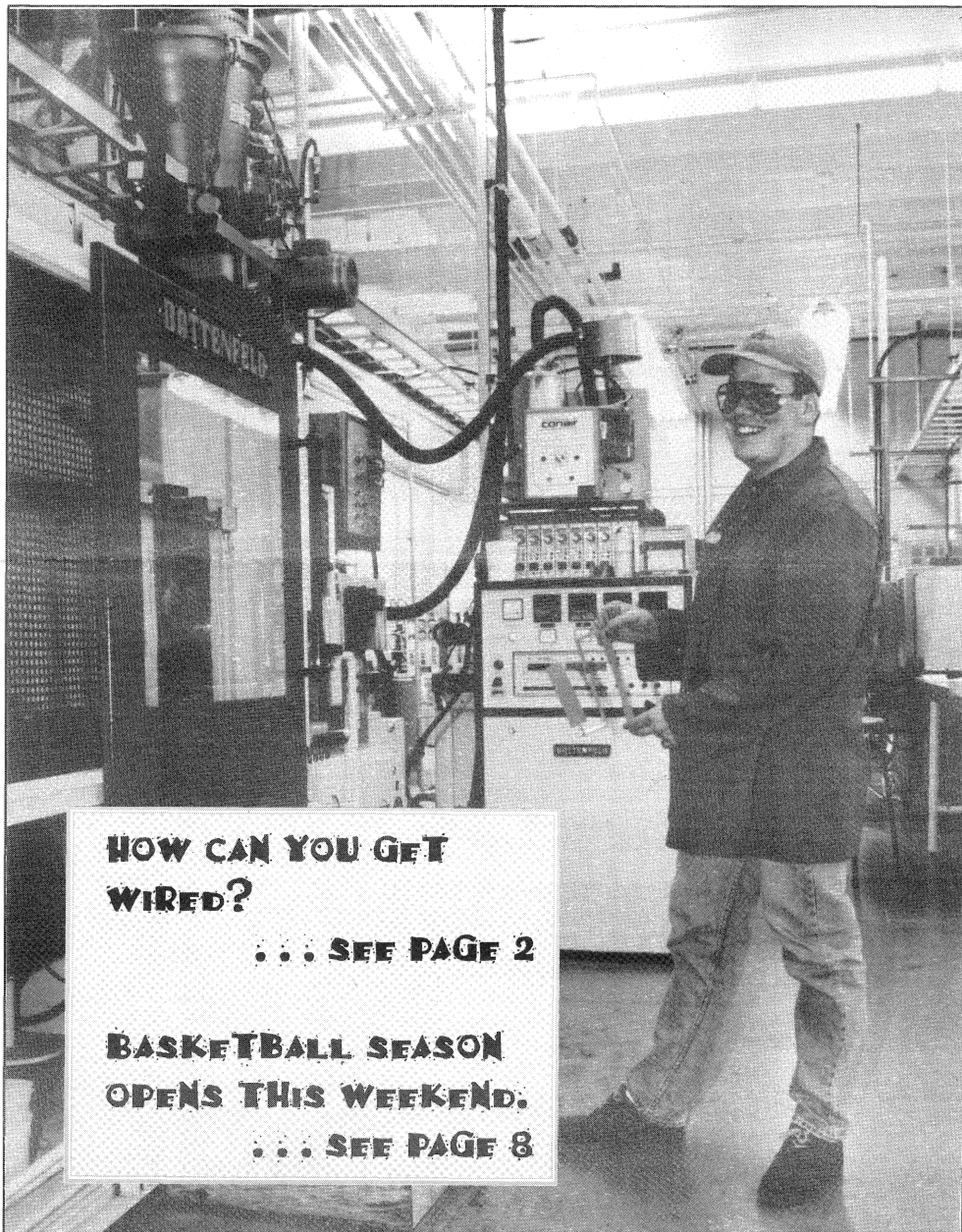

Get Wired

The Internet makes its way into NAIT . . . slowly but surely

You're missing out. The Internet is here, and it's waiting for you. NAIT is already on the Internet, contrary to popular belief. Assistant Program Head of Business, Bill Fricker, says, "it's available for a number of staff, management, administrative people." Fricker says NAIT has its own T1 line. A T1 line is basically a telephone line that can have 100 simultaneous users drawing from it.

Although there is a T1 line, programs have to pay to connect the line. Fricker explains that, "the backbone comes to within a hundred feet, theoretically, of any office or classroom on the main campus, and once it's there, then it's up to a program to pay for the connection."

NAIT is dealing with the good stuff. No text based hookups. We're talking graphical user interface — this means you get to use your mouse. "Graphical user interface," says Fricker, "now it is: see something you like, click, and go there, and it's more than just a difference between words, and pictures, it's a difference between how easily and automatically you can access something."

Don't expect home access to the Net through NAIT, though. CST Instructor Charles Coe says, "I think the closest that we're going to have to [a home access] is what OA Net offered right at the beginning of September where you bought your books."

There is a reason NAIT won't be providing access similar to the U of A. Coe thinks "the big difference is that at the University, they felt that it was important that every student have access." Coe says, "because our students are [at NAIT] for a much shorter time, I don't think that need is the same, so it's probably going to depend more on individual programs how they decide how important it is for their students to have Internet access."

Money is another reason for NAIT not providing home access.

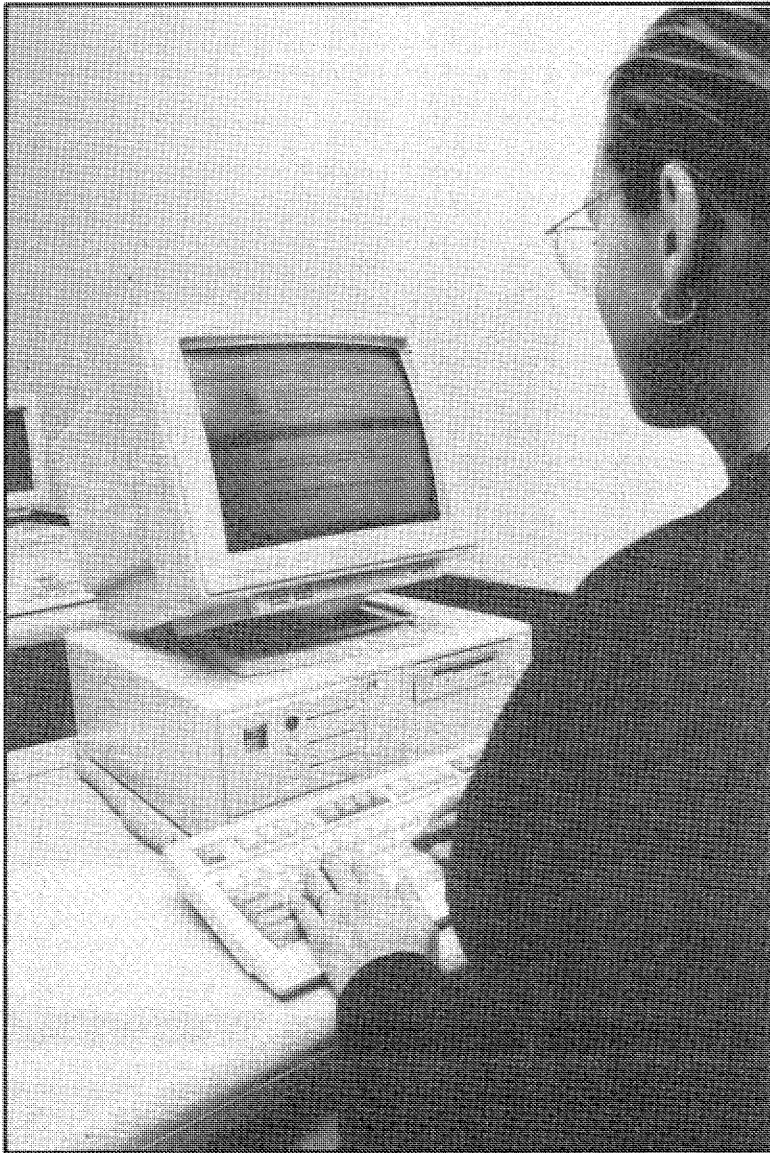

Fricker says, "we don't have the resources to buy the telephone lines [required for home use]. NAIT has a plan though. Fricker plans to 'show the students here, as quickly as we can, in the programs we can get signed up, — here's what's on

the Net, here's how to get to it, but the student, to be able to use it at home, has to have a two to three thousand dollar computer, a one to two hundred dollar modem, and the like to connect."

NAIT has its own home page. A

home page is your calling card, and much more. Every student should have their own home page. Coe says, "I am personally encouraging all of my students to get out their resumes, just as quickly as they can, on this page, and make sure it's available to [services on-line that post resumes]." Such as <http://www.monster.com>. "Basically," explains Coe, "what [the students] are doing is advertising that they're looking for work — to the entire world." You can also search for employers this way. Coe says, it should give students an excellent chance to "job hunt."

Fricker warns that "students may not be aware of how much skills of Internet they should have." Fricker has gone to members of the advisory committees, "each of the 70 or so programs," explains Fricker, "have an advisory committee who are 10 to 20 or so people from industry generally representing employer groups; so we sent out a questionnaire...to those people... and we'll have some data at the end of this week. I guess that will give us answers [as to what Internet skills employers would like NAIT grads to possess]." Fricker stresses learning the Internet because, "it will become the communication common conduit for everybody."

It doesn't take that long to learn. Charles Coe thinks 15 minutes is plenty to learn the basics on how to use the Internet. Coe says, after teaching a course for 15 minutes, "the guys were looking for girlie pictures, and they seemed to have a

pretty good idea where to go and look, and the girls were looking for poetry, and printing it off... 15 minutes was more than enough."

If you don't have a chance to take a course on Internet, Fricker offers an easy solution: "I think the best thing to do would be to find a friend [with Internet access] and spend an hour with them, and from then on, they're on their own."

Don't be left behind. "When we start showing off the Internet," says Fricker, "people look at it and say — Gee, the more I know about this, the more quickly I gotta make a change, not just a change of skill base, but a change of employment base." Fricker says, "it is going to come, and I'm afraid it's going to come much quicker than any of us really expect."

Coe says, "two years ago, I don't think anyone considered that it would be important to be connected."

The Internet is for everybody. Fricker says, "I can't think of any technology that I could automatically rule out [that could use the Internet.]" Everything is out there on the Net. Coe says, "it's increasing at such a scary rate, that what we can't find today is probably going to be up tomorrow."

Coe has a prediction: "within a year or two, there will be some university offering courses throughout the world, given by instructors throughout the world, the university is going to be in someone's basement." Find out about the Internet, and "get wired" soon.

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Plastics, our environment's biggest trouble maker

Here's a couple solutions for an ever-growing problem for a product we can't live without: those of us that use a reusable cup instead of a styrofoam cup pay the same price for our beverage as those who insist on using the "disposable" cups. People who continue to contribute to the "issue" should be penalized just like any other person who chooses to abuse our world and it's products. So why not charge

those who choose a "disposable" cup more than those who choose not to (like 7-11). We have bins for pop cans (some cans are being made from plastics now) and for paper but, nothing for plastics on campus. Many plastics companies will use reclaimed plastics in their products, why hasn't NAIT contacted the plastics recycling companies of Edmonton and asked them if they would take our used plastics? Since it's politically correct to have paper recycled (save a tree and all that) it seems even more politically correct to reuse an even larger product in

our lives (save a land fill).

Government legislation, is one of the best solutions to the plastics issue. If the people would push the governments to force plastics companies to reuse their own plastics products, a large amount of non-degradable waste could be avoided. Another idea is to use plastics waste for rebuilding roads, it may cost more initially, but repairs would be less often. How about this one, next time you use a baggie for your sandwich, take the baggie back home and wash it (they are washable you know). Knowledge is Power

Hi! Our names are Keith Cheung, Charles Calvert, and Olivera Bogdanov and as part of the Business Leadership Class (BUS470), we chose to be involved with the Edmonton Epilepsy Foundation. The main goals for our project are to increase knowledge about Epilepsy as well as to raise funds for medical research.

Epilepsy is a physical condition that happens when there are sudden, brief changes in how the brain works. Epilepsy can develop at any time of life, but about 3/4 of 100,000 new cases every year start in children and around the time of adolescence. There is no one cause for Epilepsy. Anything that can

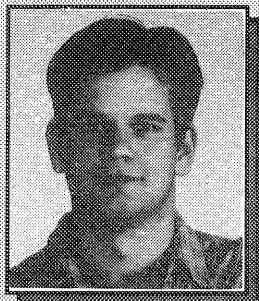
make a difference in the way the brain works, such as head injuries, lack of oxygen, brain tumours, meningitis, or severe cases of measles among others, can cause this condition.

Although we may have an idea about what Epilepsy is, it seems that the general question is how can we help if we encounter a person that has a seizure? First aid is basically simple:

1. Keep calm and reassure other people who may be nearby.
2. Clear the area around the person of anything hard or sharp.
3. Loosen ties or anything around the neck that may cause breathing difficulty.

4. Put something soft and flat under the person's head.

5. Turn him/her onto their side. DO NOT try to force his/her mouth open, it is not true that a person having a seizure can swallow their tongue.

6. DO NOT hold the person down or try to alter their movements.

7. DO NOT attempt artificial respiration unless the person does not start breathing once the seizure has stopped.

8. Be friendly with the person as they resume consciousness.

Knowing what epilepsy is and having a few ideas on how to react when someone has a seizure is only a start in education ourselves about this condition. To learn more about epilepsy, please come down to the booth located in the SOUTH LOBBY, December 5-7 between 11 a.m. - 3 p.m. We will have pamphlets and other information available to learn more about epilepsy. 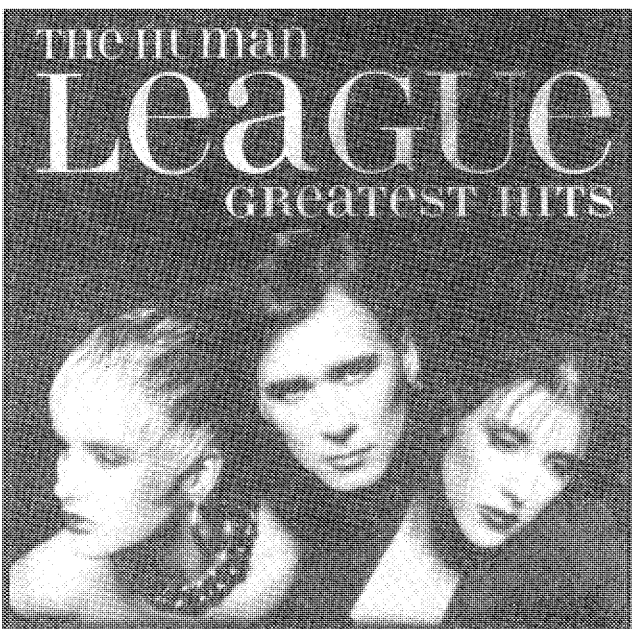
Belladonna - Belladonna

November 23-25 Sneaky Pete's plays host to "Jordan

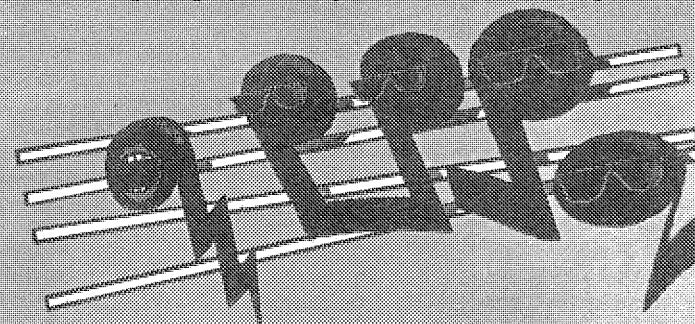
Patterson and the DC Hurricanes."

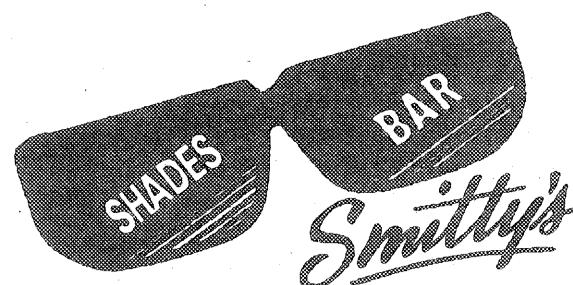

1995 Ooks Soccer Captain Brian Austen has been recognized as one of Canada's finest.

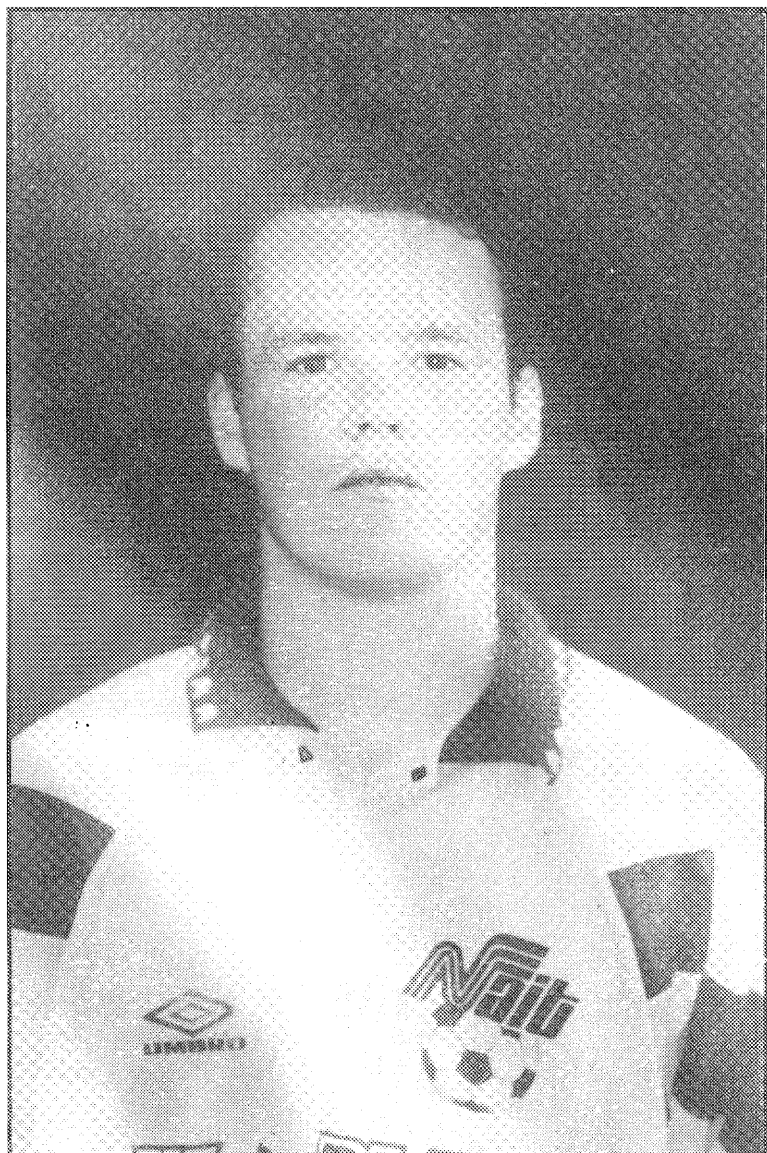

The NAIT Ooks (6-2) face the Red Deer College Kings (3-5) in a home and home series. The Ooks are in Red Deer on Thursday night for a 7:30 p.m. match up. The Kings visit the NAIT Arena on Saturday night for a 7:00 p.m. contest. The Ooks are currently in second place four points behind the Mount Royal College Cougars while the Kings are in fourth place.

After a fourth place finish (13-7-2) in the 1994-95 regular grind, the Kings

with 12 veterans are hoping to return to championship form under rookie head coach Ray Bennett. Red Deer has a pair of new faces between the pipes — Darcy Austin, a former Lethbridge Hurricane (WHL), and Cal McConnell, a former Lloydminster Blazer (AJHL). On defense, third year King Trent Harper and newcomer Gary Lebsack, a former Atlanta Knight (IHL), are key performers. Up front, veterans Chris Lenz, Nolan Weir,

While the Kings lost both ends of a home and home series with the Concordia College Thunder, the Ooks swept the SAIT Trojans in a two game set at the NAIT Arena.

On Friday, November 17th, the Ooks netted four goals in the second period en route to a 6-2 win over the Trojans.

After a scoreless first period, the Ooks gained the upper hand in the second. The Trojans acquired the early lead on Jeff Pennoyer's marker at 41 seconds. The Ooks then countered with even strength markers from Peter Kasowski at 1:18, Jay Lines at 13:50, and Rob Plante at 16:09. Terence Oliver netted a power play marker at 18:49 to give the Ooks a 4-1 advantage.

In the third, Trevor Warrener brought the Trojans to within two at 4:04. The Ooks closed out scoring as Randy Polacik found the mark at 4:40 and Dan Kopec capitalized on a power play opportunity at 14:55.

Shawn Dietrich blocked 28 of 34 shots in the SAIT crease while Mike Walker stopped 30 of 32 shots in the NAIT net.

On Saturday, November 18th, Peter Kasowski scored a shorthanded goal with 8:48 elapsed in overtime to lift the Ooks to a 4-3 win.
