The first place to look is right here on campus, at the Placement Centre. They continually update their employment selection, and have a wide range of postings in all areas. It does not cost to look there, and they are quite helpful. There may also be postings

This automated service has been provided in order to give students an

early start on summer job hunting.



## New Building Almost Done

You've seen it in the making for two semester now, and it is almost complete. It is the new South Instructional Centre, and it will provide updated services to students. Years ago, an executive council put forth the idea that more space was needed for students, and this is what they came up with. Pretty impressive, huh? Once completed, this building will house the Animal Health Technology, Biological Sciences, and Ophthalmic Dispensing. The space vacated will be taken up by EMT, Paramedic, and Respiratory. The Dental technologies will also be expanding into some of these freed up rooms.

The present layout of the building includes: 1 - 26 seat classroom, 4 - 50 seat classrooms, 2 - 90 seat stepped classrooms, and 1 - 150 seat stepped classroom. In addition there will be a 373 seat lecture theatre with the most up to date conference technology. The finished building will house the new bookstore, a combination of the old student store, and the restricted access bookstore that is located at the north end of the campus. This store will be more than twice the size of the student store,

with the same walk in access. No more standing in line to buy a textbook in the middle of the semester. There will also be a coffee kiosk on the main level, and multiple student lounging areas on both levels of the structure. Of special note are the new laboratories. These new labs are utilitarian and modern in their design. Before, when a lab was geared toward one purpose, only one class could make use of them. Now both AHT and Bio. Sci. will have use of these new labs, due to the general

setup and functional layout of the lab rooms.

Tours of the building are available to anyone interested, but you must book in advance. These tours will be provided up to the 30th of June, when the building is expected to be finished. Plans are already set to have the bookstore moved in by June 10th. When finished, this new structure will have cost 8 million dollars to build, and will contain 6200 m<sup>2</sup> of floor space.

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
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
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

Things change, and this will not be demonstrated better than during this summer when NAITSA expects to renovate like mad. The new building plays a huge part in these plans.

Here's a complete breakdown of all the changes being organized:

- the current bookstore and student store will be combined into one space with an area of approximately 11,500 square feet housed inside the South Instructional Centre. The new operation should be open for business July 2.

- the Nugget newsroom and production room, currently stationed next to each other, will no longer have a wall separating them. They will be combined into a single access room.

- the classroom just next door to the Nugget newsroom, room E-122,

to be expanded about 3 feet into the newsroom space.

- the NAITSA executive office space will be renovated to make it more open and accessible to students.

- the committee meeting space and storage space right next to the NAITSA offices will be expanded into the old student store space.

- the old bookstore space will probably be converted into office space.

For interest's sake, the South Instructional Centre cost approximately \$9 million. None of this money came from government funding; all of it came from internal fundraising over several years. Contributors include major business and industry sponsors and the NAIT Students' Association.






company. He also serves as CEO of two major TELUS subsidiaries, AGT Limited and ED TEL.




A Government of Alberta Scholarship is awarded annually at NAIT in Bill Hunter's name.

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


One of the services offered by The Support Network is the 24 hour distress line (482-HELP). This vital service is operated by highly trained volunteers who dedicate at least sixteen hours per month to help those in need.

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
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

Taxes are an interesting topic. Most people don't mind paying their taxes if they know the money they shell out is going to benefit them in some way.

The same goes for tuition and school fees. It hurts to shell out the money for school, but students know they will be better off in the end.

Even paying Naitsa fees is bearable... at least that's what I thought until recently.

In Radio and Television we are required to do a sixteen week practicum. During those sixteen weeks we are required to pay full tuition and Naitsa fees.

I can handle the tuition fees - the practicum is getting us out into the work force.

You know, I can even handle paying Naitsa fees - while I am on campus. I use the athletic facilities, my student ID card and have attended a couple Naitsa functions in

the Nest. And, of course, I read the Nugget which is paid for with Naitsa funding.

Radio and Television is not the only program with a long practicum. Combined Lab and X-Ray Tech, Medical Laboratory Tech and Medical X-Ray Tech have even a longer practicum. They only spend one year of their two year program at NAIT. The other one is spent in a clinical setting.

This brings me to my concern. Why should students who are not at NAIT have to pay Naitsa fees?

For my practicum I am traveling to Toronto. There is absolutely no way I am going to be able to use any of NAIT's facilities or benefit from Naitsa in any way.

However, I am still going to be forced to pay the fees. Granted it will only be about fifty dollars. But to a student, that could be two weeks worth of groceries. For those in the Medical technologies, their contribution will be about one hundred dollars.

Even non-work experience students experience similar problems. I've spoken to many students on Westerra campus who say they don't receive any benefits from Naitsa. Apparently, they could not even vote at their campus during the recent Naitsa elections. Now perhaps the

booth was there and they just couldn't find it. Whatever the case, Naitsa certainly is not being very accountable to those students.

Students should be able to choose whether they would like to pay their Naitsa fees or not. It should be handled more like a club where the participants are choosing to join rather than a obligatory union where people are forced to join. Students who have paid their Naitsa fees will benefit from the services their Student Association provides. Students who have not paid will simply not be able to reap the benefits.

This could have other benefits than just saving off-campus students money. It would force Naitsa to provide services that the students really want and need. If our student association had the reputation of being an organization students just couldn't do without while they're at NAIT, membership would not decrease substantially. It's simply a matter of cheques and balances.

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
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

# Strange Bedfellows - Freedom for Some

As the end of the year rolls around and my last editorial has now come to pass, an issue of recent attention is forcing a discussion here.

The issue: exclusion of freedom of sexual orientation in the Canadian Human Rights Act (CHRA). Although it may seem like a current

topic, it has existed as long as the CHRA itself. The problem is that some politicians seem to think that if sexual orientation was included then homosexuals would have special rights, something entirely against the concept of equality that is inherent in the Act. What they do not tell you, usually, is that their religious and conservative backgrounds forbid homosexuality, that it is against the will of God, or something to that effect. What they also do not tell you is that homosexuals do not want special rights, just equal rights.

Ralph Klein, right honourable premier of Alberta, does not hide his fear of gays from us. He has told us that it is unnatural and that it is a choice. He tells us that that is why he will not include in Alberta's human rights charter, despite the fact that seven other provinces, perhaps more progressive provinces, have included sexual orientation in their charters. What is relevant here is who has freedom and who does not? The CHRA states that all human beings are equal in their rights. Note the word "all". That's important. Now this one indiscretion on the part

-if so, then shouldn't everybody have special rights?

-if homosexuality is a choice, then is heterosexuality a choice too?

-does anybody choose who they fall in love with?

-if the opposition against the inclusion of sexual orientation is based on the religious or moral objections of political figures, doesn't this indicate that homosexuals do not have protection against religious persecution, that they do not have freedom of religion, or rather from religion, which is one of the mainstays of the CHRA?

-if so, then isn't that not only contradictory but also illegal?

-if sexual orientation is not included in the CHRA, does that mean that jobs can be refused solely based on a person's heterosexuality while still remaining perfectly legal?

-wouldn't that exclusion upset the same politicians who wanted it excluded in the first place?

-why is sexual orientation the

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
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

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
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
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# PROFILE: WIDE MOUTH MASON

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

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


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
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## S P O R T S

enth" player at all times is a huge bonus when you're playing at home. Next week, you'll hear all about our trip in this column. We know an opportunity like this doesn't grow


on trees, so we plan to make the most of it and bring you home a national championship. Because we believe. I LOVE THIS GAME!

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
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

### Beach Volleyball (Ages 14-18)



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# Did You Know?

Everyone's talking about how Kurt Browning is the one who put Edmonton on the sports map, but in fact, our city of Champions became famous over 70 years ago.

How many of you know that Edmonton had a World Championship basketball team? And how many would've guessed that it was a "bunch of girls" to do it? Dr. James Naismith, the inventor of basketball called them "the first team to ever step out on a basketball floor". They jam-packed "arenas" and became international stars. They're known as The Edmonton Commercial Graduates Basketball Club (AKA The Edmonton Grads).

In 1915, a group of young women just graduating out of high school got together and decided not to let their days of playing basketball end. So they spoke to their high school teacher and coach, Percy

Page, and asked him to continue to work with them.

At first, it was all fun and games. But in 1922, the ladies stepped up and challenged the National Champions — The London Shamrocks. The Grads wiped out the #1 team in Canada and started a

journey that would last 25 years.

They played the top-ranked team in the USA and beat them. Then realizing they had no competition in North America, Percy Page lobbied to make women's basketball an official sport at the 1924 Paris Olympics. His request was denied, but they did have an international tournament.

The Grads won every game

they played in Paris and were named the World Champions. This title, the women would hold on to for the next 16 years.

They played 522 games in their basketball career and lost only 20 — they won over 96% of their games. Their longest losing streak was 3 games.

The Edmonton Grads played their final game on June 5, 1940. Their home court, the Edmonton Gardens was taken over by the military to prepare for World War II. With the Gardens gone, the Grads had no place large enough to hold a crowd.

The Edmonton Grads opened gates in the world many people back then never imagined would be unlatched. They opened the gateway of sports for all women.

Percy Page died in 1973 after a gratifying career in politics.

Women's basketball became an Olympic event in 1976.
