## Feeling blue - relief may be on the way

As the days start to get longer, and the sun spends more time in the sky, more and more people will start to brighten up. They may be victims of Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD). Symptoms begin as the days get shorter, when fall works through to winter, and does not let up until the onset of spring and summer. Sufferers complain of flu like aches and pains as well as extreme lethargy. This can be combined with disturbed sleep, depression, anxiety, irritability and hopelessness.

For an estimated 500,000 people, functioning normally in the winter is nearly impossible.

It is thought to be caused by a lack of sunlight energy passing along the retinohypothalamic tract from the eye to the brain. In particular, it affects the hypothalamus. The hypothalamus is the part of the brain that regulates sleep, mood, appetite, sex drive and most body functions. The energy from sunlight stimulates the production of certain chemicals which controls the levels of these

areas. Too little sunlight, and the activity within the hypothalamus will slow. This in turn affects the

activity of the mind and body. SAD is now a recognized form of depression

that occurs during the months of winter. There is help though.

Treatment of SAD first began in the United Kingdom in 1984, at the Maudsley and Charing Cross Hospitals in London. Patients were exposed to bright lights which simulate natural sunlight. It was found that within three or four days of specific treatment, patients recovered remarkably. Further treatments showed that over 80% of SAD sufferers responded well to the phototherapy. Light boxes are available

for patients to purchase, ranging from 340-580 dollars. These boxes enable the patients to continue their own treatments outside the clinic. For those patients that cannot afford the light boxes, it is suggested that they spend as much time outdoors as possible, especially on bright sunny days. There are also new anti-depressants that will restore the chemical balance needed for normal day to day living. Due to these new breakthroughs, sufferers no longer need to be miserable.

This year's SS Cruise Benefit featured a Thailand theme. As some may have noticed, just before the break, the main lobby was the scene of activities. Every year the events

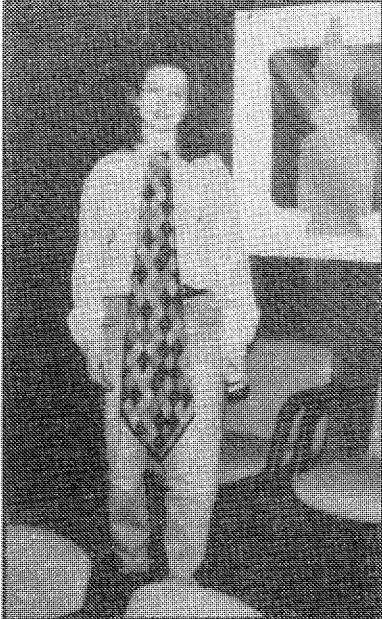

There are a lot of things that NAIT students can get cheaper, just by being a student. Many of the technologies offer services at a reduced rate, partly in order to gain practical experience, but also to offer convenience to the students and staff of NAIT. In particular, services are offered by Dental Technologies, Automotives, Animal Health, and Retail Meat Cutting. Although services are not extensive, they are nonetheless useful, and cheaper than if you went to a professional. Not

to mention the fact that you get just as good quality out of the work here.

Every new semester, Animal Health has its hands full filling time slots for neutering and spaying of animals. The demand is quite high, and once the bookings are available, all spots are filled within two hours. They also do dental work on animals, and vaccinations. All this is provided for a service charge of only ten dollars. That ten dollars goes back into NAIT funding.

In the Automotive Technologies, almost any kind of work can be done. Services range from tune-ups to engine rebuild, Brake systems to steering alignment. For all of their services, The only cost is parts and a minimal service charge. Services range between a cost of ten dollars to one-hundred dollars. However,

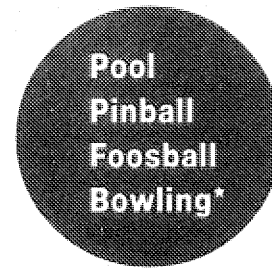

being mature and serious." My friends agreed with me, and even though they're already goofs, they... umm... we resolved to take life as it comes, and make it even better than it is already.

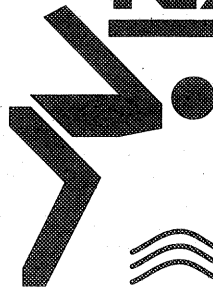

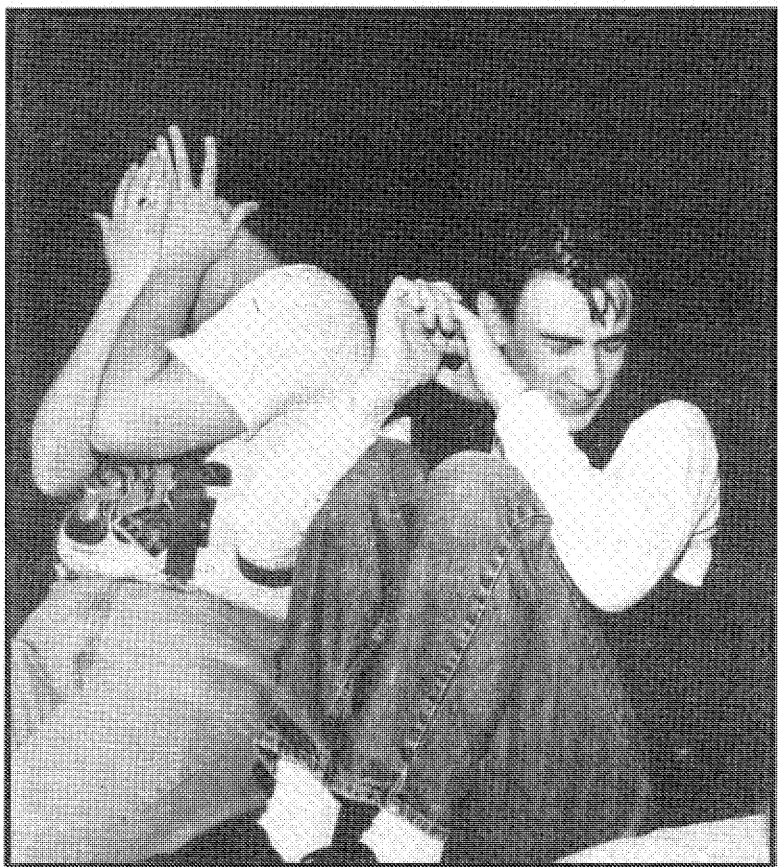
## FOR THOSE WHO MISSED IT

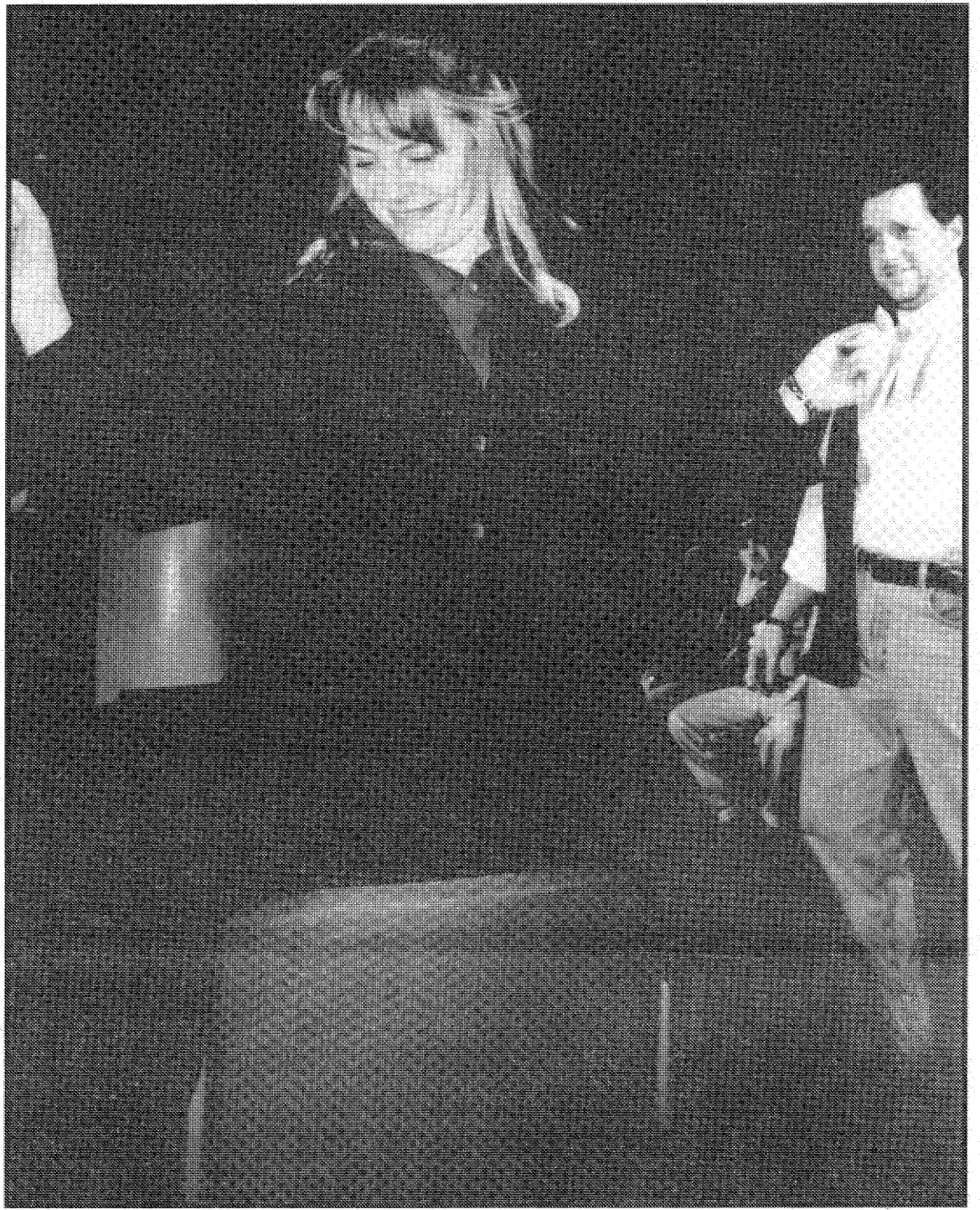

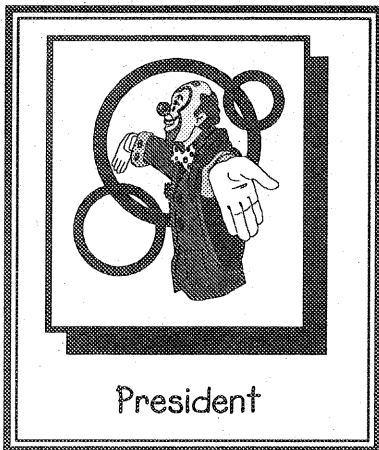

several external organizations.

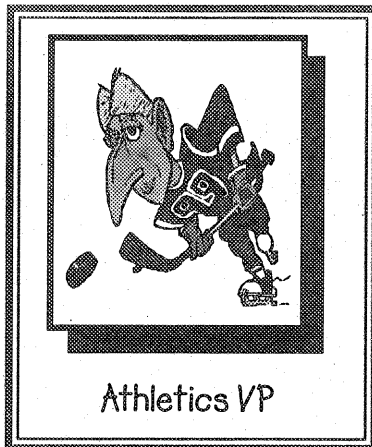
There will always be plenty to keep you busy as you automatically will sit on several committees such as Grad Committee, Awards Night, ACTISEC, and the Publications Board. In addition to these, you will be asked to represent students on several other committees throughout the year.

You will see an organization function and have a chance to view how group dynamics can affect the successes that NAIT will have.

As the President you are the leader of this dynamic group and have to pull them together so that any events that occur throughout the year are a smashing success. Occasionally, with these successes come setbacks and you may find yourself wondering what you got yourself into.

In the end, it will be by far the best learning experience NAIT may have to offer to complement your formal education.

If you want to experience this and want to know a little more about NAITSA and what you will be getting yourself into, stop in the office and talk to any of the current executives.



This position deals with the coordination of Intramurals and the promotion of NAIT Intercollegiate Athletics. You are required to sit on the Athletic Board, which meets every 2 weeks to discuss changes and improvements to the Athletic program. The Athletic Board also handles the funds for t-shirts and prizes, and promotion of Intramural and Intercollegiate Athletics.

Promotion of the ACAC games is an additional duty.

The Athletics VP chairs the Intramural Committee which meets monthly to discuss different events and issues with all technology representatives. This committee discusses what's happening in intramurals for the month and if there are any improvements to be made. Outside of the Intramural Committee, you are responsible for hiring officials for intramural events. This also includes the Ook mascot. The Ook mascot is needed for all games on campus and promotional events. It can be difficult to find reliable people for these jobs.

The distribution and deposit of recycle bins is a responsibility of this position. You will be required to keep track of all recycle bins as well as the maintenance of these bins by the technology who is responsible.

Other duties include:

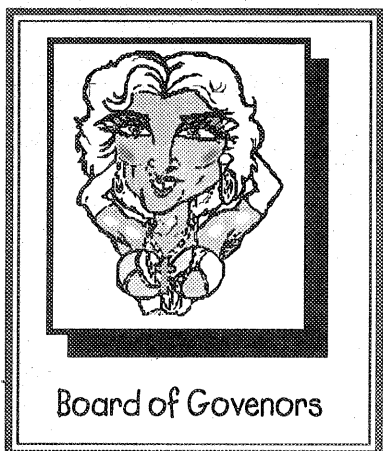

As the Communications VP, you would be responsible for maintaining up to date records on each technology's constitution and the bylaws that govern them.

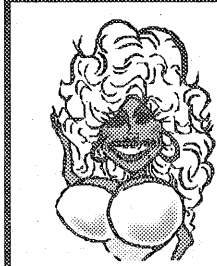

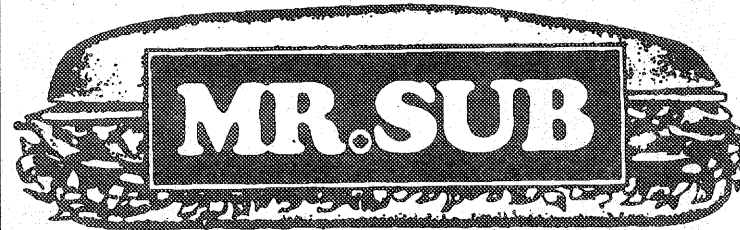
Academic/Finance VP

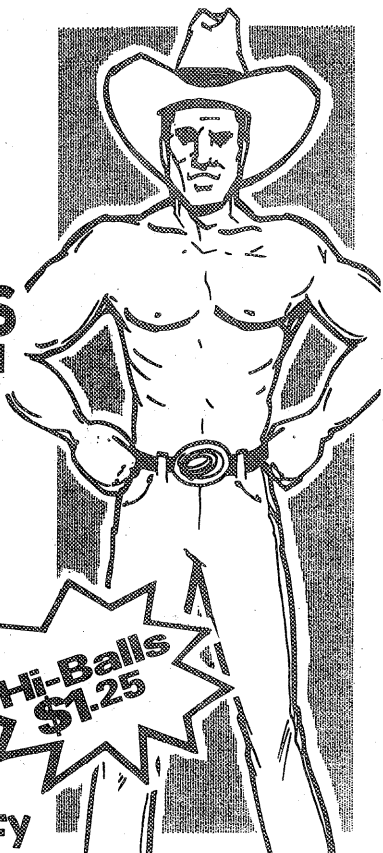

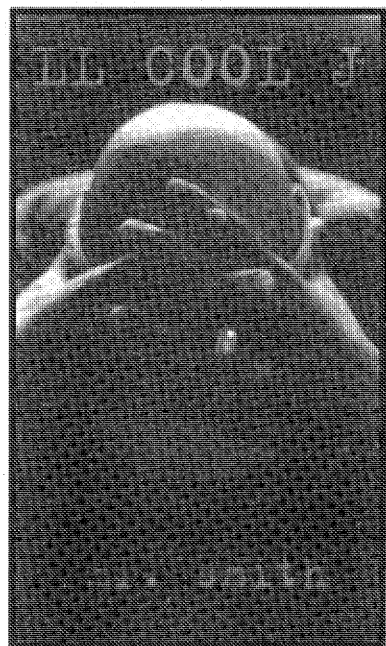
## L.L. Cool J — Mr. Smith

The losses this weekend startled NAIT out of their cozy 2nd place spot but didn't cost them the

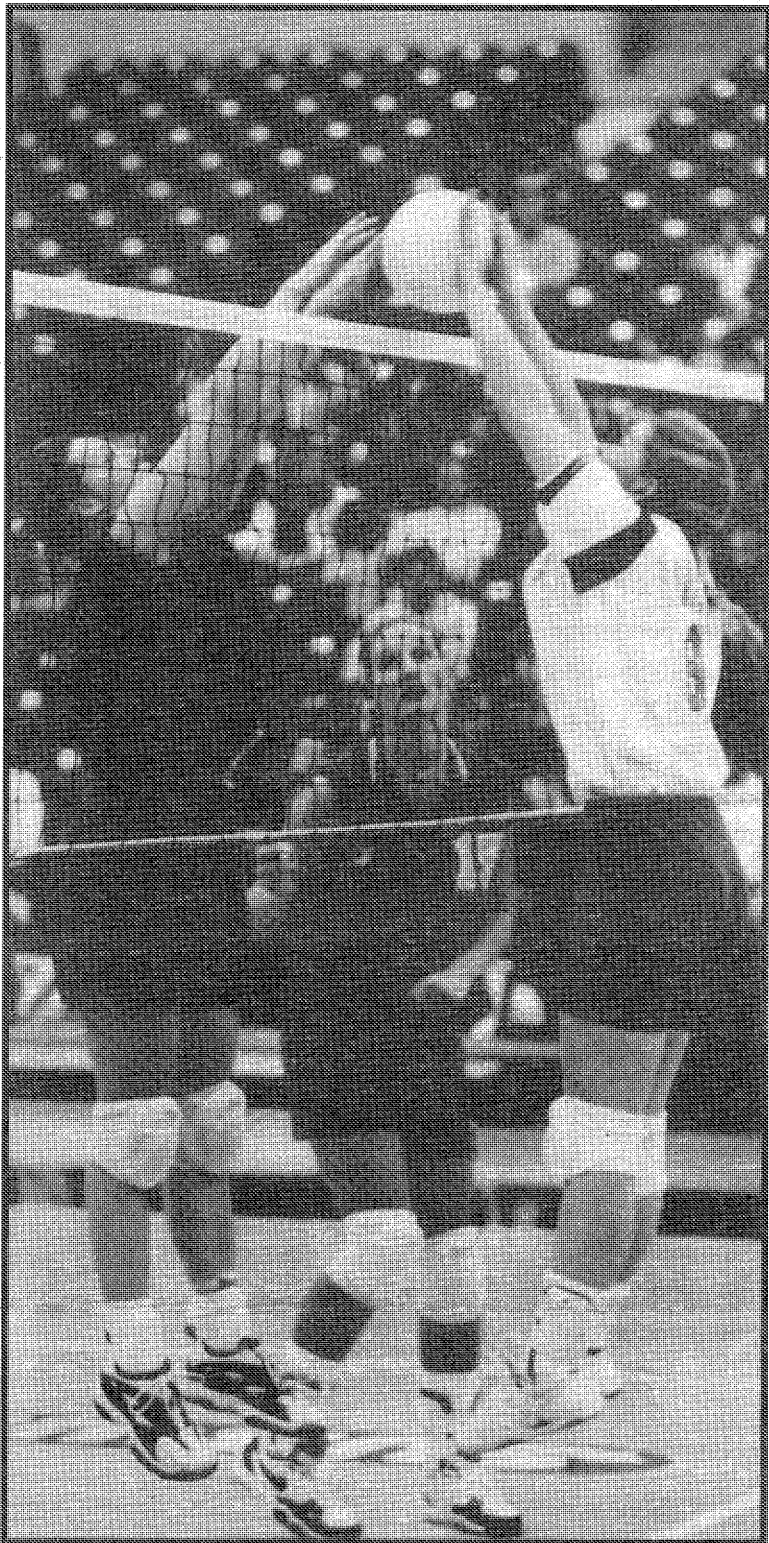
