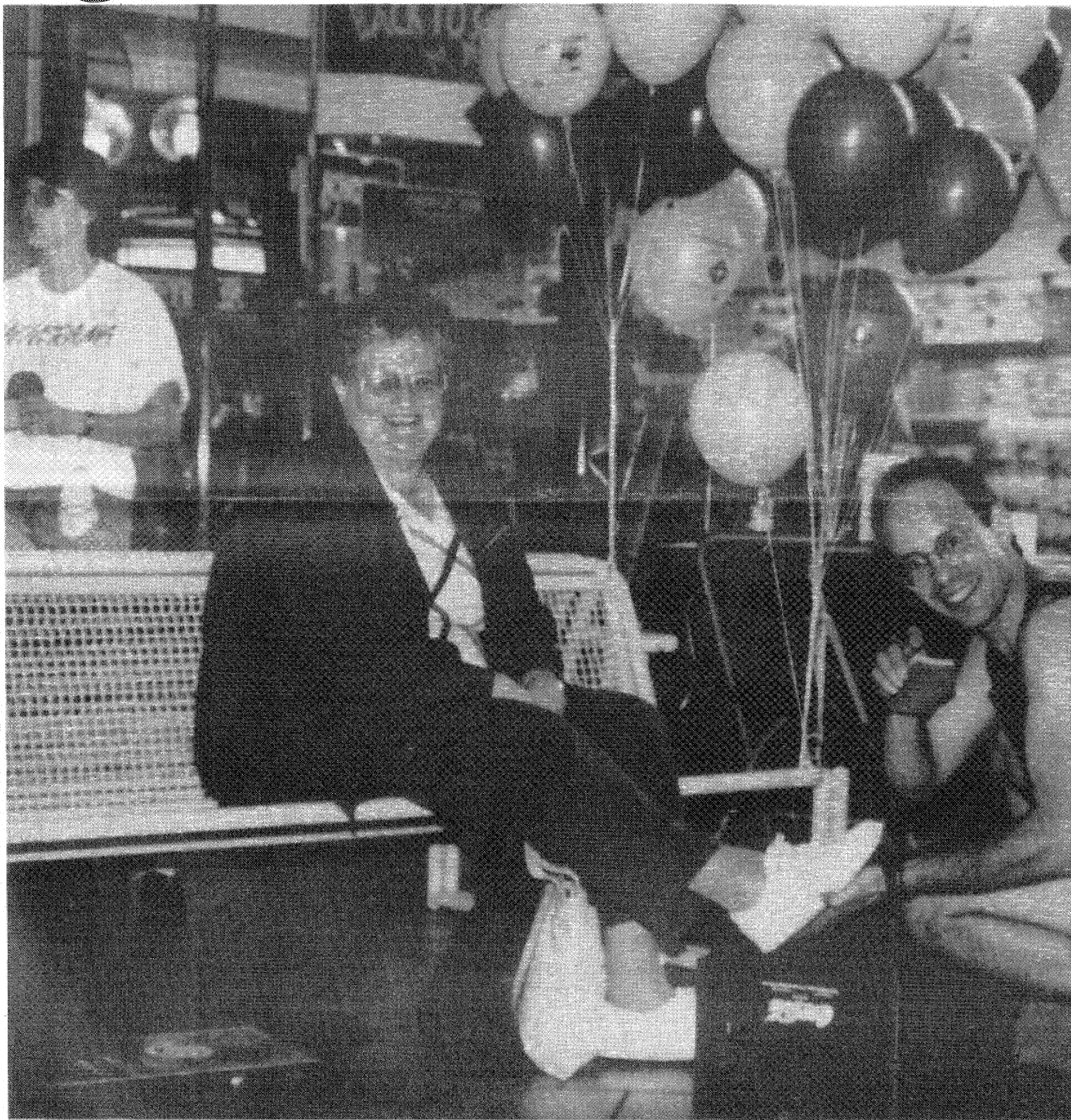

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Recycle...Why Bother?

Saving for College

All across the country hundreds of thousands of students are hitting the books for another year. Here at NAIT, spirits are high. Besides classes there has been plenty of activities such as Shinerama and the Blood Donor Clinic to keep everyone involved. But for most students and parents, returning to school means coughing up your life savings.

Education costs have risen by 58% in the last five years and they're still soaring. Parents can now expect to pay approximately \$100,000 for their new baby's college education. So if you think you might even want to have kids sometime in the future, maybe you'd better start saving now.

Most NAIT students pay for their education with summer job earnings, scholarships, student loans, or the generosity of parents' pockets. However, jobs are getting harder to find and scholarships and student loans are harder to get. That leaves the task of paying for college on alot of parents' shoulders.

Parents of budding college students have basically four options. The first choice is simply saving or debt paydown. People try to put some money away every month for their child's education. This can be a highly effective choice... if you can resist the urge to spend the money on something else. This option is really easy to do but can

be lousy with respect to taxes. Earnings on these savings are considered income and therefore, you'll have to pay taxes on them.

The most accessible strategy tends to be operative scholarship trusts. With this plan you're limited to \$1,500 a year in contributions but the earnings are not taxable. All you have to do is buy a unit for a set price, usually about \$10/month and keep paying it until the child turns 18. It's very simple. The major draw back to this option is that the money must be used for post-secondary education. All earnings will be forfeited if the child doesn't go to college.

Registered Education Savings Plans (RESP's) offer more flexibility to parents, although they still have the \$1,500/year limit. Whether you choose them deposits or mutual funds the child must pursue post-secondary education of some sort.

The strategy most people recommend these days are flexible trusts. Parents buy a mutual fund for their child and designate it as "in trust." (So when he/she goes to NAIT they can't blow it on a big party at the Nest for all the wonderful staff and the Nugget without their parents' consent.) The earnings are not taxable, they have higher earning power and the money can be used for anything after the child turns 18!

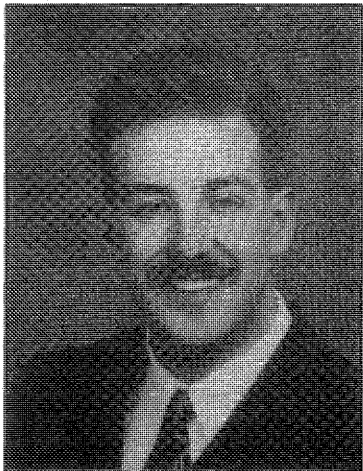
not I think Haiti should be invaded or some mad bull saved I'm asking for your help.

I hope you are enjoying the renovations to the Tower Lounge and the Dock.

The Tower Lounge underwent a major face lift with new carpet, paint, furniture refurbishing and re-upholstering. The east wall was also rebuilt as well as a new ceiling and lighting system installed. The old lights needed to be replaced since the lighting was well below the acceptable standard for students to study under. The finishing touches were added this past weekend when new reflective glass was

installed on the south and west side of the Tower Lounge. The new glass was needed to replace the unsightly window screens that were long overdue to be replaced as well as to cut down on the glare from the sun.

Over at the Dock, all the furniture was painted and re-upholstered, new carpet installed and the whole lounge repainted. Just outside the Dock, a new patio area was built and landscaped. The new Dock is a great place to kick back and watch some TV or hit the books.

Over the summer we also added a new dimension to the Plaza II games rooms/student

store. NAIT provided us with a little chunk of real estate just outside the games room which allowed us to expand our existing space in order to better accommodate you, the students. We now stock several extra student items for your convenience in Plaza II.

NAITSA information bulletin boards are also being installed throughout NAIT campuses. There will be one information bulletin board at the following locations: Plaza II, Westwood, the Medical Annex, Westerra and 6 on main campus. We will also be providing an ACTISEC (Alberta College and

Technical Institute Student Executive Council) information bulletin board on main campus, just off the main lobby.

Although we don't have a final bill for all the renovations, it looks as though they will come in well under budget. Finally, I would like to note that most of these projects were joint efforts between NAIT and NAITSA and couldn't of been possible if several people hadn't worked closely together. Smokers' Haven

Since we've had such beautiful weather lately some of you might have ventured outside to catch a few rays. And while you were relaxing puffing on a cigarette or eating second hand smoke in the courtyards you may have noticed two new additions.

Two wooden gazebos were placed in the courtyards over the summer, and depending on student response there may be more to come. The cost of each complete unit was approximately \$4000.00 and the entire project was funded by NAIT to add to the students' courtyard experience.

There has been some talk as to whether the gazebos will be winterized as a refuge for smokers during the chilly months. But it seems that this is more rumor than fact.

Bob Kerr, the Director of Facilities Management at NAIT says there are no current plans to

make the gazebos a "heated" hang out.

One of the major obstacles is the heating bill. NAIT's gas bill is already \$600,000 a year and heating the gazebos primarily for smoking students and staff isn't a probable plan at this time.

Another problem is snow removal. Facilities management already has to clean 3,800 parking stalls, handicapped areas etc., so the gazebos and courtyards are low on the priority list.

However, there still might be a shred of hope for the future. "NAIT is moving toward becoming a non-smoking institute, however, we know this causes hardships for smokers," says Kerr. "We try to make some allowances, a sort of trade-off." So a warm haven for winter smokers could become a reality. Depending, of course, on what the demand is and how the gazebos are being used now and will be used in the future.

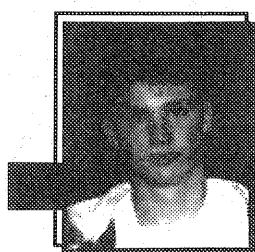

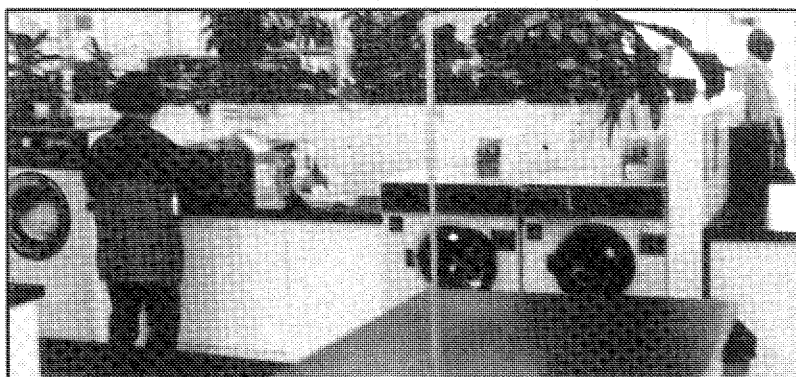
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Record Reviews
