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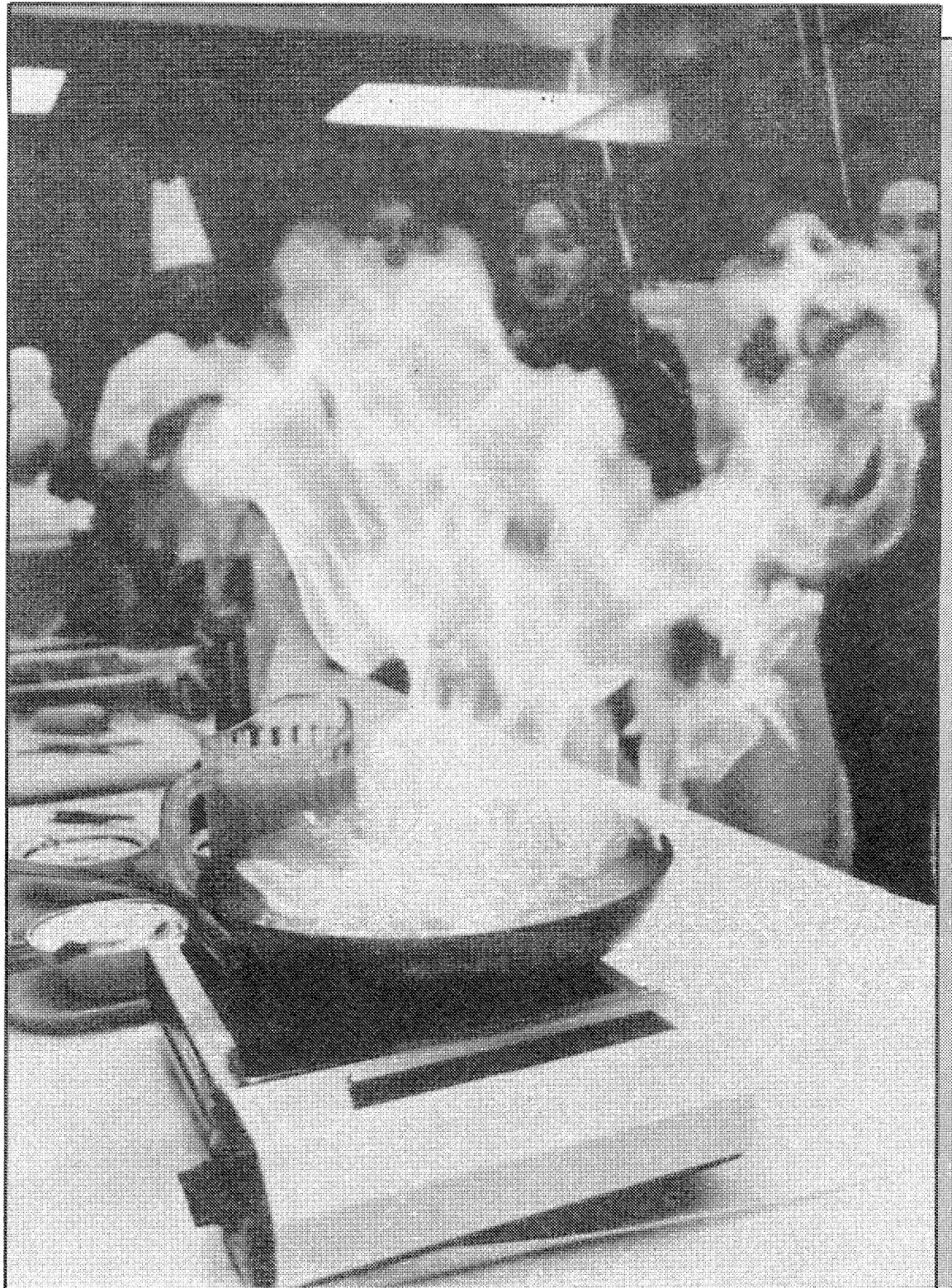

In Memory

Death is a hard thing to accept and to live with. Many of NAIT's students have felt this at one time or another. It is even harder, when a loved one is taken away before their time. And although vehicles are being made with more and more standards to follow, it has been proven that they cannot always save a life. Almost two weeks ago, Friday, March 2, this simple fact became a stark reality for two families. As was published earlier by the Edmonton Journal, twenty-year-

old Diana Towers, and her fiancé eighteen-year-old Donald MacEachern were involved in such an accident. Diana's twin sister Christine, an engineering student here at NAIT, must now live with this tragedy. It can only be said that this is one of life's most unfair moments. To live without a loved one is traumatic. To live without a twin must be psychologically staggering. This article is in memory of Diana and Donald, and a notice for Christine that she has friends here at NAIT.

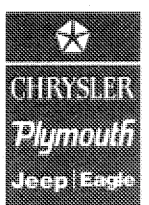
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Jailed 'n' Bailed

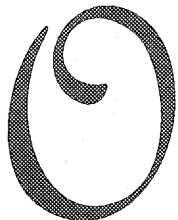

It is still tax time, but have you filled out your return yet? For a lot of students, taxes are fairly basic. You may have just one T-4, and one form from NAIT for your education credits. But when you get into RRSP's, Scholarships, Student Loans, and multiple T-4's it can get quite confusing. If you don't have someone that is well versed in tax preparation, you should find one. It makes things easier on yourself, and decreases the chances of making a mistake (it may also give you a higher return).

This time of year, many companies set up small cubicles in the shopping malls just for tax preparation. Watch out though, their prices may be a little high. A good bet is to go to H&R Block. Sure, sure, you've heard all about them. But the truth is they are friendly, fast and efficient. They make sure you get the most out of your return. Their services are relatively inexpensive as well. For a basic preparation, the cost to you is about forty dollars. That might seem a little high if you're not getting a lot of money back though.

Another option is to get your taxes done by students. You may have noticed the classified add in last week's Nugget. Students in the Accounting and Finance courses are volunteering to prepare your tax return for you. They are prepared to do basic tax returns free of charge! If you haven't done your taxes yet, call them before the end of March if

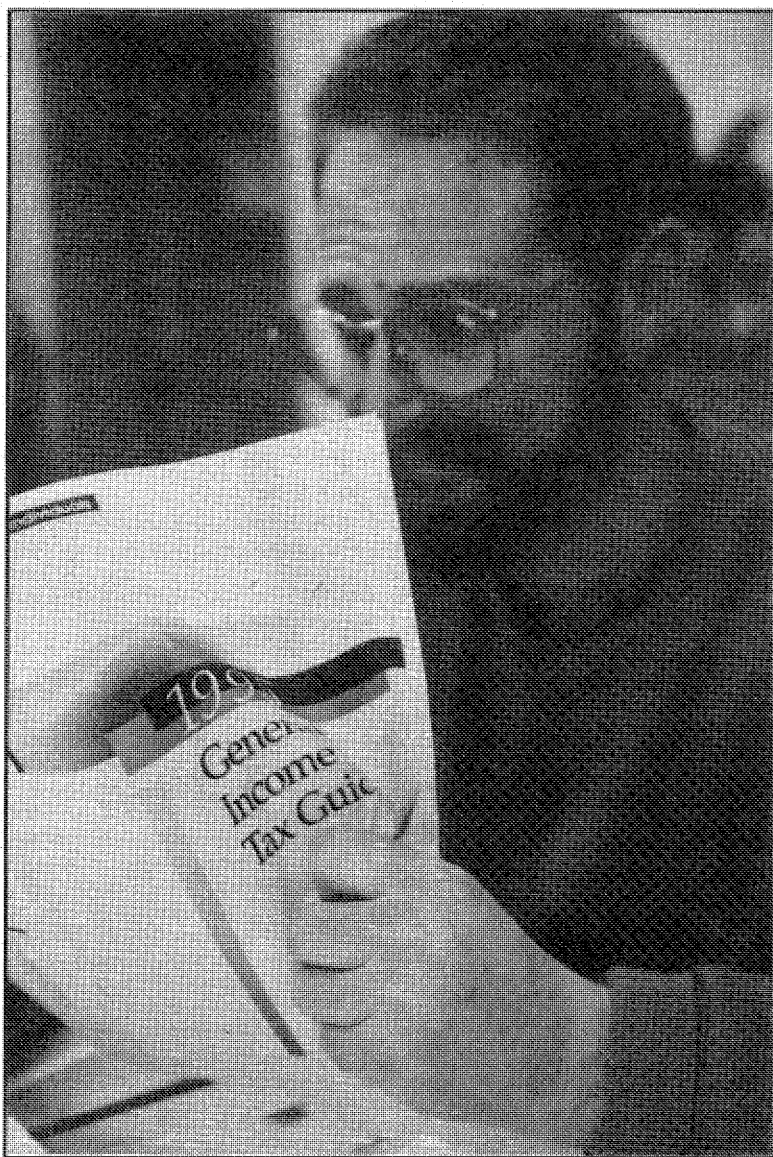

first year of this service, and your involvement will dictate its return next year.

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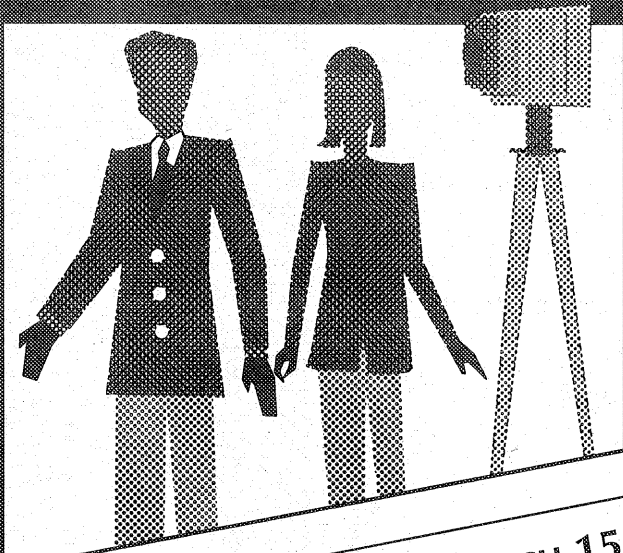

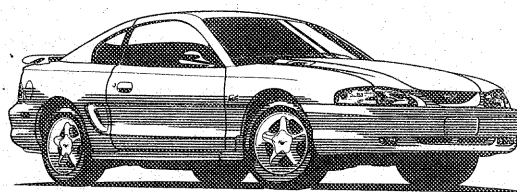

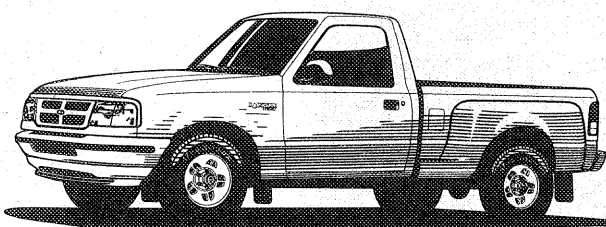

This employment agency will even mail them potential resumes - for free.

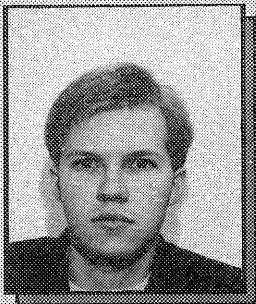
Try and get that kind of information at the University of Alberta.
