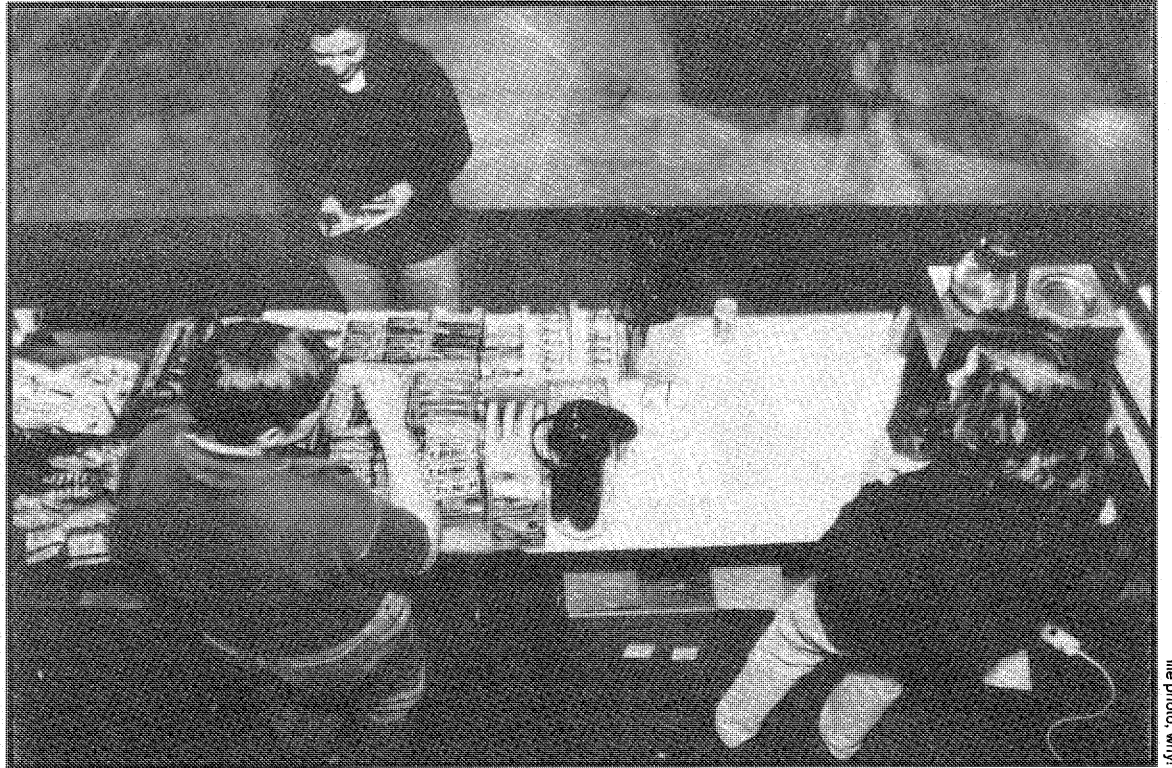
who is she seeing? Well, it seems that she just can't get away from men with regal titles.

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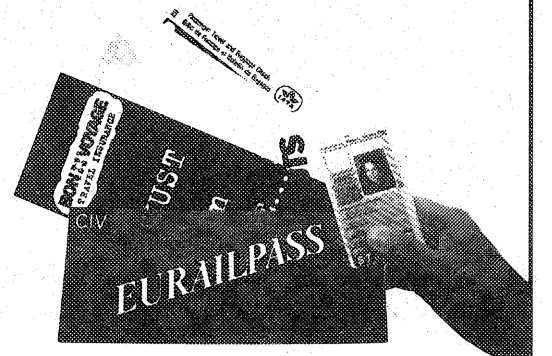
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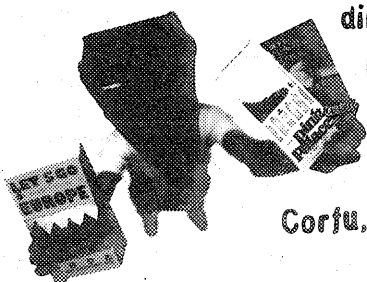
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Quick News From Around The World

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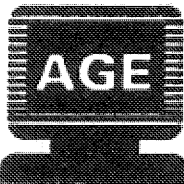
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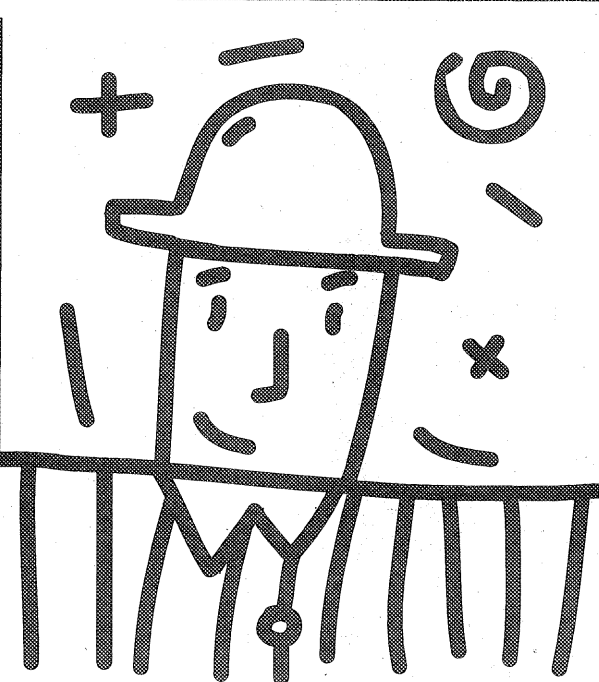
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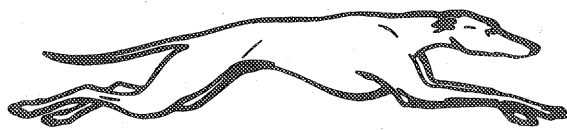


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STUDENTS' UNION A SHAMBLES

My point exactly.

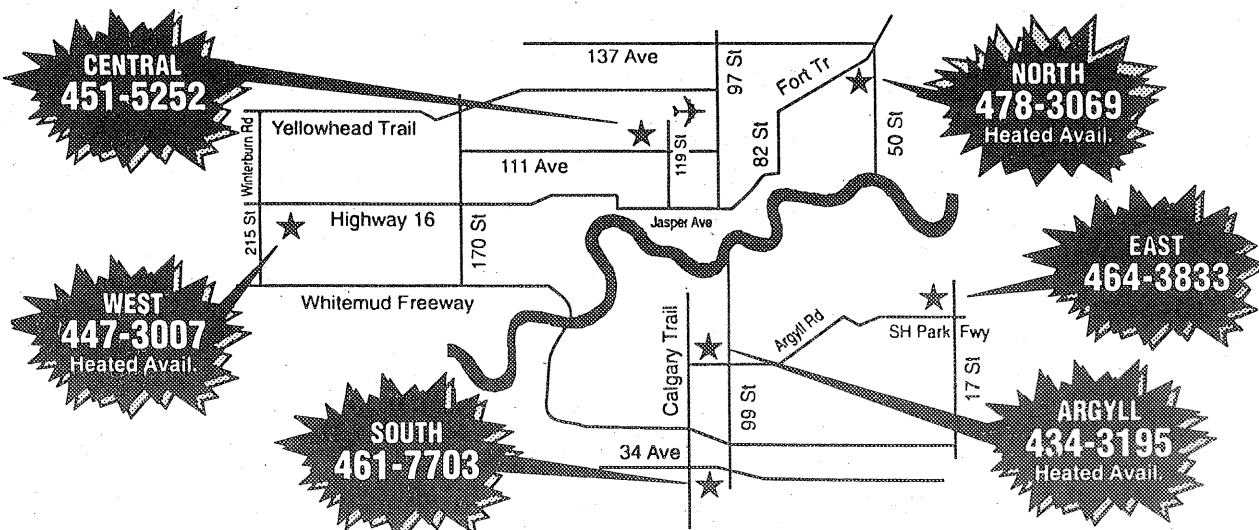
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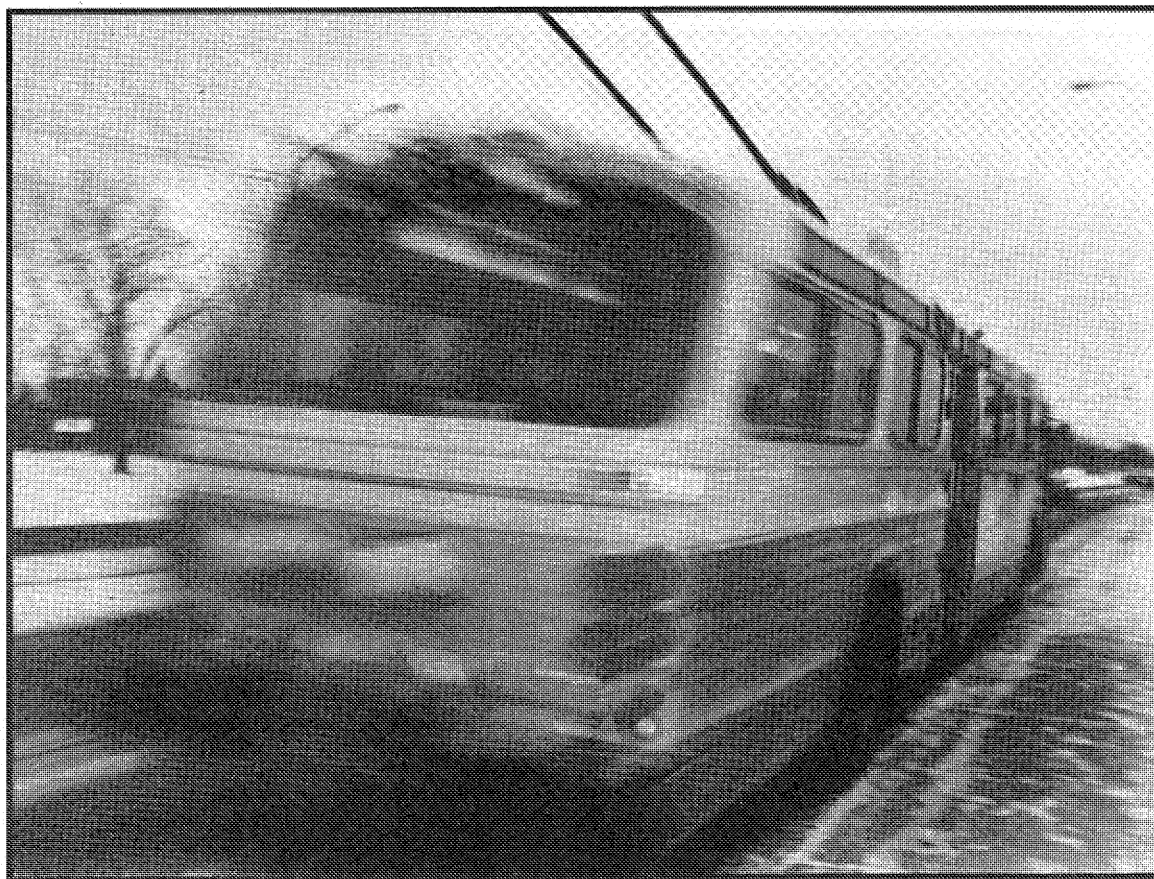
Something interesting Finally happens at Westwood Campus!

Resume Response Rebuttal

This is a response to W.H. (Bill) Fricker from first year business administration concerning the style of resumes being taught in Bus. Comm. 121. I had mentioned that I did not feel adequately prepared for entering the work force this summer with my resume as it was, so I took it to the counseling office to get it critiqued. It got critiqued right into the nearest garbage can. For those of you that actually read the articles in the Nugget, you will remember the article. Anyway, the response that I got from Mr. Fricker (Assistant Program Head for first year Business Administration) was that I was wrong and that "A resume is like beauty in that its value is uniquely determined by the beholder." Well I don't know about the rest of you people out there, but I don't want a "beautiful" resume, I want an effective resume that will set me apart from the hundreds of other people who I am in competition with for that dream job. I didn't come to NAIT to get a job, I came

here to get a career; so I need a resume that sets me apart from those people who want a job. The underlying lesson here — while standards of resume writing exist, it is the instructors responsibility; therefore NAIT's responsibility, to teach me how to prepare a resume that will set me apart in the brutal job market.

I do not have the luxury of time to sift through all the sources of resume information out there so I have to rely on NAIT instruction to show me the way. When I got a perfect score on my resume I considered it to be good enough for the business world and I shouldn't have to question it.

Mr. Fricker had the resources to check out my claims with the counseling office and they endorsed the book we were taught directly out of and that the book is consistent to what the prospective employers are looking for, but he also states that the older style of resume may be more widely accepted. So now who do I believe? The previous statement contradicts everything that NAIT represents; that is to provide qual-

ity career education while providing its students with up to day, cutting edge resources that serve the needs of the economy. To expand on that statement, I also must question the frequency of course validation and examination of resume preparation. The last time these things were examined was in 1991. Well, 1991 was a generation ago. Since then, hairstyles, clothes, food choices, and lifestyles have changed dramatically; I would think that resumes have also changed since then and that the style of resume that is generally accepted may also have changed. I also question the statement that was made about the fifteen companies that were researched who employed our grads and in response I ask, can fifteen companies who provided information on employability dictate how my resume as a business student should be prepared? This letter and my previous letter are not a person dig to any one person or department in particular here at NAIT, all I am trying to get across is that the establishment should take a step back and maybe listen to what the students have to

say and not sugar coat issues by quoting high statistics about NAIT grads and the success of NAIT as a whole, but to listen to an individual student's views and try to fix the problem. I realize that I am only one person, but the responses that I have received about resume preparation is one of general consensus in that the students are now taking there resumes to other sources to get them critiqued. This response tells me something is wrong, maybe it should do the same for the people who can change things.

Further to my response letter about resume preparation in BUS 121, I have received another, anonymous letter on the same subject. The writer appears serious about his or her education and I appreciate the effort to provide me a copy before publication of your last issue.

I have evaluated the comments in this letter, and now feel that the only way to resolve the issue is through face-to-face dialogue. Thank you.

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Due to organizational changes at NAIT, many instructors may not be able to submit their 1996 Fall requisitions in time for the buyback approval of books on April 15. Books have to be adopted for the 1996-1997 school term in order to be considered for the April Buyback. Check from time to time to see if your textbooks are on the buyback list.

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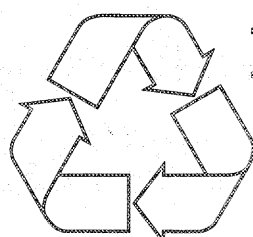
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Fifty percent of the current Bookstore price exclusive of GST will be offered for eligible books. Eligible books are determined by instructors requisitions for the 1996 Fall Term. No purchase receipt is necessary.

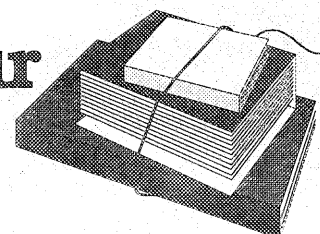
For books that are not eligible at the time of the buyback, an offer of about ten to twenty-five percent may be made depending on whether the book is active on our wholesale book list. These books will be sold to a wholesaler for shipment to another college.

Generally, no offers are made for old editions, out of print books, or books containing disks.

Since only Fall Term books are being considered for the fifty percent buyback, students may want to take a chance and wait for the Winter buyback at the end of November before trying to sell their Winter Term books. There is no guarantee, however, that these books will be eligible at that time.

Anyway, if you've reached this point I thank you. I don't mean to "preach", I just want every student to look back with fond memories and have a bright future.



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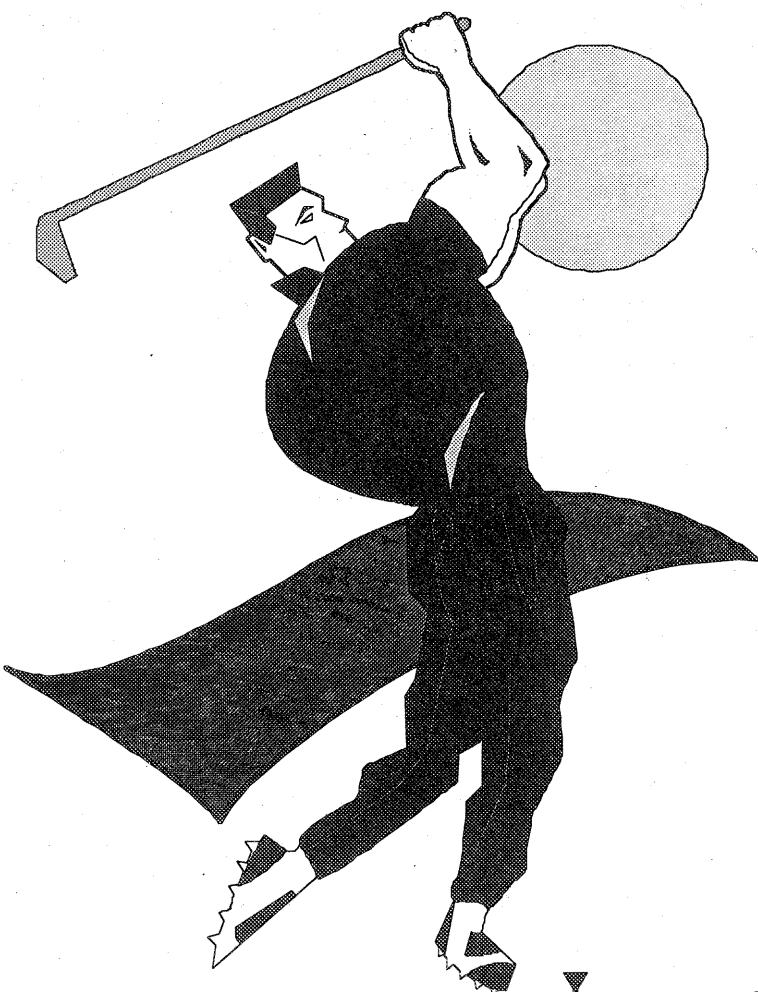
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NAIT takes Seconds at the CMA Bus Comp in Calgary

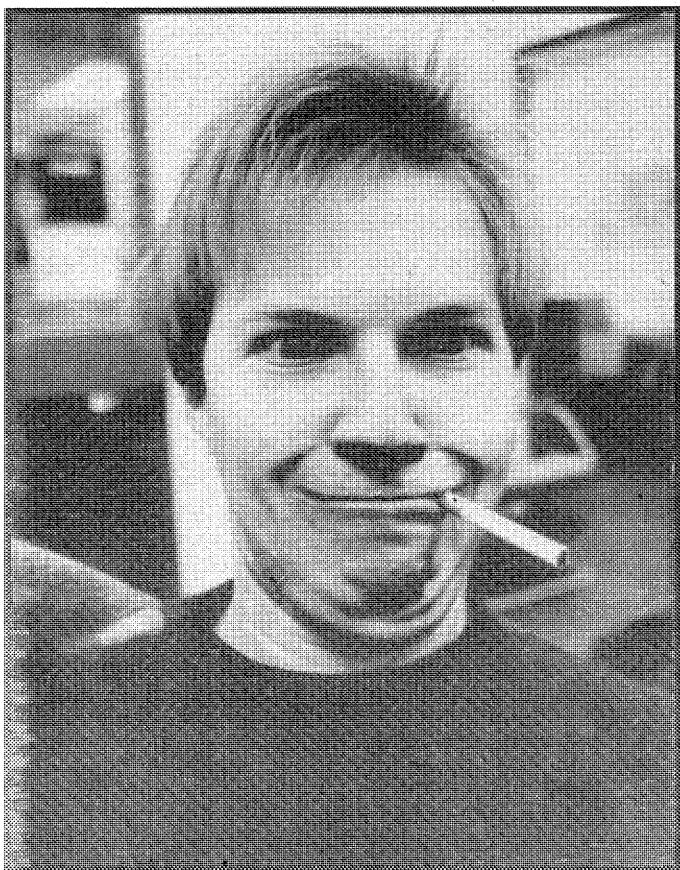

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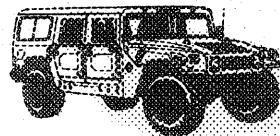

in his book "1984", where Big Brother regulates our actions, thoughts, words, and opinions?

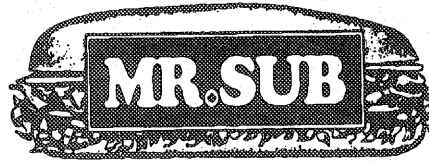
Has the Constitution gone out of date and someone failed to inform me about the new change? Nevertheless, Alex Machine will continue to report the facts as they happen.

The NAIT Ooks hockey team are once again the best in Canada. The Ooks complete a dream season winning the Canadian College Hockey Championships last weekend in Kitchener, Ontario. NAIT downed the Cambrian Golden Shield 7-5 and 6-2 to sweep the best of three championship final

With the series sweep of Cambrian, the team enjoyed a day off in Toronto visiting the Hockey Hall of Fame.

The Ooks will leave their mark on the Hall of Fame as 1996 Canadian College Hockey Champions.

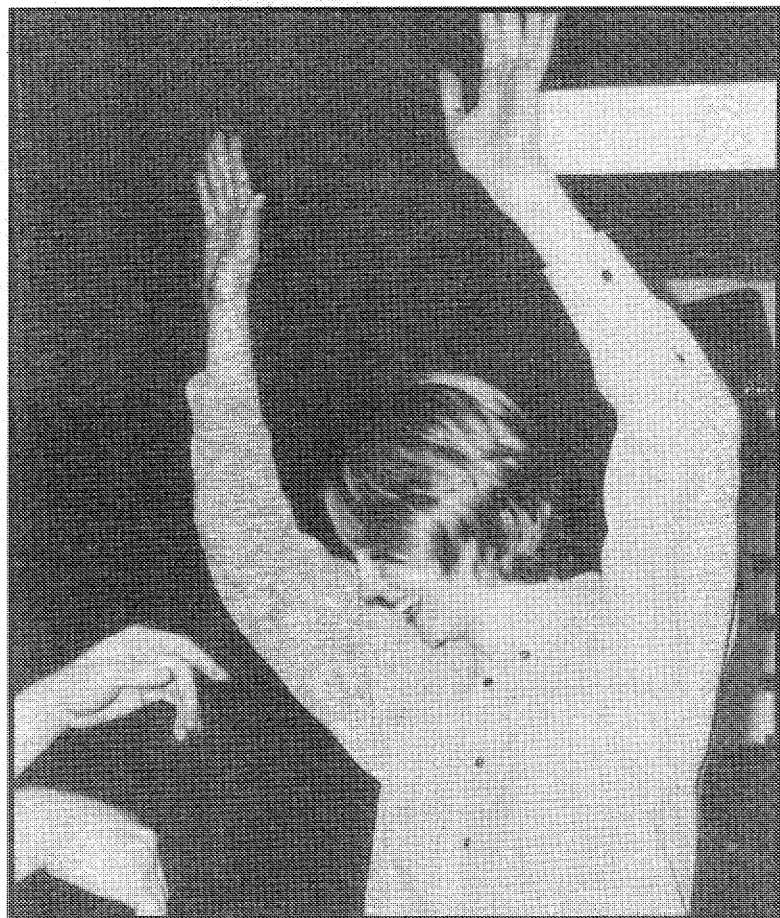

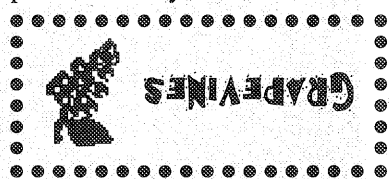
