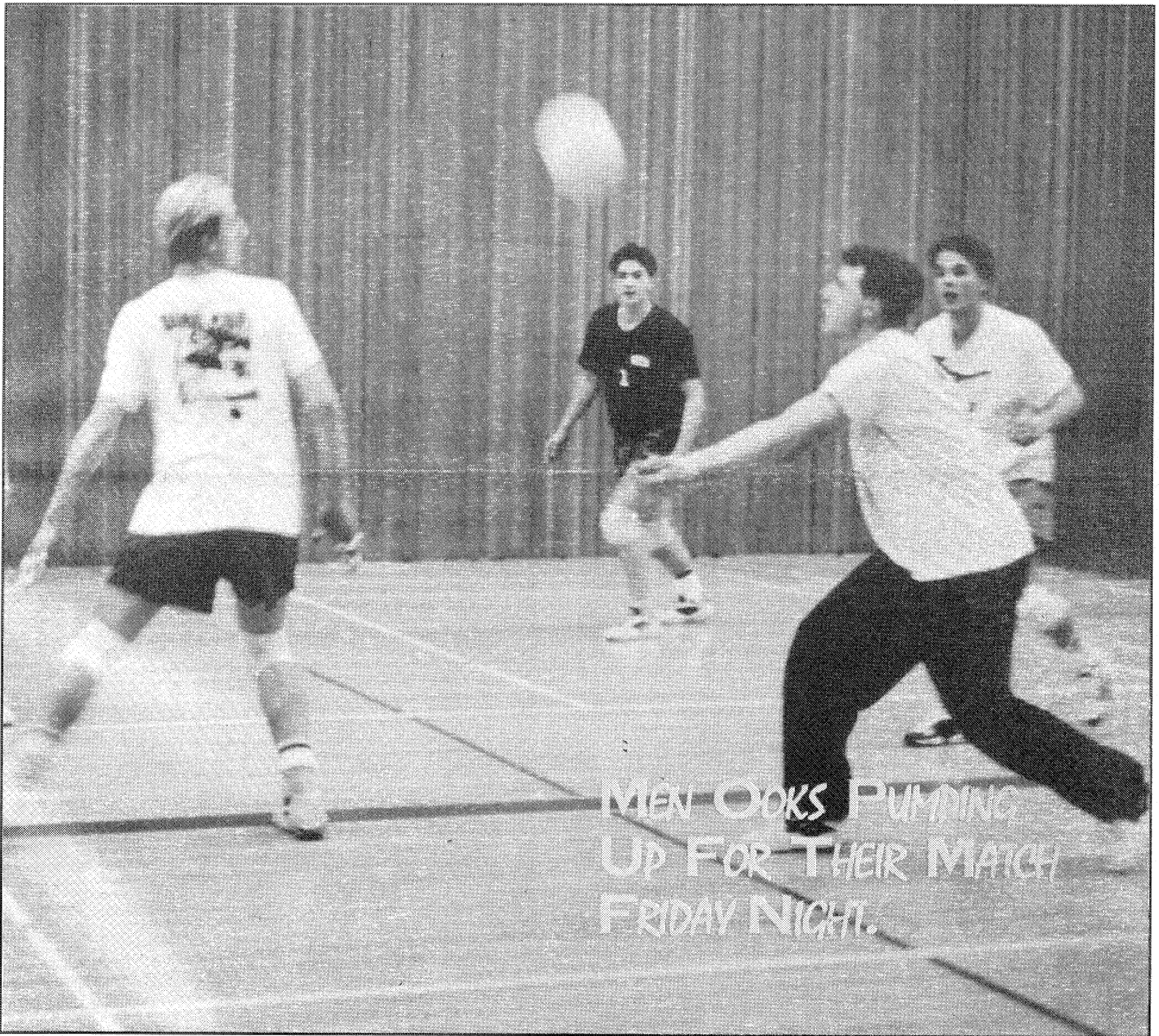

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Pro-life Turns Pro-Vigilante

As the debate over legalized abortion continues, it seems that the Pro-life contingent of the argument, or at least extremists of this side of the debate, are tired of talking. They are starting to take action in the form of violence and mayhem. In recent months, there has been an increasing trend in violence against abortion clinic workers and clientele.

One of these acts of terrorism include Florida state anti-abortionist Paul Hill. Just previous to the holidays Paul Hill was found guilty of murder in the first degree of a Pensacola, Florida abortion doctor and one of his assistants. Mr. Hill admitted to firing nine rounds from a shotgun, through a truck window, killing the doctor, his assistant and seriously wounding the doctor's wife. During the trial, Paul Hill refused legal representation, made no arguments,

called no witnesses on his behalf, and offered no defense. His only explanation was that he felt he was right in doing what he did. He is currently awaiting sentencing. As Florida does have the death sentence available, prosecution is strongly pressing for it in this case.

Another example of this blossoming aggression happened on December 30th, when a man entered an abortion clinic in Brooklyn, Mass. and started a shooting spree. When the smoke has settled, two receptionists of the clinic were dead and five other people were wounded. The accused gunman is a 22 year old student hairdresser, name John Salvi. He was due to go on trial January 9th.

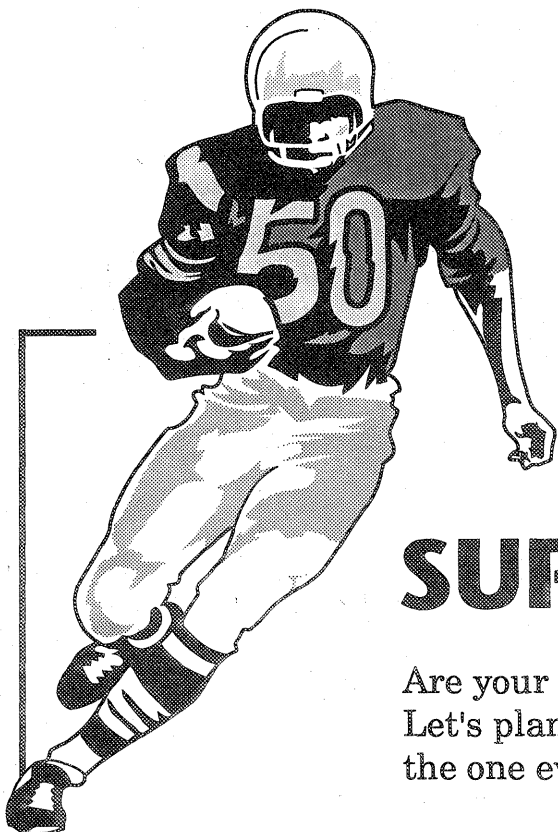
Here in Canada, this past weekend, a Delta, B.C. police officer was placed under investiga-

tion for using Canada's National Police computer system to look up pro-choice activist's, clinic workers and clinic patient's home addresses. He would use their vehicle license plate numbers to retrieve the sought after information, and then pass it on to anti-abortion

activists. In his off-hours, Constable Steve Parker was until recently the treasurer for Campaign Life Coalition of B.C.

While the ethical

and moral battle over abortions continues to escalate on a regular basis, this recent wave of vigilantism can only be seen as nothing more than another form of terrorism. It is more unnecessary violence in a world that sees too much crime, inequality, and destruction already. One can only hope that before too many more people get hurt, that killing people in the abortion clinics stops and the Pro-Life/Pro-choice debate returns to yelling and campaigning as a medium for its fight.



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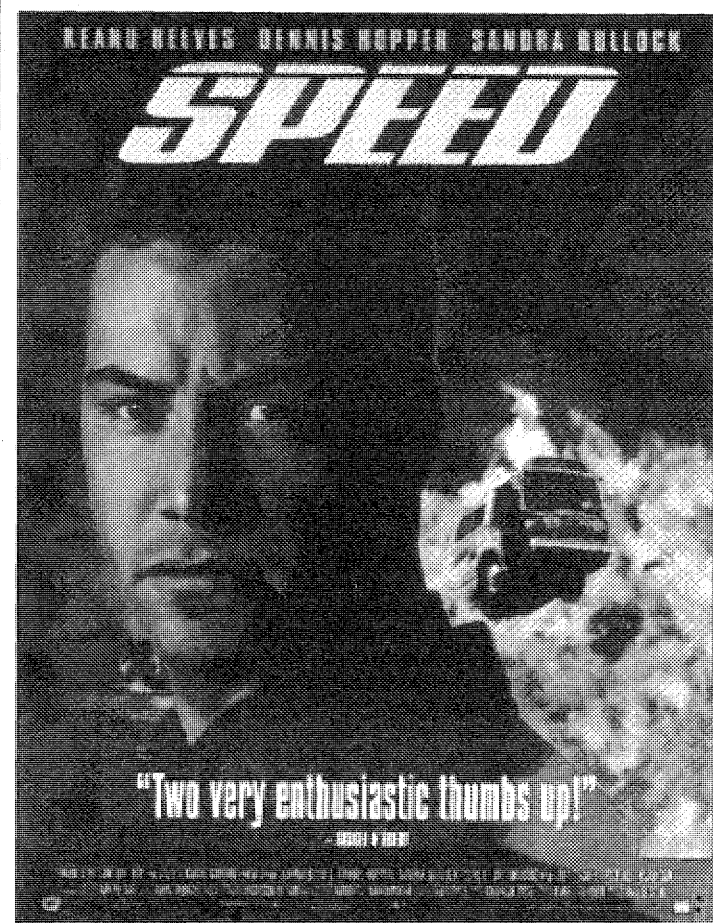
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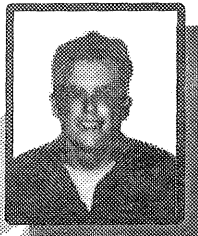

At 9 p.m. on Monday night two men held up two female NAIT bookstore employees. Walking down a hallway on their way to cash-out, the women were approached by the pair who proceeded to push the workers up against a wall and said, "This is a robbery and we're not kidding."

Staff Sgt. Ken Ogilvie said,

"Each of them was carrying a cash tray, and they were accosted in the hallway by these men, who had neck-warmers pulled up, partially covering the lower portions of their faces."

City police Monday night were looking for two white males in their early 20's.

In the past, three added Commissionaires were hired to walk the women to their destination, however recent budget cutbacks

eliminated the extra guards entirely. The women were walking alone.

No weapons were produced, however a source said that one of the women may have seen a gun, but wasn't sure.

With the current volume in the Bookstore, the amount of money at closing is much larger than normal. The two robbers took off with "a significant amount of money," Ogilvie said.

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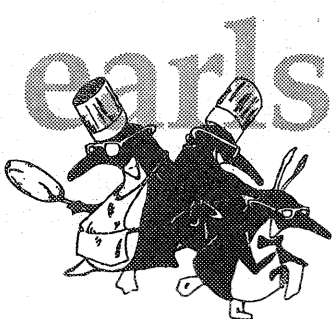
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Star Trek VII Generations

The ASET Technical-Education (TEC-ED) program was developed through an interest in obtaining evening courses to lead to a P. Eng. designation through APEGGA examinations or a Bachelor of Science degree from a university. The TEC-ED program is very flexible in many aspects. Members may enrol in the program only to take one or two courses, or they may choose to participate in all the courses to achieve a B. Sc. and/or a P. Eng. designation.

Phase 1 of the TEC-ED program encompasses the courses that are required for all engineering disciplines. These courses will be the primary courses considered by the TEC-ED committee. Phase 2 (specific-to-discipline courses) may be completed in three different ways: a) evening courses at the university (if available); b) APEGGA examination route to receive a P. Eng. without a B. Sc.; or c) full-time attendance in the faculty of engineering at the university.

Most employers are supportive of this initiative, since it allows their employees the opportunity to upgrade themselves and improve their knowledge and skills on a part-time continuing education basis.

The TEC-ED program lends itself well to the need for ASET members to continue their education on an on-going basis while allowing individuals to meet their commitment to this type of education as set out in the ASET Code of Ethics.
