A team of Instrumentation students are off to Vancouver this weekend. They are competing in the Western Canadian "Reach for the Top" competition. NAIT held Edmonton's competition this year at Open House. Two teams from NAIT competed in a two part competition. The first part was a practical. The ISA bowl is part two. Sponsored by the International Society for Measurement Control, winning the ISA bowl was the ticket to Vancouver. For the bowl instructor Sheldon Weatherby said, "Students had to troubleshoot a ladder diagram as well as level a control loop by calibrating instruments and connect wiring to make it functional."

This weekend's competition is located at the British Columbia Institute of Technology. Teams attending include NAIT, BCIT and SAIT.

The winner of the Western Canadian's will have the opportunity to compete in the World competition in October in New Orleans. NAIT won the competition last year, the first time it entered the competition. The winners receive the KA District 10 trophy as well as other prizes. The World champions also received \$3000 last year for their efforts.

This year's team consists of second year instrumentation students Troy Robillard, James Churchill, Peter Hamlett, Mike Perron and alternate Trent.

The incoming Vice President Activities is on his way out. Frank Angotti is finished.

The decision was made by the NAITSA Election Committee Tuesday morning after a complaint was lodged against him last Thursday. Angotti was charged with breaking an election rule which states, "Campaigning will end at 4:30 p.m. on the day prior to the Election Day." The committee determined Angotti deliberately made his presence known near NAITSA polling stations on Election Day. Some of the polling stations in question were the main lobby, plaza two and the NAITSA station.

The committee consisting of Chief Returning Officer Mike Bitz, NAITSA President Dean Andres and three volunteer General Council representatives met at 7:00 Monday and Tuesday morning.

Bitz said they interviewed approximately 10 people. Two of these people were Radio and Television students. Adam Smith and Dena Gillies were asked probing questions concerning election day. The panel was specifically interested in their contact with the newly elected Activities VP, Frank Angotti. They saw Angotti leaving the meeting as they arrived. Apparently Angotti was seen several times at polling stations on election day. The Radio students were assigned to cover the election by an instructor. They interviewed Angotti and said they did not notice anything wrong with his conduct. The panel asked for a copy of the taped interview. As the students did not put the interview on the air they also erased the tape.

Scott Fediow the second in line for the VP Activities position is the new VP Activities. As there were only two candidates, Fediow was immediately appointed. He is also the person that lodged the complaint against Angotti. He said, "I did put in a complaint last Thursday over some NAITSA election rules." According to Fediow he lost the position by merely eighteen votes. He said he had witnesses to back him up including ex-news editor Neil Feser.

Fediow said, "It hasn't sunk in yet but I'm excited I guess." He also said the overturn is, "unfortunate for Frank."

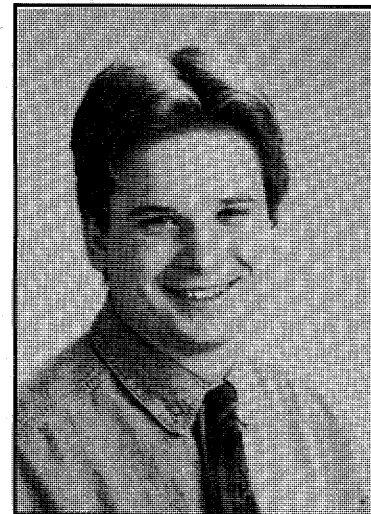
Angotti has no recourse to being disqualified even though he did not admit to campaigning.

In fact Angotti says the decision is unfair. He says, "I can justify and I can promise anyone. I did not campaign or talk to anyone about my campaign on Election Day."

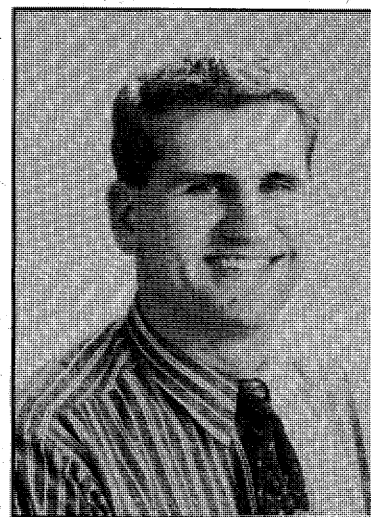
He went on to say that it would have been better to have a by-election after his disqualification rather than immediately appointing another candidate. "I believe in having a by-election and I should have the option of running again." Angotti is thinking about writing a petition for a by-election and presenting it before General Council.

Angotti also requested The Nugget mention he would like anyone with questions regarding his opinion about what happened to contact him at the BAS office at 471-7873.

The decisions of the Election Committee are final. Chief Returning Officer Bitz says the committee functioned "as good as it possibly could."

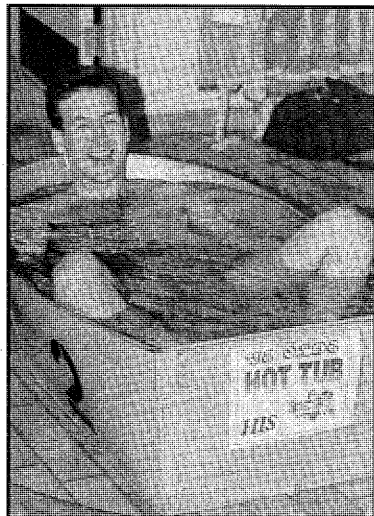

Projectionist Speaks Out

Curt Yano is a Bio-Medical Engineering student at NAIT. Yano is also a member of the Alberta Projectionist Union, and has been for 10 years. Curt Yano feels that the projectionists have received a bad rap during the Famous Players projectionists lock-out.

Yano feels there are a few facts that need be brought out before a person takes sides on the Famous Players lockout. Famous Players want the projectionists to take a 60-67% wage rollback and eliminate "guaranteed hours". To Yano and the Projectionists Union this is a message, and that message is "you're fired". Yano feels that this is an attempt to bust the Projectionist Union and replace them with untrained, unqualified personnel.

The claim by Famous Players that "operating a projector is simple" is both true and false according to Yano. Yano admits that feeding the film and getting it started is relatively simple and could be taught to someone in a short time. But what people don't understand is that the repairs and preventative maintenance that a projectionist must make cannot be taught to some one in a short time. Yano himself has 1200 apprenticeship hours as a journeyman projectionist. Also if a person looked at a manual explaining the workings of a projection machine they would be looking at a book 2 inches thick.

Curt Yano doesn't see Famous Players as having anything but the almighty dollar in mind. "What Famous Players is doing is sacrificing the quality of the movie going experience". According to Yano, a movie is a \$30 venture for a couple. They are paying \$16 just to get in the door. If the sound or picture is interrupted people are not getting their money's worth.

Famous Players is owned by Viacom, a huge multi-million corporation. According to Yano, this American company is trying to bring in the American work policy. That being cut costs at all costs no

they were re-certified as technicians during the Getty administration. This was not to last long however, because when the Klein government took power the projectionists were once more de-certified. The reasoning for this de-certification according to Yano was that their employers did not sanction it. And this Yano feels was because it gave projectionist employers more leverage over their employees.

Yano feels that Famous Players has a leg up when it comes to influencing the public. Ads in the Journal stating that "wages are not justified by the nature of work performed" and publishing the top salaries of projectionists in Alberta, are a misrepresentation of the projectionist occupation.


The top projectionist in Alberta made \$77,810 last year. This is true Yano says, but that projectionist is working New Years, Christmas and averaging about 50-60 hours a week. Also when things go smoothly it's not a difficult job, but how many jobs run smoothly all the time?

What Curt Yano wants to express is that if Famous Players wins this battle it won't be long before other theatres will follow suit. And this will be the end of the projectionist union in Alberta. Yano also feels that if projectionists fall to the corporate mentality all unions are fair game.

matter who has to suffer for it. This will trickle down to all companies in Canada predicts Yano, and eventually everyone who thinks their jobs and livelihoods are safe will be affected. This union-breaking mentality could hit Canadians hard if Famous Players wins their rollback proposal. Welders, electricians, carpenters... no one will be excluded.

What is happening to projectionists could happen to anyone Yano states. You could teach someone to weld in a year but that doesn't make him a welder. The major strike against the projectionists is they have been de-certified as technicians. The first time was in 1980. After a decade of fighting

NAIT's Health Services is holding a health fair from 11 AM - 1 PM on Tuesday, April 4th in the South Lobby. The theme this year is "All of Me...You...& Us". The purpose of the fair is to create an awareness about health and health issues.

This year's fair is taking an alternative turn. Instead of the traditional blood-pressure displays, and heart rate counts, the fair focuses on 'alternative or holistic' health remedies and practices. Health services invites you to sample the "smorgasbord" of alternative options. Dorothy Chapman,

manager of NAIT's Health Services thought it might be fun to try something different, and expand people's health horizons.

The list of displays are quite unique and interesting. Among them will be displays on reflexology, a tai chi demonstration, a yoga demo, mini massages, reiki massages (a massage with your clothes on), acupressure, trigger massages, and a host of other non-traditional holistic health procedures. Also there will be displays put on by representatives from dairy nutrition, cardiac rehab and the kidney foundation.

ACAC BADMINTON COACH OF THE YEAR

Edmonton - NAIT Badminton coach Mark Bosworth has been selected by his coaching peers as the ACAC Badminton Coach of the Year for the second time in three years.

The 1994-95 season was a typically successful one for Bosworth and his NAIT Oaks who have become a dominant force in ACAC badminton over the past five years. Following a 14-2 regular season, the Oaks qualified for but lost the gold medal match to the powerful SAIT Trojans after disposing of Red Deer College in a semi-final match. Despite finishing second in the ACAC and

having 2 athletes named to the 1994-95 All-Conference Team, the Oaks did not qualify one player in the individual events for the CCAA National Championships. This illustrates the depth of Bosworth's squad and the success of the "team concept" for which he is known to teach and emphasize.

During his five years at the helm of the NAIT Badminton program, Bosworth's teams have won 84 regular season matches while losing only 20. Included amongst his awards are 2 ACAC gold medals, 1 CCAA gold medal and 2 CCAA silver medals. In 1991-92

when Bosworth was the Team Alberta head coach, the ACAC won the CCAA Team Supremacy Award at the National Championships.

A fully certified NCCP level II coach with a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education, Bosworth is employed as a NAIT Instructor involved in staff training programs. His philosophy about the role of college athletics and the NAIT Badminton program is to provide his players with the opportunity to grow and develop in their athletic as well as scholastic and personal endeavors.

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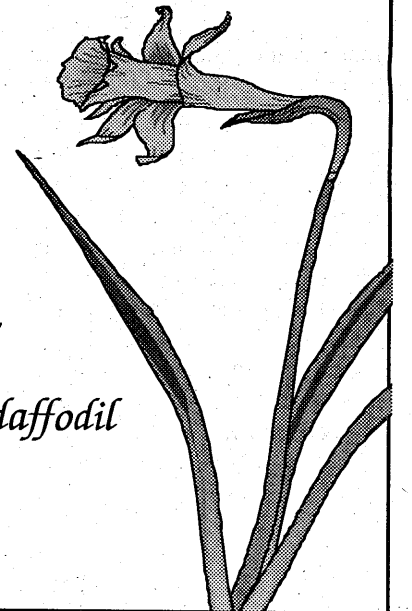

Everybody from Carrotville heard about the wedding and moved to Happy Donut Land because they missed Christina's cookies....but she sure couldn't cook very good pancakes!

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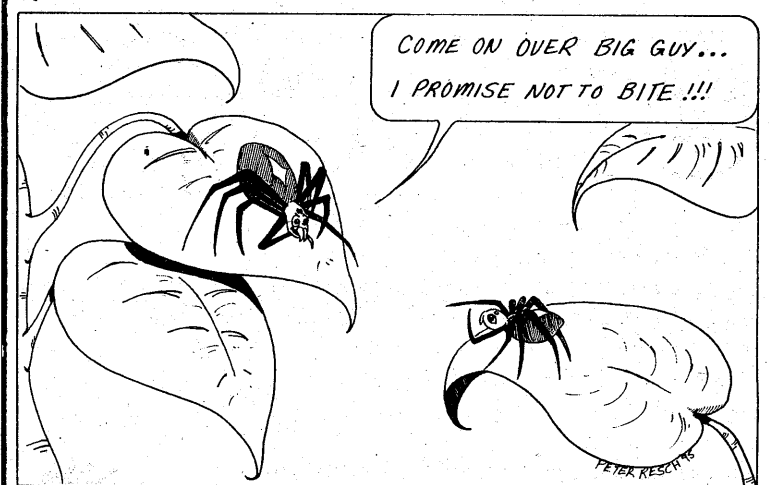
