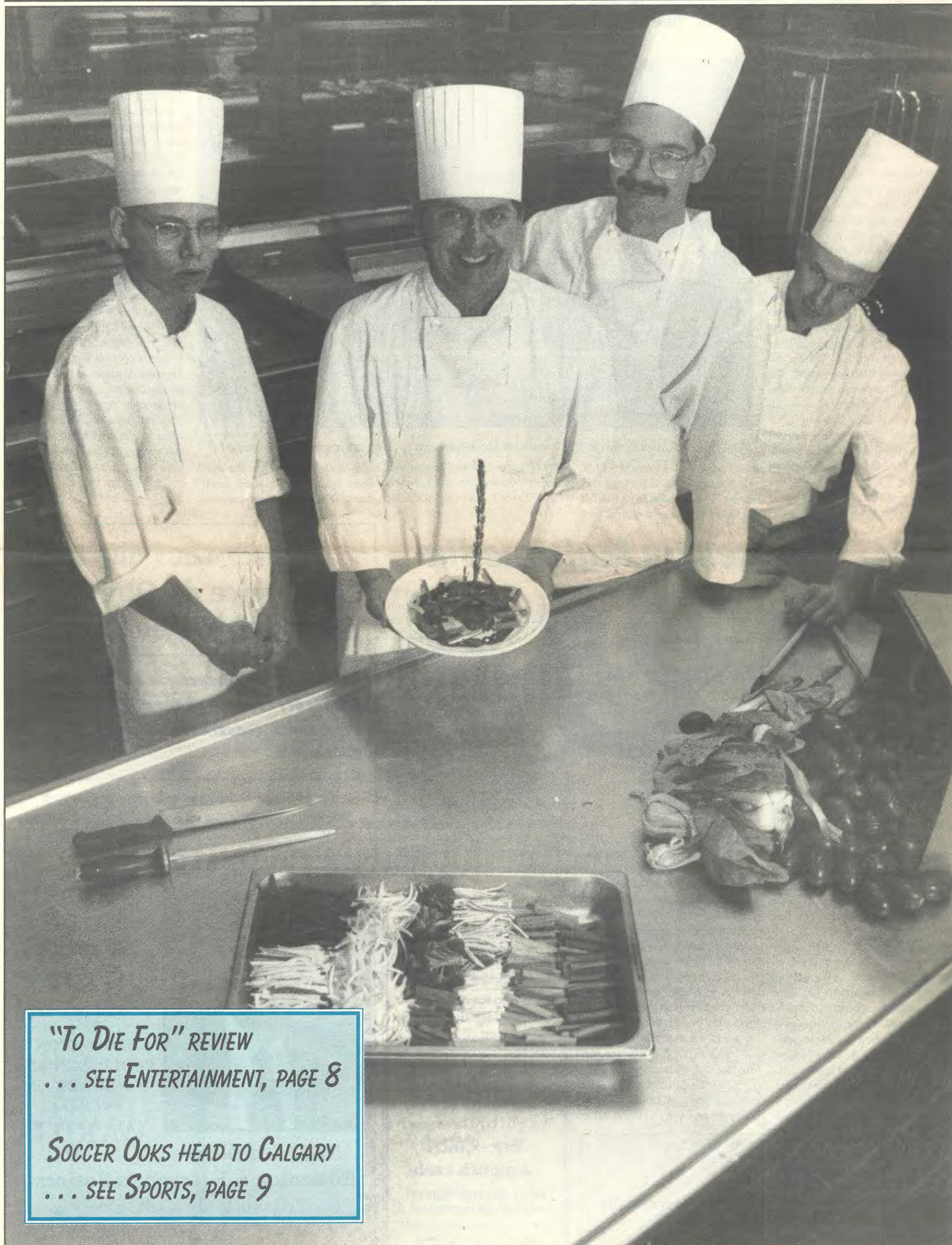

## Everything you need to know to be a responsible voter

Save our city. The Municipal Election is three days away. Monday is your chance to make your mark. A Mayor, Aldermen, Public and Separate School Board Trustees, and of course the double whammy of referendums all have to be decided upon. This article is a guide to this election. Questions to why, where, when and how you vote will all be answered. Are you even eligible to vote? You may have special needs that need to be addressed. Read on to find out the low down.

Edmonton is divided into six zones, called wards, for the purposes of electing a Mayor and Aldermen. The Separate School Board follows the same six wards. The Public School Board has nine wards. On election day, a person simply votes at their local voting station in the ward in which they live. For information on the Separate School wards, call 441-6002. For information on Public School wards, call 429-8019. The results of this election are good until the next election (three years). A Mayor will

be chosen. Two Aldermen will be selected from each of the City's six wards. One member from each of the nine Public wards will be cho-

sen as trustee. Seven Trustees will be voted on for the six Separate wards. Seven? That's right, the 7th

is a candidate who has the most votes among non-elected candidates. The referendum questions

about Keillor Road and the Airports must also be answered.

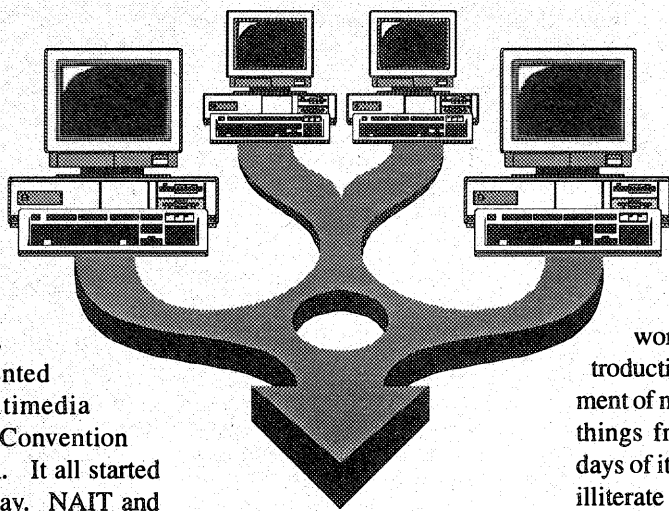
Here's the beef. Who can vote? For starters, you must be a Canadian citizen who is at least 18 years old. You have to have lived in Alberta since at least April 16 of this year. You also have to live in the city of Edmonton on Election Day. You can only vote once. Everybody has to complete a Voting Register to confirm that they meet the requirements. If this isn't done, you can't vote. So the plan is this: Figure out what ward you live in, find out where your voting station is, complete a voting register, then vote! If you're having troubles figuring out where you vote, call 496-8008 before Monday. If you won't be in Edmonton on Monday, or you have a physical disability that prevents you from voting at your local voting station, or your religious beliefs prevent you from voting on Election Day, you can vote in advance. Tomorrow is your last chance for advance voting.

On Monday you can vote from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

## NET.CONTROVERSY

In the last article, I touched upon some aspects of privacy and encryption, which are drawing heated debates in various news groups (message areas on Internet devoted to many different topics). To continue this, we'll explore another controversial aspect of the whole 'cypherpunk' scene on the net — the anonymous remailer.

"What is an anonymous remailer," you ask? An anonymous remailer is a program, which relays messages anonymously. To put it into more complex terms, it assigns each user of the remailer an identity code and password. Messages received from a user have all traces of

as a child might decide to take part in a self-help discussion news group to meet people who have shared that experience, but might NOT want to be identified. They can do this with a remailer. Other people just like the idea of anonymity.

There is a serious side to this, though. For example (and believe me, there can be MANY examples of the serious side), it's extremely easy for someone to distribute illegal hard core pornographic pictures. There are entire news groups devoted to that kind of thing, and the people distributing the stuff will probably never get caught.

Earlier this year, a remailer in Finland was raided, and the police made off with the identity of a person suspected of anonymously posting high level information on the Church of Scientology (CoS). The man had supposedly stolen files from a news group. The gentleman who ran the remailer was given a decision — hand over the man's identity information, or the entire computer system. Obviously caught between a huge rock and a really hard place, he handed over the man's e-mail and login information.

This had caused an enormous uproar amongst users of the remailer. The reason is, this man's remailer logs contain a 'whit pages' to the Internet's dark side. If one remailer's logs were ever confiscated, the identities of a large chunk of illegal porn distributors would be revealed. The same goes for all the people who have their families, careers, and lives depending on their anonymity.

So, remailers harbor good guys and bad guys alike. Some people think that all remailers should be abolished, and they might be right in thinking so. When used in conjunction with an encryption program, such as PGP, one could organize a terrorist plot right under everyone's noses, which is why various government agencies are cracking down on encryption and remailer activities on the net.

The true paradox is this — do we give in to government sanctioned censorship and give up our rights to privacy? In other words, do we subject our lives to someone ELSE'S approval?

the sender's identity stripped out of the message's header information. After that, the message is relayed to the destination given by the sender, and the message can be said to have been sent 'anonymously'. The receiver has no idea who sent it, aside from the identity code (which the sender will never broadcast as being his/her own). Unless you know who owns the identity code, you don't know who sent the message, and it's almost impossible to trace back to the sender.

The catch is, it's not TRULY anonymous. User information is kept in a locked and encrypted database on the remailer's system. That information is only available to the person who runs the system. This can usually be circumvented by hopping your message along several remailers, making it 99.9% impossible to trace.

Most people who use remailers don't want to be identified. For example, a person who was molested

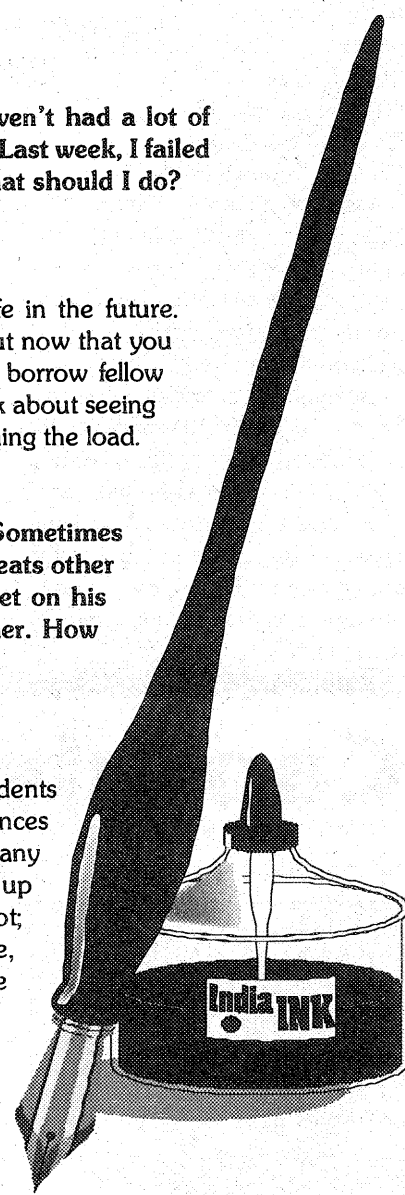
Dear Pericles:

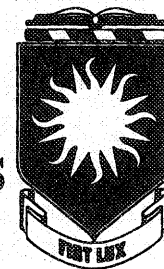

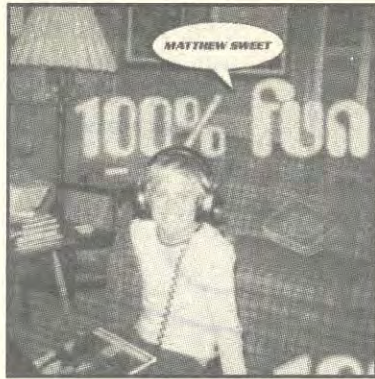
Dave Matthews Band: *Under the Table and Dreaming*

# CD's Are Forever

Ever since the discovery of the Compact Disc (CD) in 1979, the use and availability of CD's have continued to increase. High fidelity was redefined for audiophiles, as soon as they heard the pure digital sound of the CD.

More music, photos, software and other digital recordings are now available in the

CD format. This is not surprising due to the high resolution graphics and unrivaled accuracy of sound and picture reproduction.

The digital format of CD's makes picture and sound quality virtually flawless. The digitization process is done by electronic circuits that sample the analog signals several thousands of times a second. These circuits convert the signals at each of the samplings into digital pulses.

This series of pulses then activates a laser beam which illuminates portions of a photosensitive material applied to a master disc. Whenever there is a pulse the laser beam burns a small oval pit into the surface of the spinning disc, producing a pattern of pits and lands (flat areas) on the master disc.

After the master disc has been inscribed, the inscribed pattern is impressed on a molded plastic CD base. A layer of reflective aluminum is applied to the label side and topped by a protective plastic layer. The opposite side of the label contains all the information on a CD.

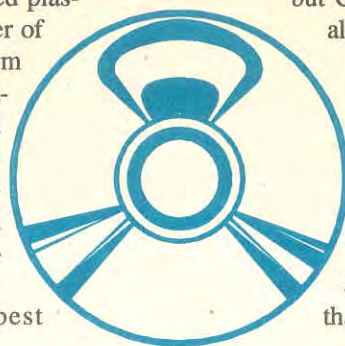
Perhaps the best

thing that ever happened to the personal computer is the development of the CD ROM (read only memory). Publishers have recently over the years produced CD ROM and CD-I (compact disc interactive)

versions of printed materials, software, interactive encyclopedias, with added animation, audio and many other features.

With CD-I, sophisticated computer programs and information can be stored on a CD that mix sound, text and graphics. A single CD has the capacity of storing information that hundreds of floppy disks can hold. The DV-1 (or digital video interface) uses the CD format to store pictures, text and sound. DV-1 allows the viewer to select and manipulate sections of the stored data. The motion aspect of the DV-1 is better than that of CD ROM and CD-I, but currently the picture sharpness in the DV-1 is somewhat inferior.

IN future, the most significant changes in the CD ROM of interactive encyclopedias will be the hyper link integration with on-line services. CD ROM technology in personal computers (PC) has increased a lot and there is an extra cost in adding a CD ROM unit to your PC, but CD's are forever and also a good investment, knowing that the cost of obtaining the unit will be long forgotten by the increased efficiency in storing and retrieving data and the added satisfaction that CD's provide.

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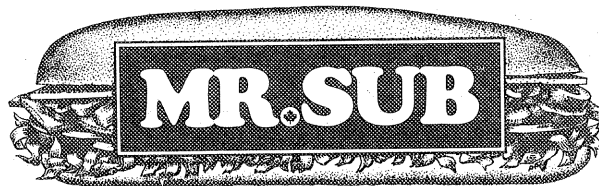

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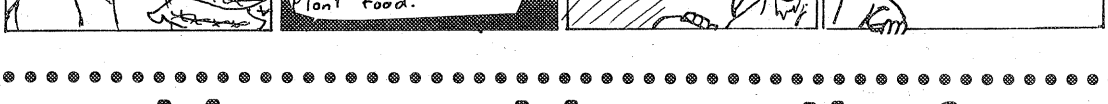
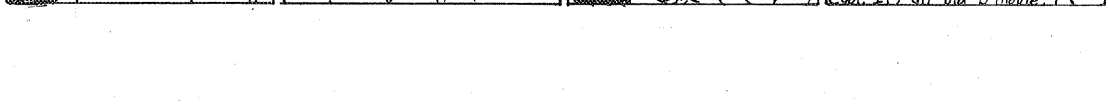

Strong team play and notable blocking shut down a potent OVC attack.

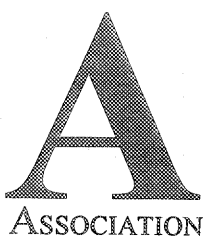
While everyone played well, Jerada Black, Adam McKee, and Richard Bowie turned in very surprising and solid performances.

now charging students and staff.

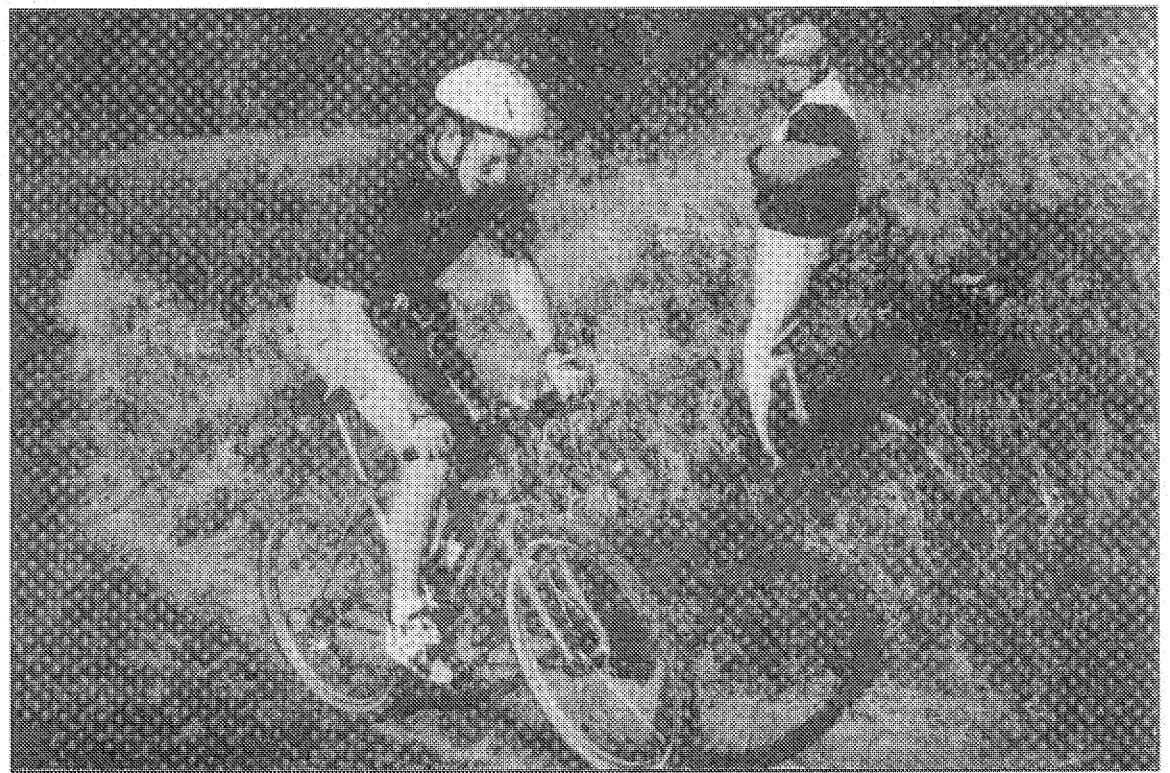

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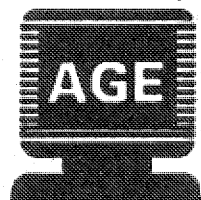

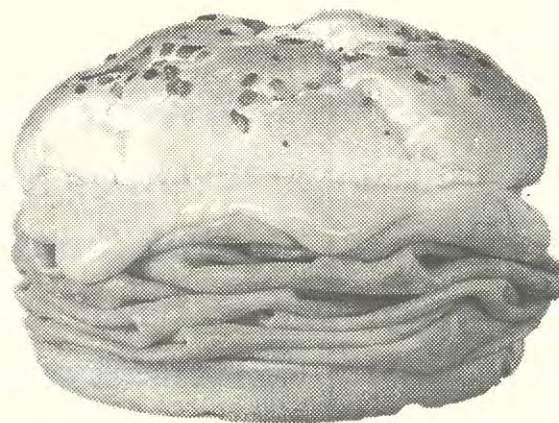
