Astronomy's Moment in the Sun

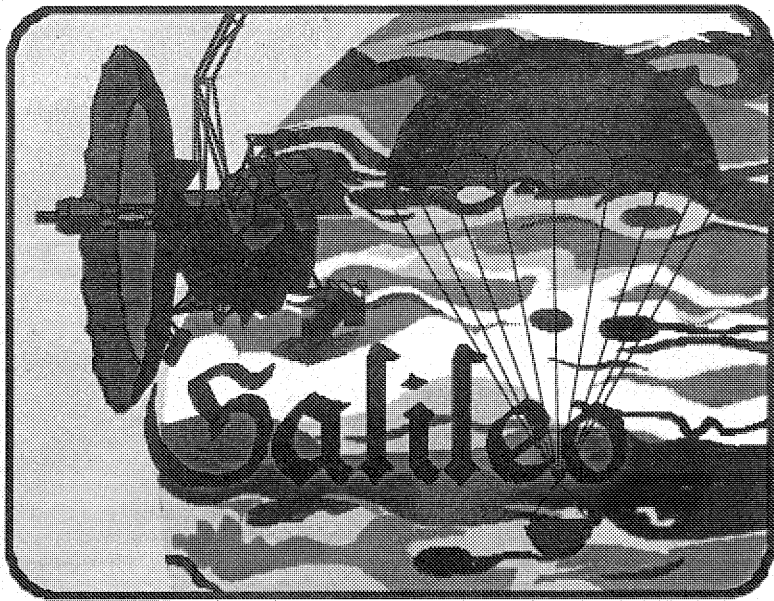

Hang tight, history could be in for a massive change. The Galileo spacecraft is scheduled to arrive at Jupiter today! Galileo is a two part deal. One part of it is the orbiter. The orbiter weighs about the same as a compact car. The other part of Galileo is the PROBE. The probe weighs the same as about 5 of your classmates scotch taped together. Galileo was launched from the space shuttle Atlantis back in October of 1989. It's 6 year mission was to travel 800 million kilometres to Jupiter.

The probe was split from the orbiter this past summer. The probe and the orbiter have been flying separate paths ever since. How much power does it take to run Galileo? The power Galileo operates on is not even enough to run your toaster.

The fun begins just before 4 p.m. Alberta time. That's when the probe will slam into Jupiter's atmosphere at a speed of about 170,000 km/hr. During this entry, the gas cap that burns in front of the probe will be as bright as the sun. The probe will also be twice as hot as the sun's surface. The probe better be tough! Within two minutes, it must decelerate from 170,000 km/hr to about 160 km/hr.

The point of the probe's mission is simple. It has to relay information on the structure and the composition of Jupiter. The probe should be able to transmit about 75 minutes worth of information to the orbiter. The probe will be destroyed after that, but the orbiter will still be on duty until the end of 1997. During the next two years, the orbiter will orbit around the solar system's largest planet and the moons of Jupiter as well.



How does Earth see the images? Galileo emits a radio signal. There are three antennas back on Earth that are spaced roughly equally around the globe. This ensures that at least one antenna can be in communication with Galileo at all times. The radio signal Galileo is sending back to Earth is very weak. It is even weaker than sitting at NAIT and trying

Owen says, "it's like opening a tube that has been sealed for 4.5 billion years."

Thank goodness we're not American taxpayers! The total cost of the Galileo mission is huge. From the planning stages in 1977, through to the end of the mission in 1997, the cost is estimated at just under \$1.4 billion. This price tag does not include launch costs, tracking costs (the three antennas), and foreign contributions. When you put the cost into perspective, it does not seem so bad. Galileo has cost each citizen of the U.S. only \$0.27 a year during its 20 year life.

All this is assuming everything runs smoothly. If the probe misses its precise 8 degree angle required to enter Jupiter's atmosphere, it will with skip off the planet, or simply burn into a pile of ashes. Good luck NASA!

ing to pick up a radio station being broadcast from Nova Scotia. The images are highly anticipated. Scientists feel the data could revolutionize our understanding of Jupiter and reveal important clues about the formation and evolution of the solar system. Astronomer Toby Owen agrees that Galileo's mission could unlock secrets of the solar system's creation. The astronomer sees Jupiter as "a giant ruin left over from events we hardly understand."

NAIT announces new academic structure

NAIT is changing its academic structure by introducing new academic schools.

The Executive Committee reviewed the recommendations of the Academic Management Team to come up with the new structure.

According to the Naitline, President of NAIT, Dr Stan Souch said, "We (Executive Committee) applaud the team's excellent work and have endorsed the recommendations with minor modifications."

Some of the Executive Committee's modifications to the recommended schools are as follows:

- Eight schools, along with Extension Services, will be established.

- One Dean will administer both the School of Hospitality and the School of Health Sciences.

The move from four divisions to eight schools was made to establish more homogeneous groupings of new programs. It is hoped that the new groupings will:

- Make it easier to share staff,

space, and equipment between schools.

- Make it easier for NAIT to promote itself to the community

- Enlarge fundraising opportunities by targeting organizations that are closely aligned with the schools.

"In making these changes we were striving to balance the size and complexity of the new schools while maintaining homogeneous groupings," Dr. Souch said, adding senior officials were unable to achieve an exact balance as the hospitality and health sciences are simply smaller groups, yet unique to themselves.

To facilitate the changeover, current Dean and Associate Dean positions will be abolished as of June 30, 1996. Those affected were given the option to: apply for the voluntary severance package, apply for the newly created positions or accept notice and severance pay. Newly created positions include Dean of a School (7), Consultant to the office of Vice-President Academic (3), Dean of Extension Services.

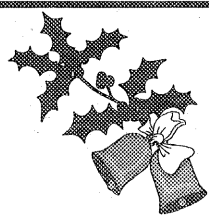

R U OK With UI?

Canada's new plan for unemployment insurance was presented last Friday. The Federal Government is trying to cushion the proposal by calling it an Employment Insurance (EI) system. The main reason for revamping the unemployment insurance program is the money. UI currently costs about 10 billion bucks each year to run. The government wants to cut this operating cost down to 8 billion dollars per year.

Human Resource Minister Lloyd Axworthy is the man behind the plan. Axworthy says the changes are about improving the system, not just saving money. EI's maximum pay out per person

would be cut \$140 per month. The government is hard at work trying to pitch the benefits of EI. Check the major newspapers and you'll find a half page add promoting the "move from Unemployment to Employment Insurance."

The government says EI will cover about half a million part-time workers for the first time. The plan would create a \$300 million fund which could in turn be used to stir up some economic activity along with new jobs. One highlight of the plan is that families

who make less than \$26,000 per year will be eligible for additional benefits. The government says every dollar earned would count if a claim was to be made. Not everyone is chipper about the proposed idea. Reform Leader Preston Manning says, "it's another case of the Liberal going a small step in the right direction but not far enough... it's far enough to make people mad... but not far enough to make a difference."

She never knew who Santa was, but her boys did not wake-up to a disappointing empty stocking on Christmas morning.

Most people don't have to be told

the cold facts about poverty in Canada. Most of us are already aware of how severe life can be for some people, especially this year with the cuts to the welfare rolls.

But, many of us put these cold facts to the back of their minds and continue on as if these people and

these problems do not exist.

There are ways you can make a difference to less fortunate children and their parents at Christmas time.

It's the Christmas season again and the University of Alberta Engineering students gave their faculty a gift of \$50 each per year.

It happened through a referendum held last month in which one thousand of 2,400 students voted, which received approval of 85.3%.

At their present levels of enrollment this could generate about \$120,000 annually and enable the facility to renew one or two labs per year. This would provide U of A students the opportunity to learn techniques on current equipment as lab experience is an essential part of any education.

Presently, NAIT maintains its equipment through donations by employers and capital that is raised through various campaigns co-

ordinated by the NAIT Foundation. Although NAIT has managed to remain as current as possible in equipment and technology it has available to teach with, NAIT could benefit from a program such as the one just instituted by the U of A Engineering students.

It would be nice to see the individual student groups implement a grad class gift-giving program.

A program like this would see graduates donate an amount of money (say \$50 per graduate) to purchase or update the equipment in their programs. By donating the money at grad, the students would have an opportunity to thank the institute, instructors, and program for

the education they received and choose what their donation is put towards. This could then be marked with a plaque stating who donated the equipment leaving a memento of their year.

As a future grad, it's important that NAIT remains one of the leading technical institutes in Canada, because regardless of what year you graduated and how good NAIT was back then, it's always the current reputation of the institute that employers base their opinion on.

The Word of a Woman

It's the women I've come for. You're all fucking feminists. I'm against feminism. That's why I'm here.

Those were his words, spoken in a quiet voice.

They were the last words ever heard by fourteen young women engineering students before they died, shot by a 22-year-old man who also wounded nine

other women and four men during his semi-automatic rifle rampage through the halls of the University of Montreal on December 6, 1989. His final act was to kill himself.

Newspaper and television reports carried the details. They seemed familiar; we read similar versions of the same story so often. He had purchased the rifle legally because he had no criminal or psychiatric record — no record despite numerous complaints by women neighbours and former girlfriends about his bizarre, sometimes threatening behavior. He was addicted to such combat magazines as *Soldier of Fortune*, to pornography, to movies about terrorism. He loved hanging around gun shops, talking with the boys. He was wearing combat fatigues when he went on his gynecidal spree.

The three page letter found on his body was virulent with misogyny: females were to blame for everything that had gone wrong in his life — for his inability to graduate from college, his loss of various jobs, his failure to gain admittance to gradu-

ate school, the breakups of his friendships or romantic relationships with women. The letter also contained an "enemies list" of fifteen prominent Quebec women, presumably potential targets. Many of these women had not characterized themselves as feminists. But then, neither had most of the slaughtered students. That didn't matter.

They were women: they were prey. They endangered men: they must be destroyed.

Honorable men find such violent attitudes and acts appalling. The guy in the street phones in to radio talkback shows. The psychologist and sociologists write articles, initiate studies, give press conferences, issue quotes. And a further violence is wreaked — by precisely such honorable men. It is the violence of denial, evasion, collaboration. Every possible analysis of the massacre is promulgated — except that based on the spoken and written words of the gunman, Marc Lepine, himself.

Because Lepine was half Algerian, some of these gentlemen use the occasion to Arab-bash ("They're all so violent, you know."). Because he hadn't graduated college, some cite class resentment as his motive (although it was his own uneven scholastic record that failed him). Because the rifle had been manufactured in the United States, the importation of such products — and

of "American violence" — can be deplored (as if Canada had no home-grown misogyny). Because the victims were women training for nontraditional jobs, there are the predictable sighs and pronouncements that "this is what happens when women refuse to stay home and have babies." Because his background included a "broken" home and battery, heads can be shaken over "the demise of the family" amid condemnations of abstract violence. Because he was raised by a woman, his "craziness" must be a reaction to her (when in doubt, blame mothers).

Why is it again left to women to notice a certain pattern evident in the

facts of the case, a pattern the honorable men in their rush to self-serving judgment conveniently ignore? The "broken" home should have been broken; it was a violent home, and the violence was not abstract, but specifically paternal. The father, Rachid Gharbi, tyrannized and battered his wife and two children for years — until the wife managed to divorce him and he returned to Algeria. That wife, Monique Lepine, reclaimed her name, raised both children on her own, became a nurse, and worked hard to support her family, even returned to school for a further degree so as to earn a better salary and improve their lot.

In the transcript from her divorce hearing, she had testified that Gharbi repeatedly and unashamedly insisted women were not the equals of men, but were born to serve men. The son was seven years old when the father he so feared left; nevertheless he learned his lesson well. His father's attitude overshadowed the different context in which his mother tried to raise him. Because, subtle or blatant, that attitude was and is reinforced by the entire surrounding patriarchal culture.

Feminism. Yawn. Surely this is the "post-feminist" era, isn't it? Isn't the women's movement dead yet? How those damned women do yammer on about her marginal neurotic complaints.

Once more then. With feeling. Because these "marginal" issues are about the majority of the human species, which happens to be female.

In North America, one out of three women will be raped; two-thirds of all women are victims of battering; a woman is raped every three seconds, beaten every fifteen seconds; one out of every four women experiences sexual abuse before age eighteen; nine out of ten endure sexual harassment at their schools or jobs. Two-thirds of the world's illiterates are female; women and children comprise ninety percent of all refugee populations and eighty percent of all poverty populations. One-third of all families on Earth are women-headed. Less than a third of all women have access to contraceptive information or devices, and more than half have no trained help during pregnancy and childbirth. Complications from pregnancy, childbirth, and abortion — which kill more than half a million women per

year — are the leading cause of death among women of reproductive age. With non pregnancy-related reproductive tract infections (RTIs) factored in, the death toll rises to more than a million, with another 100 million women maimed each year. Women are one-third of the world's formal labor force, but receive only one-tenth of world income and own less than one percent of world property. Outside the formal labor force — whether as homemaker, prostitute, nun, fuel-gatherer, water-hauler, farmer, or domestic servant — women's work is regarded as unskilled, marginal, transient, or simply "natural," and is invisible in the Gross Domestic Product accounting of virtually all nations. Nowhere does the work of reproduction of the species itself count as "productive activity."

This is violence.

So is the practice of *sati* — the forced "suicide" of a widow on her husband's funeral pyre — still prevalent, though outlawed, in the subcontinent of India. So is female infanticide, still practiced, though

illegal, in China. So are the practices of bride sale, child marriage, polygyny, abandonment, genital mutilation, and gratuitous hysterectomies; so is the two-sided coin of forced concealment in *purdah* and forced exposure in pornography. *Continued on page 6...*

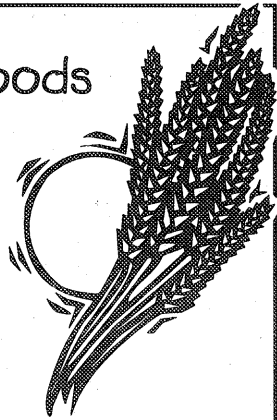

So is the denial of two basic human rights — reproductive freedom and freedom of sexual choice — to women by fundamentalists of all major patriarchal religions.

Feminism. Yawn. But that's why there's still a women's movement, now worldwide, and growing.

The classroom doors of Montreal University's engineering school have glass panels. When Lepine

ushered all males out of the room and then shut the door, the men stood in the corridor. No one ran for help. After shooting the first women, he had to pause to empty and refill his rifle magazine. The male teacher and male students did not open the door and rush him, though they were many and he was one. None of them made a move. *They watched him through the glass panel.*

This is violence.

Professor Elliot Leyton, a Canadian expert on mass murders, was quoted as saying, "this is one of the very few mass-murder cases I know of in which women were specifically targeted." The brain reels. Jack the Ripper? Richard Speck? Theodore Bundy?

This is violence.

Canadian feminists tried to point out the obscenity of such erasure, such collaboration by analysis. Day

after day, they mobilized, massing with pink armbands outside the Montreal cathedral at the victims' funeral, marching on the universities. Night after night, they consoled each other the way women do, by talking and weeping. They telephoned their sisters south of the border, and we phoned them, in shock at the capacity of most men to externalize the Marc Lepines as "other," to deny the commonality of masculinist aggression, to refuse acknowledgment of the banality of sexism, the pervasiveness of woman-hatred, the continuum of violence that creates a normality of terrorism in most women's daily lives.

As women do, we try to make sense of it through understanding, through "womanly compassion." A young woman lying in the hospital with her face half shot away murmurs that she'd like to forgive him, go forward, encourage other women to do the same. An older woman mourning her murdered daughter comments sadly that it does no good to hate, that Lepine was "a poor sick boy." Another bereaved mother says, "I can't help but think of his mother. She must be suffering so." This is the human spirit reaching across... grief to embrace commonality, not disavow it.

At such moments, every woman, whether she calls herself a feminist or not, shudders with fear and rage. At such moments, every woman secretly wonders why men hate women so. At such moments, every woman desperately reminds herself that men of conscience do exist, that there are men who actively reject the connection between violence and manhood.

But the honorable men make that difficult. The Quebec premier, M. Robert Bourassa, refused women's petitions to close the legislature and

universities on the day of the funerals. Such a day of official mourning was only called for, he claimed, "when someone important to the State had died."

Why, this is violence, nor are we out of it.

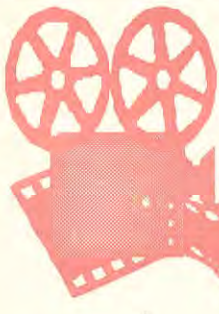

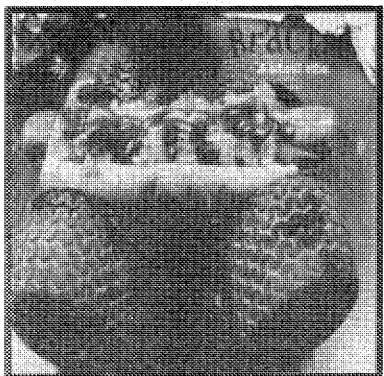

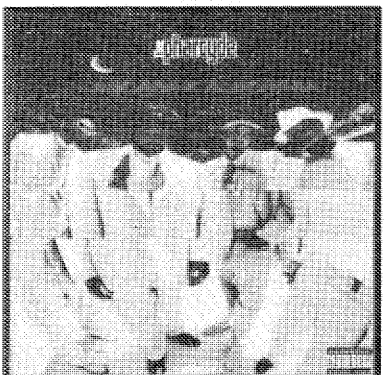
Tattoo Rodeo "Skin"

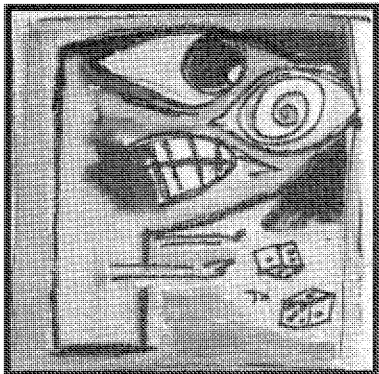
Bracket "4-wheel Vibe"

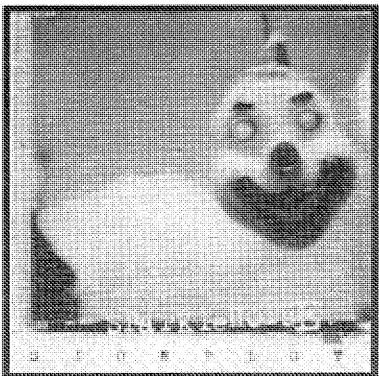
The Pharcyde "LABCABIN CALIFORNIA"
