

Do you have the Exam Week Blues?



Mid-term exams are over once again here at NAIT and students breathe a sigh of relief. So what was learned? What has been forgotten? These questions depend a lot on how the exams were prepared for. Good students study at least a week in advance. But, for most students, evenings are spent cramming half a semester of notes into already aching, tired brains.

Often, as students are up late at night (or very early in the morning),

reading for the very first time month-old lecture notes, trying to memorize seemingly arcane and foreign symbols, formulas, and definitions, they wonder about the value of what they are learning and how they are learning. In a paper on subgoal learning the author (Richard Catrombone) expresses this concern by stating, "students often memorize a set of steps...without learning what

subgoals those steps achieve. A result of this sort of learning can be that these students fail to solve novel problems that do not permit exactly the same set of steps..."

Another common complaint of students is the sheer volume of material that they are given and expected to memorize. Yet when they are tested, they are expected to know only a proportion of that ma-

terial. Studying becomes an exercise in what to memorize and what to shuffle to the side. Why is the focus not on only essential material, for example, the material that is on (or should be on) the mid-term or final exam?

Dr. Robin Leech, student advisor, Biological Sciences, was confronted with these concerns and questions. He responded by saying

that "exams (and consequently memorization) are an evil that you have to face. It is our (NAIT's) way of determining that you do or do not know the subject about which you are being examined. Regarding exams, I have had students get the exam questions and I have then selected from them."

Dr. Leech also spoke at another situation in which he gave his stu-

dents the choice of either taking home an exam that he had prepared weeks in advance of the final and know that half of the questions will be on the final. Or, the students could not take the exam home and come to the exam cold and answer the questions sight-unseen. Dr. Leech explains, "the questions were designed to cover the course. If the student's knew the answers to the questions, then they would know the course."

Most students will agree that when they do have to wade through a mire of notes, good lecture notes from instructors are appreciated. Good lecture notes have the following characteristics:

1. Neatness - If handwriting is illegible, then notes should be typed. Instructors expect no less of students.
2. Flow - Notes that fit in somewhere and are not randomly thrown onto the blackboard or overhead with a lack of discernible order and form.
3. Brevity - Nobody wants to wade through excess.
4. Attitude - Effects the three previous characteristics. The best instructors are those that enjoy their job and do the best they can regardless of politics or a salary they think is inadequate; they shine and the others pale in comparison.




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
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NAIT Possible Parliament for Technocrats

Technocracy is defined as "a system of organization in which government and industry are controlled by scientific experts of technicians." Technocracy originated in the winter of 1918-1919 when Howard Scott formed a group of scientists, engineers, and economists that became known, in 1920, as the Technical Alliance—a research organization. In 1933, it was incorporated under the Laws of the State of New York as a non-profit, non-political, non-sectarian membership organization. It has no affiliation with any other organization, group, or association in North America or elsewhere.

Technocracy's official symbol resembles the Chinese Yin-Yang symbol; it is called the Monad, and it signifies balance between productivity and distribution, which is an integral part of a social program designed by Technocracy.

Technocrats acknowledge the destruction of natural resources, pollution, poverty, crime, and cultural clashes as the product of the current political and economic system. They feel that the current system functions in a state of scarcity which keeps

prices high and is willfully preserved by "cunning" public relations, techniques (mass media, propaganda), destroying and stockpiling food to keep prices up, and sabotaging the productivity of equipment through legal tangles.

Functional Control is determined only by the requirements of the job that must be done.


Technocrats feel that today's problems cannot be dealt with effectively by the current system because the solutions and incompatible with profiteering, political power struggles and evaluated governmental

concepts.

The type of government Technocracy proposes is one that operates under Functional Control. Functional Control is not control by a small group of elite, it is control by technique, which means that the process which works best is adopted, and the process which is shown through performance to be less efficient is discarded. Functional Control is determined only by the requirements of the job that must be done.

Technocracy would like to see technology developed to help people not purely for profit. Tasks like building dams, power plants, canals, railways, and a highway system should be done with maximum effectiveness in mind.

Technocracy's ultimate purpose is to exist for the purpose of harnessing technology to the task of creating an equitable high-quality life for its citizens.

TAX DOLLAR TV

Your wallet may be getting a break. Rumor has it CBC is planning to sell off its Calgary TV station. President of Friends Of Canadian Broadcasting, Ian Morrison, says the corporation is down-sizing. He says that CBC is planning cuts that will slash almost one-third of its jobs in Alberta. Morrison says that the corporation's directors are planning to dismantle Canada's public broadcasting system. Morrison believes CBC's agenda includes selling TV stations in Calgary and other communities. Turning some smaller CBC community stations into "Storefront" operations and cutting broadcasts to rural areas also seem to be possible. Morrison estimates Alberta's cuts would translate into 50 out of 215 jobs in Calgary and 127 out of 337 positions in Edmonton being lost.

MONEY MATTERS

Canada is tops. That's not necessarily a good thing though. Canada ranks high in a study of gaps between the rich and poor. The United States reigns supreme, followed by Ireland, Italy, Canada and Australia. The study was conducted by the Paris-based organization for economic co-operation and development.

HUGE VEHICLE RECALL

Your car might not be safe. It's going to be a bumpy road ahead for General Motors. GM has announced its biggest recall of the 90's. A test by Transport Canada discovered a problem with rear seat belt anchor bolts. Over two million mid-size passenger cars in Canada and the US need fixing. Dealers will replace the anchor bolts on affected vehicles at no charge. The models

being recalled are the 1989 and 1990 Celebrity, the 1989 through 1991 Pontiac 6000, the 1989 through 1995 Oldsmobile Cutlass Sierra and the 1989 through 1995 Buick Celebrity. GM says there have not been any owner reports of seat belt failures, accidents or injuries related to the defect.

HUNTER LANDS HIMSELF IN JAIL

Last week a French hunter set his sights on one big bird. He brought down a four tonne troop-carrying helicopter in a Southern France forest. The man was apparently angry at low-flying army choppers. The hunter started blasting away with his shotgun as the aircraft flew overhead. The helicopter's fuel line was cut by the shotgun blast. The chopper was to make an emergency landing. No one was injured. The hunter was arrested by police who say he had been drinking.

DANGEROUS LIFE-SAVERS

Air Bags may not save children's lives. This has caused regulators to issue a warning about air bags. They say the bags can kill children who aren't wearing seat belts. Officials are looking into whether the deaths of six children killed in car crashes were caused by inflating air bags.

RACISM OR NOT

Remember this? The Mounties say one RCMP officer was present at a "good old boys" picnic last year in Tennessee. The picnic is a gathering of Law enforcement officers. The U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee claims the Tennessee event has been racist since the first annual picnic in 1980. Back in Canada, the

RCMP claims its officers found no evidence of racially oriented overtones or activities.

KOMRAD(ERY) IN SPACE

There's big news for world in space. Thirty years ago, Russia was competing to beat the U.S. in the space race. In the 90's the countries are working together. Russian space officials have agreed to train a western astronaut as a mission commander. This is a first. Until now, western astronauts have only flown as researchers on board Russian spacecraft.

BOOZE AT THE WHEEL

Across the country there was something strange brewing. A Fredericton man has been fined for operating his motorized wheelchair while drunk. Forty-year-old Raymond Macdonald has Muscular Dystrophy. Police stopped him in his chair on a city road. Macdonald failed a breathalyzer test. He pleaded guilty and was handed a 300 dollar fine. Usually, when people are convicted of impaired driving they can't operate a motorized vehicle for three months. Macdonald can't use a manual wheelchair because of M-S. So, the judge decided to order Macdonald not to operate his wheelchair in public while drinking.

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
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Technical Barbarians

An instructor here at NAIT thought that he would give his students a break from Organic Chemistry and Biosynthetic Pathways by having them watch a film.

The purpose of this exercise, the instructor explained, was to keep the students from becoming "technical barbarians." A technical barbarian is a student with a too narrow focus on his/her training, a student who can't apply the training to new or global situations. The movie was an eye-opener for the students.

The movie was called, "Limits to Growth." In this movie, scientists, academics, and experts from many disciplines and from around the world contributed their knowledge with the intent of creating a computer model that would predict the fate of mankind. A computer was

used to handle the huge amount of data and the complex mathematical inter-relationships that would develop.

The computer model took variables like capital investment, standard of living, food production, population, pollution, time. All of the variables were then individually and hypothetically increased or decreased. The ultimate outcome was usually a crash in population and standard of living.

For example, if capital investment was steadily increased, pollution, due to increased industrial production, reached lethal concentrations followed by massive population decline. It seemed no matter what variable was manipulated, it caused the population to eventually and dramatically crash.

The movie made clear that the earth is a closed system with finite

resources. Like any organisms in a closed system with finite resources, humans will reach a point where the resources cannot sustain the numbers and the waste by-products of consuming become lethal. This is inevitable but we can control the rate at which this happens.

The movie offered the following solutions that would produce a steady state where the population did not crash: reduce capital investment, hold standard of living at present, reduce food production, reduce birth rate by 50%, and control pollution.

All of these solutions require political action. Also, as a society, an increased standard of living must be defined. For example, does it mean buying that automatic bread-makers? Is economic growth a pathological process?

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Sometimes "Government" shoves things down our throat whether we like it or not. You may remember the metrification that swept the country in the seventies under the watchful eye of the "metre police" who threw people in jail for selling carpet by the square yard rather than m².

A lot of bunk was distributed at the time, and to this day there is not much common sense when it comes to labeling products. This is particularly true in the food and grocery business. For someone like me, who grew up with the metric system, switched to the imperial system early in my professional career and is now back to measuring in ml and grams, it was particularly obvious that bureaucrats mindlessly follow dictum regardless of consequences. And so it came to pass that we are now selling solid products by the litre (detergents and pickles for example) and liquids by weight (honey).

For the technical industries, metrification was a godsend, it made the Canadian industry compatible with the rest of the world (except, of course, Great Britain).

Metrification for the food industry has not worked very well. Not for lack of trying, mind you, but because almost all our food products come from the United (we-do-what-we-want) States. Of course, if you are serving a market of nearly 300 million people, us included, one has to accept a certain amount of autonomy in marketing. It's just that, well read your average label on any can: 298 mls of diced carrots in brine. Really. What does that mean? How much brine, how much carrots? And how much carrots are one

cup? Let's face it, unless all your cookbooks at home have been purchased in the last week or so, chances are there isn't a ml or gram to be found in any of the recipes. It's cups and quarts and teaspoons and pounds and ounces.

I've seen recipes converted from Imperial to metric and half teaspoon of pepper became 3 mls or 3 grams. How utterly asinine. There isn't a household scale (or commercial scale for that matter) that could measure such a quantity.

If you're lucky you get 5 gram increments, most domestic scales are 10 gram increments, and they are so poorly made that you couldn't be sure whether you have 10 or 20 grams of anything. For a recipe that calls for 3 grams of pepper this could spell disaster. To my mind it's good to be modern and progressive and with-it, like surfing the Internet etc., but when it comes to accurate recipes, give me teaspoons, cups and ounces anytime (good old England).

But there is a point to this story, and it isn't the bitching. In my last column I gave a recipe for a delicious cheese and vegetable lasagna, and without giving it a second thought I listed all ingredients in the old Imperial way, mainly because that's how I copied it from the Internet. You may have guessed it, the epicurious page and the vegetarian page reside in California in the good ol' US of A.

So, here is the question: How many readers looked at the recipe and tossed it aside because it made no sense (what the heck is 2 cups of broccoli)? After all, metrification has been around long enough for some students here to

never have heard of Imperial measurements. And how many felt comfortable with the old style? For that matter, how many people actually made the lasagna, how many parties did this result in, and how many calories were consumed and later worked off. Inquiring minds want to know. I would like some feedback (to the editor) for future considerations. Is there a demand for other recipes not commonly found in standard cook books. How about recipes for 1 person? More vegetarian? Some hearty meat and potato recipes? Also, if you have any questions regarding food or food preparation, feel free to inquire. The editors will let me know and I'll try to have an answer in the next paper.

So, the saga continues.


The most enlightening part of referendum evening was watching the Canadian dollar climb on the Tokyo stock exchange peaking at just over 75 cents US.

Jacques Parizeau is the most disappointing part of the sovereignty referendum. Apparently his own party agrees with me - he resigned as Premier of Quebec.

His speech, after it was clear Quebec was to remain a part of Canada, was offensive. He said, "we

were beaten it is true, but by what? By money and the ethnic voters. All it means is that we [francophones] were 60 per cent this time; we'll just have to be 63 per cent next time."

Parizeau's statements illustrate



the most frightening and disheartening part of the Quebec sovereignty campaign. It shows the arrogance of some Quebecers who believe true Quebecers are francophones only. That arrogance would be willing to split up Quebec (which is about half anglophones and allophones) for their own purposes despite what the rest of Quebec and Canada may think.

Unfortunately, the Parti Quebecois are due to spend several more years in the Quebec Legisla-

tive Assembly. During this time I hope they have time to consider the size of Quebec's debt along with many other economic problems in the midst of trying to destroy Canada.

I read the editorial in the Journal thanking Quebec for staying. I momentarily felt bad about still being angry. However, every time I think about how much it is costing Canada to wrangle with Quebec, my empathy fades. After all, this is Alberta.

I don't understand what they want. Canada is the best country in the world to live in. We have an impeccable reputation for our high standard of living and international responsibility.

For people in Quebec, this is not good enough?

On top of everything they already have - including the multi-

million dollar a year transfer payment from the federal government - they want the rest of Canada to recognize them as distinct. Distinct from what... the Ukrainian culture on the prairies, the Japanese culture on the west coast, the Native Canadian culture, the Italian culture, the East Indian culture... the list goes on and on. There are so many cultures in Canada which are distinct from each other, why should the francophones in Quebec be classed differently.

However, I would be willing to concede Quebec has a distinct society and give them more power to govern themselves if, they became less of a burden on the Canadian taxpayer. Let them have the power, but make them take the responsibility.

I encourage all Albertans to call their federal Members of Parliament and tell them how they want to be represented in the House of Commons with regard to this issue. There is a list of Edmonton and surrounding area MP's on page two.

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





Mike Scott - Bring 'em All In


He looks like Rick Springfield but sounds like my ass. This Chachi is a cross between Gowan and Meatloaf and believe you me that's not a pretty thing.


Iron Maiden - The X-Factor

Rent Evil Dead 2. Rent it because then you can say that you were on of the unique few who has enjoyed it's campy hilarious flavor.




If you are not into any of these bands, then the Rev has an 80's

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



#17 Jason Harke- this 6'2" forward from Holy Trinity School is a very determined player. Harke is respected for his good work ethic.




SAIT put an end to the battle and claimed victory with 7 minutes left in the 2nd overtime period.

Twelve colleges competed in this year's championships and was attended by 59 men and 51 women.


The Grand Prix awards were also presented at the ACAC Championships. These awards were presented to the top ten athletes placed in at least four of the pre-season and


