23 DOWN, 2 TO GO

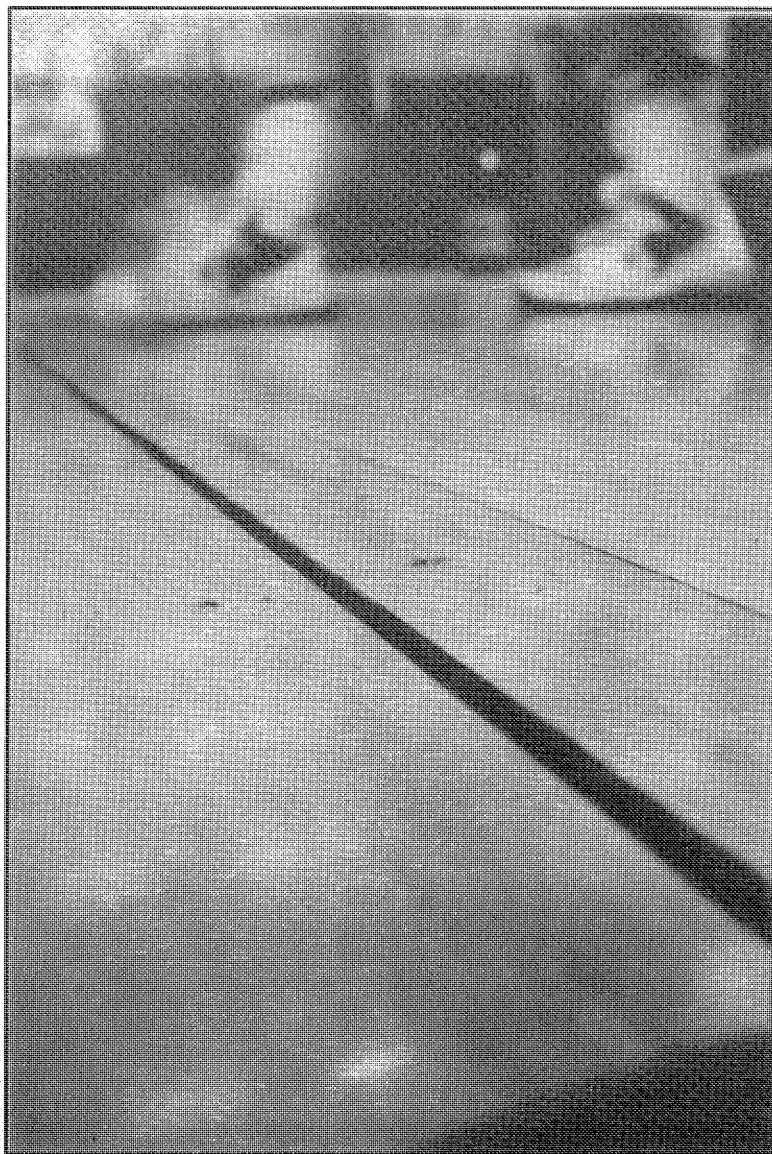

If you were at the General Council meeting of March 5, you would have heard a proposal for a new gymnasium. Take a look at the old gymnasium, and you will see why there is a need for a new one. The floor boards are separating and buckling, and there is not much that can be done about except for costly rebuilding. The floor has been repeatedly mud-jacked (pumping mud beneath the concrete floor) in order

to level the surface. The plan was put forth at the meeting by Reg Hodgson, Dean of Student Services, to commit the fifteen dollar per year from students to the building fund. For five years the account will collect these amounts each year from each of the students fees. At the end of the term, it will be decided if and how the new building will be put up.

The plan is initially to place it in the parking lot between the Activities Centre and the current gymnasium. What will go inside the new building? According to Doug Popowich, current Athletics VP and newly elected President, in addition to the new gym it could house a new

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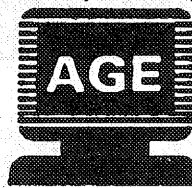
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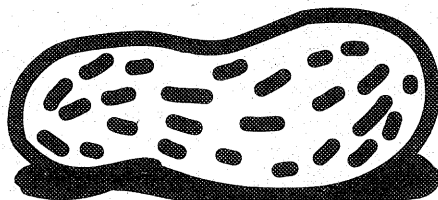


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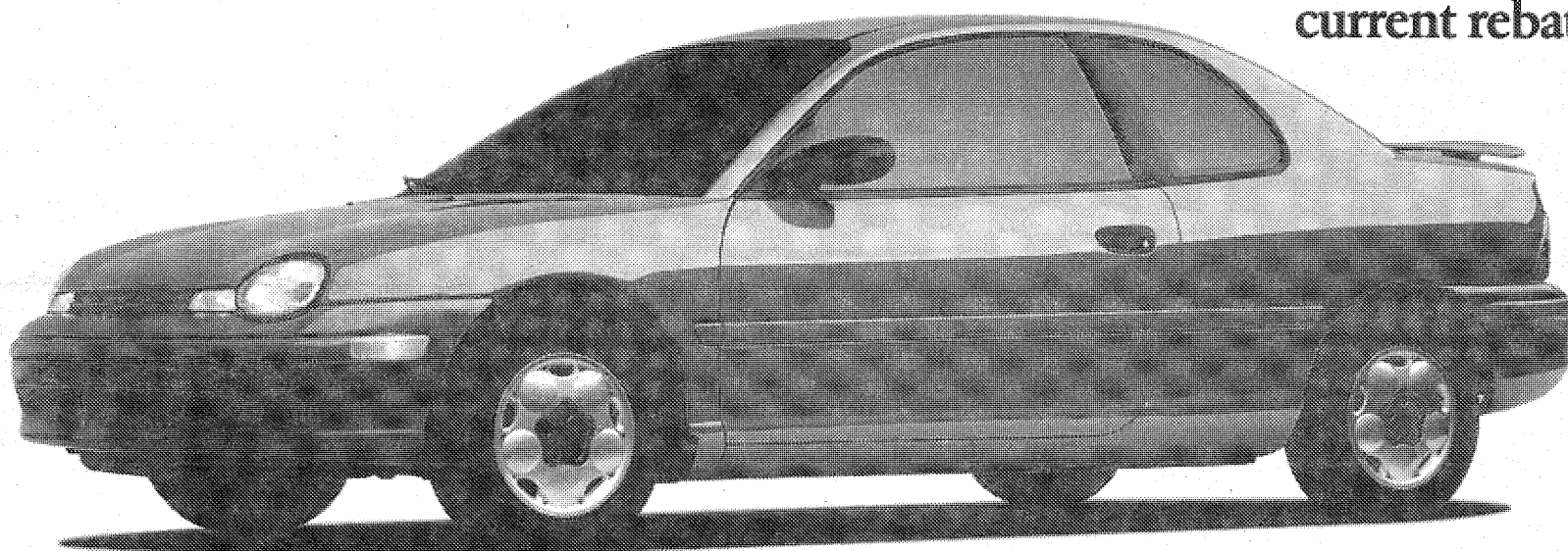
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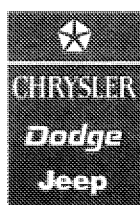
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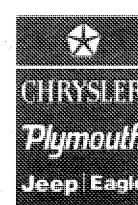
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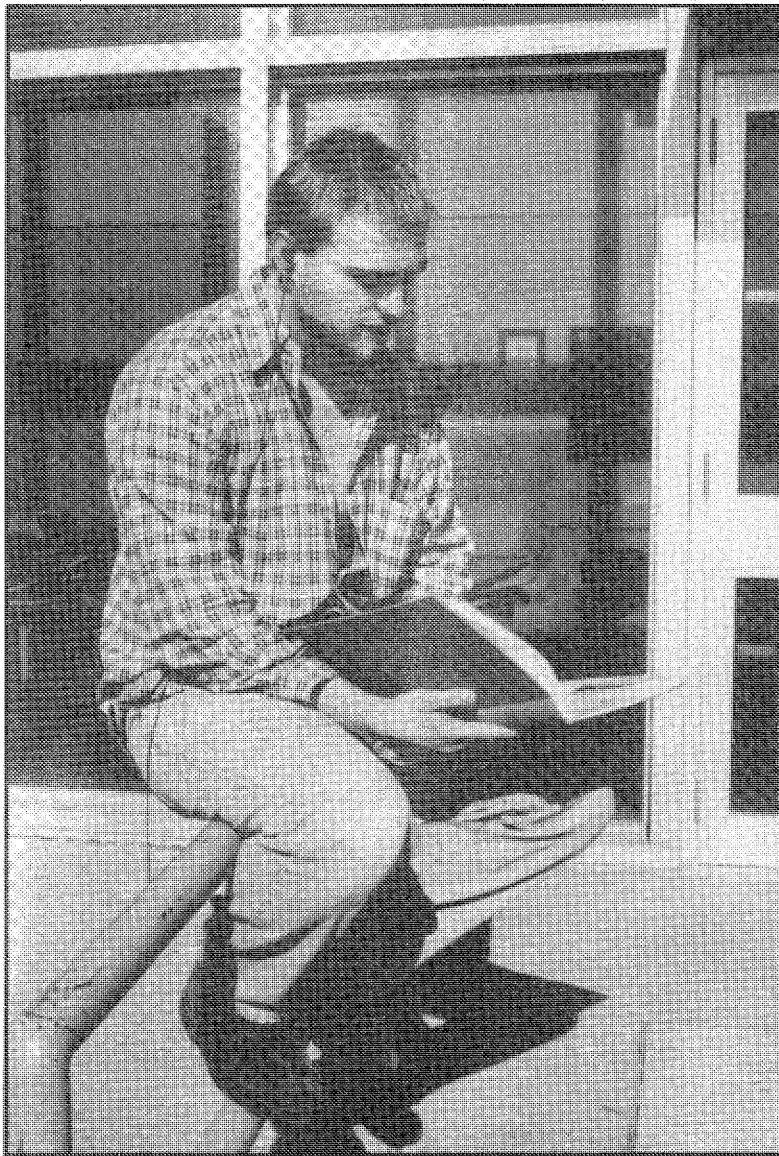
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Burning days are here again

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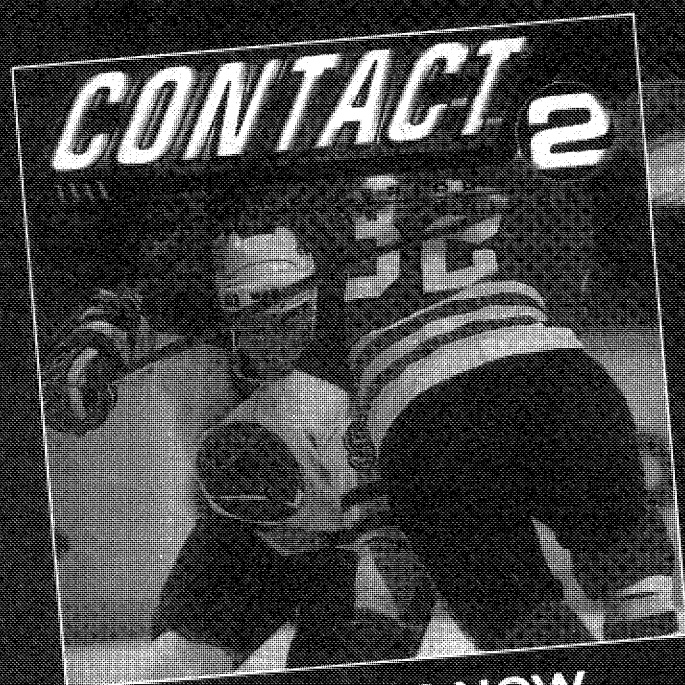
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Academic Council Address

Who are instructional assistants?

Instructional assistants are people hired by NAIT to aid instructors in teaching students.

Why are instructional assistants necessary?

NAIT, from the beginning, wants to provide people the best instruction to its students. Even with the low instructor to student ratio of less than 1 to 35, not all of the students' questions and other needs are being met. Instructional assistants answer questions, demonstrate in labs and has knowledge of using the latest equipment.

What are the Instructional Assistants' duties?

They may help answer questions, mark exams and papers, supervise the writing of exams and tests, and generally assist with instruction in a similar way to Educational Lab Technologist who may demonstrate the operation of sophisticated and dangerous equipment safely and efficiently. But they do not lecture in the classroom or labs. This will free up the instructor's time to do something else that will enhance the quality of instruction.

When will instructional assistants arrive?

Actually, NAIT has a handful of them already helping the hearing impaired. Hopefully, NAIT will have a few more I.A.'s by the fall.

What qualifications do the Instructional Assistants have?

The minimum qualifications are a high school diploma and two years of experience in a related field. Usually, I.A.'s will have more than this, and remember, that's just the minimum. NAIT values experience more than the formal education, because the experience of the I.A.'s gives NAIT students a hands-on instruc-

tion that is practical and helps the students get jobs. With the recent experience in the real world, they have expertise in operating the latest equipment.

The reason why the student representatives of Academic Council wanted to contact you through the Nugget is because we believe introduction of I.A.'s in NAIT should be of interest to students. It is our duty to represent your concerns of receiving the best education there is. We feel it is so important that we must have your direct input, because this is a major issue on academic quality. Resume Response

To the Editor:

This letter is in response to a story in your March 7, 1996 edition. An anonymous writer was critical of the resume teachings from Business Communications BUS 121. Because of the anonymity of the author, I can't address specifics, but I have some definite thoughts.

A resume is like beauty in that its value is uniquely determined by the beholder. The underlying lesson — while standards exist, no one style of resume will be best all the time. Any of the Business Communications instructors that I have spoken with or staff from the Counseling Department echo this opinion.

One specific detail from the article was the statement that the writer was "taught out of the book." Assuming this book to be our text by Guffey and Nagle, *Essentials of Business Communication*, First Canadian Edition, 1994, I re-examined our coverage of resume preparation. In Chapter 13, between pages 320 and 331, I found 17 specific references to the need for the resume writer to make strategic choices for both what to include and how to present it. Four traditional (chronological) resume samples are shown; each with subtle differences from the others. One functional resume is also offered.

Jerry Cossitt, Manager, Student Placement and Liaison, on March 8, stated that the Counseling Department will normally advise against the submission of functional resumes; he recommends a combination type. His opinion comes from contacts with some current, potential employers. Our text has similar advice when on page 331 it states, "... prospective employers are more accustomed to seeing the traditional resume. They might reject the newer functional approach simply because it is different." I also asked Jerry to review our text. He found a differing opinion with respect to the emphasis on restricting information to one page. Otherwise, there is nothing in our text that the Counseling Department doesn't support.

Like a signature, any resume must be personal. Taking strategic information from a text book and matching it with unique interests and background should produce a unique document. Sometimes such a document will appeal to the reader;

sometimes others' resumes will seem more appealing. For "real-world" feedback, students should try this — after submitting a resume and after the hiring decision has been made, contact the employer's representative and ask for his or her impressions.

With regard to observing our mission statement, a concern raised by this article, I offer the following. We validate our courses on a revolving basis and examined resume preparation and other course components in 1991. Representatives from fifteen companies who employ our diploma graduates met to contribute information focused on employability.

Our Instructional Publication IP#1765 contains a 10 page self analysis provided by the local office of an international business consulting firm. Further, our 1992 handbook offers brief coverage of resume preparation.

Our annual placement statistics of diploma graduates, even though challenging employment times, is an attractive feature that we offer to prospective students in our Information Sessions. On a larger scale, we provide Business Communications 121 to about 900 students annually. Further, NAIT provides business instruction to over 1/3 of business students in all of Alberta. In summary, with validation from industry, provision of current text choices, successful placement statistics, and our continuing presence as a major business educator in Alberta, we feel proud and confident that we are serving our mission statement: "The Northern Alberta Institute of Technology is dedicated to offering quality career education that fulfills the goals and expectations of students while serving the needs of the economy."

To meet our mission more fully, I urge the writer of the article to see his or her instructor, myself (471-7862; office T-600D), or Jerry Cossitt (471-8875; office O-111A). All of us are committed to protecting the anonymity of the student, if that condition is important. This offer should be considered open for acceptance any time — now, after finals, or even post-diploma.

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The Support Network; There is Help

Do you ever feel like the walls are closing in on you? Do you get really stressed to the point that you lose all control? Do you ever feel like you are all alone and that no one cares? Do you get angry and confused about things that are happening to you? Do you keep everything to yourself and bottle-up your true feelings and emotions? If you've said yes to any one of these questions, be aware of the consequences.

Suicide is a topic that people tend to ignore or just don't care to discuss because it is such a dark topic. It is not a common conversational topic, but there is something to be gained by discussing it and more importantly, something to be learned about. Every so often we hear about someone that couldn't cope or gave in to suicide because they did not know where to turn. You may recall the recent stories in the news about the young students in Leduc who chose to end it all by taking their lives. We hear stories like these in

the media, but these are just a minute fraction of the actual loss of life from suicide. The reality of it is that suicide has or will effect everyone at some point in their life to some degree.

For many students, problems exist such as exam stress, money worries, and alcohol or drug abuse. Alone or in combination, these things can really be hard to deal with. Suicide is the second leading cause of death among 15 - 24 year olds and 80% of the time the person has given out definite warning signs. The chance to respond to the clues is an opportunity to intervene with support that can prevent a suicide.

When someone you know:

- makes statements about wanting to die
- is depressed and/or withdrawn
- takes unnecessary risks
- gives away valued possessions
- Ways to help:
- listen with concern
- do not judge

- explore and support their feelings
- encourage reaching out for help

If you feel the need to reach out, there is a place to turn to and it is called THE SUPPORT NETWORK and it is there for you! About the services:

- Distress line that is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week: 482-HELP (4357)
- Crisis counseling (confidential)
- Mobile Mental Health Crisis Team: 482-HELP (4357)
- Community Service referral line: 482-INFO (4636)

If you have a problem, take comfort in knowing there is someone who cares about you. In 1995, The Support Network handled over 40,000 calls. Calls from people wanting information about personal and support services or to talk to someone about a problem, and people requiring immediate intervention.

The Support Network will enable you to receive the assistance that you

need to help you deal with the problem you are experiencing. They strive in gathering vital information and bringing together all the important organizations in the community whose goal is to extend a hand to help people in trouble.

To increase awareness of the help that is available for people in crisis, a group of NAIT Leadership Development students will be setting up

an information booth in the south lobby. This booth will be set up from April 1-4, from 11-1 p.m. Information on supporting, volunteering, and the services offered by The Support Network will be available. Volunteers from The Support Network will be on hand to answer your questions. While visiting the booth, you can enter your name in a free draw for some great prizes.

My computer crashed.

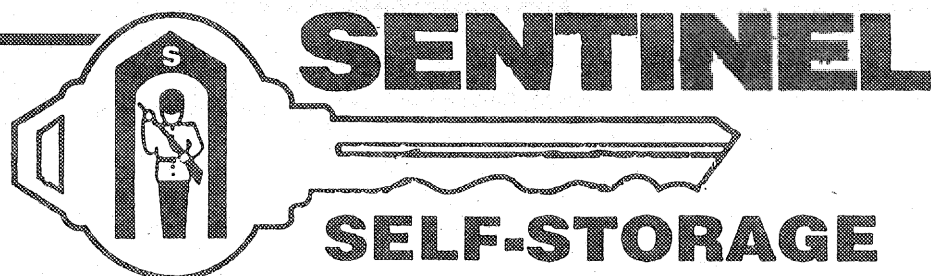

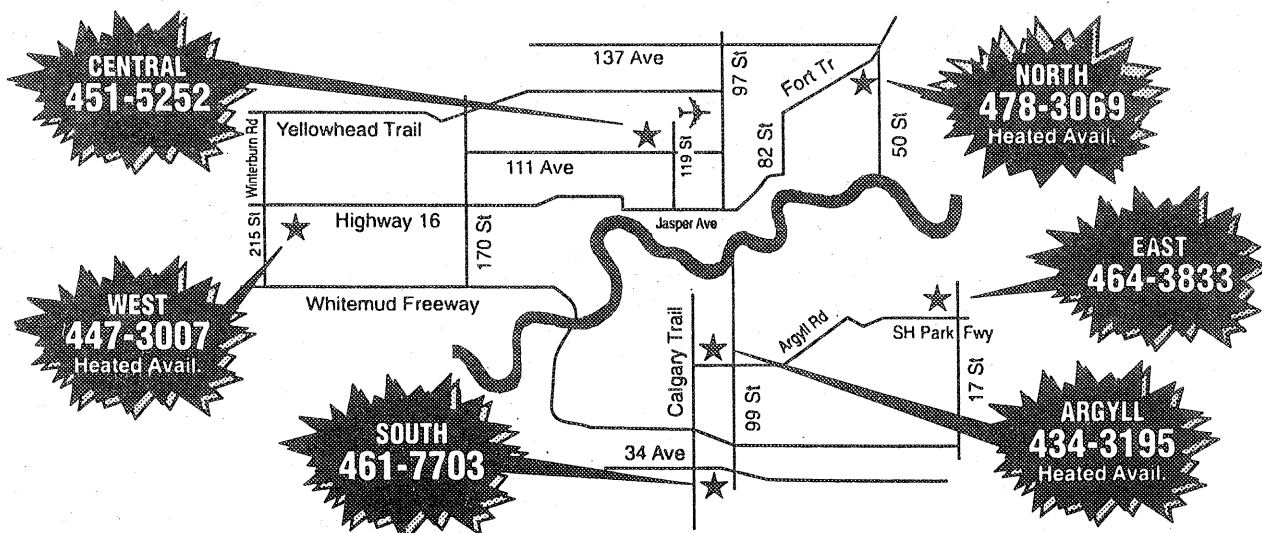

Movie Review: 'Executive Decision'
