

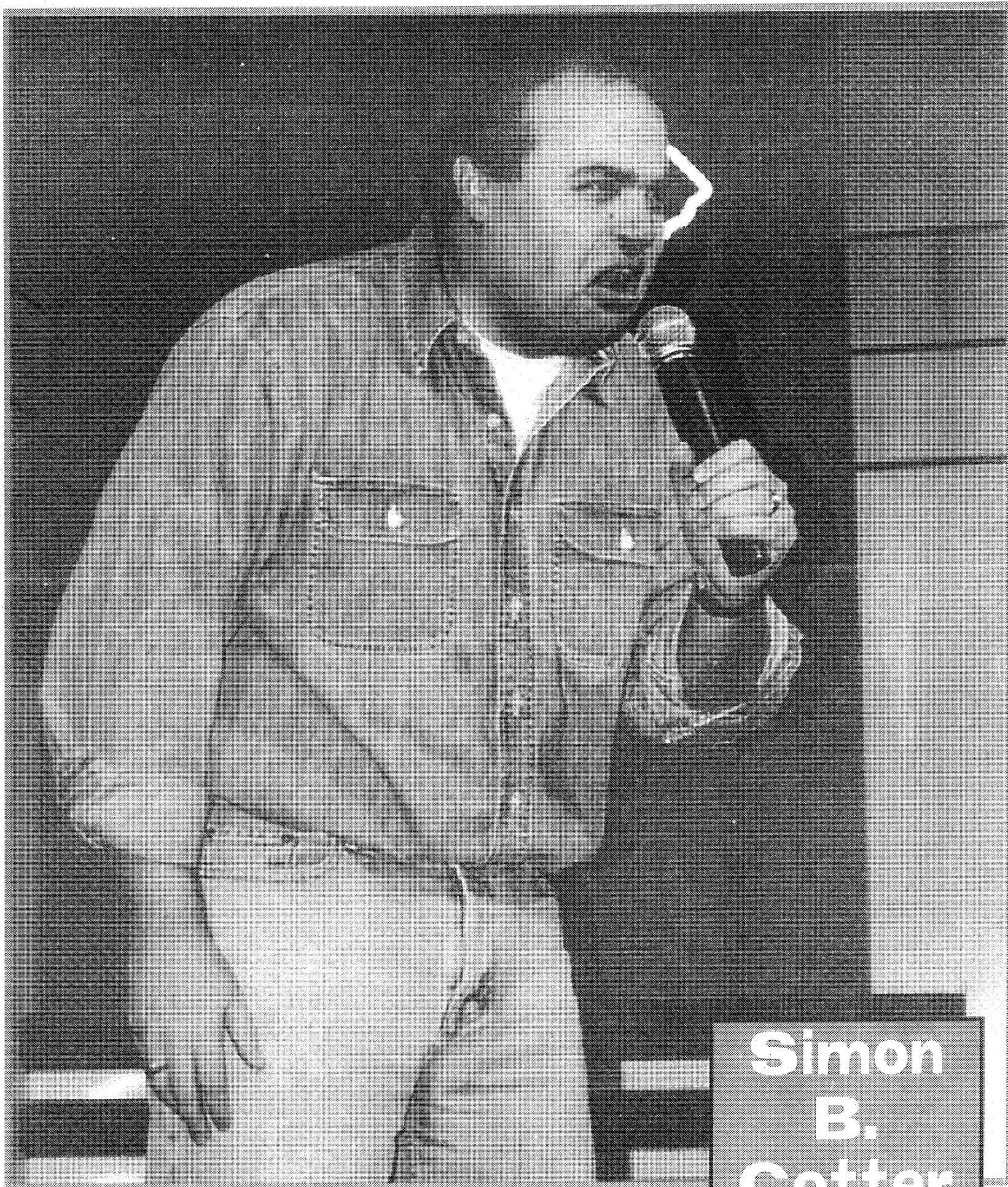

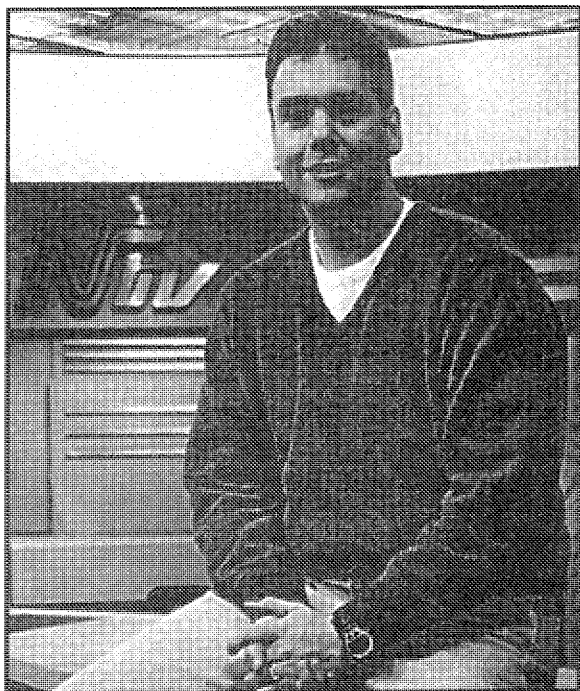
Three days of no sleep can make a man tired and giddy. In Chris Durham's case he had to anchor First News on ITV with Tara Nelson after this stretch. The morning they had to report on the death of Orville Reddenbacher was the morning in which they started giggling during the broadcast. Chris describes this as his worst experience to date. Fortunately, regardless of such an outburst, Chris managed to dazzle morning viewers with his fresh and genuine spirit every day. It wasn't until 1996 that he left ITV to become a Television Arts instructor here at NAIT. We sat down with Chris to discuss his past and current role in the local media as Part II of our MAD MEDIA exclusive.

Living in Edmonton for all of his life, Chris attended NAIT for his training in RTA before being recruited to ITV in 1987. He was hired on when he heard of a job opportunity in the summer and worked as a junior reporter. After two weeks at his new job at ITV, Chris was exposed to the great tornado that struck Edmonton—he refers to this experience as "BAPTISM BY FIRE." He then became a beat reporter on the street covering events such as city hall. Finally, he hosted a morning show with Lorraine Mansbridge, FIRST NEWS, for four years. Chris attributes his personal networking with people as his key for entry, not to mention beer drinking with the right fellas. Previously, he was covering Oilers games for the National News Service.

Chris was set apart from other anchors on the news because he is capable of laughing at himself and speaks candidly. He also possesses a genuine personality,

which he was praised for by viewers. His best experience as a reporter was having an exclusive half hour with Prime Minister, Jean

and being competitive is the advice he gives his students. His best experience back at NAIT, thus far, was seeing a student, not-so-confident in her

Chretien, when he was first elected. While Chris was working for ITV, he was proud of being involved in the local media scene here in Edmonton. He believes that there is a false perception that all reporters are vultures because his philosophy was to only inform the public of what they needed to know. This way they could form their own opinions on hot news issues. He credits American influence for bringing some sensationalistic practices into Canada.

Now that Chris is teaching here at NAIT, he tries to instill a sense of ethics in his students pursuing a media career. He enjoys his role in helping to develop future reporters. Being persistent, learning as many skills as you can,

As for life's hardships along the way--Chris sacrificed a promising football career to pursue his career in media. He attended the U of A and majored in Football 101 briefly.

Being a TV JUNKIE is why Chris always knew he would be in the media. He

consistently sat in front of the TV set absorbing as much information as possible. In five years, Chris will most likely still be teaching, or possibly back in the field. One thing is certain, he has a sense of humor and is easy-going. He is also prepared! When we sat down in the Editing Room in the V-wing, Chris announced, "I Got Some Notes!" This is why his nick-name should be changed from "Bull" to Chris "I Got Some Notes" Durham. Please refer to the "CHRIS IS A WHORE FOR" section because he's a whore for quite a few things. Chris was gracious enough to let us talk to him about his work, (past and future), so we can't help but want to buy him a beer. Now we just have to get him tattooed.

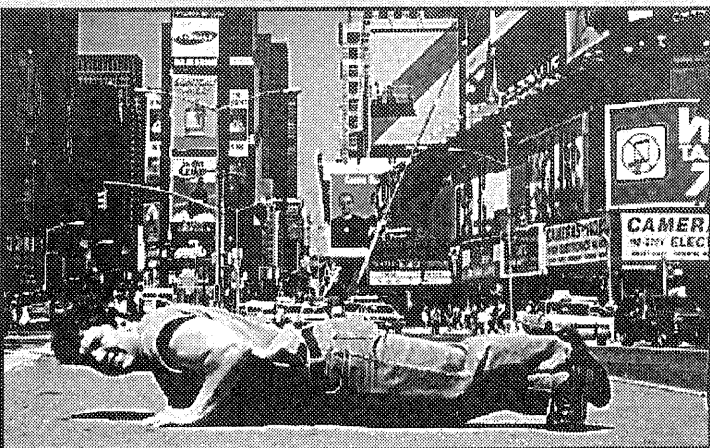

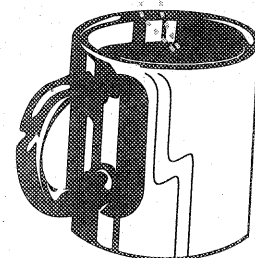

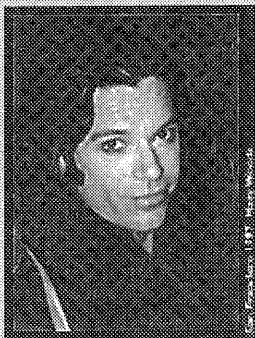

The importance and understanding of responsible drinking was the main focus of the week. Hopefully this message was successfully delivered to students. On that note, here are some educational statistics:

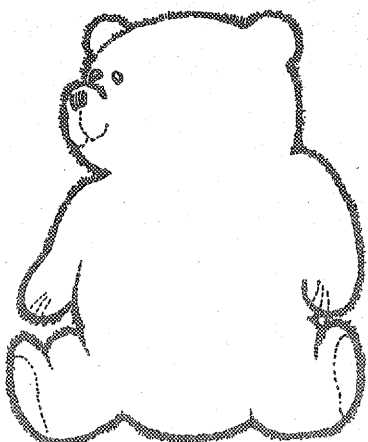
- Number of people in Alberta charged with impaired driving causing death in 1996—133

will have a map for the location of our tree in the OA office by the day before light up.

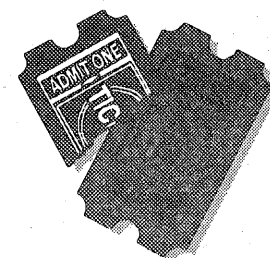

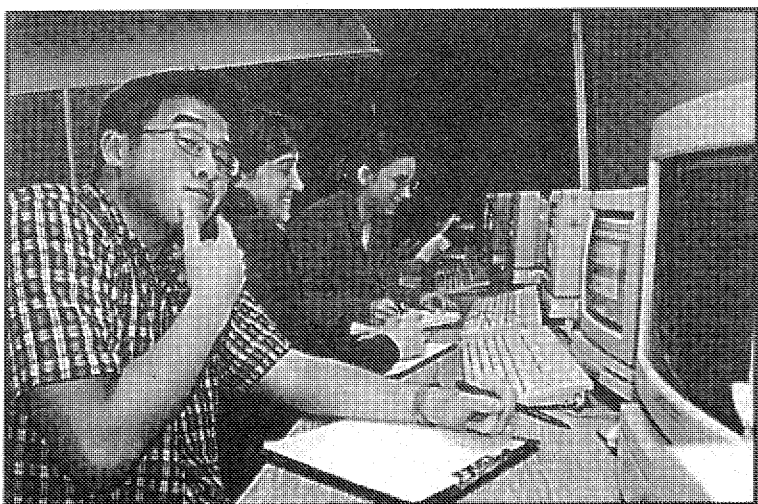

The Twenty-Third Psalm

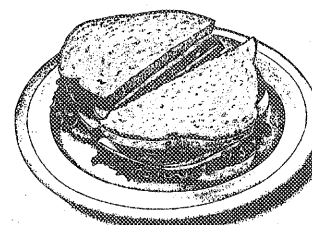

It's in shambles. I come home sometimes, take a look around and all I can do is just sit down on the dirty, dirty floor and cry.

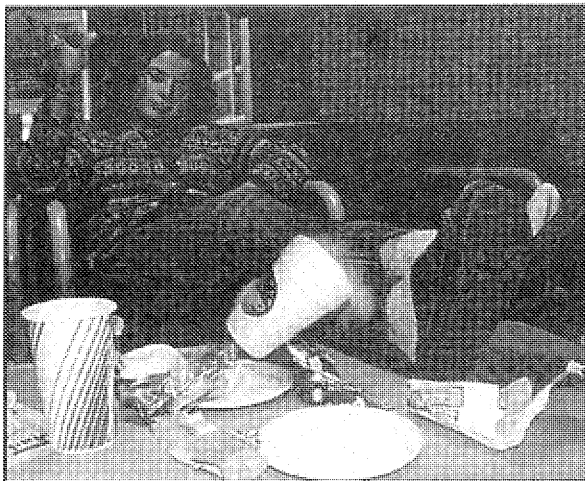
"Hey look, there's another stain on the floor. Gee, isn't that weird? The floor just keeps getting dirtier and dirtier!"

Dear Editor,

I wish to reply to James Olson's article, "The Bible Code," in the previous issue. His article surprised me because religion is rather a taboo topic among tech school students. Of course, there's nothing wrong about discussing those things, but the article is something I'd expect from a university newspaper rather than a tech school.

Mr. Olson believes that the Bible's divine inspiration and doomsday prophecies are backed up by "cold, hard facts" in the form of equidistant letter sequences (ELS's) found in Hebrew Biblical texts. He is impressed that key words found in the sequences supposedly predict future events such as Yitzhak Rabin's assassination and the Oklahoma bombing. Be-

fore readers take "The Bible Code" and other related works seriously, I'd like to offer my skeptical two cents.

The claims from "The Bible Code" seemed compelling at first, but I asked myself questions. Is the Hebrew language structure somehow more flexible, increasing the chance of ELS occurrence? Can ELS's occur in text by random chance?

Hebrew is different from our language in that it has no vowels. For instance, if it were English, RBN could be interpreted as Rabin, Robin, Ruben, or Rubin. This allows more flexibility for ELS's to occur. Especially since the author of "The Bible Code" looks for ELS's in any textual direction (left or right, up or down, and diagonally).

ELS's can also be found in non-biblical text. Mr. Olson is impressed that the names of 66 Rabbi's are encoded in the Book of Genesis. It might also impress Mr. Olson that 59 terms used in Hanukkah were found encoded in the Hebrew translation of "War and Peace." Are we to believe that "War and Peace" had divine inspiration as well? Another surprising fact is that ELS's can be found in English works (despite less flexibility since English uses vowels). For example, using a method similar to "The Bible Code", key words were found in "Moby Dick" that supposedly predict future events. These include President Kennedy's assassination, Yitzhak Rabin's assassination, Princess Diana's death, and many more.

In conclusion, the arguments presented in works like "The Bible Code" are totally without merit. Readers need not worry themselves over Mr. Olson's concerns of a near future apocalypse supposedly predicted by encoded ELS's in scripture. With a final note, I'd like to say that as a society we need more critical thinking skills, especially with the coming of the new millennium and the accompanying doomsday hysteria.

Actually the so-called "discovery" made by the authors of 'The Bible Code' is anything but amazing, in fact, I contend, it is highly probably, when one considers the arbitrary techniques the authors used.

To illustrate this point I have taken the text from the first two paragraphs of Mr. Olson's article, and 'encoded' it. That is, I first omitted all punctuation, capitals and spaces, and then, quite arbitrarily, arranged it into a rectangular array of alpha-numeric characters. Then I applied a set of rules (i.e. Word Search) and found a hidden message from the past. The array is printed below, and so is Mr. Olson's cleverly encoded message.

The team's next tournament is January 23 at GMCC. Good luck in '98!!!

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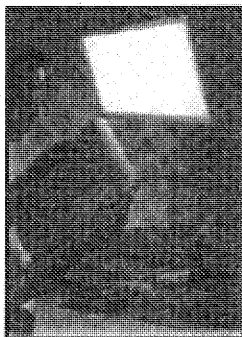

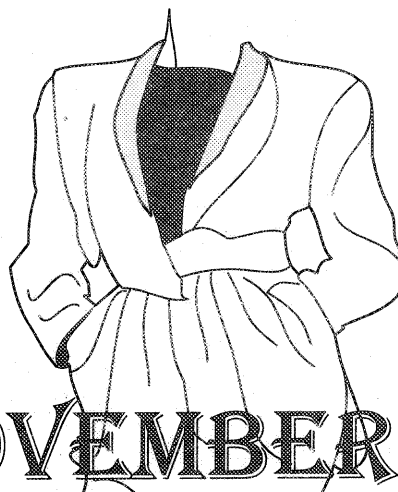
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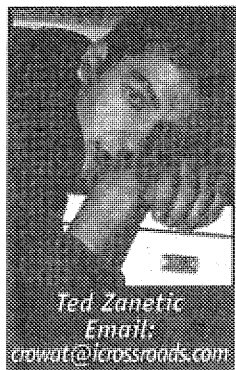
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MOVIE Review

Starring: Bruce Willis and Richard Gere



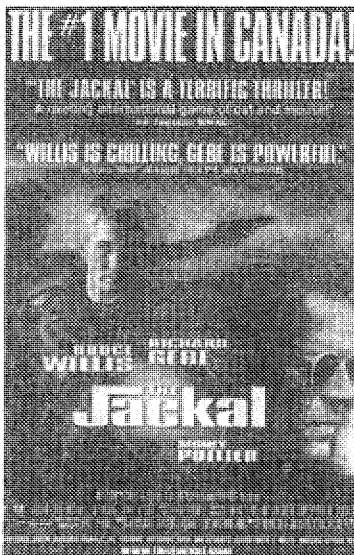

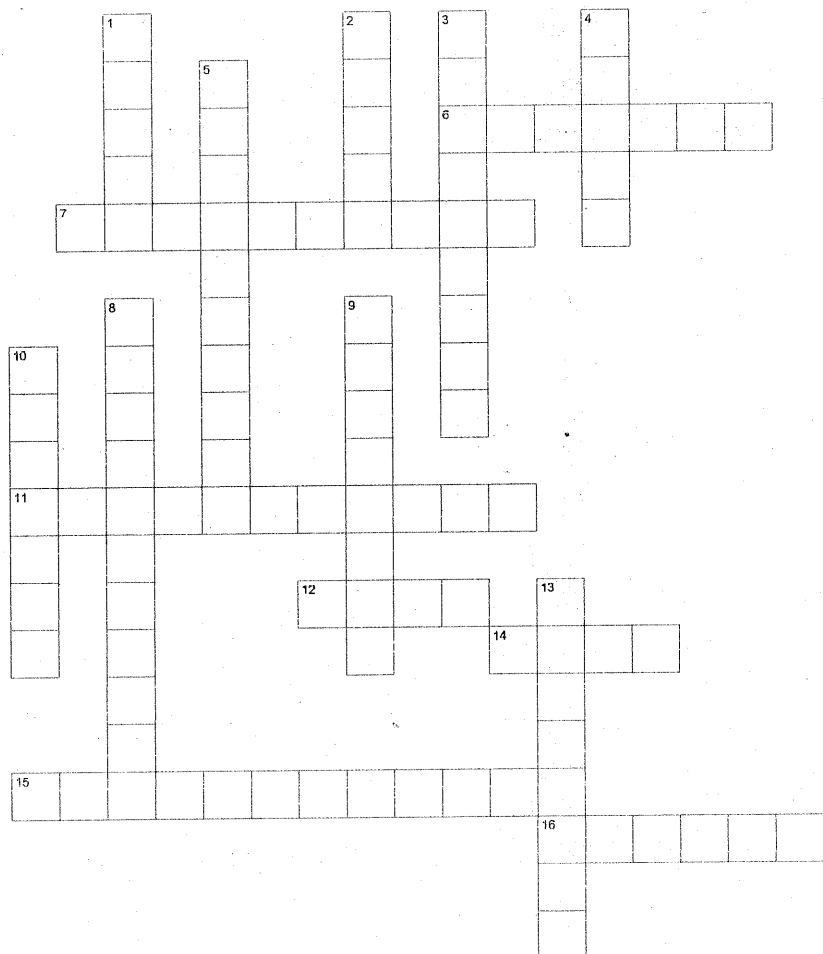
The movie encompasses action, suspense, and drama. There

The Little Mermaid: More Barbie Than You Think

Cartoons so fabulous that they became Hollywood sensations. It wasn't a Mickey Mouse outfit any more. With success came greed; Disney turned into a merchandise empire. Not just figurines but stuffed toys and movie books for kids and instructional game-type CD roms and kick ass soundtracks featuring top billing performers like Michael Bolton or Vanessa Williams or Elton John. There was one movie that started all of this Disneymania, this worldwide hysteria. Before this move, things were almost normal and Disney was what you watched Sunday nights at 6 on CBC. This movie bewitched audiences young and old and became the talisman of a prosperous future for Walt Disney's family values corporation. Ariel is an attractive red-headed princess who has a short attention span and focuses much of her time on scavenging, which is the mermaid equivalent for shopping. (Notice how she always carries a purse.) She materialistically collects trinkets only by consistently disobeying her father. Also, she doesn't have any commitment to singing or anything at all actually. She seems to have a happy family life, though. Her several sisters, her caring father, her...wait! There doesn't seem to be a mother in here. That's odd as far as I can say. Why wouldn't there be a mother? Are the scriptwriters trying to show women as scoundrels who abandon their children? Now, of course it's noble and easily endearing that the father rears the children on his own, but in reality it is usually the woman who plays the role of the sole provider, the single parent. As we will find in other Disney movies, this device is oft repeated. Maybe the mother was killed or even worse-ran off with another fish. It is never explained and so we will never know.

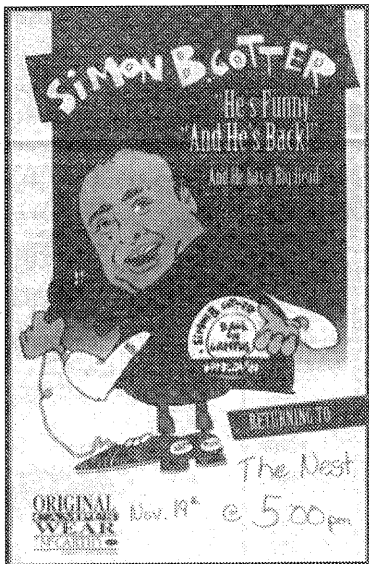

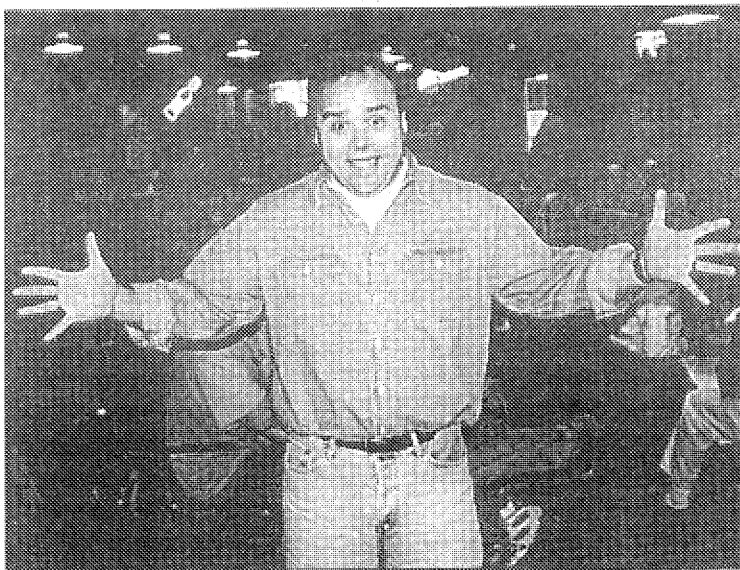
