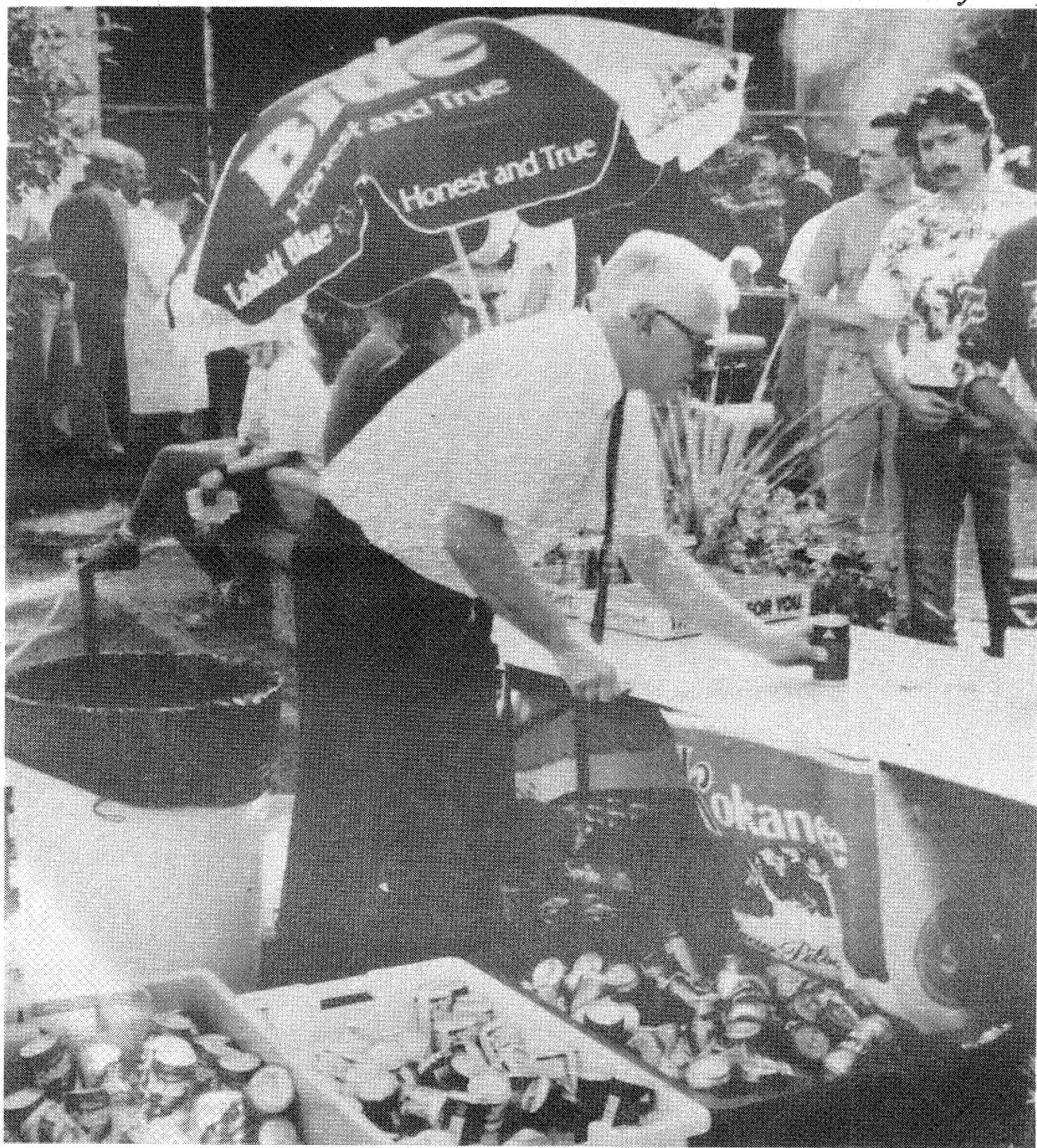

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Tuition Hikes...Again.

As many of you students are aware of (or at least you should be) we have to pay money to attend NAIT. We are obligated to pay a fraction of our tuition, while the rest of the money comes from the institution and the government. This is about to change.

On Wednesday, August 31, student representatives met with the Honorable Minister of Advanced Education, Jack Ady. Around thirteen students were there to listen to, and give suggestions to Mr. Ady in regards to tuition hikes.

The meeting was to cover five important issues. The first and foremost was the tuition fee policy, and the rate of incremental increases. At various "Roundtable" meetings, there was a consensus that tuition fees should be raised, but before they could not decide at how much. Tuition caps are the maximum amount that an institute can make a student pay out of their tuition. For example, if your tuition was \$1000, and the tuition cap was 13.3%, then the full amount of your tuition would be over \$10,000, but you only pay a percentage. Right now the tuition cap for all post-secondary institutes in maintained at 20% maximum. The current breakdown in as follows:

- University students pay 19.6%
- College students pay 14.8%
- Technical Institute students pay 13.3%

There were two options brought forward about increasing the level of tuition fees. The first suggestion was that the tuition

fees would become completely deregulated, and would then be set at "whatever the market would bear". The other option was that the level of payment could be raised from 20% to 33%. From all indications from the meeting, the latter suggestion is the most likely.

Some other suggestions brought forward dealing with tuitions were:

- Tuition levels should be set according to the cost of delivery of a particular program of study.
- Tuition levels will be set annually, and institutions would be required to publish 3-4 year tuition plans in their calendars.
- Collective bargaining agreements between the institutions and the students could be created.
- Because of the expected increases, students should be allowed a greater representation on the boards of institutions.

Now, the Minister of Advanced Education will not comment on his decision, stating that "now is the time for decisions". His "White Paper", which will be released at the end of October, will let us all know what is going to happen. The White Paper will become the government's bible when it is dealing with tuition issues.

If you are worried about the kind of increases each institute could enact once the tuition caps is raised, here is something to consider. Every school will be regulated by the government, which uses Key

Performance Indicators (KPI) to determine how an institute is doing.

Should enrollment in any course drop by more than 2%, the institute will be "fined" \$2500 per student over that 2%. By fining the institute, the government simply won't allocate them the money they were supposed to receive. KPI's also include the following occurrences: fiscal irresponsibility; high drop out rate; low graduation rates; and drastic increases of tuitions.

Dean Andres, President of NAITSA, said this about the KPI's and the tuition increases. "It's in the best interest of the institute not to drastically increase tuitions." Dean also spoke out about the new tuition policy. "The government wants to keep this policy well into the next century."

The other points talked about at the meeting dealt with strengthening ACAT (Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfers). This was in regards to several points, including giving NAIT students more credits should they want to transfer to the University. The accreditation of Athabasca University in the brokering of degrees was discussed next. It was also brought up that a member of ACTISEC should sit on the Student Finance Board. (Currently two university students hold the two positions.) Lastly it was brought up that legislation should be imposed on King's College, thereby allowing them to finally have a students' association.

New Building for '96

Guess what! We're getting a new building! Last year the proposal that would have seen a new Health Sciences facility built on the grassy knoll of main campus was shot down by a lack of provincial funding. Whoa. Surprise.

This year NAIT has taken a new approach to the problem. It's been able to supply the funding needed from it's own resources. The most specific sources are:

- Partners in Tomorrow Campaign
- Capital reserves from the last decade
- Expected new donations

It's important to note that the Partners in Tomorrow fund has been built over many years and was designated specifically for a new facility.

The estimated \$9.9 million structure will have instructional space, an auditorium, lecture and seminar theatres, student support services, a new bookstore, and other added amenities. The 5500 square metre building will begin construction in the summer of '95 and should be complete in time

for the fall of '96.

The importance of this building is the approval of the Minister of Advanced Education and Career Development, The Honourable Jack Ady. His approval is seen as "a vote of confidence in NAIT and a recognition of the importance of our employment-focused programming."

So here is some food for thought. While the country is enduring an economic crisis and other schools such as the UofA are closing faculties and doubling tuitions, we get a great big expensive building, that we're paying for ourselves, and we're raising tuitions a hundred bucks. Hell of a positive note to start the year off on don't you think?

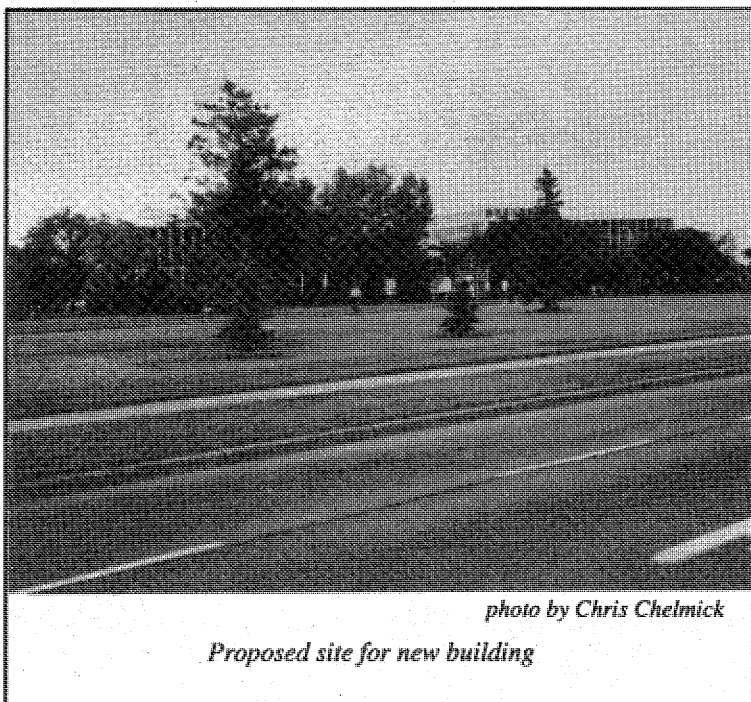

Another Year Without Her

NAIT students hurry through the busy hallways heading for their next class. Laughs and groans register on their faces as the whole "Back to School" reality sets in. Welcome Week Activities, Shinerama and other events at NAIT soften the blow of saying goodbye to summer.

However even the excitement of getting back to class can't mask the lingering sadness at one Edmonton school.

It was exactly two years ago Tuesday, that six year old Corrine Gustavson disappeared from outside her Rundle Park home. Her body was found two days later in a trucking yard. She had been sexually assaulted and smothered to death.

Corrine's abduction and death triggered one of the most intense investigations in Edmonton police history. Hundreds of leads were generated but no arrest was made.

Students and teachers at Eastwood Elementary - Junior High School haven't forgotten Corrine. The tiny tree planted there in her honor has many visitors. It's an everyday reminder of the horrible tragedy and her absence.

For a second year Corrine's family and friends gathered at her grave for a candlelight vigil. Time hasn't eased the pain or grief of losing her. Her mother Karen says they're still trying to put their lives back together. Corrine is greatly missed and thought about every day.

Hope of saving Corrine may have vanished but the hunt for her killer still continues. Homicide detectives Terry Alm and Al Sauve have investigated 5,000 tips to date and Corrine's case file remains hauntingly open waiting for an answer. The two men follow arrests made in other cities hoping for a connection to Corrine. But so far nothing.

Corrine has almost become "Edmonton's lost child". Her smiling face in her kindergarden grad gown and hat can be seen peering back from posters and signs all over the city. It's almost as if she's crying the headline which reads, "Somebody out there knows."

Her sad story has not only touched the hearts of Edmonton but North America as well. NBC's Unsolved Mysteries has aired a segment on Corrine twice in the past year. Hundreds of tips poured in from across the continent but nothing has panned out.

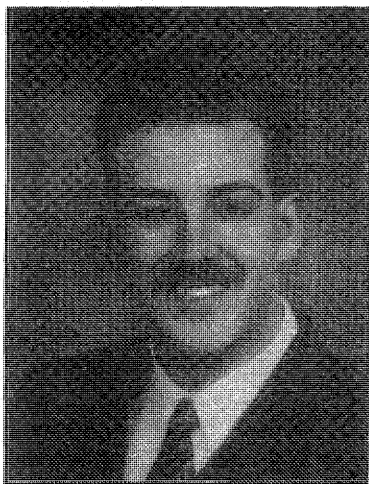

part of our summer representing you and planning events for the upcoming year.

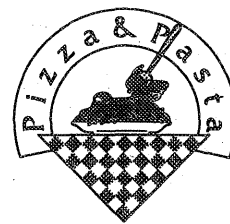

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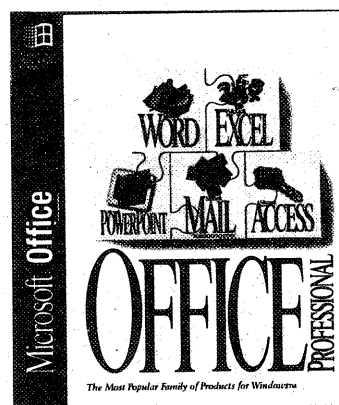
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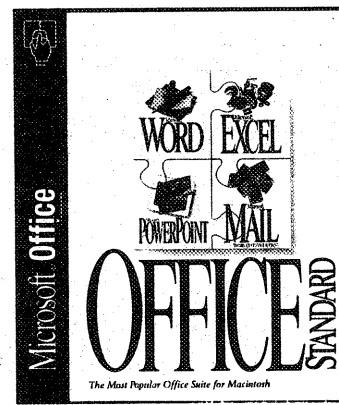
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Been There, Done That, Got the T-Shirt

Anyhow the crowd loved it all. At times it seemed as if many were amazed that the Stones had actually made it to town after

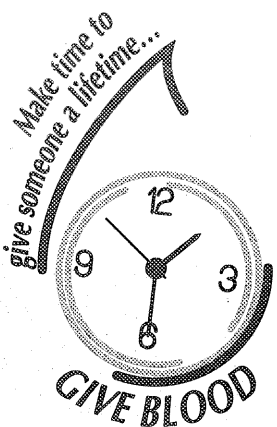
weeks of media hype. The Evil Twins were even heard saying between beers, "Hey that's the Stones! Cool eh?"
