

# **NAITSA to Host By-Elections**

Next month, NAITSA will be holding by-elections to fill the post of Communications Vice-President, which became vacant with the recent resignation of Spencer Myers.

According to the NAITSA constitution, "any vacancy occurring before the start of the second semester shall be filled by a byelection conducted in the same manner as Executive Council Elections." (section 6.09.5). This by-election will be held on October 18 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Voting stations will be set up around campus...

To be eligible for the position, candidates must be a member of the Student Association in good standing and enrolled in a program of at least 2 years. You must be enroled for the full length of the term in office and have an academic average above a minimum pass. (NAITSA constitution section 10.02.2)

Nomination forms are available at the NAITSA office. These forms must be submitted with 10 signatures. (section 10.03) The deadline to submit nominations is Friday, October 4 at 4:30 pm.

Candidates can begin their campaign on Friday October 11. Posters must be approved by NAITSA before they are put up. Campaigning ends on Friday, October 17 at 4:30 pm. Posters must be taken down by this time as campaigning is not allowed on election day.

Candidates' speeches will be held on Wednesday, October 11. Times and places will be announced at a later time.

The lucky candidate that wins the election will begin their term as Communicati-ons Vice President on Monday, October 21.


Deer College Cross-Country races for the men's team. last Saturday.
