Campaigning for the 5 executive and 2 Board of Governors positions starts next Sunday, March 10 at noon and runs through till Thursday, March 14 at 4:15 pm.

To learn more about the candidates, a speech schedule has been prepared. The itinerary includes 4 forums from Monday to Thursday. Speeches will be held at the Tower Lounge on Monday, March 11; at the Westwood Lounge on Tuesday, March 12; at the Dock on Wednesday, March 13; and at the Naitrium on Thursday, March 14. All forums

will begin at 11:15 am on the day specified. For those who cannot make any of these speeches, some, if not all, of the candidates will be writing articles outlining their platforms for next week's Nugget.

The actual voting takes place on Friday, March 15 from 9 am - 3:15 pm. Here is a list of the polling stations:

Do You Need A Break?

How many times a year does a student get to take a vacation? Once if you're lucky. This time of year, Mexico is a great place to go. In the last few years, a lot of restructuring has been going on which has improved the dollar situation. Now, instead of needing thousands of pesos to equal one dollar, you only

go, and how long you want to stay there. If you're not careful, you could wind up in the middle of a Mexican festival (or maybe that's just the thing to look for). Also, be sure to get all documents that you might require. A passport is not needed to enter Mexico, but it does make things easier and is an internationally recognized form of identification. Medical insurance is also a good idea. Check to see if you are covered through work, or Blue Cross. If not, Medical Insurance can be obtained through most banks.

Try to avoid driving. If you have the money and the time, take a plane down and enjoy yourself. If driving is necessary, there is a lot more prep work that must be done. First, get a tune up. This will decrease the chances of anything major happening to the vehicle. It is also necessary to obtain a Vehicle Importation Permit, and Auto Insurance from the proper Mexican authorities. Be sure of the roads you are driving on. Plan your route well in advance, and let people know when and where you will be. Exchange money to the peso when you cross the border. There are many toll booths on the

major roads, and the attendants will not always give you back change if you use American money. Never try to be funny with the federal police. They have automatic weapons, you don't. Try to avoid travel

at night. Even the federals (the Mexican police) warn against this. The risk of encountering bandits increases with darkness and distance from cities.

Once you get to where you're

going, PARTY! Let them know you are Canadian (you will be treated better than the Americans). Talk to people on the beach, chances are you will find someone from some part of Canada. Ask your hotel service desk about local night clubs and upcoming events and parties. When you go out, expect strong drinks. Don't be surprised if the glass you are using could double as a fish bowl. One thing the Mexicans can do well is make people happy. Try some of the local cuisine, but stay away from anything that may have been prepared with tap water. Many people can tell you about how they contracted "Montezuma's Revenge" while in Mexico. Don't be afraid to barter with the beach vendors. A good strategy is to offer them half

of their first price. They expect it and adjust their prices accordingly. Try to make the exchange interesting, like tossing a coin to decide

between their price and what you are willing to pay (it's been done before). Take a lot of pictures of everything you do. Not only does it provide you with great memories, it makes your friends jealous as hell.

There are a lot of things people can tell you about their trips. Be sure to ask friends or family about their vacations in order to make yours a good one.

Be sure of the roads you are driving on. Plan your route well in advance, and let people know when and where you will be.

If Mehran sounds excited, he should. Last year, he facilitated customized training partnerships with several large organizations, including ED TEL, CFB Edmonton, and the Mennonite Centre for Newcomers. These associations are ex-

One such partnership resulted in an exchange of training space for highly specialized(read: expensive) HYSIM software for our Petroleum Engineering Technology Program. February 24 was the day of the SS Benefit NAIT Cruise to Thailand. It was the annual charity fund-raiser for NAIT organized by the NAIT Foundation. The cruise is generally determined through the International Education Partnership. Past cruises include Mexico, New Orleans, Australia, and Japan. Each year raising over one hundred-thousand dollars.

In attendance were a lot of corporate and big business people. Alberta Premier Ralph Klein and Edmonton's Mayor Bill Smith were there to help make the evening a success. Although the total funds raised have not yet been calculated,

it is expected to be around 150,000 dollars. This year, some of the hot items were lunch dates with Jim Dinning, Bill Smith, and even Ralph Klein himself. One of the combination prizes was a John Deere lawn tractor, garden shed, and one hour of live entertainment from Danny Hooper and his band. Maybe that's so that you can mow your lawn and have music at the same time. Danny Hooper was also the Master of Ceremonies for the evening. It was said that he was extremely entertaining, and he almost had people splitting their sides.

How does this money benefit NAIT? All funds raised go towards scholarships, endowments, and

capital equipment replacement. That means computers, desk, chairs, any instrument you might use was probably because of the NAIT Foundation. Past acquisitions include: a microfilm reader/printer, flatbed scanner, and a camcorder, for the LRC (worth \$4,000); a big screen projector, for Business (worth \$5,600); a film writer, for Photography (worth \$10,200); two bandsaws and a vacuum packer, for Retail Meatcutting (worth \$26,000). Equipment upgrades for next year will not be decided until July, once all the programs have had a chance to hand in a "wish list."

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
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

Although the sight of your own blood may have added to the already tremendous loathing of the first working day of the week, the Edmonton Red Cross is happy you did anyway. They wish to thank you from the bottom of their heart.

This past Monday saw the Blood Donor Clinic come back to NAIT's north lobby and it was a great success.

Lorelei Campbell, the head nurse in charge on Monday took a quick minute out of her busy routine at the north lobby to explain the reasons for holding the clinic.

"We've been coming to NAIT for quite a few years. We hold these at set times, usually 3 times a year. This one's probably an extra because the last time we were here we could only stay for one day whereas we usually stay for two."

The process of donation has 6 steps, all of which take an approxi-

mate total of 45 minutes. First, you fill out a questionnaire about your health. With your picture i.d. in hand, you then go to a computer station where nurses ensure that you have donated before by checking the donor lists on microfiche. Your blood pressure and temperature are taken. The nurses also get a quick sample of your blood to determine your blood type and its iron level. From there, your questionnaire is reviewed for accuracy. If everything is correct then it is time to actually donate. You get to lie down on what looks like a reclining lawn chair while a trained professional taps a needle into a vein in the middle of your arm. A pint of blood is removed. Since loss of blood usually tires a person out, you get to rest for 10 minutes while your arm heals. This all done means it's time for treats: cookies and coke, compliments of the Red Cross. Et voila!

How Well Can You Hum?

If you become the winner of the NAIT Foundations newest lottery, you would be able to hum quite well. The newest model in transportation is the Hummer, an off-road wonder to rival the best utility vehicle.

It began back in 1979 with the US Army's requirement for a new utility vehicle to replace the old Army Jeep. The Army needed a High Mobility Multipurpose Wheeled Vehicle (HMMWV). On March 22, 1983, the 1.2 billion dollar contract was awarded to AM General, an American Manufacturing company. Many alterations have been made to the original design to make the vehicle suitable for personnel carrying, cargo, or weapons, but the capabilities remain essentially the same.

Standard features are a 190 hp 6.5L V8 Turbo diesel fuel injected engine or 5.7 L gasoline engine, and a carrying capacity of 2500 lbs. The model for the raffle also has self inflating tires. As shown in the video in the main lobby last week, in the event that a Hummer actually gets stuck the tires can be partially deflated from inside the vehicle to increase traction. Once clear of the obstacle, the tires can be reinflated using an onboard compressor. The 37" x 12.5" Goodyear Wrangler tires give the

hummer a total of 16" of ground clearance, and increased traction due to the larger "footprint". When outfitted with the towing package, the vehicle can tow up to 8000 lbs. Due to the construction of the Hummer, the bulk of the weight is in the lower chassis. The body itself is made from aluminum, the hood is made from glass fibre reinforced composite, and the roof and doors are made from coated galvanized steel. All this makes the vehicle extremely resistant to corrosion. In comparison to a sport utility vehicle, the Hummer is wider and longer. Some would say that this detracts from the maneuverability of the vehicle; what they forget is that "...the Hummer does not need to go around obstacles, it goes right over them." Like the slogan says "It's not a matter of the competition not being able to keep up, it's a matter of not being able to follow."

The reason for this new draw is because of the uniqueness of the vehicle itself. Since only 1500 civilian models are produced each year, the Hummer is a rare thing indeed. Tickets are \$20 each, or 3 for \$50. The Hummer can be seen until Sunday at the Northlands Agricom.


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
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

to come up with ideas that better reflect the individuality of the students of NAIT.


Reviewing censorship in the channels of communication at NAIT. It is important that people voice their opinion, after all, we are all entitled to one.

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


One of the things that I would like every student to experience is the amount of fun you can have at college. It is hard for me to just sit


As students at NAIT, it is important we have representatives that can address student concerns in all programs. The Board of Governors this year will have a number of matters to resolve such as




Ron Landry







Hello everyone. My name is Spence Myers and I am running for the Communications VP position on the NAITSA executive council. As



stand aside and watch as everyone a lighter shade of brown is admitted, regardless of whether they produce a club card or not.



when these guys decided to try something new, namely this club card business.



The D.O.C. — Helter Skelter

In 1989 rap was boom'n! EPMD was still together and takin' care of business, BDP was layin' out the blueprint of hip-hop and the Ghetto Boys were coming up. And Ruthless Records was the hottest independent record company and home to NWA, Eazy-E, M.C. Ren, D.J. Yella, Dr. Dre and Ice Cube and A.T.L (Above the Law). Out of this camp came the D.O.C. with the songs "It's Funky Enough", "The Formula", and "The D.O.C. and the Doctor". His debut album was entitled "No One Can Do It Better", and this was not a brag or a boast, but a fact. The D.O.C. was unquestionably the hardest M.C. around aside from Rakim. Backing up D.O.C.'s lyrical skills was Dr. Dre on the boards. "No One Can Do It Better" is a classic among rap fans. Mike Walker blocked 28 shots in the NAIT net to record the shut-out. Barry Becker stopped 31 of 36 shots in the SAIT crease.




The scorelock at the end of the women's game pierced 79-37 in favor of the Griffins. Then again, the Griffins are ranked number one in the nation.



The NAIT coaches and manager also did well in their respective events with John Reeves (Head






