

## Not Sexy SAW

Through its name, Sexual Awareness Week might suggest it is a period of time set aside to revisit all the embarrassing Grade 5 Sex Ed stuff on first periods and nocturnal emissions. In fact, SAW is designed to remind students of the bad scares that can accompany sexual activity (which is what they probably teach in contemporary Sex Ed class). Organized by NAITSA, SAW addresses unwanted pregnancy, sexually transmitted dis-

ease, and rape, specifically acquaintance rape.

ing. According to Kara Anderson of SAC, the focus will be on breaking down myths that surround acquaintance rape and on preventing sexual assault through the use of effective communication.

At the university, the comparable week is called Sexual Assault Awareness Week. However, according to Scott Fediow, Activities V.P., "Assault" is removed from the title at NAIT, because our Awareness Week is more about promoting responsible sexual behavior in general.

## Create a New Country

The Magna for Canada Scholarship Fund is asking college and university students the following question: "If you were the Prime Minister of Canada, what would you do to improve living standards and unite the country?"

This annual awards program is designed to inspire new ideas for a more prosperous and united country.

The awards program is sponsored by Magna International Inc., the largest supplier of automotive components in Canada. It is also sponsored by the Fair Enterprise Institute, a non-profit, non-politically affiliated organization whose premise is to improve Canada's standards of living.

## NAITSA Meeting

It was another long NAITSA General Council meeting with little discussion and lots of constitution reading.

The first two readings to remove our commitment to ACTISEC from the constitution were held.

A straw vote was held to put in motion a change to NAITSA's involvement in Shinerama. Be-

cause of declining student involvement and fund raising success, the Executive suggested amalgamating the student's association charitable involvement or holding activities similar to Shinerama later in the year.

A motion to increase the Executive's salaries from \$650 to \$950 for the vice-presidents and \$900 to \$1200 for the president was passed. These increases were proposed to offset increases in

the cost of living and to bring the level to rates more comparable to other institutions of the same size. (The levels at SAIT and RDC are around \$1400.)

Activities V.P. Scott Fediow, rounded out the hours with reminders about Imaginus, a poster sale which runs January 23 and 24 in the Naitrium, and about the Reading Pause Ski Trip which runs February 14-17 and for which a \$75 deposit is due January 17.

consumer reports and genealogy materials are some of the many other things available at the library.


Non-residents no longer have to pay the extremely high fees that they used to have to pay. Now, with a valid library card (like for St. Albert, for example) you pay just \$12.00!

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# Have your cake and eat it too?!?

At this time of year many people have made resolutions to "eat right" and cut back on junk food and things like that. A new product being considered for public use, Olestra, may make eating junk food a guilt-free experience.

**BKE:** "But you can have chicken!"


**ME:** "Uh..."

## Pulp Horror

As the lights began to dim in the theatre, my friend and I were hopeful that the movie was everything that the previews said it would be. Soon after the opening credits I began to feel that we had been the victims of misleading advertising.

The promotions led me to believe that I was in store for a science fiction thriller. Sadly, the climax was so thrilling that my friend had to nudge me back to full consciousness...Twice.

This movie is about a genetic aberration, a superstitious cop, and an evolutionary biologist. The genetic aberration is a gargantuan creature with yellow fangs, razor sharp claws, and a long scaly tail. Created by Oscar award winning creature effects artist Stan Winston (Aliens, Jurassic Park), this monster is the

highlight of the movie.

Bodies begin turning up, and homicide detective Vincent D'Agosta, played by Tom Sizemore, gets the case. A boatful of corpses drifts into harbour, and soon a connection is made with a mysterious decapitation at the Chicago Museum of Natural History.

It is there that the detective meets, Dr. Margo Green, played by Penelope Ann Miller. Unfortunately, the doctor contributes little else than the shrieks of terror and the occasional tidbit of scientific insight. On a good note, she doesn't fall in love with the detective by the end of the movie, saving my stomach any extra upset.

The majority of the movie is the typical chase movie. For the most part the chase takes place in the secret tunnels and deep catacombs that can be found in so many natural history museums in the United States.

By the end of the movie I was feeling cheated, and I didn't even pay to get in. So if you like spooky monsters, badly written plot, then this is the movie for you. The effects however are quite impressive, but I'd wait until it hits the dollar theatres

A due change of pace this season from dramatic movies that are screaming Golden Globe nominations and Academy Award contenders, Turbulence holds its own appeal with edgy, explosive, action-packed adventure.

Ray Liotta and Lauren Holly star in this flick and develop desirable chemistry since neither are overexposed and are talented in what they do.

Ray Liotta plays a psychotic serial killer who is in the process of being transported to L.A. to begin his death sentence. He takes over the airplane in hopes of a crash landing to avoid death row. This is a part more suited for Liotta's talents. Where he's the

likable bad guy. Operation Dumbo Drop put him in the bell jar and Unforgettable wasn't thick enough to captivate audiences. Turbulence is a film that seems more challenging for Liotta - much like the classic flick GoodFellas.

Mrs. Jim Carrey, cutesy Lauren Holly takes her roles up to a new plateau as she breaks the ice with a solid effort at being a top-billed leading lady. Holly's performance is exceptional as she plays a likable flight attendant forced to fly the airplane as Liotta causes obstacles (trying to stop her). Since her days at Picket Fences and roles in such credible films like The Dragon, Dumb & Dumber, and Down Periscope, Holly reveals a new side to her acting abilities as she is required to cry, kill and scream her head off in Turbulence. She does it very well.

Another benefit to Turbulence aside from the performances is the special effects. The

realistic shots and unique camera angles keep this movie in high-paced motion. For those who are mesmerized by colossal special effects, I'm sure that you'll appreciate the extreme technical efforts.

So, it was not the incredible performances and the incredible effects that brings Turbulence down a couple of notches; but one major flaw is its weirded out plot. The movie is favorable unpredictable — yet the plot is filled with gaps (or opportunities) to question. Why didn't she do this?? She should have done this. But, aren't they all.

Overall, Turbulence is an acceptable flick in its field of action and flows well — so much that the time in the theater seems too short. The movie is a little bloody (but not overly) and is funny in a psychotic/warped way. Turbulence is action packed, but it's not kick ass. But, I'd take in this movie before any Van Damme or Seagal film anyway.

- Madonna's role as EVITA is overexposed and over-hyped. She's suitable enough for the film but her portrayal is nothing to write home about.



Tupac Shakur, alias Makaveli: 1971 - 1996. This kid was only four years older than me and he already released a handful of albums, acted in a couple movies, completed a jail term and died a violent death. Tupac died with enough recorded material to release three more albums: Makaveli, Outlaw Immortals and One Nation. This album being the first of the three.

With a double album already released earlier in the year, Tupac has recorded forty tracks this year. Producing this much material you would think that his second album would sound much like his first, but Tupac utilizes a whole new team of producers unlike his first album. Tupac also used guest appearances on half the tracks of his last album, however he raps by himself on all but two tracks on this album.

It seems Tupac didn't want to let his war against the East-coast end, as he attacks known rappers: Notorious B.I.G., Sean "Puffy" Combs, Mobb Deep, Jay-Z and Nas. He also manages to rap about his childhood, hardships, mortality, sanity and ghetto life, strife and love, the material that made him so recognized and appreciated. Tupac warns anybody who hangs with him in "Hail Mary" as he raps about the violence that surrounds him and his lifestyle. The nasty boys of R&B, K-Ci & JoJo of Jodeci fame, make an appearance in the song "Toss It Up", along with Aaron Hall and seventeen-year-old Death Row singer Danny Boy. This is an upbeat party jam dedicated to the ladies, but Tupac still finds a way to vent some steam and say bye to Dr. Dre, who left the Death Row camp. In "White Man's World" Tupac gives words of hope to the black people who live in the ghettos and tells them to use intelligence to get out of their social penitentiary instead of violence. "Me And My Girlfriend" is a ghetto fairy tale of crime and love: "Lost in the whirlwind/'96 Bonnie and Clyde/Me and my girlfriend".

Tupac was always aware of his words and actions and the repercussions they could generate with lyrics like: "Probably be murdered for the shit that I said" from "Against All Odds". The fact that he usually wore a bulletproof vest proved this. Love him or hate him, Tupac's life, as well as his death, affected everyone who listened to his music, remembering him makes his star shine longer and brighter.

Very rarely is a soundtrack produced that contains a diverse set of musical styles, yet still manages to convey the original feel of the movie with each and every song. The soundtrack to Romeo and Juliet is such a thing.

Each and every song — be it alternative, long song, grunge, or whatever — mimics the movie in its own way. It's almost as if each songwriter was trying to write their own version of the film, but form their own style and perspective. From Garbage's hardened angelic sound to Radiohead's moody in-your-face lyrics, there's something for everyone, no matter what your musical tastes — and chances are you'll enjoy the CD as a whole.

An even bigger surprise came after I had opened the package up. Yep, R&J's soundtrack is an Enhanced CD, which has become very popular around the music industry lately. If you've got yourself a computer capable of playing it (IBM PC with Win 3.1 or higher, or a Macintosh), you can try this thing out. The creators didn't want to give too many hints away on using it, so you kind of have to play around a lot.

As far as Enhanced CD's go, this is one of the best I've seen to date. It's neo-gothic style of interface doubles as a player for the CD's music, as well as allowing you to go through a slideshow of pictures from the movie itself. In fact, if you tell it to play a song and let it sit, it will automatically flip through the pictures as well as advance to the next song. Really cool stuff.

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
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# Take Three



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


# Men's Volleyball


