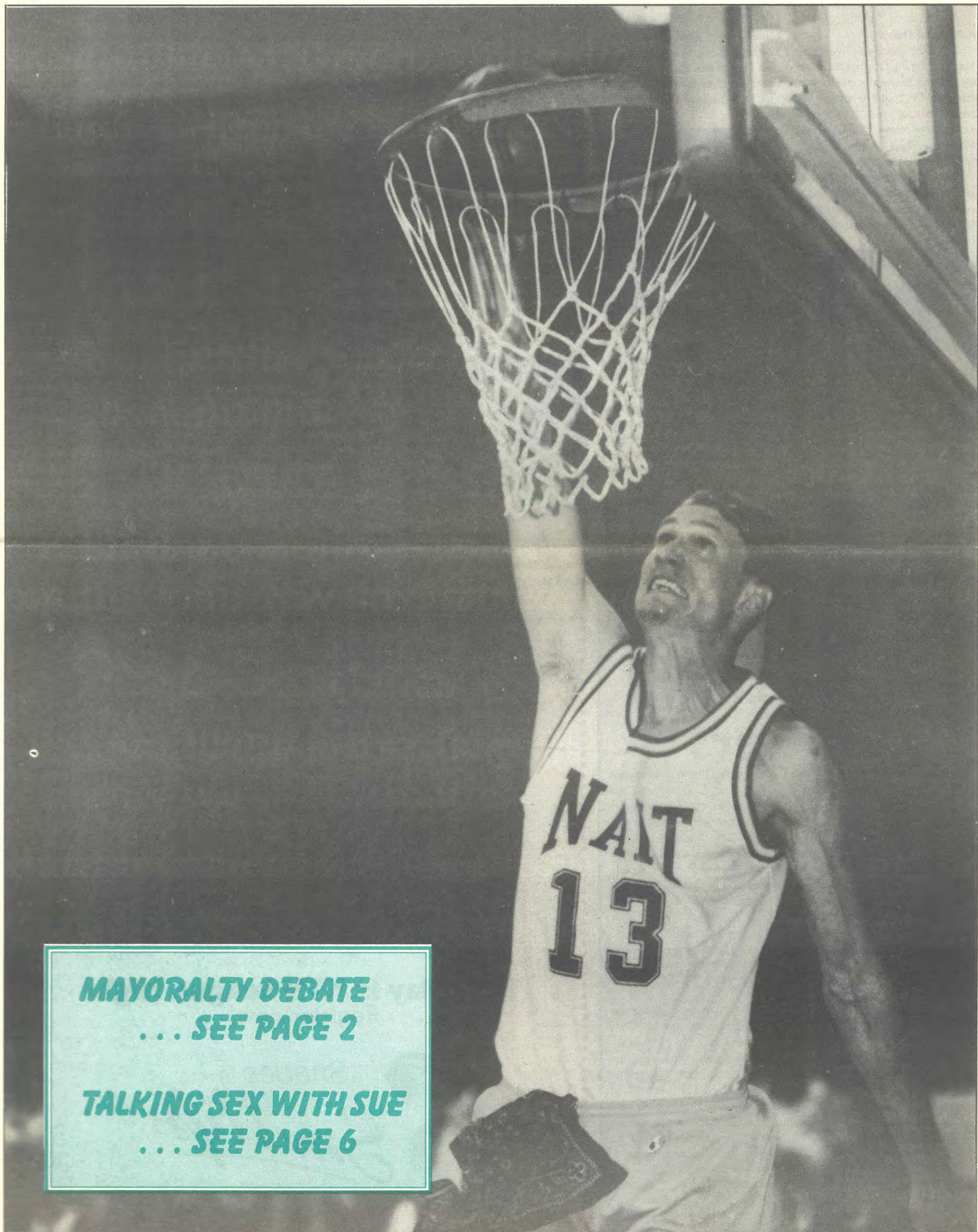

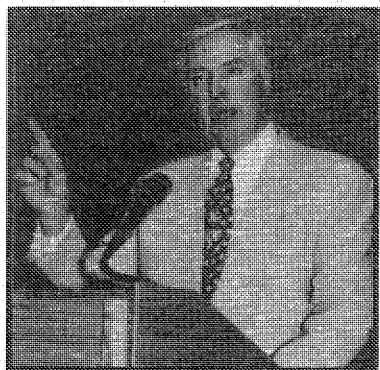

# The Mayoralty Debate Comes to NAIT

## Candidates try to sell themselves to students in a real tongue twister

Change the place you live! Your chance is coming October 16. Monday marked mayoralty madness at Nait gym. Six could-be mayors had five minutes each to sell their goods to the sparse crowd. Lance White, Robert Ligertwood, John Ramsey, Paul Earley, Bill Smith and current city leader Jan Reimer addressed their respective reasons for running. Each voiced their rationale as to why they should be supreme in this fall's election.



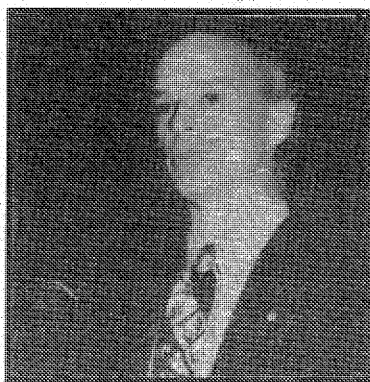
Bill Smith was the first speaker. Downtown was Smith's main concern. Smith said "The heart of the City is its downtown core. We must have more people living downtown and doing things downtown." He offers to promote the development of a two block area that will be called the "GATHERING PLACE", that will attract people to our City's

center. High "Quality of Life" is another of Smith's projections. Secure City public spaces, more police on the streets, and safe schools and neighbourhoods top his agenda.

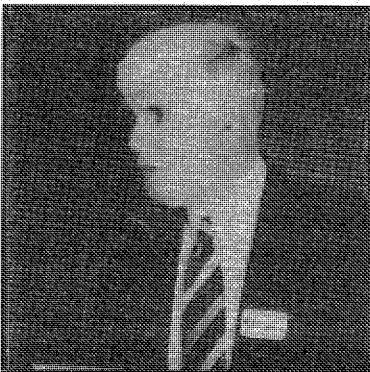


Jan Reimer was second up to bat. Reimer also spoke about "Quality of life." She wants the chance to "make our safe city safer." A compassionate city, a greater partnership with youth, and strong fiscal management were all ideas that Reimer brought across. Reimer spoke of her "commitment to stand up for our kind of Edmonton—compassion and great humanity."

Robert Ligertwood was third at the podium. He opened his speech with his mission to see Edmonton's "historical legacy as gateway to the north restored." Ligertwood feels Edmonton is not only one of the finest

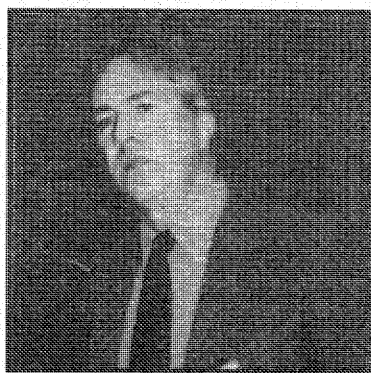


est city's in Canada, but one of the finest in the world. Job wise, Ligertwood wants to establish a working respect that is "intellectually motivated." He looks to promote economic growth in Edmonton through the use of an Edmonton "HOME PAGE" on the net.



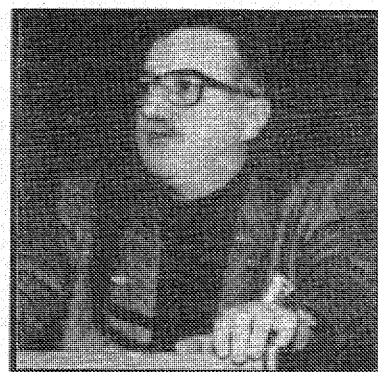
The fourth mayoralty candidate to speak Monday afternoon was John Ramsey. Ramsey pegged Ed-

monton as the all around best place to live. He believes there are two types of people: "those people who live here, and those who don't want to live here". Ramsey wants Edmontonians who pay taxes to feel that they "paid for (their) needs being met."



Lance White was the second last speaker. He believes his strengths lay in experience, energy and balance. White feels that the fundamental thing that Edmonton lacks is confidence. "Opportunities are here," says White, "we just don't say it. White says "we must start convincing ourselves before we start convincing those in Toronto, Montreal, and New York. He looks to create an "added value" system. This means "instead of shipping out raw grains, we can ship out pasta." White ended by voicing his plan to

reduce Edmonton's unemployment rate through a program called JOB START. The program "focused on helping young people earn that first critical line on their resume."



Paul Earley was the final speaker at the noon hour forum. Earley began by proclaiming his self as a multi-tradesman. He said he didn't want to "stand up and mouth off a bunch of rhetoric." Earley denounced having "flash" or "glitter." He says he's just an "ordinary guy," a "working guy" who is running because he didn't like what he was hearing from the other candidates. Earley says he "only brought up the Airport Issue to point out how stupid these others are thinking!"

After Earley was cut off by the mediator at the five minute mark, a fifteen minute question period was allowed.

## Instrumentators, International Winners

NAIT students are international champions.

An instrumentation team consisting of five NAIT graduates travelled to New Orleans, on Monday, October 2, to compete in an International Student Competition sponsored by the International Society for Measurement and Control (ISA).

There, the team consisting of Troy Robillard, James Churchill, Peter Hamlett, Mike Perron and Trent Stang won first place in bowl competition and second place in the practical competition. IPN from Mexico City took first place in the practical.

This is the second time a NAIT team has made it to the international level in instrumentation. They are one of only two teams from Canada qualified to go. Last year, the NAIT team won the bowl and the practical competitions.

The competition consists of a family-feud-like segment (less the family) called "the bowl" where two teams go head to head, responding to questions on theory and practice.

The practical segment consists of each team being given a set time period to solve a problem and their performance is then evaluated on the basis of quality, accuracy, and solution explanation.

Mike Perron says the team is thrilled and would like to thank coach John St. George who is an instructor at NAIT. Perron says, "he did a wonderful job."

Many student's do not know what instrumentators do. Instrumentation is a lot like making beer.

Instrumentation involves the measurement and control of industrial systems. Similarly, making beer involves many of these systems. During the brewing process the temperature has to be carefully controlled by certain systems. After brewing, a precise amount has to be put into cans or bottles, the number of bottles counted, the number of cases kept track of and so on. All of these processes are maintained by instrumentation. Besides beer making, instrumentation also has applications in a wide variety of fields ranging from oil and chemical food.

# General Council

NAIT's population is affected once again. Last week the latest General Council meeting was held. It was rather quick and dirty. The meeting was actually well attended. All technologies showed. The following will basically be a readers digest form of what happened. Many issues were brought out in the open, including the infamous "POSTER ISSUE." There are to be no posters on painted surfaces or glass. If any posters are found on these surfaces, they will be removed immediately. Hold on, it gets even scarier. Any technology found violating the rules will be put in bad standing. The technology will lose all privileges. When a technology's poster is approved by Naita, the technology must provide Naita two tickets to the event. Naita executives will check the event to ensure all regulations are met.

**Section 6.08.4 Article (d) changes from:**

*Dereliction of duty or misconduct - unanimous approval by the remaining Executive Council members shall be sufficient to remove a member of Executive Council from office for improper or indiscreet conduct or neglect of duty;*

to:

*Dereliction of duty or misconduct - unanimous approval by the remaining Executive Council members or a seventy five (75) percent majority vote by General Council from office for improper or indiscreet conduct or neglect of duty;*

It will be presented two more times in General Council before a motion will be made.

Lastly, the Naita Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held Thursday, October 12 at 12:15 p.m. in the Naitrium. Everybody is welcome.

# Quotas Reduced for Health Techs

The NAIT Health Sciences Department is shrinking. Over the last four years the student quotas in some technologies have been cut 50%.

Specifically the Medical X-Ray, Medical Respiratory and Medical Laboratory technologies have been down-sized. One reason for this is hospitals indirectly control the quotas for the health technologies at NAIT.

Due to the need for hands-on training in

the medical technologies, cooperative training takes place with various hospitals around Edmonton. Since most hospitals are coping with major cutbacks, quotas for NAIT students have been reduced in accordance with overall healthcare downsizing. The job outlook in Alberta is pretty bleak for Medical X-ray, Respiratory and Medical Lab Technicians.

Dean of Health Sciences Nelson J. Kennedy says, "We train students for a worldwide economy." NAIT students are accredited across Canada and the United States.

Since most hospitals are coping with major cutbacks or else closing down, quotas for NAIT students have been reduced in accordance with overall healthcare downsizing world wide and students are well aware their careers will probably begin outside Alberta.

So what is NAIT doing to compensate for the downsizing?

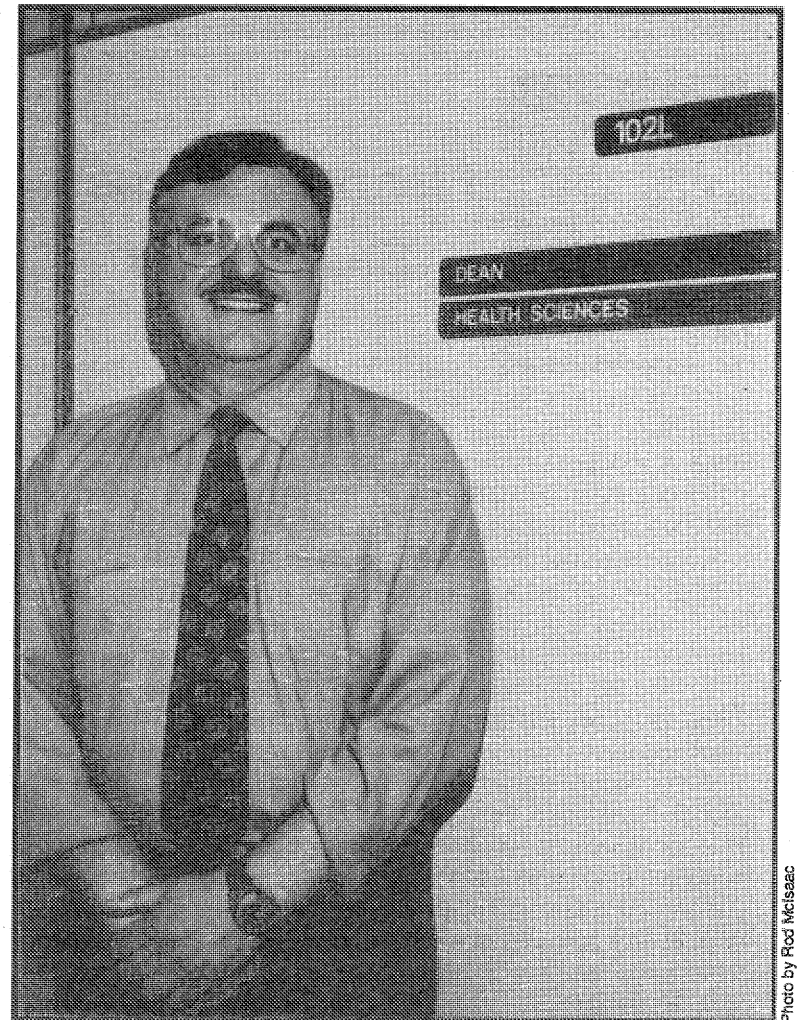
Training a multi-skilled healthcare professional is one idea as well, "NAIT is actively pursuing

change." Certain courses would be universal for all the healthcare technologies.

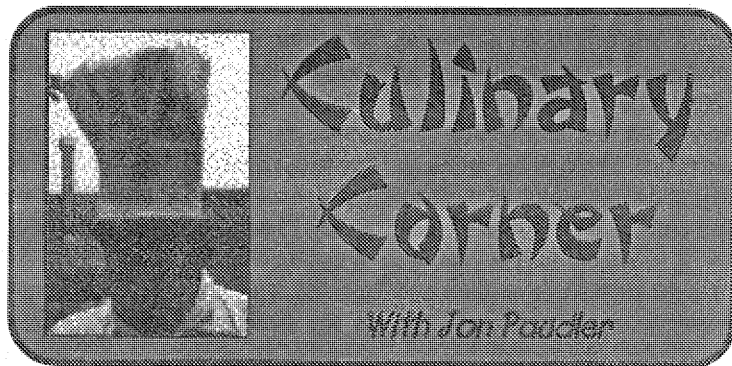
For the first time ever NAIT and SAIT are co-operating to form a health sector advisory committee which was set up to direct the health sciences.

Finally, the government had introduced *Key Performance Indicators* (KYIs) which are like report card which evaluate a department's performance based on student demand, graduate placement, cost for training, retention rate and student/ employer satisfaction.

I was reading the other day that 89% of all surveyed schools, colleges and universities in (North) America have incorporated a cafeteria policy where at least one meal daily is available to vegetarians and/or lacto-ovarian vegetarians. That is a lot of lettuce and rice. Years ago, if you went to any establishment of reputation, say Macdonalds, or Wendy's or some equally classy operation and asked for a vegetarian meal, they probably would have called in the militia and have you forcibly removed.

(But you've got to look presentable - no cutup jeans and T shirts.) And did you know that the instructor there is a confirmed vegetarian and has

Anyway, you get the picture. Food is happening at Nait. Good food. Nutritious food. Healthy food. Mind you, not health food, yecch, pfui, gag me with a spoon. But good food, nevertheless. Go check it out.

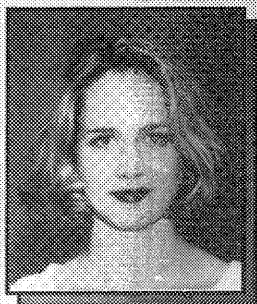

NAIT's departments are separated. There are so many people training in so many different areas that students don't develop a common identity.

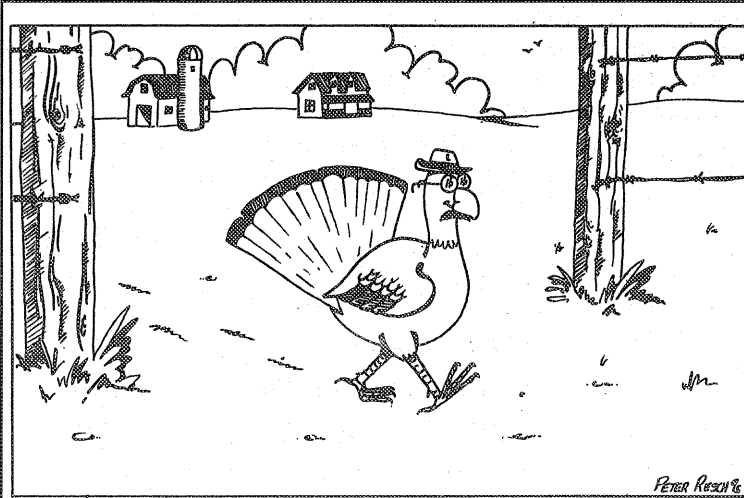

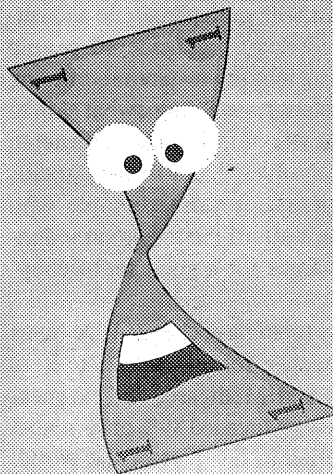

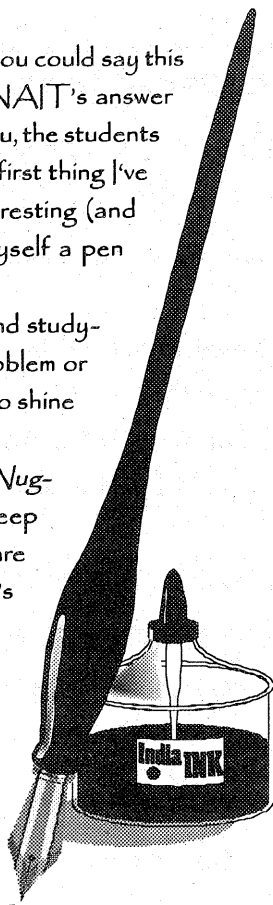

# Net Controversy

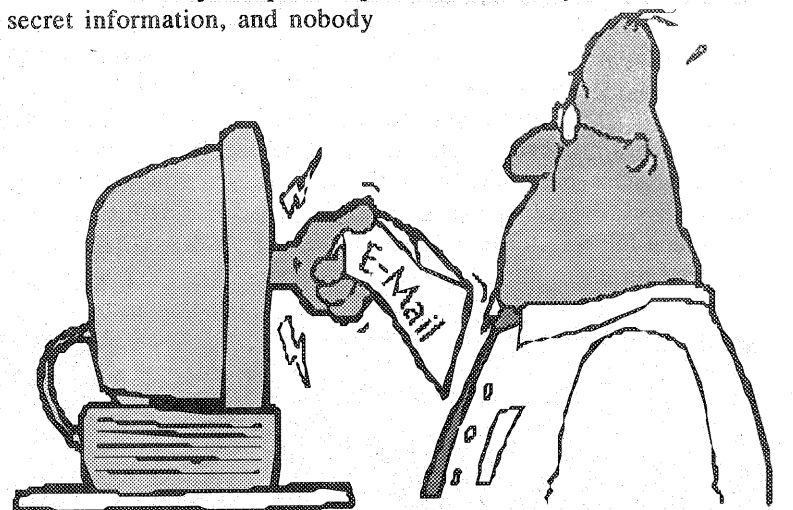

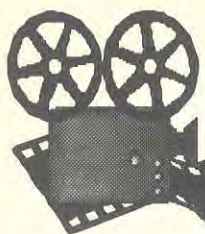

3 out of 4 Nuggets.



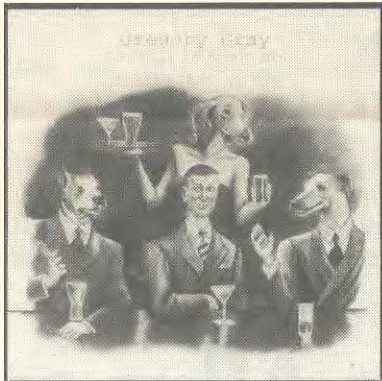
# Capsule CD Reviews

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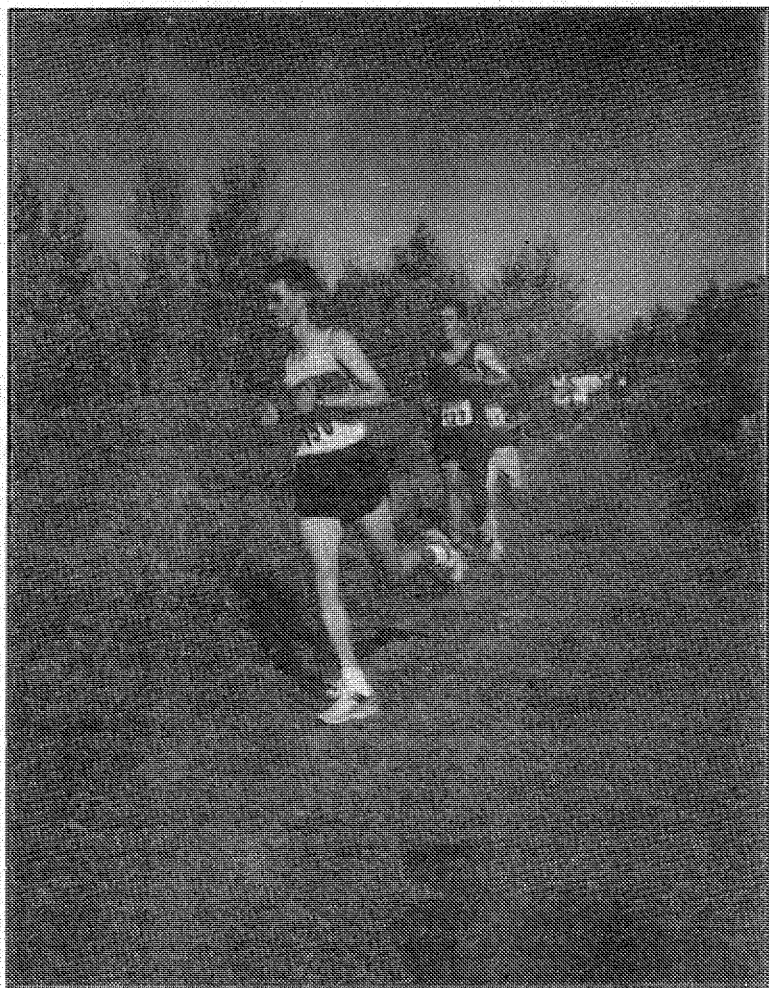
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# NAIT Cross-Country Run Draws 80 Runners
