



However, with his recent poor and inconsistent decisions, Smith has proven, with the flair of a solely politically motivated monster, that he is interested only in his re-election.

His support of the decision to deny the funding of \$30 million dollars to rehabilitate our lifeless downtown shows poor judgement and understanding of city function. The lack of a vibrant city core does not only deny city dwellers experiences of social, cultural, and urban opportunities; it also harms the business community in several ways.

Few people are drawn downtown from the city and surrounding areas, so little money is spent, and business cannot flourish. Business from elsewhere will not be attracted to locate in Edmonton without a lively downtown when the sole urban attractions are an overcrowded mall

and a 3 block strip of pubs. Denying the funding drives another nail into the downtown coffin, but it is easy to understand why it was done; Billy was too chicken to ask the average homeowner to cough up a few bucks to ensure the future of the city.

Before this, however, it seemed Smith and council were going to do something right for Edmonton's future. They were instituting a property tax system where owners would start to pay for the current value of the property. It seemed, for a moment, that downtown property owners would be given a long deserved break after paying taxes far too high when compared with the market value of the properties.

Unfortunately, when council found that they would have a revenue shortfall as a result of the change to a fair system, they deour downtown.

If it means losing votes for themselves to benefit the entire city, Smith and friends will continue to be unconcerned about improving the likelihood that life could be breathed into our downtown, which would, thereby, improve the business prospects of Edmonton.

Because Bill Smith hasn't had any problem breaking his election promises in the past, and because all he has left is his promise to be pro-business, I guess if he breaks this one too, he'll have a perfect record.







Wise guy movies have to be the best there are. Donnie Brasco is no different as it almost comes close to the ranking of GoodFellas and Casino. Johnny Depp and Al Pacino star in a "based on a true story" tale of an undercover cop working in New York to blow the lid off of a dominating mafia. Johnny Depp (Cry Baby, Benny and Joon, Edward Scissorhands, Nick of Time) plays the character of the undercover FBI agent, Joey Pistone, a.k.a. Donnie Brasco. Al

Pacino (Scent of a Woman, and the bitterness that Lefty is Frankie and Johnny, Heat) plays an aging key player in the mafia network and goes by the name of

The story breaks when the two come into contact and Lefty takes Donnie under his wing. Donnie, of course, goes along to discover and collect evidence of criminal acts. He is forced to partake in criminal activity to keep his cover; and the "brotherhood" mentality of the mafia soon embraces him. As the credibility of Donnie increases, the closer Lefty and Donnie's relationship becomes. Lefty is one who has been in the mafia for approximately 30 years, yet is at a standstill in moving up to the ranks of a mob-boss. The major glitch of the tale is that Donnie becomes so absorbed with the life he leads undercover, he begins to understand the values and will defend them. Side issues in this film are: his family is sorely neglected,

experiencing for not being recognized or acknowledged. Johnny Depp proves by this role that he is escaping the "pretty-boy" romantic comedy image; and delivers a strength to this demanding role. Al Pacino, what can I say... it's Al Pacino, the best man to play a witty, rock-hard tough-

Because Donnie Brasco is a true story, the ending is less predictable because the outcome can swing many ways; awaiting the outcome is thrilling on its own. Majid Kiani Master of Persian Music at the Shaw Theatre Wednesday, March 19, 1997



For a man who knows very little about Iran or its culture, I developed a great affinity for the music of Majid Kiani in a very short period of time. What I do know of him is that he is very well educated (having studied musicology at the Sorbonne in Paris), very well respected (with discs on the prestigious Harmonio Mundi, Ocora and Auvidis labels) and very distinguished in his career (since he's generally recognized as the modern master of the Santur, or

hammer dulcimer, toured and lectured extensively throughout the world, received the highest honors, and is now directing the music program at the University of Tehran).

NAIT had the privilege of hosting this great man on Wednesday night as he treated everyone to an evening of his classical Persian music. The Santur is described as a trapezoidal resonating box with eighteen sets of four strings, and is played with two lightweight wooden hammers, and the sound it produces is among the sweetest and most beautiful in the world.

Persian musicians must be proficient in playing solo and improvising. In these regards, Kiani is regarded as the best. It was an honour having this great man play here.








Below: Kim Emilson, a Journeyman Baker, demonstrates to the public how to make cake decorations during the Open House in the Bakery Department.









Going DEEP

Mobb Deep Hell On Earth (Enhanced CD) LOUD/RCA Records http://www.loud.com reviewed by Mic

"In those days when the people were blasphemous, led astray by the false prophets who spoke unholy gospels and worshipped at the feet of the goddess Lucci, the Lord HIP HOP turned its face from the people in anger: 'I will unleash my holy messengers upon you so that you may know how greatly you have displeased me!' And the heavens ripped open and blood-red fire rained upon the cities as the angels Havoc and Prodigy brought down their fury on all the dis-believers and slanderous hypocrites. Thus began the era of Hell on Earth."

Sacred Tomes of the Boom Bap Scroll 3, Verses 6 and 7

One of the most intense hardcore rap acts to appear this decade is, without a doubt, Mobb Deep. Even though this latest flood of wanna-be-thug-turned-rapper fads has turned me off, I have recognized a truly great album. This is the Mobb's third album, and the lyrical content may not have changed from their second album, The Infamous, but why mess with near-perfection? Most people who know of Mobb Deep aren't aware to their first album, but Havoc and Prodigy released an album under the alias Poetical Prophets and entitled it Juvenile Hell. By not changing their lyrical content, they run the risk of being criticized by the media as being carbon-copied lyrical gangsters adding to their problems with society. But if they tone down their lyrics a notch or two they lose their core audience and have their hardcore credentials come under scrutiny. With all the gun-toting, I'll stick you lyrics there is also inward reflection with lines like: "I'm tired of living life this way/Crime pays, but for how long?/ 'Till you reach a downfall" from "Animal Instinct". Production on this album raises a level as Havoc tries new styles like haunting organ choruses, sharp kicks and snares and female voices chanting in the background. While also keeping the dark styles that made The Infamous turned gold like the thick and heavy bass, mesmerizing pianos and that scratchy record sound in the background. There are also some guest appearances on this album from other very well-known artists like Wu-Tang Clan member Method Man, fellow label-mate and another Wu-Tang Clan member Raekwon and fellow Queensbridge native Nas. Big Noyd also manages to make another appearance twice on this album. Although a Mobb Deep album doesn't require these guest appearances to bring it well-deserved recognition, they make this album a shinier gem. It's hard to name a few tracks on this album as standouts, as this entire album is tight. Overall this is a better album than last year's but lacks the presence of dominating tracks, like last year's "Survival Of The Fittest" and "Shook Ones Part II". This is also an Enhanced CD, which means if your computer is hi-tech enough, you can experience additional multimedia when the CD is inserted in your CD-Rom drive. There is also a hidden song that you can only access through the Enhanced CD feature, but first you must visit their web-site to obtain the instructions and the secret code. 



















Random Thoughts From an Empty Head



On Saturday afternoon we turned the


trick again, poking three holes in the Condoms and winning 3-1. Don Dunnigan, Brett Huckerby and Trevor Ruptash snyped for us.



Credit should be given to the entire team for never losing faith. Quit was not in our dictionary. Till the bitter end we truly were one word. RELENTLESS.


