

Summer job time is around the corner with only a month and a bit left of school. It seems, at this time of year, that everyone is out to help us find jobs.

The Hire-A-Student Job Hotline has opened well in advance of the actual job office opening which will take place May 1. The 24-Hour Hotline can be reached at 495-3900. New jobs are posted every day. As well as job listings in various categories, including career related, child care, health care, labour, retail, restaurant, and house painting/landscaping, the Hotline offers information on job search skills and employment equity.

According to Shaliza Shorey, an official for Human Resources and Development quoted in the Edmonton Journal, the Hotline is open now so that more employers will have posted employment opportunities by the time the office opens in May. To post jobs, employers should call 495-2070.

Closer to our home, NAIT Counseling and Career Services,

located in the South Lobby, Room O111, offers similar services that are more specific to the technology you are studying. They have job listings sorted by technology, and relative even to last year, you have a greater number of opportunities. To expand on information about job search skills, CACS offers counseling in job search and interview techniques, as well as discussion of interests and aptitudes as related to career.



Special Olympics NAIT gets involved

Getting involved has taken a new meaning for many NAIT students and staff. Some staff and students took part in a bowlathon Saturday, to help raise funds for the summer Special Olympics.

Two teams from NAIT participated in the bowlathon. One, headed by our president, Dr. Souch, also includes NAITSA's Finance Academic VP Tara Tanguay and Business instructor Gordon Smith. The other team, headed by Vice President Jim Berg, includes Con Ed student Graham Black and Business instructor Anne Jacobs.

The Special Olympics gives mentally and physically challenged athletes the chance to develop specific sport skills; discipline required to train and be a part of a team; gain confidence and learn to set goals and accomplish goals; and develop self-confidence.

The Alberta Special Olympics Summer Games will include 9 events: these events include soccer, track and field, and bowling. Currently there are 100 athletes and coaches registered to participate in the Games June 20-22. At the Winter Games, which took place March 7-9 in and around Edson, 246 athletes and coaches participated.

The Special Olympics Athlete's Oath is: "Let me win. But if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt."

NAIT's other connections to the Special Olympics include: business students Brad Carson and Continuing Education's Graham Black, who serves asTreasurer and Finance Director respectively; Graham Black is also a member of the Summer Games Board; CST instructor Nora Jean Paradis, who is a board member of the Edmonton Special Olympics and the Summer Games Committee; Dan Maloney, the manager of Continuing Education, who is a Summer Games board member; Marion Marler, a Con Ed student, who is responsible for recruiting volunteers for the Summer Games; and Linda Hoffman, a business instructor, who is involved with the Edmonton Special Olympics and was involved for many years with the Special Olympics in Virginia.




STASH YOUR STUFF FOR THE SUMMER



Jim Carrey is back in LIAR LIAR. If there is one man in Hollywood that deserves a \$20 million dollar plus salary, it is him. Carrey has a true talent of exploiting himself to deliver the best possible performance he (when blowing out his birthday can. His talent for molding his rubber face, and emphasizing his distorted speech would make even a straight faced tightie crack a smile. LIAR LIAR is an all-out comedy which features Jim Carrey's embarrassing style utilized in a new way. He's not intended to be annoying like in the Ace Venturas, and he is not intended to be dumb or mental like in Dumb and Dumber or The Cable Guy. However, Carrey's sarcastic, mouthiness is what makes this a superb, all-audiences film.

From the opening scene to the end, LIAR LIAR spins with comedic value with only a few serious moments intervening. Some highlight scenes are as follows: Tina Turner impression, bathroom scene, court room scene, and the conference room scene. Carrey plays a big shot lawyer/father/ex-husband, Fletcher, who lies for a living and frequently neglects his son. After missing his son's birthday, his son wishes

cake candles) for his dad to be unable to tell a lie for one day. The duration of the movie spans over this one day of forced honesty; and unavoidable mishaps cause potential trouble for Fletcher.

LIAR LIAR is an exceptional comedy because the comedic pitches range from simple mumbled statements to full blown slap stick. Another factor that makes this film a hit with audiences is that although the preview is funny and attracts people to go see it, it doesn't give away all of the punches.

Of course I recommend this flick to all audiences; it's light hearted and hardly offensive. LIAR LIAR has been toted as being Carrey's comeback success after The Cable Guy (What was wrong with The Cable Guy?); but Mr. Hollywood doesn't have to prove anything. However, if you aren't a fan of Carrey's schtick, leave this one alone—it will only annoy you.
