The Bible Code

Prophecies of doom, apocalyptic visions and cold, hard facts to back it all up. That's the bible code in short.

It's a kind of historical registry of man's most important figures and events, and it was written and encoded in the bible more than 3000 years ago. The Wright Brothers, Hitler, Edison, Shakespeare, Watergate, World War II, electricity, it's all in there intertwined in the words of the Torah. It is absolutely amazing to think of the implications of this discovery.

WHAT IS IT AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

When the bible was first delivered to mankind in ancient Masoretic text (Hebrew), it was simply a long line of characters with the spaces eliminated. Man, of course, put the spaces in and

there you had the Torah (the first five books of the bible). Dr. Rips took the text in it's original form (spaces eliminated) and performed an experiment on the Book of

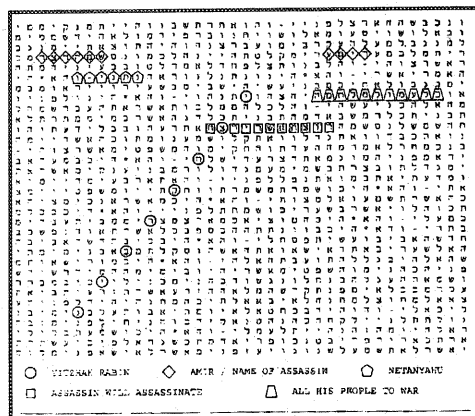

The code also predicted the assassination of Yitzhak Rabin, the former prime minister of Israel. Along with his name was printed "Amir" (the name of his assassin), "Netanyahu" (who would be the next prime minister) and "assassin will assassinate". 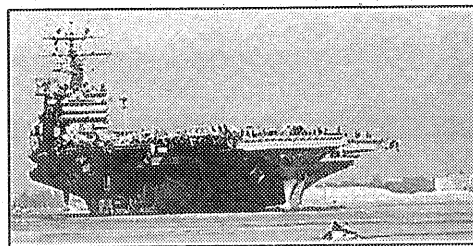
The phrase is referring to Rabin's people, the people of Israel. In the

last few years, tensions have been mounting between Israel and it's neighbors over the way the mid-east peace process is being conducted by the United States. Subsequently, the U.S. has fallen out of favor with Israel's neighbors and has been unable to use it's usual strong arm tactics with Iraq. Without the support of the mid-eastern block, America is powerless with Iraq, which is why they have been using the United Nations as a front to fulfill their agenda in Iraq.

Last week, President Clinton announced that he would be sending a second Aircraft Carrier, the U.S.S. George Washington, to the Persian Gulf in response to Iraq's latest refusal to allow American members of the UN arm's inspection teams into areas under investigation.

"This is simply too dangerous an issue that would set too powerful a precedent about the impotence of the United Nations if we didn't proceed on this," Clinton said.

The U.S. has made it clear that they do not need permission from the United Nations to take

With all of these facts combined and the example America has

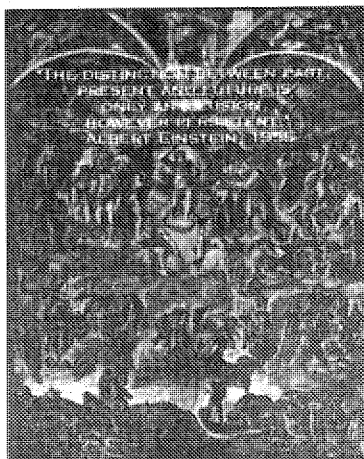

Of course, I suppose screaming at him and telling him

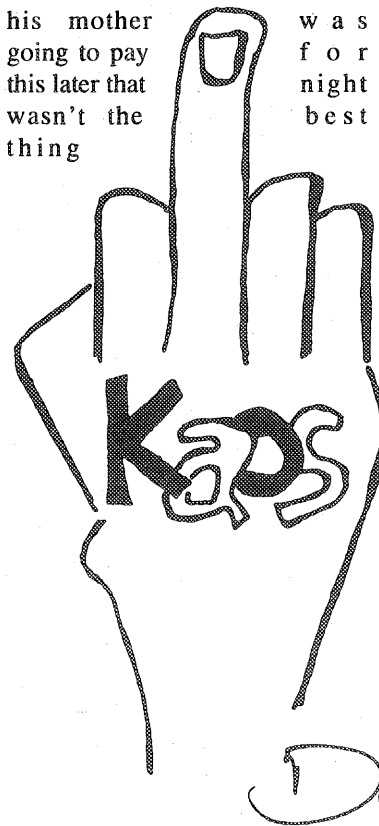
his mother going to pay this later that wasn't the thing

why they call me Crazy Mike."

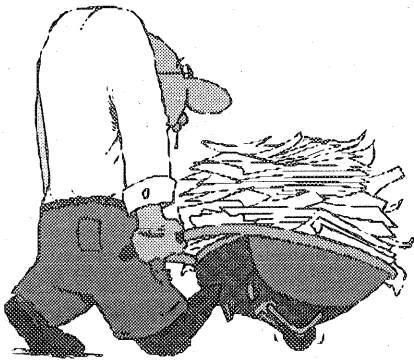
Mike would like everyone to know that he's single. He's looking for a girl with a sense of humor, fun to be with, and attrac-

A man that flew to Las Vegas to see U2 perform! A man that went to Ontario for the Juno awards! A man that toured with Wide Mouth Mason in the States! A man that wrote a tribute to his grandfather in the paper when he turned 100 years old! A man that received a phone call from Gavin Rossdale to discuss the concert review he wrote on BUSH! This one man is Shawn Ohler, music writer for The Edmonton Journal.

**RATTING ON WHAT
SHAWN SAID:**

"It's the TV guys that are the life of the party while the print guys stay in the corner, bitch, and just drink."

On Friday, November 14, 1997, we sat down with Shawn in the NEST to discuss his role in the local media, and to gain his perspective on music, journalism, and life in general.

Shawn, a 26 year old, Carleton University graduate, made his way to Edmonton in 1994 and began working at the Edmonton Sun in the news department. It wasn't until eight months later he was offered a job by the Edmonton Journal. This suited him fine due to the fact that he is more passionate writing about music than he ever was writing about politics.

Now in the present, Shawn schmoozes with rock types as the Journal's resident music writer. He interviews artists, reviews CD's, and reports on live shows. He describes his job as exciting because every day is different. When he walks into the office in the morning, he doesn't know who he may have to talk to, where he may have to go, or what story might break. His job is flexible and spontaneous; he has the freedom to pursue and write about topics that he wants to write about. On a typical day, Shawn is on the phone 40 times with promotional reps, readers, and artists. Even though he has an overall good repertoire with peo-

ple, some complaints do come in. For example, A bleached blonde lady at the KISS concert threatened to sue him based on a reference he made to the whole front row being dominated by blondes in his concert review. Mail and phone calls

come in more frequently when he reviews a show negatively such as his reviews on The Backstreet Boys and Roch Voisine. Overall though, Shawn receives mostly calls of support; he cited his Marilyn Manson article as an example.

The greatest hardship that Shawn had to overcome to get to where he is today was self doubt and uncertainty when looking for a job in the print journalism field. Once he gained enough confidence, he rose above his competitors. Shawn attributes his success to his determination—(and harassing editors). When Shawn was asked if he would consider relocating to another city, he replied loyally with a "no" because he loves his job at The Journal.

USED BOOK BUYBACK

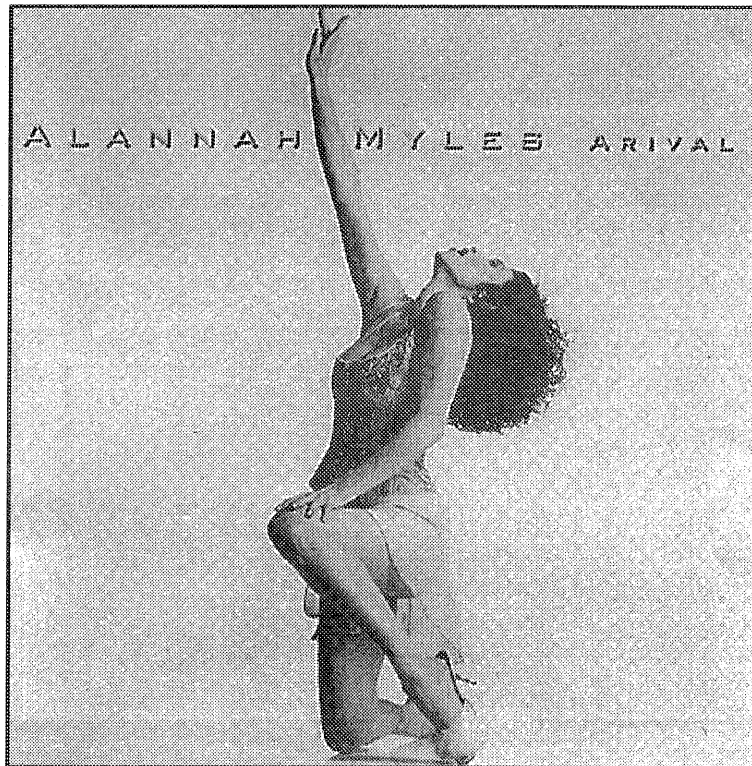
Save your money on this one. Better yet, donate that money to Alannah's retirement fund.

hold out her breasts in her hands like some kind of peace offering while I'm trying to make sense of the minuscule lyrics printed beside her.

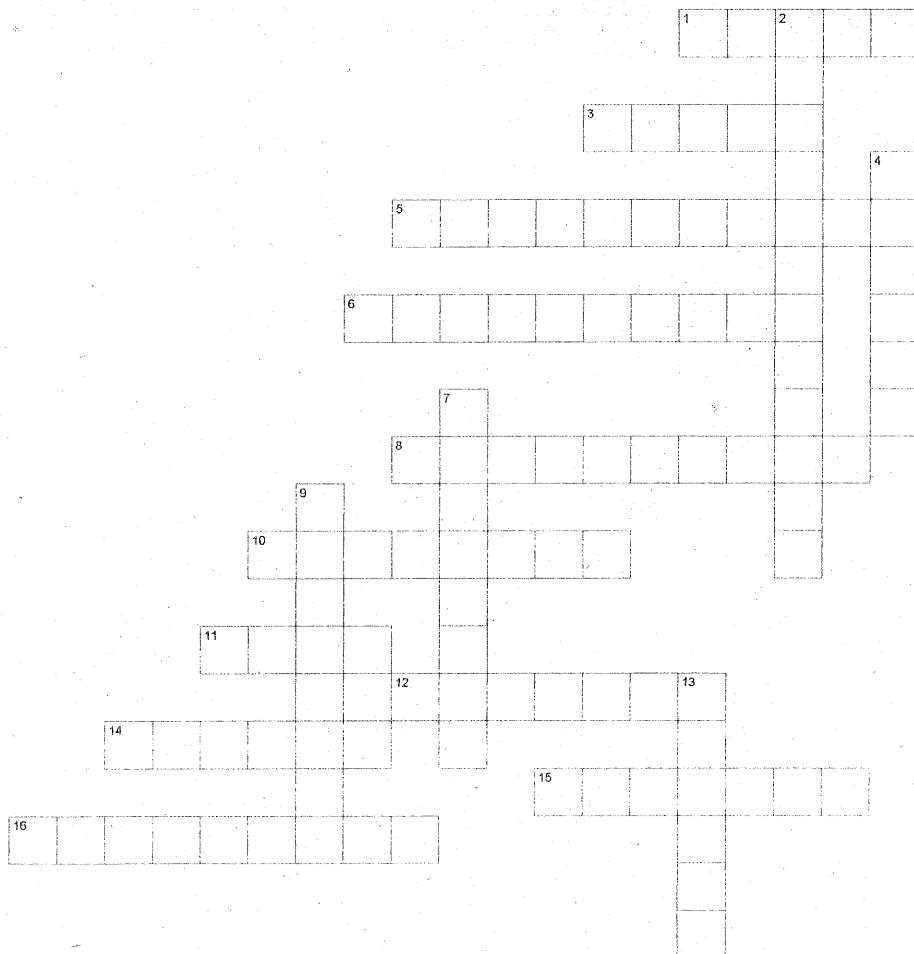

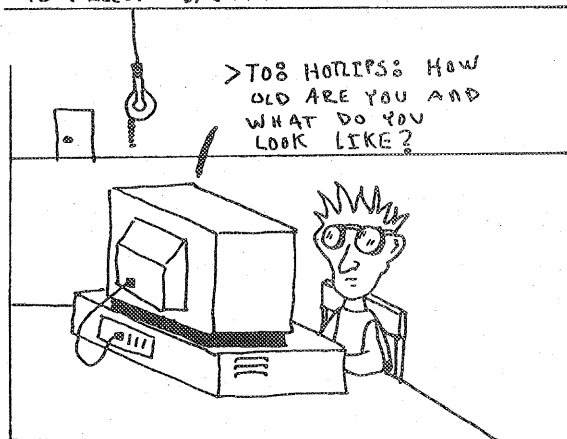

no barrier between the crowd and the stage, and only a few security guards (sitting down), I'm surprised there wasn't a riot. Clothes were coming off fast and furiously, though.

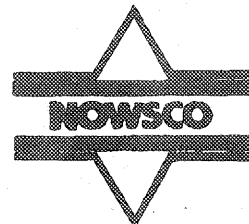
