this course is at liberty to use different methods to try and encourage the "team building" aspect. Bill Fricker is one such instructor who decided to use the swampwalking method.

Using "swamp skis" built by Dave Hoy and Mark Bosworth, the students trekked across the swamp (the grassy knoll of the Tower) in search of different objects they had to recover in order to be successful. There were, however, certain obstacles they had to overcome. Some students were forced to wear blindfolds and use kazoos to communicate because of the "swamp conditions". As you can see on the front page, when students are strapped to a pair of two-by-fours it can be a little tough to stay on your feet.

"It's good to have an instructor who makes a class like this

interesting," said Patrick Armstrong, one of Fricker's students.

This idea, however, is not Fricker's. Swampwalking was used this summer for NAIT's staff training seminar.

CQI (Continuous Quality Improvement) is an increasingly popular philosophy used in more and more organizations, and has been adopted by NAIT to keep pace with today's business world. "Quality at NAIT has always been a concern for management and instructional staff," says Fricker, who is Chairperson of NAIT's Educational Technology Advisory Group (ETAG). "Some of the courses we've been able to take recently offer us new techniques to ensure the quality will continue." Swampwalking follows the CQI idea of strengthening team building, to increase the productivity of the group.

As a NAIT student if you haven't heard of CQI it would be a good idea to find out about it. Your future employer will probably be impressed.

Okay, so the title is "slightly" misleading as to the context of my editorial. This is to discuss a problem that faces every woman alive, breast cancer. One in nine Canadian women develop breast cancer and fifteen women die each day in Canada from this disease.

The cause of breast cancer is, as is the case with nearly all cancers, not known. However, there are some factors that definitely influence a person's susceptibility. For example, women are one hundred times more likely to develop breast malignancies than men are, and there is fairly good evidence that it is hereditary. It is also a statistical fact that women who have had children before age 25 have a lower incidence of breast cancer than those whose children come later, but it is not known why.

There are several fairly good signs. Nipple discharge or crusting is very important and should never be ignored. Breast examinations should be carried out at least once a month and any unusual lump or mass should be immediately examined by a physician. Confirmed malignancies should be promptly exercised.

The most common treatment has been and still is total mastectomy - complete removal of the breast and its attendant lymph nodes.

# Quest for Breasts

However, even with such radical surgery, fewer than half of the patients survive more than 10 years, and the statistic can be matched with much less radical surgery. One technique used with success has been to cut below the breast and skin it, then remove the offending tissue beneath and take out the necessary lymph nodes. The entire area can then be reconstructed, and when the skin is placed back down over the newly molded breast, all normal external sensations will still be there. Another, even simpler, procedure is known as a lumpectomy (removal of just the malignant lump). Many surgeons insist that this is not the treatment of choice, but statistical evidence indicates that these less-radical procedures produce survival rates as high as total mastectomy and both recovery rate and life quality are certainly better.

So what can you do to help? The Honda Run for the Cure is a good start. The Honda Run helps to raise money for breast cancer research. On Sunday, October 23 at 10:00 am, you have a choice between a 5 km run or a 1 km walk. You can compete individually or as a group. Registration and sponsorship forms are available at the NAITSA office located at E-133, or at the parking office.

Just when you though it was all over, and he was guilty, they prolong the agony even more.

O.J. Simpson's lawyers waged another losing battle to throw out evidence and the sister of Simpson's slain ex-wife suggested for the first time she has questions about his innocence. No really!!

"If O.J.. is so innocent, why are they trying to suppress all the evidence?" Denise Brown asked after the court session.

Simpson entered a plea of "absolutely 100% not guilty" in the deaths of his ex-wife Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ronald Goldman. But Denise says, "He's 100% innocent? Keep the evidence then"

Brown and other family members have sat through most of the hearings in the murder case. But this was the first time any member of Simpson's family has hinted at his/her view.

The point behind last Wednesday's hearing was similar to others. It was a new effort by the defense to keep out of the trial such evidence as analysis of blood drops found on the driveway of Simpson's mansion and items seized from his vehicle.

Both sides also accused each other of using lying witnesses, but Judge Lance Ito said no one knows yet who is lying and who is telling the truth.

# No More O.J.

Ito said the defense had an opportunity during the preliminary hearing over the summer to find out if Detective Philip Vannatter lied when he said officers tried to call Simpson before entering his estate without a search warrant.

The judge said state law allows the defense only one chance to seek suppression of evidence-either at the preliminary hearing or later in Superior Court. And they chose to fight at the preliminary hearing.

However, defense lawyer, Gerald Velmen, insisted new evidence has surfaced showing Vannatter lied when he testified about the circumstances under which police entered the estate. He cited cellular phone records and communication transcripts.

What they presented at the hearing was a well-orchestrated tissue of lies," Velmen said.

In another ruling against the defense, Ito upheld the testing of blood found on Simpson's driveway. Velmen said the tests invaded Simpson's privacy and police should have had a search warrant. The judge said the argument was "interesting and novel" but unsupported in the law.

Jury selection for the trial is still continuing. They've taken a week's break to allow the lawyers time to read more than 300 questionnaires filled out by prospective jurors.

With the announcement of the new 9.9 million expansion to NAIT's main campus, everyone is talking. The 5500 square metre building will satisfy a number of critical needs: instructional space, an auditorium, lecture and seminar theatres, student support services, and amenities such as a new bookstore.

Since the government is unable to provide funding for any new construction, NAIT has to look for other resources. Specifically, these funds will come from the following three sources:

- 1. Partners in Tomorrow Campaign
- 2. Capital reserves developed over the past decade
- 3. Expected new corporate and private donations

This is where we as students play a big part. In 1989, the NAIT Students' Association (NAITSA), started allocating \$15.00 from each student fee towards a future building fund. In 1990, the NAIT Foundation embarked on the Partners in Tomorrow Campaign where NAITSA pledged to donate

\$15.00 from every student fee for the next five years. Combined with interest the total pledge was estimated to reach \$775,000.00.

The maturity date for the NAIT Foundation Reserve is October 15, 1994 and the amount sitting in the fund is \$608,847.82. Student fee assessments and interest rates were lower than expected with the actual total being \$608.847.00 rather than the estimated \$775,000.00.

Over the next two meetings, General Council will be discussing the NAIT Foundation Reserve with respect to our pledge in the Partners in Tomor-


row Campaign. I hope to see you all out at General Council on November 1 because your representatives will be voting on whether to continue the contributions for another year.

As I was mulling over ideas for an editorial this week, I realized something. I really don't




### Crime Report



Remember, if you see someone in the act of committing a crime, contact NAIT Security at 471-7477 immediately. Don't become a victim of opportunity....help us prevent crime.


