En-LIGHT-enment WALKING THE HIGH WIRE Controls Us All

Last spring, Curtis waited to cross Princess Elizabeth Avenue at an uncontrolled pedestrian crossing near 102 Street. Twenty...thirty...fifty cars zipped past without the slightest notice that he and a small crowd were waiting to cross. Finally, a taxi slowly emerging from the traffic circle in the centre lane came to a stop. A small car in the outside lane, noticing the taxi slowing and the gathering pedestrians, screeched to a halt immediately before the cross walk. Curtis and the small group began to cross when a third car, a fancy, new sports sped around the corner in the centre lane and, just like in the "Speed Kills" commercial, the driver decided erroneously that the taxi was turning left. Without slowing, it swerved into the outside lane and ran smack into the rear end of the little car, propelling it through the crosswalk.

Fortunately, there is a happy ending to this story: the pedestrians had already passed the outside lane and were not injured. The

sports car's front end was completely pushed in, showing its driver the damage he could have caused (and also to slow down before he hits the little boy from the commercial). What's most important though (although not necessarily a result of the accident) is that Curtis and his friends who have to cross Princess Elizabeth Avenue now have a controlled pedestrian crossing.

Over the past few weeks, city workers have been busy digging, installing, and wiring the new traffic signals, flashing pedestrian activated warning lights. According to Ben Yarmuch, a transportation technician with the City of Edmonton, the lights and their installation are estimated to cost \$16 500, which will be paid out of the city's transportation budget.

Although the decision to install these lights was made after a City transportation planning study, the pedestrians crossing Princess Elizabeth Avenue were well aware of the desperate need for traffic control at this intersection and are grateful..

Suffer From 'Pack' Pain?

With midterm exams looming on the horizon, more and more students are hurting their backs and without even realizing it. As students start to carry more and more books around so that they can study, knapsacks keep getting heavier and heavier. When these bags aren't worn correctly, there's a good chance you're in for some kind of pain.

The best way to wear a knapsack is with the straps over BOTH shoulders. This helps to distribute the weight of the bag more evenly. If you have to lean forward to compensate for the weight of your

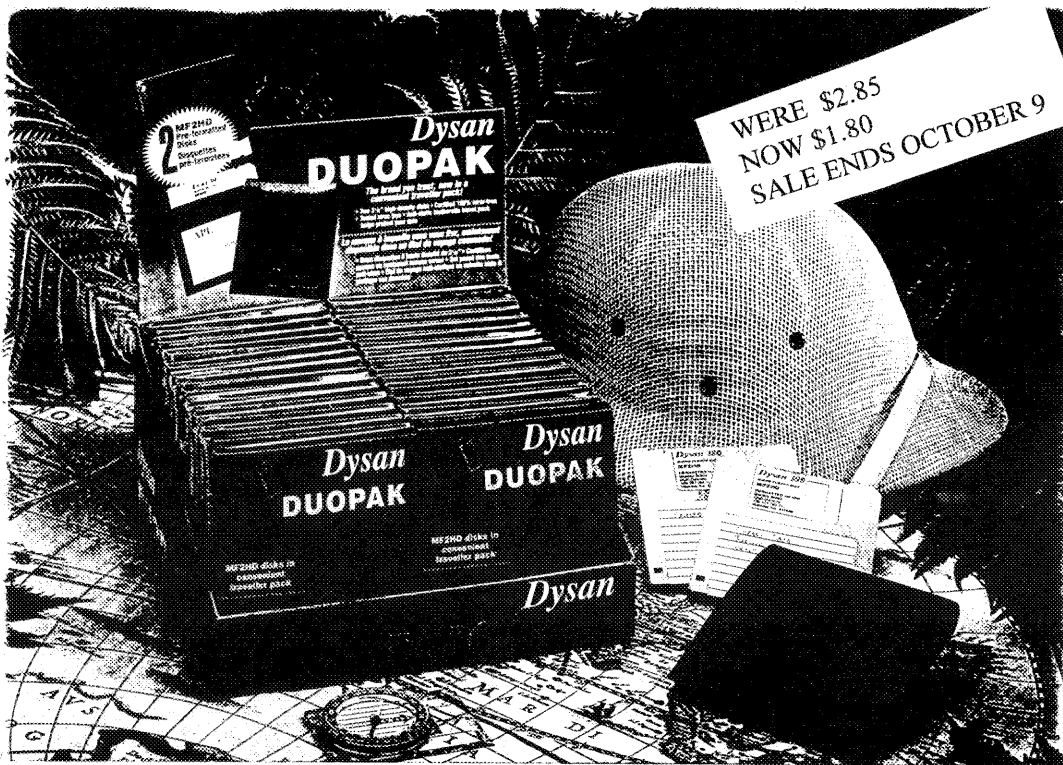
bag, it's probably time to take a few books out. If you can lift your bag with one hand with relative ease, then your back should be okay.

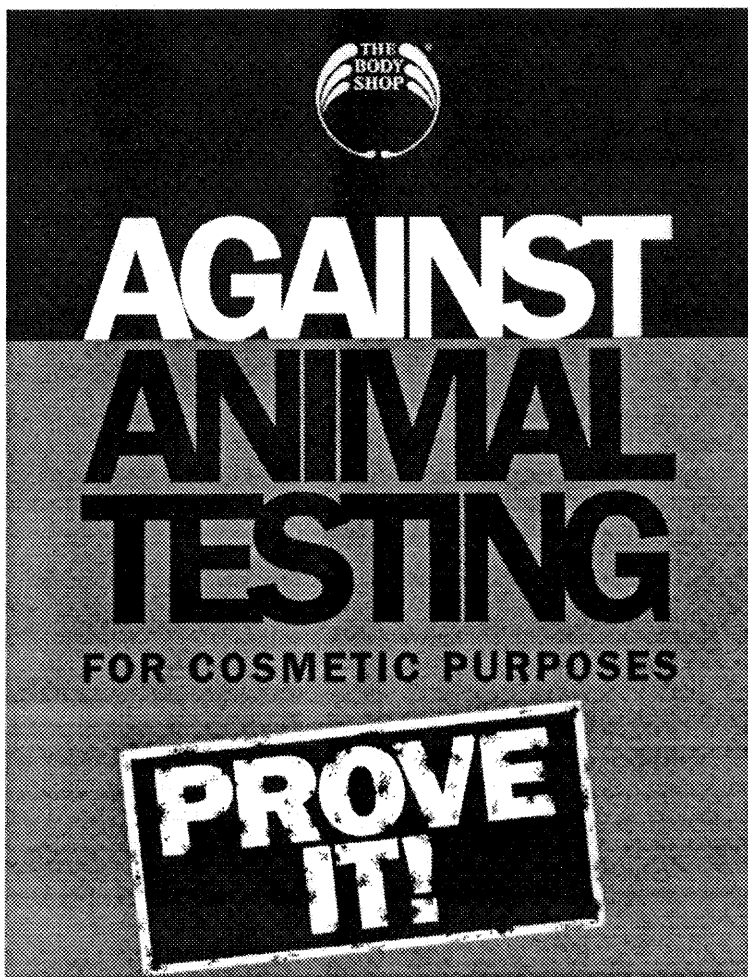

The Body Shop Canada wants everyone's help to stop animal testing for cosmetic uses. Even though many companies claim that they have switched to cruelty-free practices and products, there are so many claims to contend with that it's hard to

conduct tests on animals to test ingredients or products? Does the company monitor their suppliers to ensure that ingredients are not tested on animals? Would the company take action against a supplier if they found out the supplier had used animal testing?

The Body Shop Canada believes that animal testing in the cosmetic industry is unethical, unnecessary and unreliable. There are thousands of ingredients available to use in cosmetics that do not require animal testing. The results from animal tests are not 100% reliable because of the different physiological make-up of animals and humans. BSC is striving to stop these practices so that the delicate environment that we live stays balanced..

The Body Shop Canada has launched *The Body Shop Charitable Foundation* to support groups and projects who support alternative testing. This Foundation takes \$1.00 from each sale of the "Against Animal Testing" t-shirts to fund the initiative. A recent Angus Reid poll indicated that 73% of Canadians agree that more time, money and effort should be invested into alternative testing practices.

The Body Shop Canada wants consumers to ask questions and to make cosmetic companies take responsibility for their products. Does the company have tests conducted on animals for their products or the ingredients in their products? Does the company commission other companies to

Shop has taken the responsibility for their products. They do not test their products or any of their ingredients on animals. They have a Purchasing Rule that states that they will not purchase from suppliers that have tested on animals after December 31, 1990. The Body Shop requires each supplier to submit a declaration every six months to ensure that they comply with the Purchasing Rule. Any supplier that breaks the Purchasing Rule will be penalized by Body Shop refusing to purchase anything from them.

The Body Shop wants to encourage all Canadians to educate themselves about this issue. All Body Shop stores carry information and the tools needed for consumers to make an impact. We as consumers have the power to force cosmetic companies to take responsibilities for their actions and stop testing their products on animals. Education, however, is the first step to making a positive change.

Cosmetic companies have been making the claims that they are "Cruelty Free" or that they are "Not tested on animals" but we as consumers must ask questions, find out the facts and make these companies prove that they do not test on animals.

NAITSA Meeting

NAITSA's most recent General Council meeting was held October 9 at 4:30.

The first significant motion was the decision whether or not to grant Ralph Klein an honorary degree. Virtually all the representatives were against the motion, and according to Tara Tanguay, V.P. Financial/Academic, "this issue will now die."

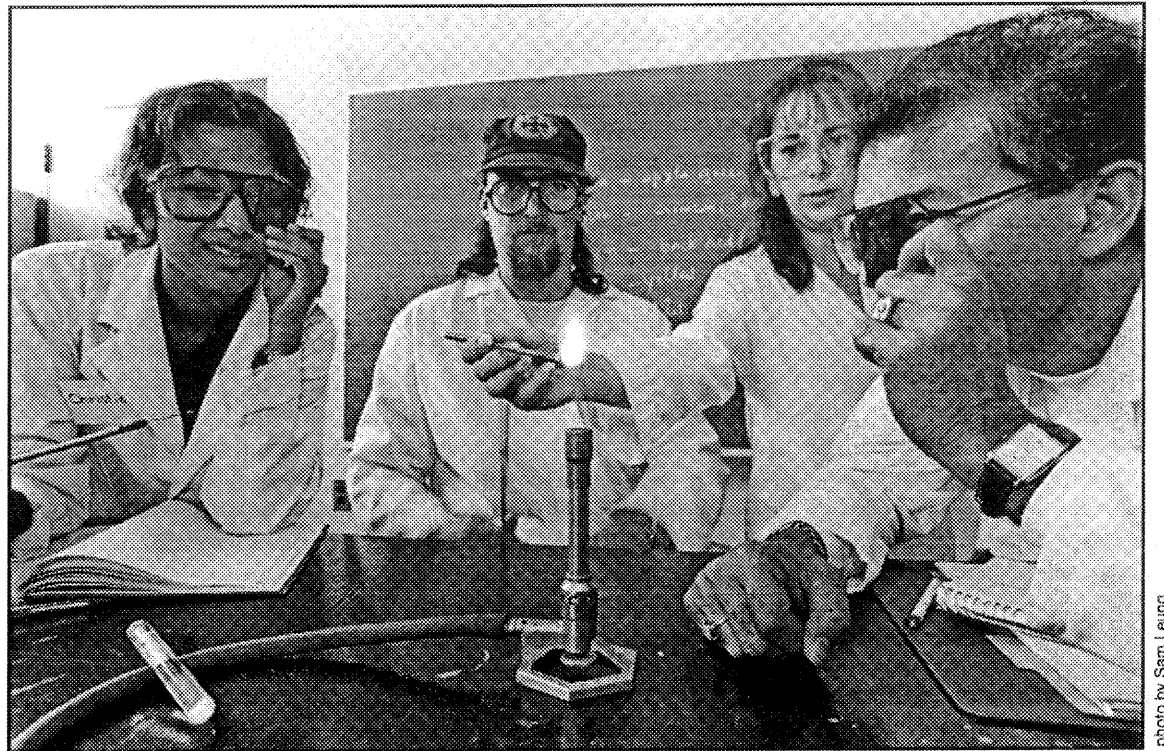
A heated debate followed regarding whether or not to permit a release from the NAITSA budget in order that computers may be purchased for each of the NAITSA executive. The cost of these five state of the art items would be \$9030.80 from a \$7.5 million

budget. Several issues were raised by your reps questioning the necessity for each member to have a computer, especially ones as up to date as the chosen packages. The executive outlined the many benefits of purchasing these items, the general consensus swayed, and the motion passed.

Also presented was the question of whether or not to donate \$300 from the NAITSA budget to a disaster relief fund. The donation was solicited by a letter from the Association of Community Colleges and will benefit students in Quebec who lost learning materials in the flooding which occurred last summer. Again, the motion passed.

Doug Popowich, the NAITSA president, announced that, for credit in a leadership course, he is required to complete volunteer hours. To fulfill this, he will be running a daycare at NAIT events. The first daycare will be run at Captain Tractor, on November 1, and will be staffed by daycare workers. A nominal fee will be charged.

Finally, the next meeting will be held in three weeks on October 29, and will be the Annual General Council meeting. All are invited and are encouraged to attend, as 100 students are needed at this meeting to achieve a quorum. It will be in the Shaw Theatre in the South Learning Centre at 4:30.

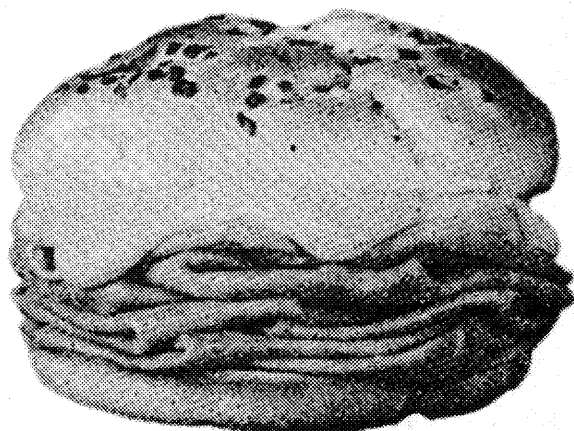

It wasn't long before the Electrical Technology students could be heard each evening happily operating a variety of relays remotely. Even greater was the sheer abandon of the Electrical Technology students glee when they managed to operate a series of relays through a rather large control box that actually transmitted radio signals to control the relays.

After that little bit of excitement, the Electrical Department settled down to a quiet buzz of activity. Every evening, five days a week, various noises could be heard emanating from the series

With much forethought, it was decided that the device would become truly versatile and have not only radio control but also a separate plug-in so that direct wire control could be utilized in cases of emergency.

Mrs. Ayles thought that the electrical boys had made a good job of everything and that they should be highly commended for their efforts. One of the Electrical Students piped up that they had tried a variety of materials for covering the device but no material so far seemed to do the job. Could Mrs. Ayles assist them in deciding upon a suitable material?

Mrs. Ayles mused for a few minutes and then calmly said that the black seal skin fur coat that she was wearing would do the job admirably! A stunned look of utter amazement washed over the group of students and lecturers. 
other parades that Ookpik attended that year but none quite as significant as the Morinville Frontier Daze Parade.

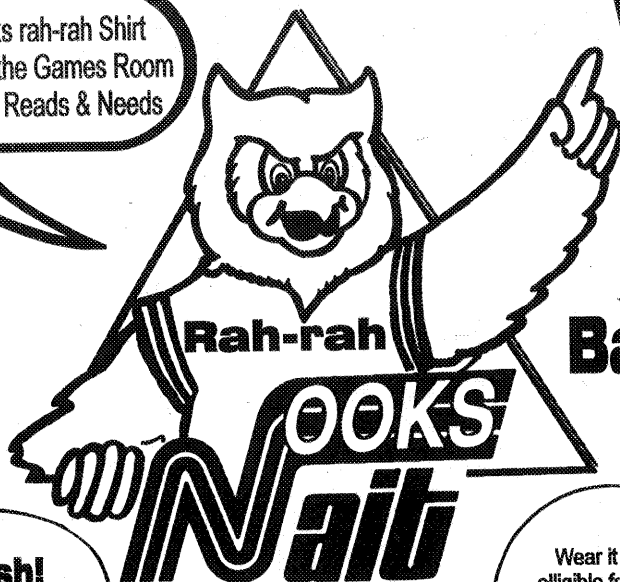

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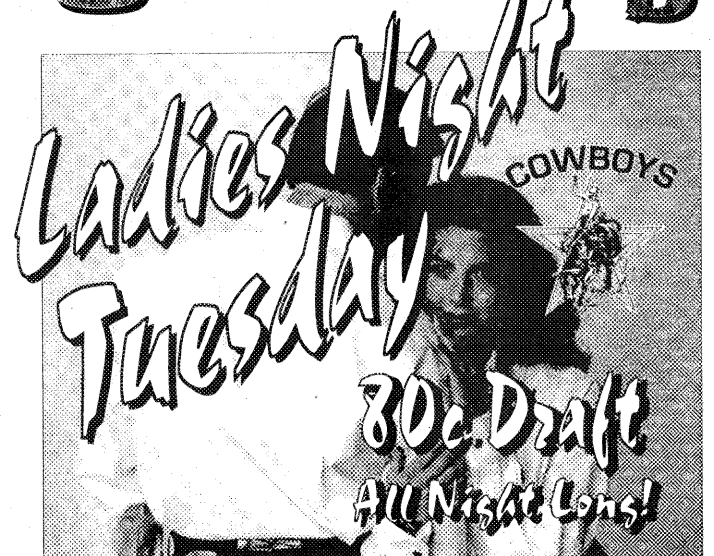
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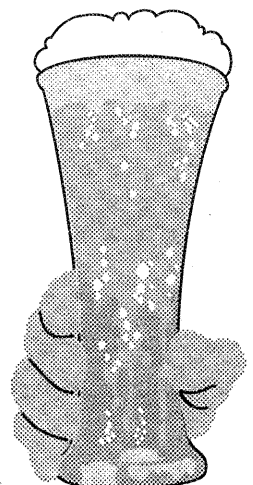


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A Bus Named Nightmare Part VI

quantity of prescription drugs were confiscated from her car, along with a wide assortment of hunting knives and assault weapons."

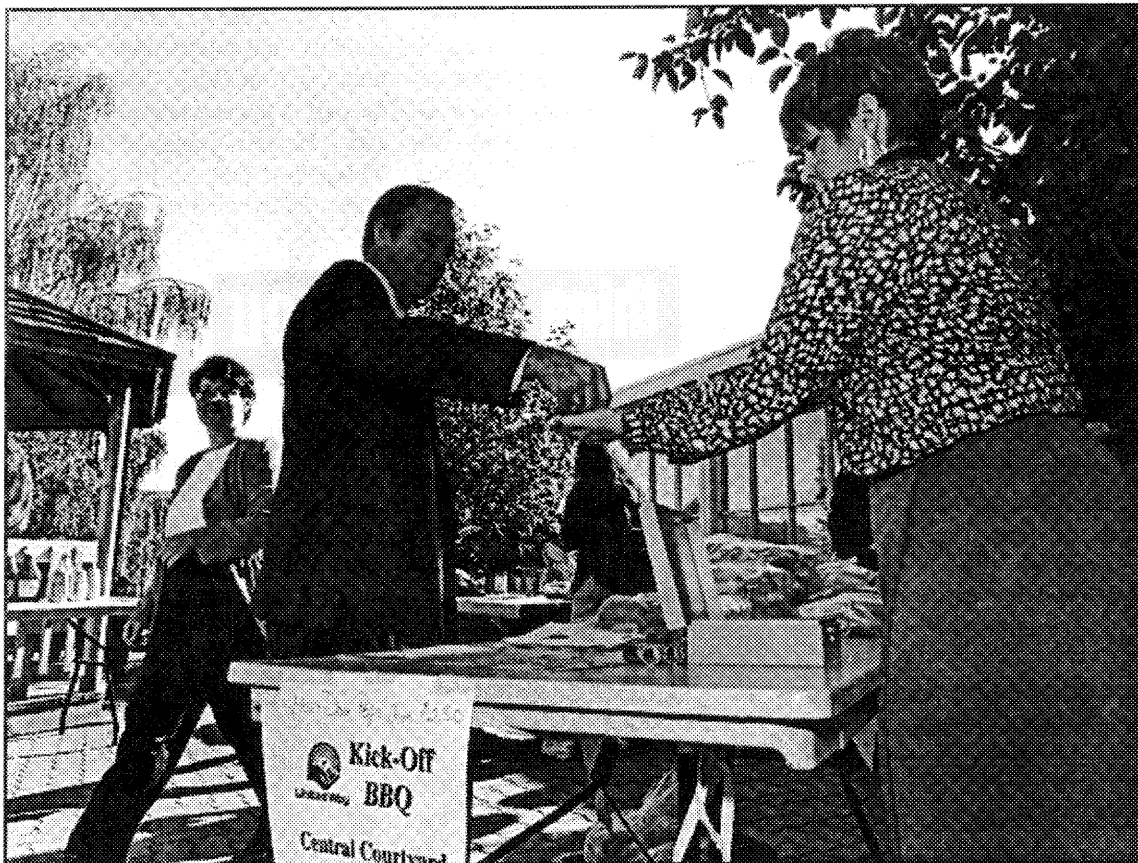

That Thing You Do! is a fictional story based on the musical career of the one-hit "Wonders." The setting is this: these four guys grow up in a small, rural community in the 1960's. They, of course, practice their music in a garage and acquire gigs at local diners, etc. Their local fame begins when they win a local music contest and from there a slow ride to success (and eventual destruction) begins. The guys record their one-hit "That Thing You Do!" and go on a small tour before hooking up with Hanks' character, who is a manager for Playtone Records. Once these two forces collaborate efforts, the "Wonders"

gain more publicity as Hanks helps them with their image and plans their next steps.

The movie's major pitfall is here, at this point of the game. They begin a greater tour and become over-anxious to go on to new things like meeting other celebrities and recording a new album. As their single climbs the charts, their fame grows greater, and soon a few heads start to swell

very well. It flows too slowly and becomes predictable in many places. Once progress is made in the plot, revelations take place too quickly before the audience can try to anticipate a conclusion. The greatest advantage this movie holds is Tom Hanks' talents—yet his part in the movie isn't to be the star. He is a supporter in **That Thing You Do!**, so his personal, high Hollywood-status doesn't

seems to be the theme of the whole movie. Nothing more, nothing less. Everything is just plain "good", so it depends on your own perspective as a viewer. The debate is whether or not this is a bomb for Hanks' high-rated career and an end to his lucky streak (Sleepless in Seattle, Philadelphia, Forrest Gump, and Apollo 13). Or you may look at it like since it isn't a complete flop - it's just a plateau Hanks' is comfortable maintaining.

In conclusion, **That Thing You Do!** isn't exactly filled with "turns-of-event," but all in all, the story has its highlights. The ending seems to be a quick cop-out, although still believable and

somewhat expected. This movie is suitable for all audiences and is clean humored. The phenomenal hit, "That Thing You Do!" is played constantly throughout the movie. (It's their ONE and ONLY hit, so we must bare the repetitiveness). It's a great catchy song, and in the movie, "The Wonders" are constantly compared to the Beatles. (Once again, it's in the eyes of the beholder). Basically, my overall impression of this flick is warm and light-hearted, not to mention, "good." 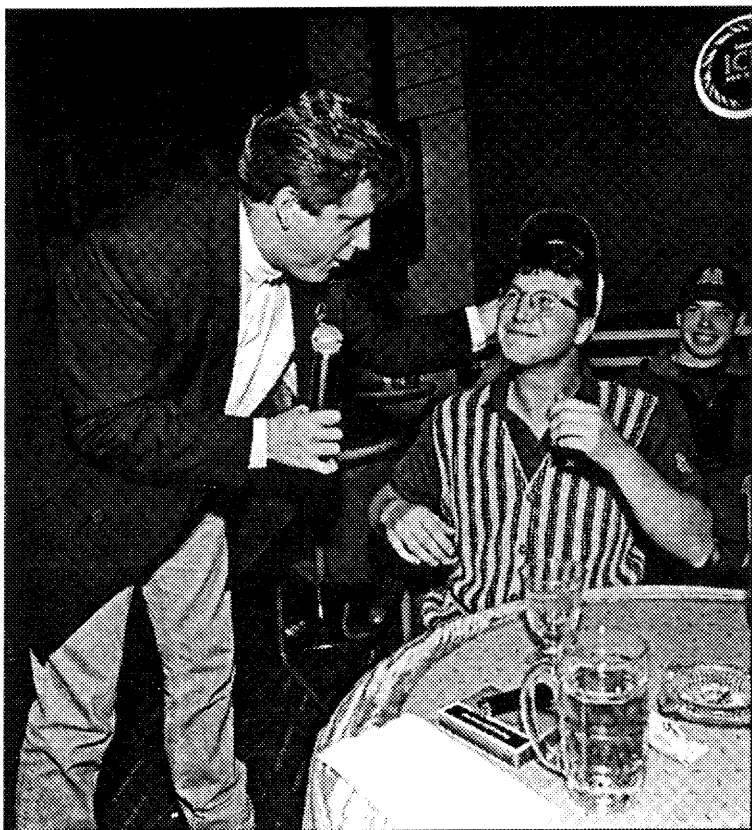

At this point, I'm thinking "wicked," this film contains lots of violence and tons of sex."

'Crash' is basically about a collection of sex addicts, who find cars (especially car crashes) highly erotic. The film is based on this book by J.G. Ballard. It is supposed to be a cult classic about the similarities and relationships between cars and people. The movie just comes across as a story about a bunch of freaks, who become extremely hot and bothered when watching, driving, riding, crashing, or in close proximity to any car. The film should have been ti-

The Crêperie Restaurant

The Crêperie Restaurant is the most beautiful and intimate restaurants that Edmonton has to offer. It is an independent credit to our fair city (since it is not a part of a full-blown franchise). The Crêperie features Country French cooking and is located on 103 Street, just a few steps down from the downtown Greyhound Station. The Crêperie is placed between two other great restaurants, The Old Spaghetti Factory, and BONES.

Once through the door, a small red-carpeted set of stairs leads you to the restaurant which is in the basement. When you enter the main area, the atmosphere that you are used to is transformed into really fine dining without the discomfort of formalities. An attentive hostess greets the guests genuinely, and provides a table to each customer that allows privacy so that everyone isn't all cramped in one section. There are many old-fashioned sections, each playing with the same theme of "French country." A few of the delightful designs in The Crêperie include an area enclosed with shelves filled with old, hard books; an area with rustic pots and pans displayed on the walls and roof; and an area that has two wine bottle arches that span from the floor to the ceiling.

The lighting throughout is dim and each table is covered with a floral cloth cover, as well as a small burning candle. The menu is predominantly crêpes with different fillings and sauces, hence the name "Crêperie". They have chicken and beef, as well as fish and sausage. There are also vegetarian selections, and each entrée includes a side order of pasta and vegetables (squash, pea pods, and eggplant to name a few—these are somewhat unidentifiable at first). There is also a wide selection of appetizers and soups, not to mention the dinner entrée items on the menu that don't come wrapped in a crêpe (such as pasta and meat portions). The prices vary from regular restaurant prices - \$5.00 to \$8.00 - with a few items that range from \$15.00 to \$20.00. Many specialty drinks and wine are offered (YUM!) but if you prefer water, juice, or pop—it is constantly refilled by your server. A serving of fresh baked bread with garlic butter is delivered with any order and it is MELT-IN-YOUR-MOUTH. (The bread alone is a meal enough for me). The great food doesn't end after dinner—you must save room for dessert. They are to die for! All the dessert items, well, most of them, are wrapped in crêpes (just like the

dinner items). A great example is the Crêpe à la Suisse, which is strawberries, soft cream cheese, sprinkled with kirsch—wrapped in a soft crêpe. Other selections include: raspberry and bananas with ice cream or chocolate sauce. The Crêperie is an appropriate choice just to solely go for dessert!

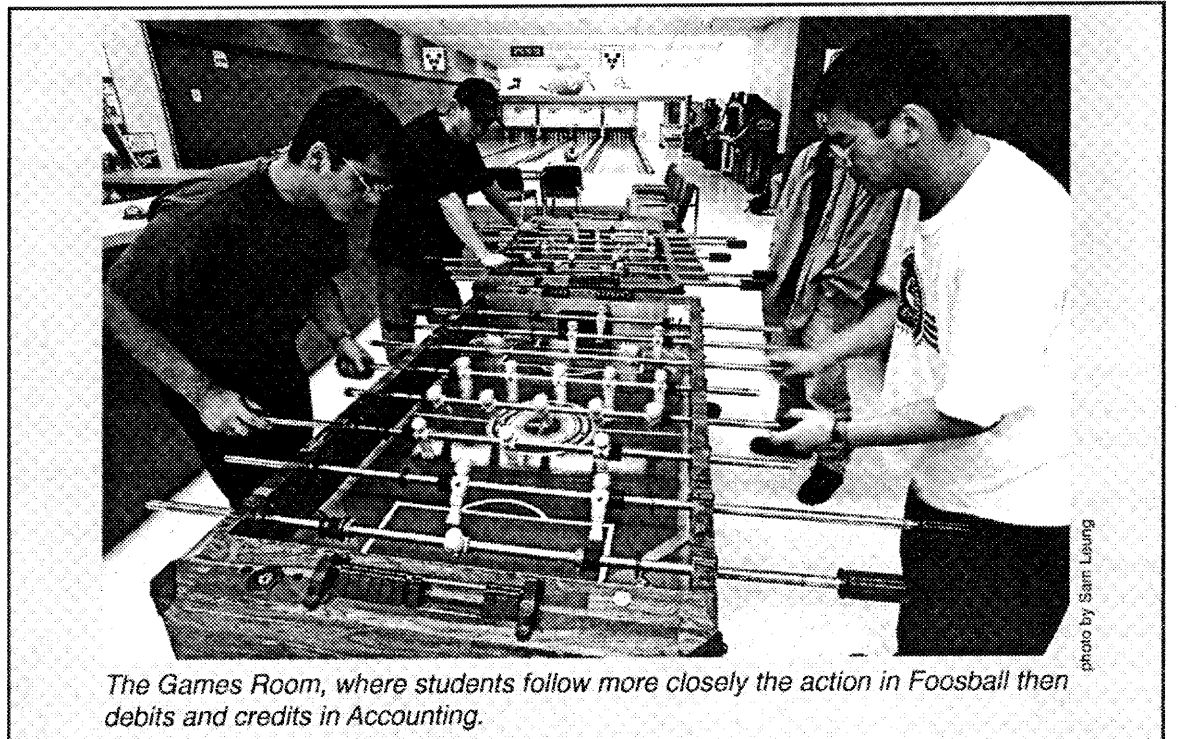
The most prominent points offered by The Crêperie related to customer service are, as follows: a pleasant attitude, the cleanliness of the restaurant, and the appearance of the servers (they all wear 1/2 tuxes—meaning a vest and a tie, and pants - not implying they're half naked). When the bill is presented to you, it comes with an overall evaluation for you to fill out, and a chocolate dipped, better-than-a-fortune-cookie, sweet croustille. It is evident that The Crêperie takes pride and care in customer service. The place appears fancy but there is no need to wear anything more than jeans and a T-shirt, unless you want to. The

Crêperie can accommodate large groups or intimate gatherings.

In conclusion, The Crêperie Restaurant deserves to be highly rated for its authenticity in every

aspect. This restaurant could be a dumpy cellar, but it has been renovated to perfection. The setting is quaint for the romantic, sappy ones and the food is a nice change

from a burger smeared in grease. So if you are in the need of a change of atmosphere, try The Crêperie downtown, I'm sure you'll be pleased.

NEXT GAME: exhibition game Thursday in Camrose against Augustana at 8:30 tip-off and Saturday at King's College, tip-off at 3:00.

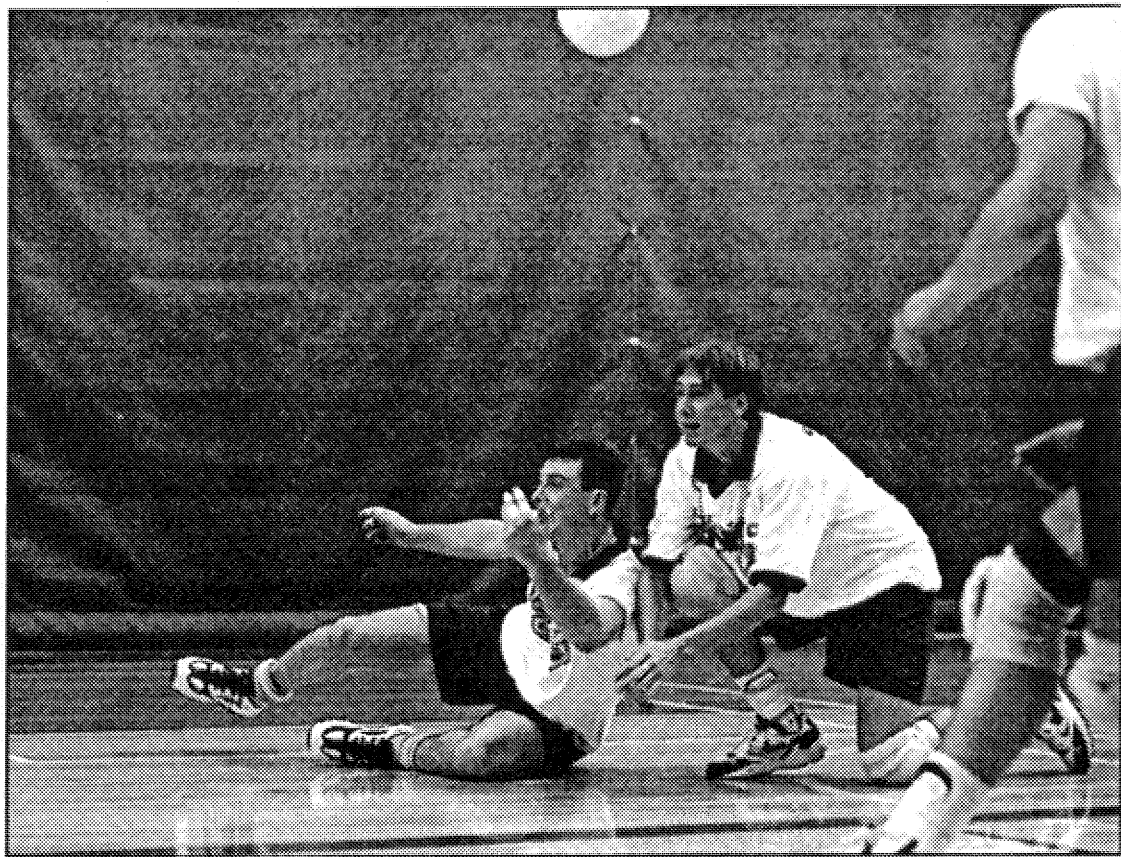
