# Aids Awareness

Do you know anyone who has died of AIDS? Let me rephrase that. Do you know anyone who has died of AIDS related illness? So far 141 Edmontonians have and at least 100 more are living with full blown AIDS. As of August 1994, 1,163 citizens of Edmonton have tested positive for HIV, the virus that leads to AIDS. It is also estimated that for every HIV+ person there is, there are 5 to 10 more that are positive and may not know it.

Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, or AIDS, has been around for decades, but still some people refuse to believe that this is not just a homosexual disease. AIDS does not differentiate between race, gender, social status, or sexual preferences. AIDS is totally preventable, all you have to do is be aware.

The AIDS Network of Edmonton has its annual AIDS Awareness Week scheduled for October 3 - 9. It is a nation-wide effort to confront AIDS.

It is a time for questions to be asked, to learn, and to take action on HIV/AIDS issues. This year's theme is "HIV/AIDS and Youth." Approximately one-quarter of adults were infected as teenagers.

"AIDS Awareness Week is a time to reach out to the young people we care about with messages about safer sex and abstinence, encourage them to get the skills they will need to be healthy, happy sexual beings in the age of AIDS, and encourage them to seek out and talk about information regarding their sexual health," said Sonya Thompson, AIDS Awareness Week Co-ordinator.

Throughout the week, many different activities will be happening. Memorial quilt panels will be on display in City Hall. Approximately forty different agencies that provide services for youths will be reaching out to clients with messages about self-care around sexuality, including safer sex and HIV prevention. Also, a display

of books concerning HIV/AIDS, as well as, printed material from the AIDS Network of Edmonton Society, will be on the main floor of the Centennial Library from October 3 - 9.

Prior to the October 3rd start date, some very special events are happening on Saturday, October 1st, the Ninth Annual AIDS Vigil of Prayer will take place. This event is hosted by the Interfaith Association on AIDS, at 8:00 pm at the University of Alberta Hospital Chapel. Other prayer vigils are also taking place across the city.

Also on Saturday is the AIDS Dance for Life. This is a day of dance classes to raise money for HIV/AIDS education, prevention, care, and support. The classes offered are: jazz, ballet, country, modern, tap, latin, physical theatre, ballroom, and belly dancing. You can register by phoning 487-4587.

On Sunday, October 2nd, the official kick-off to AIDS Awareness Week begins with the Walk for Life. The walk starts

with a 10:00 am registration at the Rundle Park Family Centre. The actual walking begins at noon.

On Monday, October 3rd, there will be a public forum. The topic of this forum will be The Family and HIV/AIDS. This is hosted by the HIV Outpatient Clinic at the University of Alberta Hospital. The focus will be on families of those infected with HIV. Parents, caregivers, and loved ones will speak. The forum takes place from 7:00 - 8:30 pm at Bernard Snell Hall, Medical Sciences Building, University of Alberta.

The Interfaith Association on AIDS will be co-hosting and Interfaith Service on Thursday, October 6th. The association is co-hosting the service with the Edmonton and District Council of Churches. The service begins at 7:30 pm at Robertson Wesley United Church located at 10209 - 123 St.

Finally, on Sunday October 9th, is the Candlelight Memorial walk. This walk of reverence and

solidarity for Edmontonians affected and infected by HIV/AIDS will begin at 6:30 pm at City Hall. Along the way, there will be short stops to hear speakers representing different communities of people who have been affected by HIV/AIDS.

NAITSA will be having the following events going on with the AIDS Network. Also, NAITSA is giving away condoms and red ribbons for a donation. Along the same lines, NAITSA has red ribbon tattoos, for a dollar. Tech. charity points can be earned for raising money and/or donating time. All proceeds to the AIDS Network of Edmonton.

First order of business was the vacancy at the Nugget. Communications VP Lorraine Sitter announced that a new Editor-in-Chief will be needed to replace yours truly, and applications should be in by Friday, September 30th to make the transition quick and painless for everyone involved.

Dean then talked about his trip to Toronto last week to the ICRP Symposium regarding government student loan issues. Anyone wanting more info on the conference, or if you just want to know what ICRP stands for, see Dean in the NAITSA office.

College night will be this Friday at the Edmonton Eskimos' game. Activities VP Carolyn Sitter announced the Tailgate Party ticket prices of \$25 for a field-level under-the-tent seat, where the beer and barbecue will be, and \$10 for a

Carolyn then put a calendar of upcoming events on the overhead screen. ## Shopping For Babies

With all the miracles of modern technology these days, you can do almost everything better and faster. But somewhere along the line something will get sacrificed for the sale of modernization. Now it seems we've reached the point of choosing our children.

Dr. Robert Jansen, an internationally recognized expert on in-vitro fertilization (fertilization outside the womb) visited Edmonton last week. And the resident of Sydney, Australia had a lot to say about the latest developments in his field.

"It's now possible to create a human embryo outside a woman's body by micro-injecting just one sperm through the translucent wall of the human egg in a petri dish." Said Jansen. The eggs are surgically removed from women who have taken special drugs to produce more than one egg at a time.

Jansen explained it's still not possible to pre-determine whether you'll have a boy or girl by using this method. "The methods at the moment for sex pre-selection don't work," said Jansen. "So-called gender clinics that advertise that they can tell you the sex of your baby are a con."

Your odds at these clinics are no better than those already set by Mother Nature. Her figures right now sit at 50.5% boys and 49.5% girls.

But Dr. Jansen said they're not giving up. "Within 5 years it will be possible to select the sex of the baby by micro-injecting a single human sperm into the egg in a laboratory," explained Jansen. He predicts governments won't fund such research but the work will continue.

In-vitro fertilization does have some definite advantages. For couples who are infertile, the process can give them some hope of having a child. The technology is also helpful in detecting and eliminating some diseases. But I don't believe it's worth it.

Bringing life into this world is something that shouldn't be tampered with. It's one of the great mysteries of life. We know less about our development than about any other species from frogs to elephants.

If a couple really want to have a baby they shouldn't care whether it's a boy or girl. The surprise is have the fun. Babies are captured miracles that were meant to be.

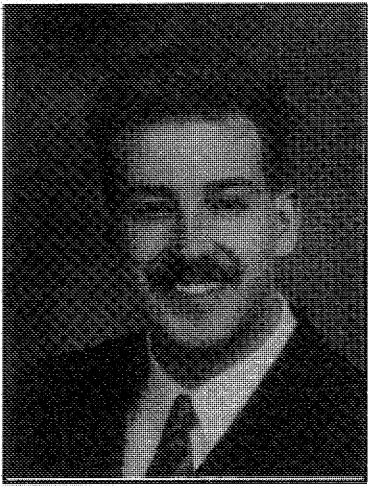

## Deadly Smokers

For all you smokers at NAIT, you may be able to ignore those nasty messages on your cigarette packages, but this latest information will hopefully shake you from your "fatal" habit.

Deaths from cigarettes are likely to triple over the next quarter century, to twenty every minute around the globe.

Scientists at Britain's Imperial Cancer Research Fund, the World Health Organization and the American Cancer Society published a book last week entitled, "Mortality from Smoking in Developed Countries 1950 - 2000." This book reveals all the latest findings and shocking truths.

"Worldwide smoking is already killing 3 million people each year and this number is increasing," says Richard Peto, a researcher at the Imperial Cancer Research Fund. But the news gets worse. "If current smoking patterns persist, then by the time the young smokers of today reach middle or old age, there will be about 10 million deaths a year

from tobacco," Peto said. And that comes out to one death every 3 seconds.

This new survey provides the most comprehensive analysis of the world's smokers, describing the trends in smoking related deaths since the 1950's and forecasting deaths into the next century.

An estimated 60 million people have died as a direct result of smoking since the 1950's. Investigators predict smoking will kill 10 million people a year by 2020.

"Smoking is like no other hazard. It will kill one in two smokers eventually," says Dr. Lopez of the World Health Organization, a co-author of the study.

All the researchers hope the survey will encourage governments to enforce strict anti-smoking policies, such as banning cigarette advertisements or raising the price of cigarettes.

One in two smokers, just think about it.

## "Zap" Out Violence

Do you think there's too much violence on television today? Well, soon you'll be able to control everything from the blood and guts to the nudity.

Government officials got a demonstration last week of a TV violence-zapper than will soon get an exclusive test run here in Edmonton.

Participants at a Canadian Radio and Television Commission watched as a man pinned down his opponent and put a large knife to his throat. However, instead of seeing blood, a large grey square appeared.

It covered most of the TV screen, including the violence.

The device was revealed as part of the proposed takeover of MacLean Hunter by Rogers Communications. Shaw Communications, which stands to acquire several cable systems as part of the deal says the "zapper" will be tested within six months.

It's actually called a V-chip and it would allow parents to filter out objectionable programs by selecting a number from one to ten in each of three categories. These categories being violence, foul

language and sex. The V-chip will be installed in 60 - 80 Edmonton homes in a \$75,000 field trial.

Test viewers will be able to pre-select rating levels put into the video signals of local telecasts. If a program's rating is higher than the personal level selected, the entire show or certain scenes would automatically be blocked out.

If the Rogers deal proceeds, Shaw promises to spend \$300,000 on a national test to see how household in other provinces like the Canadian-designed invention.

## Tuition Hikes

Many students at NAIT are still recovering from the \$1100 blow to bank accounts for tuition this year. And already there's talk of increasing it for next year.

Treasurer Jim Dinning says students will have to start paying a greater share of the education costs.

Universities and colleges are now limited to collecting up to 20% of their costs from tuition fees. But this could change. Advanced Education Minister Jack Ady launched a review of the current rules two years ago. He's expected to make

several recommendations next month, but Dinning says they're headed in the direction of increasing fees.

The increase would be "based on the cost of the delivery of the program on a per student basis," Dinning explained.

Student leaders said they've been bracing for an increase of the limit, to between 25 and 33 percent. These increases were suggested in the governments education white paper, released earlier this year.

However, since Ady hasn't yet announced his recommenda-

tion, students are working on their own suggestion. They're looking at a 26% cap, phased in over 4 years.

That would mean tuition at the U of A would jump from the current figure of \$2200 to about \$3000 a year. And you can be sure students at NAIT will experience a sizable increase as well.

The price of tuition already keeps many students away. If the problem gets much worse, it will drive students to attend school in other provinces with cheaper

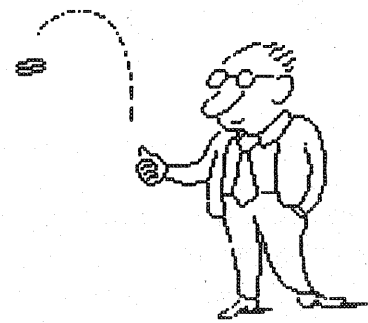

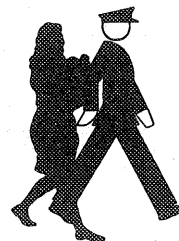

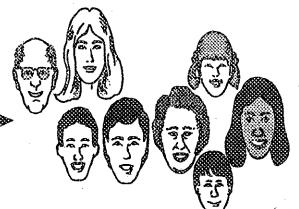

As soon as I said it, I realized it. Stupid. The epitome of stupidity. Stupidness hemorrhaged from my red face.

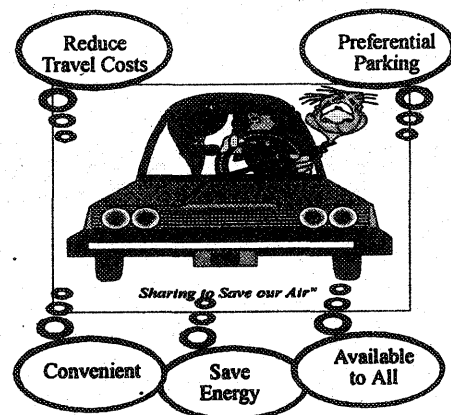

In an incredible performance this past weekend, NAIT captured the Mens' and Ladies' individual titles.

Prior to the tryouts, I felt we would be competitive with Ben Bandura and Jason Gilroyed returning from last years' championship team. When Trevor Bloom, Kevin Adams, and Gary Smith completed the roster I honestly felt we could defend the title. No one could have predicted we would be so dominant. We finished 1st, 2nd, 5th, 6th, and 9th in the individual standings. Of the 14 rounds in the 70's, we had 9 of them. Just an incredible performance.

Jana Kolot won the ladies' individual championship by seven strokes. If another lady from NAIT had stepped forward and shot rounds in the mid 90's, we would have added the ladies team championship to our already impressive list of medals.

NAIT would like to thank the Raven Crest Golf Course for adopting us. Their attitude and cooperation were very instrumental in us winning the '93 and '94 championships.

To the team I offer my congratulations. Thank you for your effort, attitude, and cooperation. It was a fun year.

Two exceptional athletes are finishing their college athletic careers this year. Ben Bandura with a golf record that may never be broken - 2 golds, 1 silver, and 1 bronze. Jana Kolot, the 1993/94 Female Intercollegiate Athlete of the Year, has earned 8 medals in her ACAC college career - 3 in golf, gold, silver, and bronze, 2 in soccer, both gold, and 3 in curling, gold, silver, and bronze.

In closing a special thanks to Jana and Ben for their outstanding contributions to NAIT and the athletic programs.

# NAIT Repeats Gold at 1994 ACAC Golf Championships

"INCREDIBLE!! To defend a championship is a feat and an honor, but to win it by 35 strokes and in the process capture the Mens' and Ladies' individual title is something very special," echoed a jubilant coach, Jules Owchar.

NAIT defeated ten other colleges to win the Mens' Championship by an amazing 35 strokes. Nine of the ten scores posted by the NAIT team were under 80 - a college record - and the margin of victory broke the old ACAC record of 34 (NAIT).

In superb conditions - sunny with windier conditions on day two - the enticing Connaught Golf Course was ready to challenge the ACAC best, 41 men and 13 women.

A quick glance at the scoreboards after day one and everyone knew NAIT was the team to beat. Although they led MRC by only 8 strokes, the fact that only seven golfers broke 80 and four of them were NAIT players left a clear message.

The script was then set for day two, and for all intent and purposes it was NAIT vs MRC for the Gold Medal. MHC was in

3rd place trailing by 24 strikes. The battle some were hoping for never materialized. NAIT posted scores of 77, 78, 79, 79, 79, and beat MRC by 27 stroke on day two.

Although there were 13 ladies, only two schools could field teams (2 players to a team). SAIT bear MRC for the Gold.

The real drama centered on the Ladies Individual title. Mary Bingeman of SAIT led NAIT's Jana Kolot and MRC's Amy Macdonald by six strokes. After nine holes on day two, the three ladies were tied. An impressive 38 on the back nine settled the issue giving Jana the title by 7 strokes. Jana finished the competition with rounds of 89-83. The Gold medal was NAIT's first ever in Ladies' play.

In the Men's individual standings, the NAIT team players finished in the top nine. For a second it looked like all the medals would go to the NAIT players. Gary Smith beat team-mate Kevin Adams by two strokes for the Gold medal. In fifth, 5 back, was Trevor Bloom, in 6th, Ben Bandura and in ninth only 9 back was Jason Gilroyed.

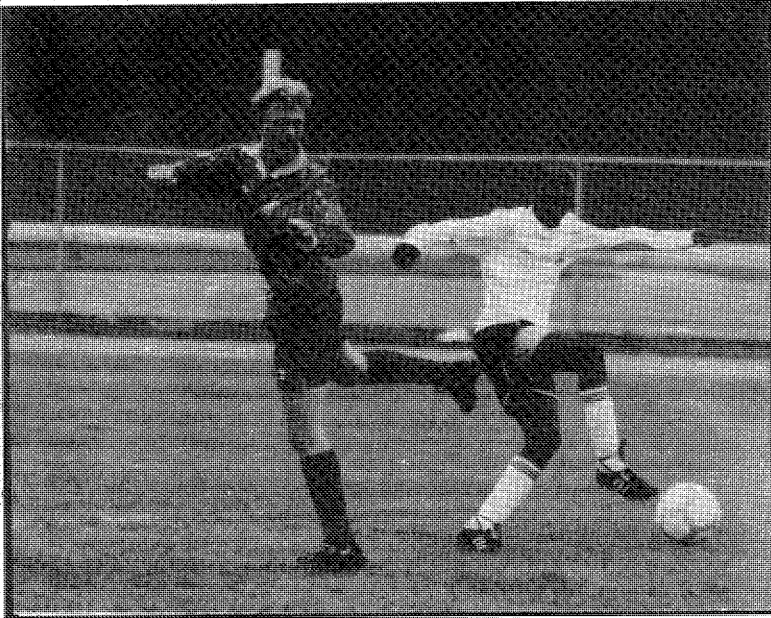

The next meet for the mighty paddlers is October 1st in Camrose, then the ACAC Championships here in Edmonton on October 15th.

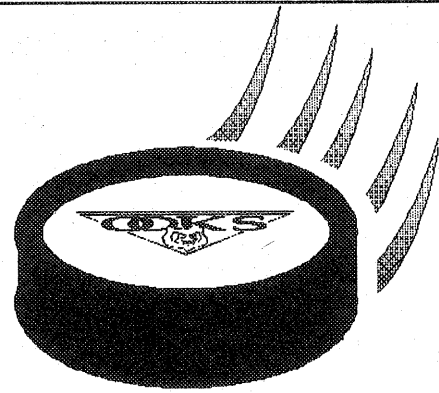

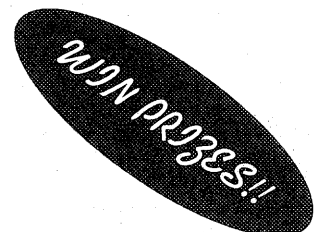
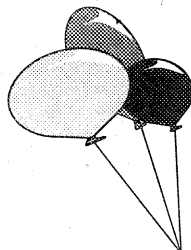
