

Basketball Ook, #13 Darren shows his magic at the first annual NAIT Pep Rally on Thursday, September 28, 1995





center. High "Quality of Life" is another of Smith's projections. Secure City public spaces, more police on the streets, and safe schools and neighbourhoods top his agenda.



Net Controversy

Most people really DON'T have a need for extreme privacy in their day to day e-mail conversations. But there are messages that you don't want everyone and his dog to know about, right? Well, that's where encryption software comes in.

Anyone who's in the know about crypto software knows about PGP, or "Pretty Good Privacy", by Phil Zimmerman. What most people DON'T know is that PGP is considered and treated like a weapon by the US government, who won't allow the original version to be exported outside of US borders. PGP uses an encryption algorithm so strong that it's almost unbreakable. Oh, it's not FLAWLESS — a short one line message DID get deci-

phered by a group of people a little knows it. Why? while ago. But it took them MONTHS to do it, and it was done on computers all over the world simultaneously, amassing more computing power than any average person would EVER own in their life.

"How does this all fit together?" Say I'm some sort of hacker who managed to get plans for a secret new aircraft the USAF is developing. Well, I grab PGP, encrypt it using the most ludicriously high computational setting you can put PGP at, and scramble the plans for the plane. Other than that, "Cub" hits the Rev with "Pansy Division" (opened for "Green Day") and


