## NAITSA to Host By-Elections

Next month, NAITSA will be holding by-elections to fill the post of Communications Vice-President, which became vacant with the recent resignation of Spencer Myers.

According to the NAITSA constitution, "any vacancy occurring before the start of the second semester shall be filled by a by-election conducted in the same manner as Executive Council Elections." (section 6.09.5). This by-election will be held on October 18 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Voting stations will be set up around campus.

To be eligible for the position, candidates must be a member of the Student Association in good standing and enrolled in a program of at least 2 years. You must be enrolled for the full length of the term in office and have an academic average above a minimum pass. (NAITSA constitution sec-

tion 10.02.2)

Nomination forms are available at the NAITSA office. These forms must be submitted with 10 signatures. (section 10.03) The deadline to submit nominations is Friday, October 4 at 4:30 pm.

Candidates can begin their campaign on Friday October 11. Posters must be approved by NAITSA before they are put up. Campaigning ends on Friday, October 17 at 4:30 pm. Posters must be taken down by this time as campaigning is not allowed on election day.

Candidates' speeches will be held on Wednesday, October 11. Times and places will be announced at a later time.

The lucky candidate that wins the election will begin their term as Communications Vice President on Monday, October 21.

## \$9.9 million NAIT Expansion Officially Opens

Edmonton, September 18, 1996—NAIT leapt into the 21st Century with the completion of its state-of-the-art \$9.9 million expansion. The expansion project was achieved without new government money. NAIT raised a full two-thirds of the funding for its construction through Partners in Tomorrow, a five-year capital campaign. The balance was set aside through prudent management of NAIT resources.

"We're pleased with the success of the Partners in Tomorrow campaign," says J.R. Shaw, Sr., Chairman of the NAIT Board of

Governors and head of the fundraising campaign. "The fact that \$6.4 million was donated by students, staff and the business community, makes this achievement even more significant."

NOVA Corp. donated over \$250 000 for the purchase of the instructional equipment for NAIT's new South Learning Centre. "We are pleased to be one of the many businesses committed to this cause," says Mr. Robert Day, Manager of Government Affairs at NOVA. "We realize the increasing need for a highly skilled work force, and like many others, we believe it is important to sup-

port technical education in Alberta."

The South Learning Centre, which increases NAIT's space by 3.5%, will alleviate overcrowding and provide space for 200 additional students. It includes a 373-seat auditorium with multi-media facilities, laboratories, lecture theatres, a bookstore, and additional classrooms.

"We are extremely grateful for the support NAIT receives from organizations such as NOVA. These generous contributions make projects like this possible," says Dr. Stan Souch, NAIT President.

# Frum Tells Them What They Want To Hear

On Friday, September 20, the inaugural presentation at the Shaw Theatre located on NAIT's new South Learning Centre, was made. The speaker was right-wing author and broadcaster David Frum. He dedicated the proceeds from the presentation's ticket sales and the evening's sales of his most recent book, *What's Right*, to two scholarships for NAIT students. The scholarships are dedicated in the memories of broadcaster Ernie Poscente and NAIT instructor Stewart Barr.

Frum's address was titled "The Private Sector and the Public Interest." In the address, he outlined his personal ideology, as is communicated in his two books, in relation to this inaugural event. He stated it was fitting that the address be made by a person having his beliefs, considering that the South Learning Center was built without government assistance in a time of severe fiscal restraint. He argued that this is evidence that self-reliance and individual initia-

tive are more important and effective than government.

With his usual flair, Frum continued, repeatedly expounding his political beliefs—if that's the way it has been, that's the way it should be. For example, he noted Canadians conquered the western wilderness individually and in isolation. Thus, the effort that has been undertaken in Alberta to cut back government and its influence is not a "radical transformation", but a return to the way it used to

be. He stated that the urban arrangement that we call suburbia, however ecologically damaging and economically unsustainable, should be celebrated. because the cars, malls, and mass consumption that characterize the lifestyle are controlling most aspects of the lives of the majority of Canadians.

He went on to note that westerners often have the "inability to tell the difference between the present and the future." If this is the case, it's doubtful that, as Frum asserts, Albertans will be

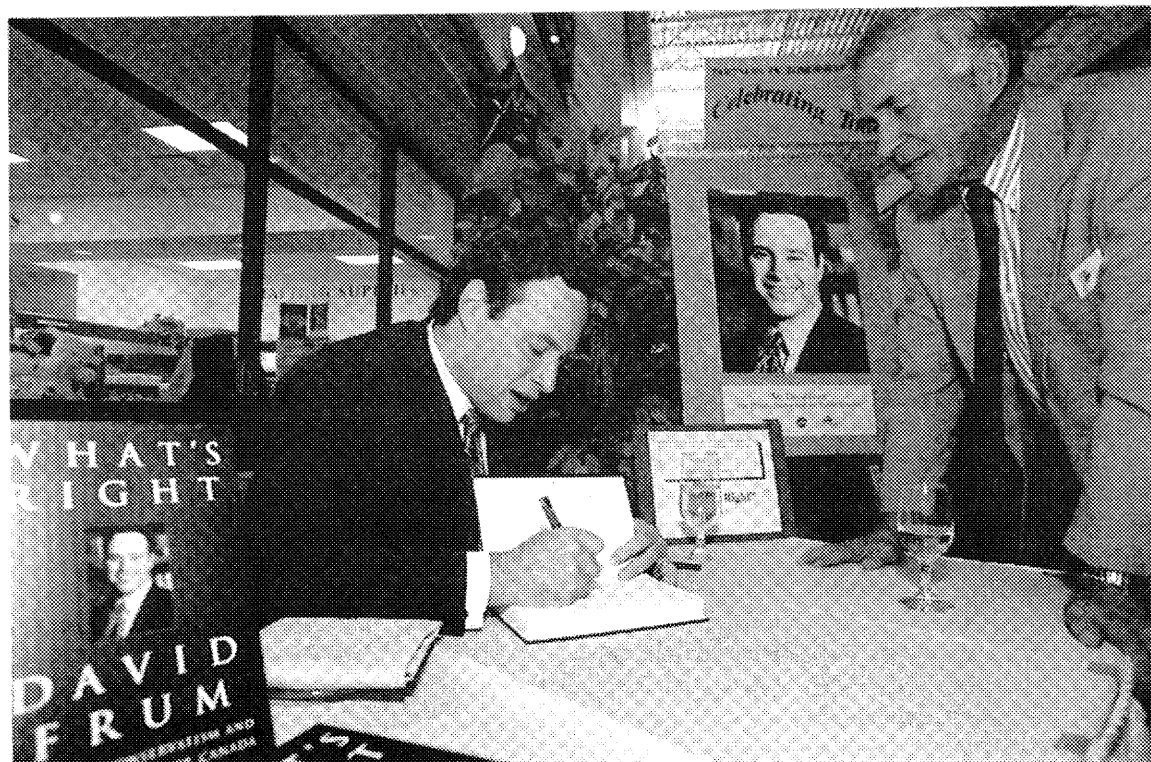

able save Canada.

Unfortunately, Frum claims that he and most other successful holders of conservative political mindsets would also benefit by becoming victim to the "westerner's" delusion.

However, judging by audience response and the presence,

among others, of young right-wing student and author, Ezra Levant, Frum's emotionally appealing and educational presentation was well received and highly suitable for the evening.

Dean Souch was present also to introduce Mr. Frum, and to thank him, and the other sponsors

of the evening, The Edmonton Sun and Avison Young, for their generosity. The president and several members of the student's council were also on hand to thank Frum for his address, and to present him with NAIT T-shirts for him and his family.

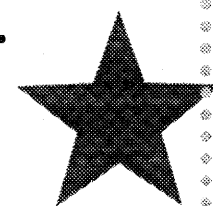
Students of this program will be able to choose from five different diplomas: accounting, finance, management, marketing and office administration. The classes will be taught in both of Canada's offi-

# CBC CUTBACK CANADA

I'd guess you'd say I have unpopular views. I'm a feminist, a socialist, and while I wouldn't call myself an environmentalist, I'd put ecological health before economic growth any day. I also hate what's happening to the CBC.

But before you say, "Hey, I'm not like you at all. We don't believe in any of the same stuff," think for a minute. Think back to when you were a little kid, before you started kindergarten, or when you were home from school sick. You were curled up on a couch with *The Friendly Giant*, *Mr. Dress-Up*, and the Canadianized version of *Sesame Street*. Or think a little later on when you're older and Tuesday's lunchtime talk is all about Joey Jeremiah, Spike, and Wheels and all the other Deggrasidorks who seemed so goofy, yet so relevant. Or think about recent events like the Olympics, or the Canada Cup final before the Americans scored.

Now tell me that CBC wasn't part of your life, has nothing to do with the experience of being Canadian, and isn't worth continued support from our so-called Liberal government.

It seems our country's political leaders are bowing to the cries of the masses consumed with deficit reduction, and not proceeding with something that is in support

of the beliefs on which the Liberal party is founded. Concern with deficit fighting is fine and good. I mean, personally, I would never run my finances like the government has for the past thirty or so years. Spending beyond your means is stupid and shows incredible lack of foresight. But it's not institutions like the CBC that have caused our debt problems.

The cuts to the CBC totalling \$417 million dollars in two years to save the average Canadian less than the cost of one month's cable service, show the current government's lack of reasoning ability. In a time when national unity is of prime importance, the last thing the government needs to do is get rid of a contemporary medium of communication that helps to provide uniquely Canadian cultural experiences to be shared by millions.

Because of this year's cut of \$190 million, the CBC has been forced to re-evaluate it's direction. Continuing with the mandate of "Bringing Canadians to Canadians," the CBC hopes to continue to be able to produce quality programming, while instituting re-

quired changes.

While not all the changes as presented by CBC President, Perrin Beatty, are likely to have a negative effect, many will. The 2,500 people laid off will cause a deficit of brain power that will likely cause a decline in the high standards of quality previously found in CBC programming. The decision to reduce the amount of sports broadcasts will alienate a large number of CBC viewers, while freeing up these profit making shows to the more commercial, American style networks. The decision to include more advertisements, including in

Mr. Dress-Up, will profoundly alter what CBC stands for.

The decision to stop broadcasting all American programming despite the money these programs put into CBC's pocket is positive. Because these shows often cause CBC to be indistinguishable from any other channel, they hope this change will cause the viewing public to realize the importance of CBC, while freeing more time to actually bring Canadians to Canadians. Also, in Alberta, they're returning to two broadcasts of the

evening news, with one based in Edmonton and one in Calgary with intent to improve competitiveness.

However, it is my hope that the CBC does not have to be consumed with the quest for competitiveness. The far superior quality and intelligence that the CBC shows are produced with, especially on radio, should be graded not completely by how many people are tuned in. It is on a more intangible scale that the CBC and it's "competitors" should be graded; that is the total impact the program has on the lives of all who enjoy it. Every day I listen to CBC and every day I feel a small bit of the "Canada Cup before the Americans scored" feeling. It is pride in being Canadian, and a feeling of being a part of something bigger than the individual being interviewed, the song being played, or the idea being discussed; it is a universally attainable daily affirmation of nationhood.

So even if you're not a feminist, a socialist, or an environmentalist by any stretch, you'd be willing to give up one month of cable a year to help preserve a Canadian institution, to prevent television being monopolized by mindless American garbage, or even to save some of those 2,500 jobs. Wouldn't you?

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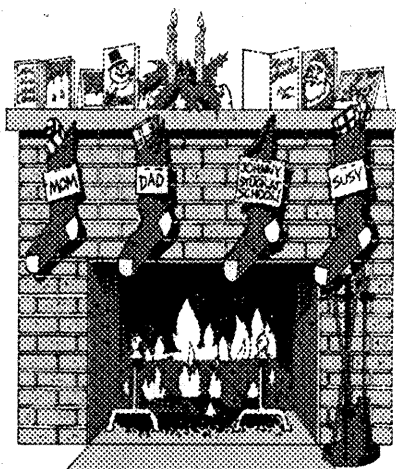

Seven buses. Seven deadly sins. Coincidence? Fate? Bad Karma? Payback for all those times I've ridden the bus and not

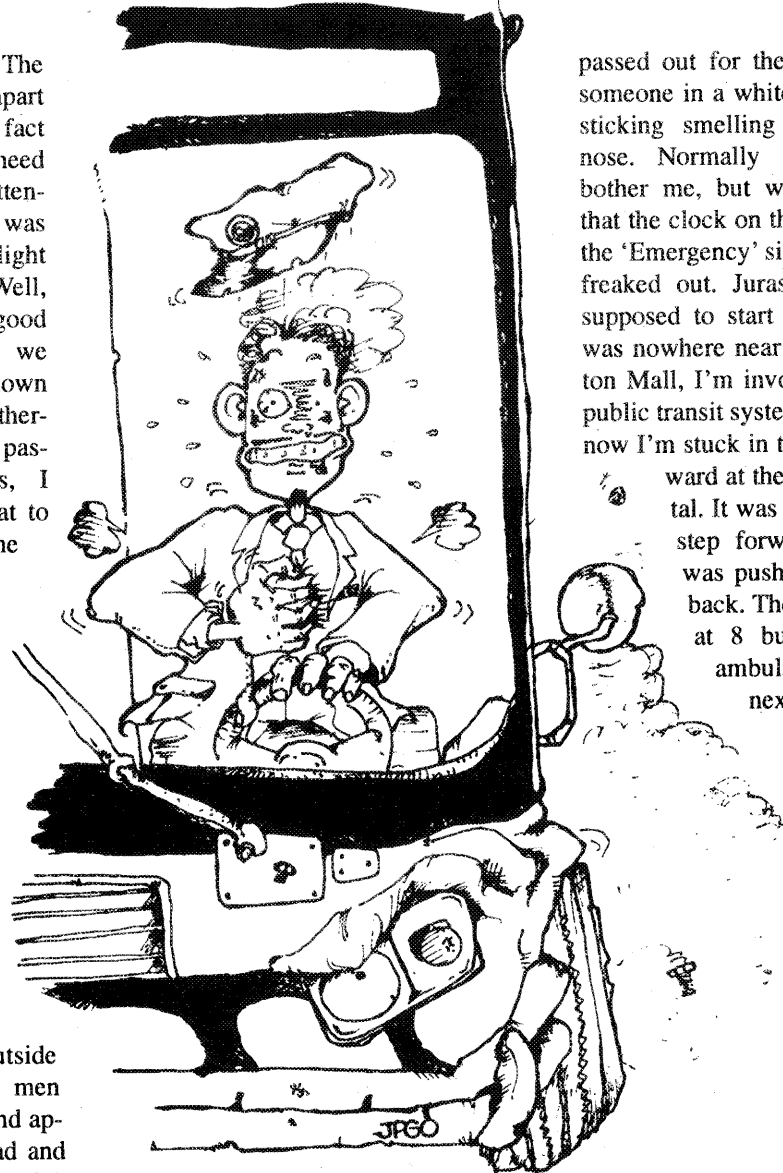

## Premiere Sitcom *Men Behaving Badly*

"Men Behaving Badly" is a new sitcom that premiered last Wednesday. This show will make men (who can laugh at themselves) and women (who would think it's "typical" of a guy) laugh out loud! Its producers are the fine folks of Carsey-Werner whose credits include 3rd Rock from the Sun, Grace Under Fire, and Cybill.

"Men Behaving Badly" is one of my favorite debuting shows this season and here is why: The stupidity of men is captured, and not from a "bashing" perspective as some critics have concurred, but from a realistic point of view that both men and women can laugh at, simply because it exists. I know some men that do not fit into this category, and I know some that are of equally disgusting nature. Unfortunately, I also know some men that exceed this level and boast of their behaviour. The show's focus is not to imply men are inferior but just to poke fun at some inherent traits that they have.

The show stars Rob Schneider (formerly of Saturday Night Live), who plays Jamie, an unemployed photographer, Justine Bateman

(Family Ties), who plays Sarah, a nurse, and Ron Eldard (formerly ER paramedic), who is Kevin, a manager at a security systems company. Kevin and Sarah are a couple, and Kevin and Jamie are roommates. The plot entails men saying stupid things at the wrong time, and being very analytical. It also portrays men as uncommitted, adolescent, and downright dense! (Surprising! - I think not). They are unserious, irresponsible, and can't make a decision without beer. A narrator states in the middle of the episode, "Some decisions are just too important to make without beer." Also, the men lack the part of the brain that holds back offending comments. ## "Club Malibu Situation"

A number of persons have asked me what is happening with the "Club Malibu situation". For those of you unfamiliar with our story, it goes something like this: earlier this year myself and a number of my friends experienced or heard about a number of incidents. There, fellow blacks were being denied access to certain Club Malibu's (The Morgue, Southside, Bourbon St.) for what we believe to be discriminatory reasons. After continuous incidents, we decided to bond together and file a series of complaints against the Malibu outlets with the Alberta Human Rights Commission. And this is where our case stood at the end of last semester. Subsequently, there have been new developments.

During the summer, myself and my co-complainants had an initial meeting with Mr. Shiraz Kariuali, one of the co-owners of the Club Malibu's, his lawyer and an officer from the Human Rights Commission. At this meeting a number of concerns were discussed by the parties, it was decided that a subsequent meeting would be held with Club Malibu's management present. This meeting was held on Sept. 9 and Mr. Kariuali informed his managers that under no circumstances were they to discriminate against patrons of different ethnicity. Persons can and may be denied access

if they are inappropriately attired, are known troublemakers or in the company of such individuals, or if they are intoxicated. The suggestion was put forward that when persons are denied access they are informed as to the reasons why. It was also jointly agreed on as to what people should do, if as they feel they are being denied entrance on racial grounds. In light of last week's exposés in the Edmonton Journal focusing on racial discrimination at local night spots, this writer believes that the public should be informed on what actions are to be taken, should they encounter such problems. Please take note of and remember the following:

"If you or others have future problems in gaining access and you feel you have been discriminated against, you should ask to speak with the manager on site. If not satisfied there, ask to speak to the owner. Ask calmly why you have been treated this way, and be prepared to describe why you feel that the treatment is not fair. Note the time, date, persons involved and any witnesses to the event that are available."

"If you have not been satisfied at this point, you can decide that you want to do nothing further, or you can make a human rights complaint or speak with a lawyer or friend about what other steps might be taken."

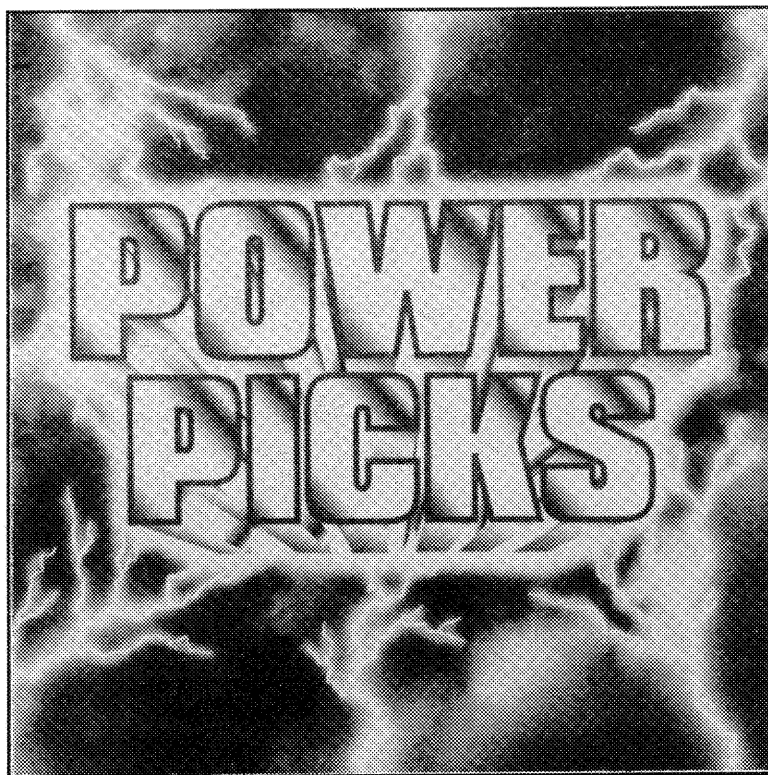
Probably the two biggest disappointing groups on this album are **Picasso's Life** and **State of Affairs**. 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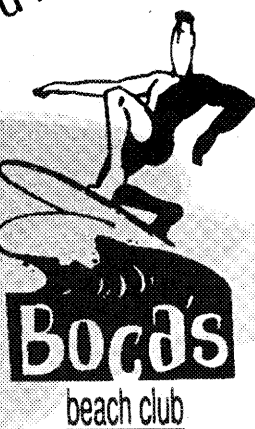

I found this entire CD to be a refreshing change from the regular top 40. I highly recommend picking one up!



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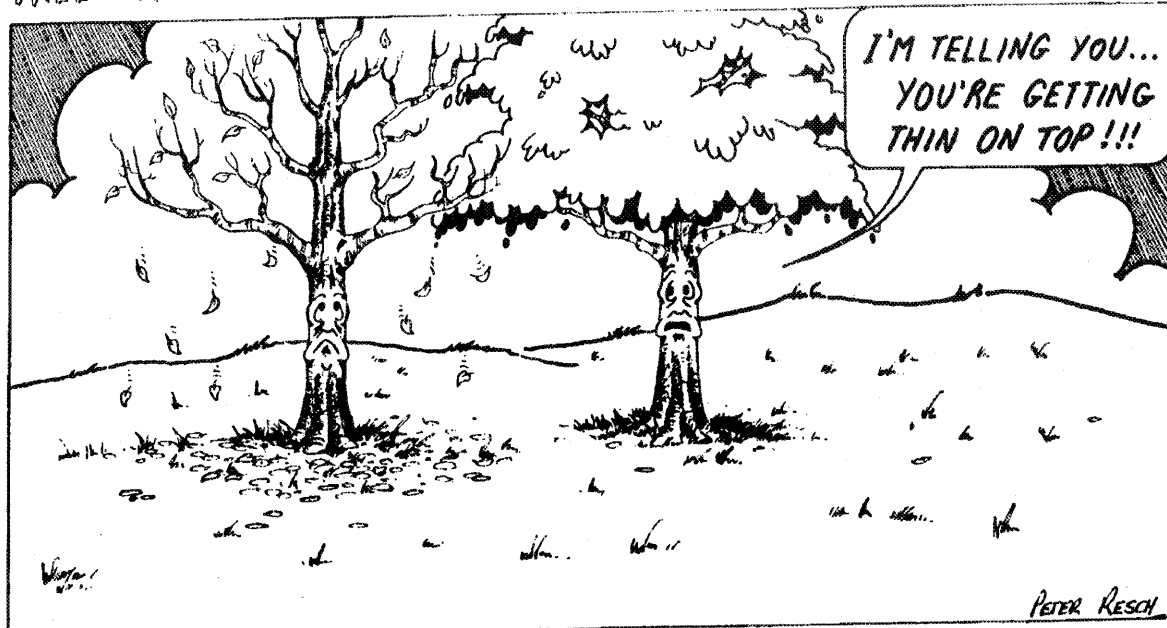
**SHE**

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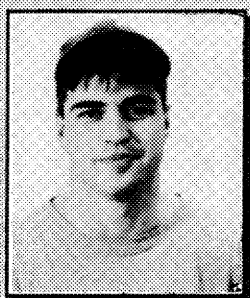

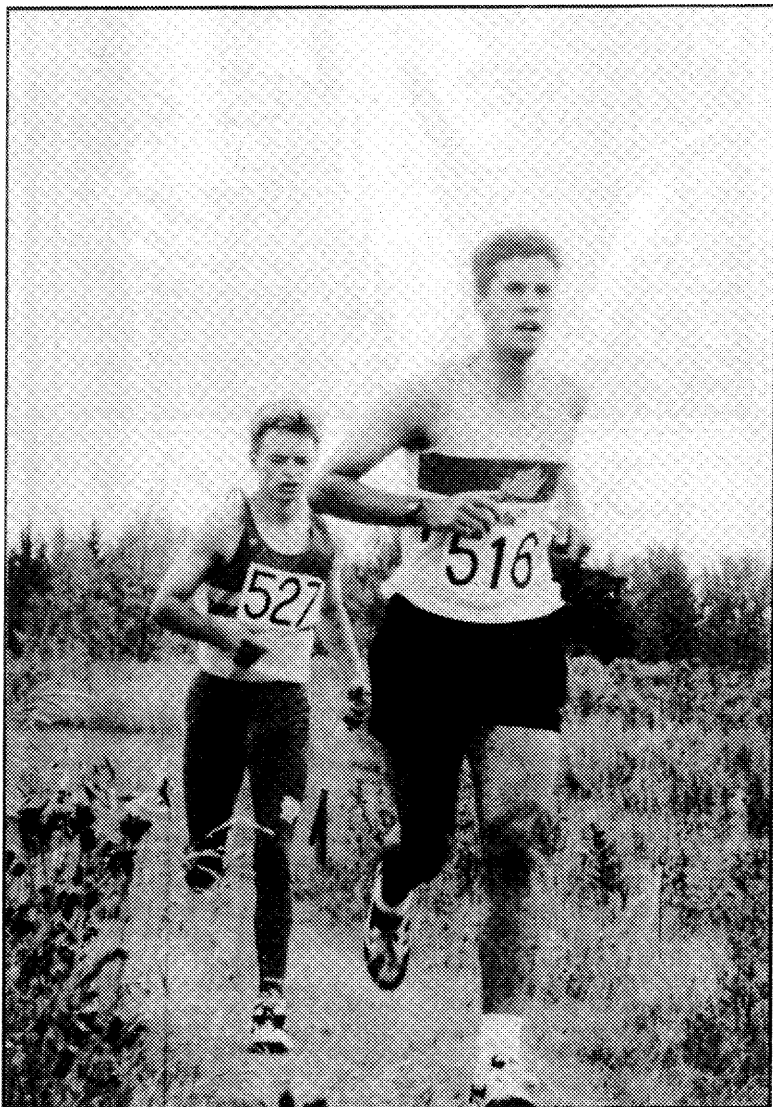
The NAIT Cross-Country team traveled to the Open Red Deer College Cross-Country races last Saturday.
