PAROLE STILL A GOOD IDEA?

Headlines such as "Parole System Under Fire" are leaving a bad taste in Canadians' mouths. What is so wrong about our system that we have yet to spend \$10 million on a study about their problems? Are we releasing convicts who we "strongly feel could be a danger to the public"? Yes, I think so. And now comes the question: Why?

The 23 year old Surrey, BC woman who was abducted from the tanning salon which she managed is still missing. Her suspected abductor is no longer at large after being found dead in a garage full of carbon monoxide. Fernand Auger, 37, was found Sunday near High River after committing suicide in a garage of a vacant house. Melanie Carpen-

ter, 23, has been missing since Jan. 6th.

Since 1975, Auger has been involved in crimes ranging from sexual to firearms offenses to armed robberies. He was arrested in April 1993 for the armed robbery of an Esso gas station in Calgary. He was convicted of the crime and sentenced to two years in prison.

When Auger applied for parole in Nov. '93 the board refused to grant him on the grounds that he was too dangerous to the public to be released, and was at high risk to re-offend. But when he had served two-thirds of his sentence (16 months) he was released, walking away from Bowden Institution last August.

The conditions for Auger's parole was mandatory supervision by a parole officer once every week. He lived up to those conditions until earlier this month when he failed to report. Then the abduction.

What we have here is a question. Why are we letting prisoners free, who have been convicted of violent crimes, and who are "considered to be at a high risk to re-offend"? I'm thinking common-sense has to come into the picture at some point. Now the parole board can't be completely responsible for this one because he did serve the mandatory two-thirds, but he still should not have been released.

These situations are happening too frequently in Canada. Prisoners are going free on early release and then re-offending soon afterwards. We have to start paying closer attention to criminals with violent histories or the trend will continue.

Supporters of "early-release programs" will say that we save millions of dollars with these systems in place. We let 'em go a little early and we save money that could be spent in much better places. Melanie Carpenter's parents are willing to pay \$50,000 to have their daughter back home. I have little doubt they would give anything to have used the money to keep Auger in prison, and have Melanie home where she belongs.

This past Sunday was the birthday of one of the greatest people to ever set foot upon this pitiful planet. Dr. Martin Luther King would have been 66 years old today if he was still alive. (Obviously he would have to be alive...I have never understood why people find that they need to include that "if he were alive" I'm sure everyone understands that....but that's another editorial.)

Every year on the 15th of January I read over his famous "I have a dream" speech and am filled with wonder and awe every time. This speech moves me like nothing else every has. His preaching voice plays over in my head as I read over the words "Let freedom ring" and I am on my

feet, my heart beating 180 times a minute when he ends up with "Free at last...Free at last...Thank God Almighty...Free at last!"

This speech is so powerful and moving, and at the same time saddening. How far have we come? Pretty far? Far enough, for some? Hardly moved? I believe that we have moved, but not far enough. Everyday I read in the paper about violence, and I remember my psychology instructor once told me something, now I think about it everytime I read about violence. He would say that when we picture a crime being committed, do we visualize it as being a black man committing these crimes, or a white man?

He told me that the majority of people almost always think that it is the black man doing these evil things. Why? I know that a big part of that is how black people are portrayed in movies and television. If you see a crime being committed, 8 times out of 10 it is a black person doing it. Making black people as a whole look like they haven't quite climbed out of the 10th century is dangerous. But then they turn off the movie and turn on the news and watch the news. The L.A. Riots are a perfect example of this stereotyping. I have this theory and if you will indulge me, I'll try to explain it to you.

In America, the land of the free, and the home of homeless,

they are still doing experiments. Imagine, if you can, that you are a scientist, and upon discovering that you have a "lower species", you want to study him. You dress them up, teach them to speak, rub baking powder into their eyes, but still you want to do more. How will they react to each other? So you build cheap massive housing units in one section of town that has no source of income, and put too many people in this area. How would you react if the city of Edmonton was suddenly reduced to three apartment complexes and all the jobs took off? Imagine life like this for decades, wouldn't you go insane? The government of the United States has been performing these "experiments" on black people for decades. They may have been granted freedom, but many are still the slaves of a government run by white males.

Do you know another name for experiment? Think about the name of where people in the ghettos of Los Angeles live. Give up? Projects. That's what they are. Government projects to study how these people will react to one another. Now it has become a stewing pot of anger and rage... and it is understandable. How far have we come? Our own Canada has a lot to be desired when treating other races. Natives, for example, our predominately in the news almost everyday now. "Who let them off the reservation?" I heard

someone speak when a group of Aboriginal people held a sit in. Are we any better than the States when it comes to dealing with a group of people that no-one wants to deal with? They have projects, and we have reservations. We give them money to do nothing and stay quiet. Give them access to alcohol and hope that they never wake up. Well, they are waking up. What do we do now? Do we give them more money? Should we stop giving them money? I don't have the answers, if I did I wouldn't be here that's for sure. If I had the answers I'd be in Denmark right now. This is a time for change, and it is causing people to re-evaluate their beliefs and ideas. Change is scary, but necessary. If we don't change now, we may never, and that would be disastrous beyond belief. One of my favorite thoughts that I tell myself everyday comes from my favorite movie. "A man needs new experiences or something sleeps inside of him and seldom awakens. The sleeper must awaken." We, as a people, as a world, have been asleep far too long. We need to wake up from the MTV unconsciousness that has engulfed us all. We need to find a solution to our problems or the riots in the city of Lost Angels may soon be pale compared to the upheaval that will happen.

How far have we come again?

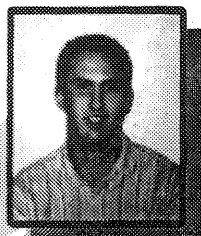

ANIMAL RIGHTS ACTIVISTS GOING WILD

After all the recent uproar following the transplanting of Alberta Wolves to the United States, I realized I had better say something.

How about, "Get a brain people!!" Does that just about cover it?

The trend towards Animal Rights Idiocy (I'm sorry, I meant Activity) lately boggles my mind. Is it such a big deal that Alberta Fish and Wildlife officials and U.S. Fish and Game biologists are moving a few wolves from here to there that everyone needs to get bent out of shape? According to Alberta Fish and Wildlife, Alberta has 60-100 wolves in its southern areas, and over 6,000 in its northern wilds. So they aren't an endangered species here in our great province.

Why not help out our neighbors to the south?

Activists opposed to the move, argue that it is cruel to pull the animals out of their habitat and move them. Should we, perhaps, ask the wolves for permission next time? Or how about we send them a thirty day eviction notice? Get real. The biologists aren't beating them, or using them for weird genetic experiments. They are merely re-locating them. So relax, please.

Animal rights activists have been getting on my nerves more and more lately. Just before Christmas, Vancouver Safeway and Save-On Food outlets were forced to get rid of thousands of

As of now, NAIT Student Association has worked out a deal with MCA Records Canada, and HMV in Kingsway Garden Mall. This new deal is a win/win situation for NAIT staff and students. It incorporates savings on CD's, hot new music for The Nest and advertised specials in The Nugget. Curious as to how this all falls into place? Here's how it works.

Instructor Morale Low at NAIT? Why?

What's wrong at NAIT? Certain staff seem to think that they are being hit hardest in the Alberta Government's bid to reduce Provincial budgets. Yes, NAIT has been affected (21% over 3 years) and everyone at NAIT has felt the effects of severe grant reductions, but let's move on and make the best of it.

Students pay good money for their education at NAIT and shouldn't be the object of this negativity. Classrooms are for student instruction not for instructors to carry on about how budget cuts have increased their work load and how NAIT Administration doesn't seem to care and won't listen to them.

Why can't the NASA (NAIT Academic Staff Association) and NAIT's Administration work posi-

tively on collective agreements and budget reductions? Where does C.Q.I. fit in the picture?

NAIT adopted C.Q.I. in and it has worked it's way into the classroom. C.Q.I. is also present in certain curriculum at NAIT, therefore, some instructors even teach it. As student leaders, we've adopted C.Q.I. and put it to use. We've worked positively with NAIT Administration and the Alberta Government on tuition fees and balancing the budget, why can't NASA? Why doesn't the staff association practise the principles of C.Q.I.?

AUPE (Alberta Union of Provincial Employees) and NAIT came to a collective agreement in 3 days of bargaining last summer. How? As positively and constructively as possible. AUPE under-

stood that they would have to cut salaries and positions so NAIT could achieve a balanced budget. The result was a 4.9% salary rollback, as few jobs as possible lost and an agreement that affected the least number of people.

Don't take me wrong, I'm not supporting AUPE or NAIT, I'm just trying to be rational. The NASA vs NAIT war is now starting to take its toll on students at NAIT. Funny as it may sound, our situation resembles the recent NHL strike. Look what that little fiasco has done for the leagues image and relations between players (NASA), owners (NAIT Administration) and the fans (students). The players and owners bargained the same way NAIT and NASA did, no trust, no cooperation, no compromise, and

no rational thinking by either the players or NASA.

Maybe NASA could look at more constructive ways of using their energy. Take a look at NAITSA, we try and do things to increase school spirit and boost morale for students, possibly NASA could try something similar for it's members.

I guess the final question I want to ask as a representative of the students at NAIT is, "What can we do as students to increase morale at NAIT?" Please let me know. We have a suggestion box just outside the NAITSA office (E133) or feel free to drop in and see me.

Civil Sleddin' for Pride

Inter-national pride is on the line. 6 NAIT students and staff left Wednesday for Montreal to race against about 50 other teams in The Great North American Toboggan Race.

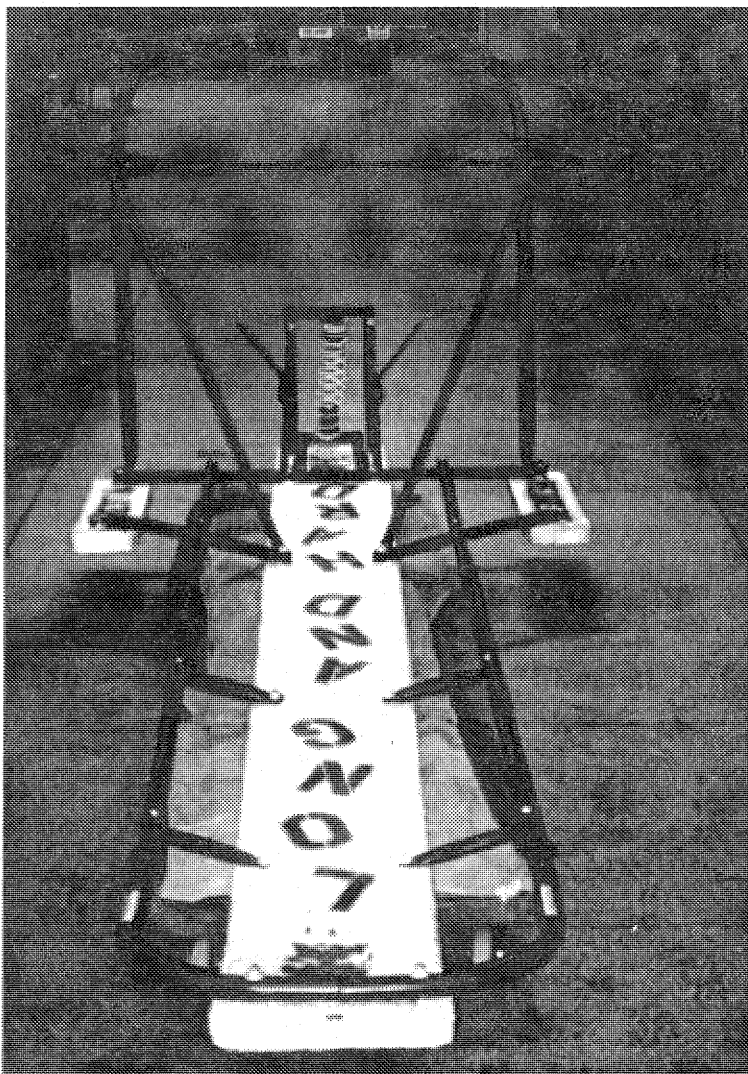
On January 20th, the "Alberta Rednecks" will be in Sherbrooke, Que. to compete in the annual event, which has been held in Canada since 1975.

Riding a sled the team designed themselves, the group will head straight down a snow-covered hill at speeds upwards of 60 km/h. Teams will be judged on speed, sled design, braking ability and rider's enthusiasm.

But here's the kicker. The toboggan must be made of concrete. Each team is challenged to design and build a top-performance, concrete toboggan weighing 135 kg. "What our guys have done is try to spread the 135 kg, plus the weight of the riders, over an area that will best glide over snow," said Ivan Gramlich, NAIT Civil Engineer Instructor.

The group collected \$4500 from Edmonton and area sponsors.

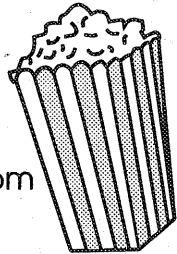

Suspect Two is described as:

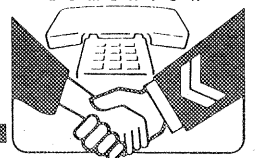
- approximately 6' tall White male

Looks like we haven't been lynched by the Country & Western fanatics yet; we're back for another issue! This week I'll be looking at Weezer's self-titled album, their first commercial release.

Hey - you got lucky: I had to run my ear across the new Eagle's CD, *Hell Freezes Over*, and after listening to this reunion album, my theory has been reinforced...

Germans love David Hasselhoff?

No, simpleton, the only good thing to come out of The Eagles was Joe Walsh's solo career.

Although Don Henley's *I Can't Stand Still* wasn't half bad.

Yes, but Glenn Frey better pray NBC brings back *Miami Vice* to give HIS solo career a forum (anyone remember *Smuggler's Blues*?). With regards to *Hell Freezes Over*, if you're an Eagles fan, and have fond memories of that schmaltzy soft rock that almost killed FM radio in the 70's, you probably already have this permanently mounted in your pickup truck. The CD contains four new studio tracks, including *Get Over It*, which gets my award for the most overplayed single of 1994. Weezer, on the other hand, is on the leading edge of the new wave of pop/punk that we talked about last week. Their unforgettable video for *Buddy Holly* is getting massive air play on both MuchMusic and MTV - and deservedly so. It was directed by Spike Jonze, and features a recreation of Al's Drive-In from Happy Days.

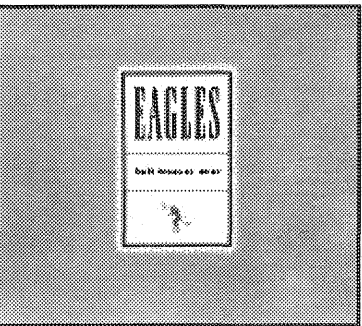
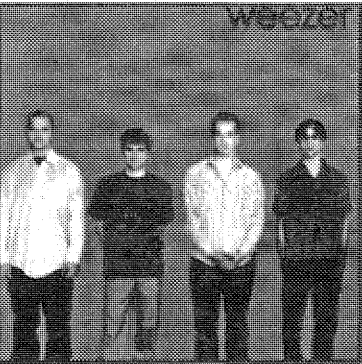
Jonze also directed The Breeder's *Cannonball*, and my 1994 favorite, *Sabotage* from the Beastie Boys.

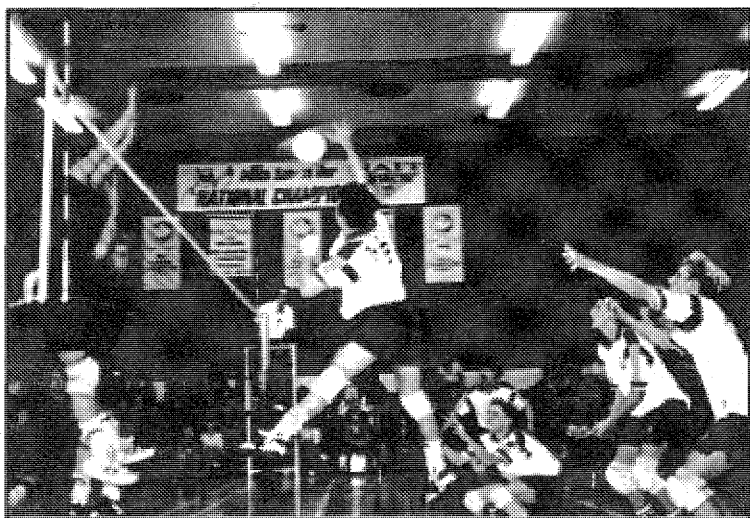

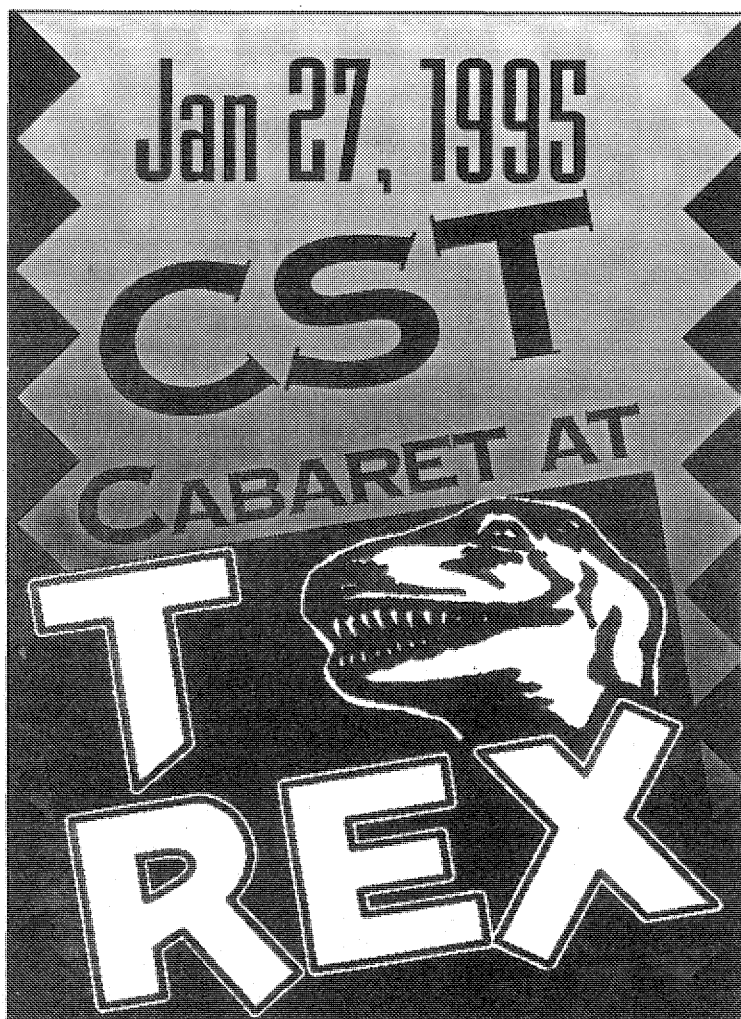


Lee Letawsky, game announcer by night, "kill man" by day. Excellent job guys!

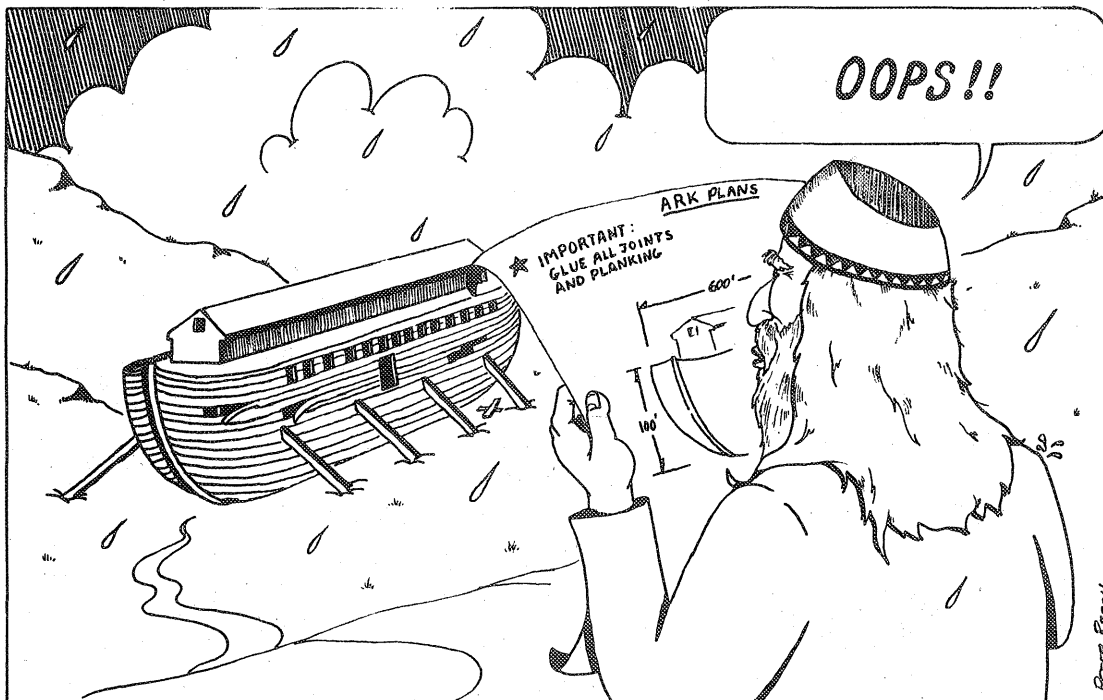

On Thursday, the Oaks scored three specialty team goals in the third period to record a 4-2 come-from-behind victory over the Thunder at the Agricom.


In the first, the teams traded goals with Darryl Romano open-
