

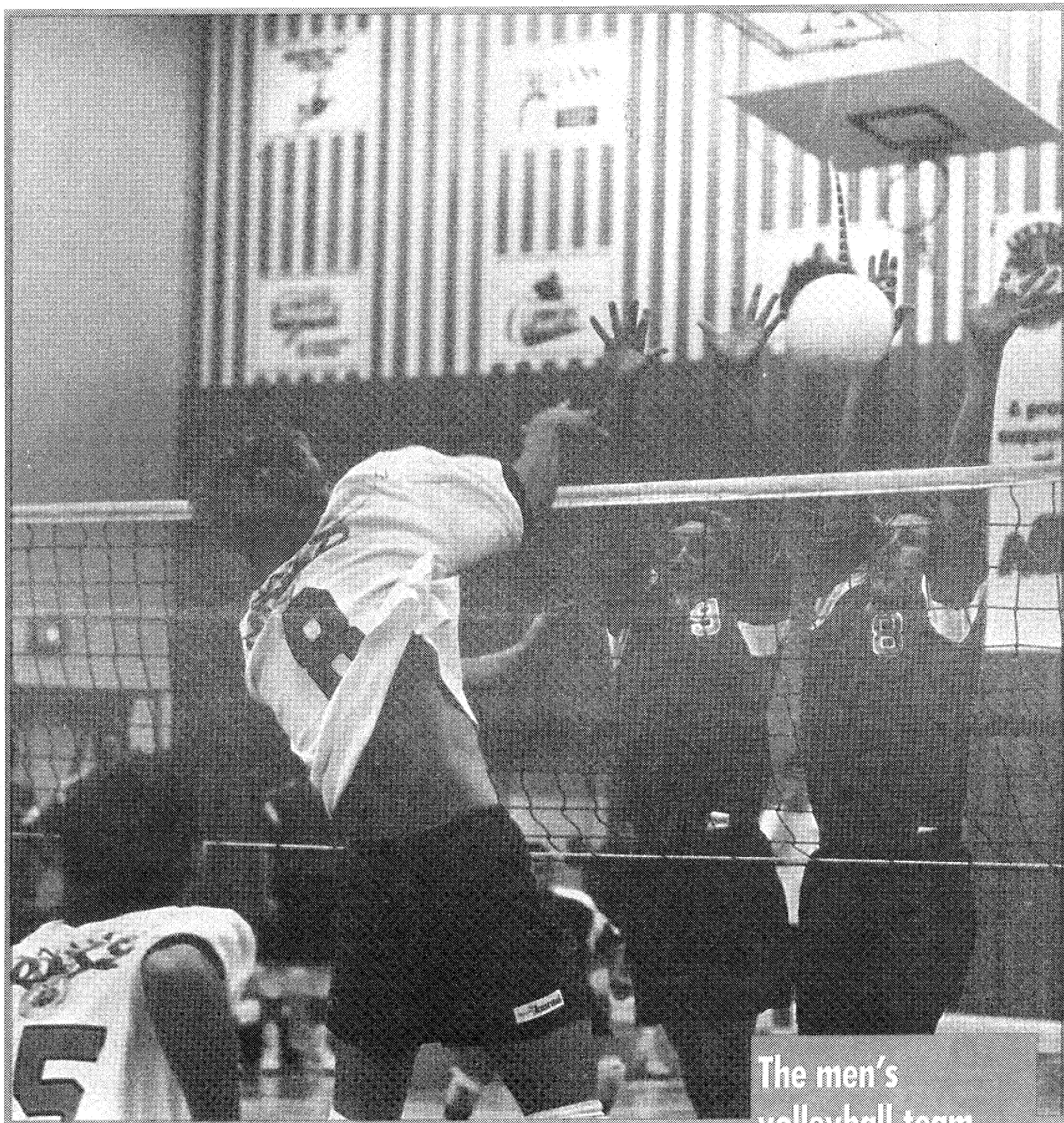

Presently, Luc said that they are trying to recruit more students into the program. "Their goal was to bring in 15 students, and so far they have

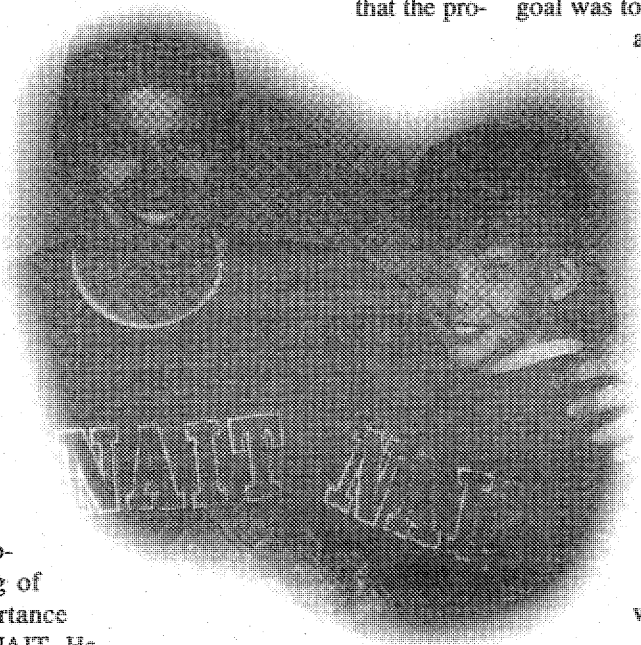

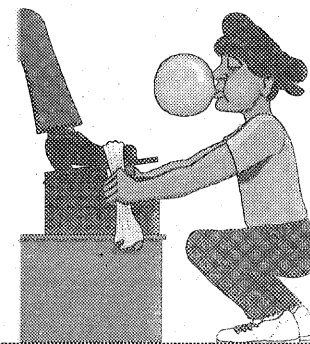
Shinerama results are in!

NAIT's new President

Dr. Sam Shaw

NAIT recently received a new President, Dr. Sam Shaw, as of October 1. I had an opportunity to speak with him about his own personal goals for this institute, as well as, future plans and changes that he feels should be made.

Dr. Shaw is originally from Nova Scotia but is glad to relocate to Alberta to be closer to family and to have the opportunity to be a part of NAIT. He was previously involved NAIT when he Chaired the Canadian Medical Association Creditation. He was impressed by the program association and instructors

involved.

While pursuing his education, he has had the opportunity to attend various universities and colleges. During his first years, he attended University in Nova Scotia, and then completed his education at the University of Toronto. While attending the University of Toronto, he took interest in the Student Government, and soon became President.

Dr. Shaw has previously worked in Thunder Bay, Ontario, with Contact North (Government Agency) as a service provider.

He has also been the Vice President of Academics at the

Mitchner Institute in Toronto, and has been the President of an institute in Manitoba.

He wants to take advantage of the high degree of enthusiasm at NAIT, with both students

and staff. Dr. Shaw also believes that it is important to continue building relationships with organizations, whether it be local,

provincial, or national. For example, he informed me of a merge with Grant MacEwan College where both Nursing, and the E.M.T. program at NAIT can receive credit for one another. This allows students with the opportunity to expand into different areas of expertise without feeling restricted.

Technology is Dr. Shaw's prime thrust as he enters NAIT. He believes that "technology has to be looked at in order to enhance learning". He feels that because this is a Technological Institute, we have to take a look at the technology available and take a "leadership role". Technology is always in a state of change, therefore, NAIT as an institution has to stay informed. "Technology needs to be put on board to help students". Overall, he is impressed with NAIT's facilities, and instructors. He feels that it is an advantage to have instructors with practical experience who relay this information

to students. The hands-on experience and small classes that NAIT allows sets us apart from most post-secondary institutions. Students leave with the practical skills that the industry is looking for; therefore, Dr. Shaw says "That is why over 80 percent of graduates are employed in the first six months."

In regards to post-secondary education, he believes that his own three children should take a year off after high school to decide what they would like to pursue. He doesn't want them to rush into anything without giving it a lot of thought. Today's tuition costs are increasing year by year in all post-secondary institutions whether it be universities, colleges, or technical institutes. "The cost is way more than from when I went to school. Students have to look at the costs involved."

Gift of Grapevines

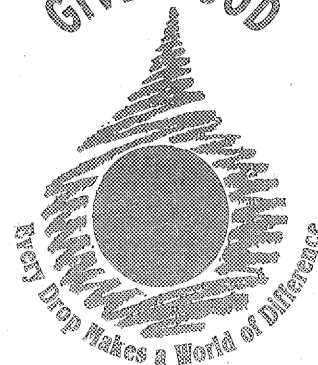

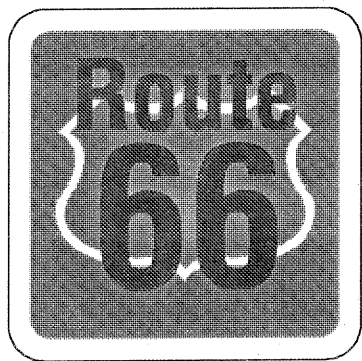
Peace, love, and just overall getting along are like foreign values to us these days. Being happy with what you've got seems as preposterous an

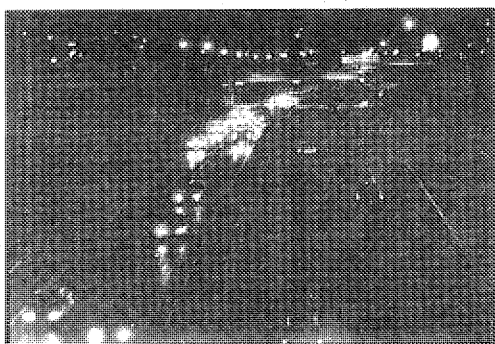

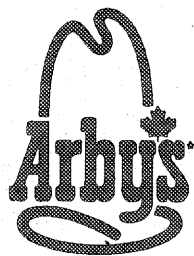

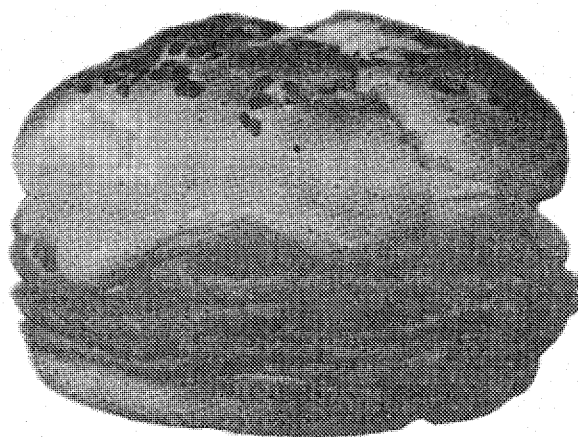


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What *has happened to the family*?

On September 27, in Vermillion, two of our guys got our season off to a good start. They paired up with the Lac Labiche team to win a first, a second and a third place.

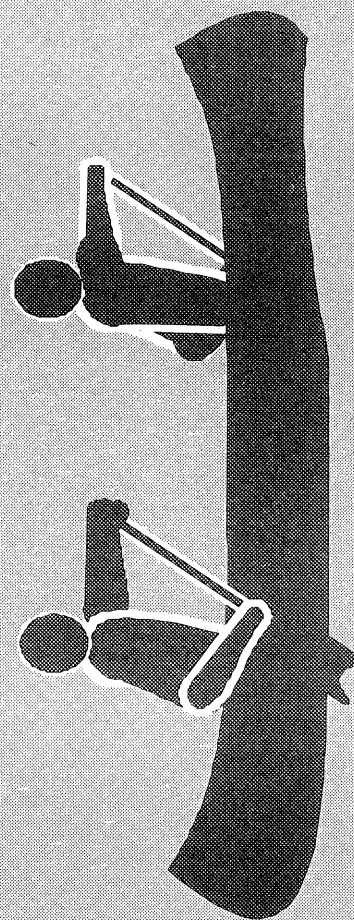

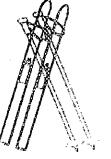
\$100,000.00 and in the next year or two get a 200% raise. ZERO, NADA, NONE, UNAVAILABLE FOR COMMENT.

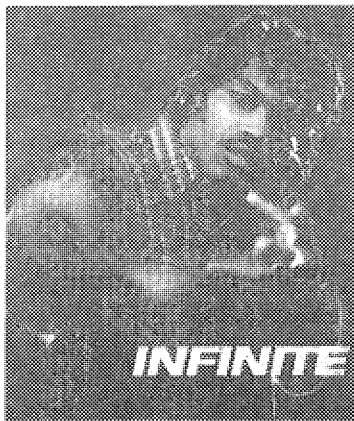
Starting in the industry at the age of 18, Infinite is no stranger

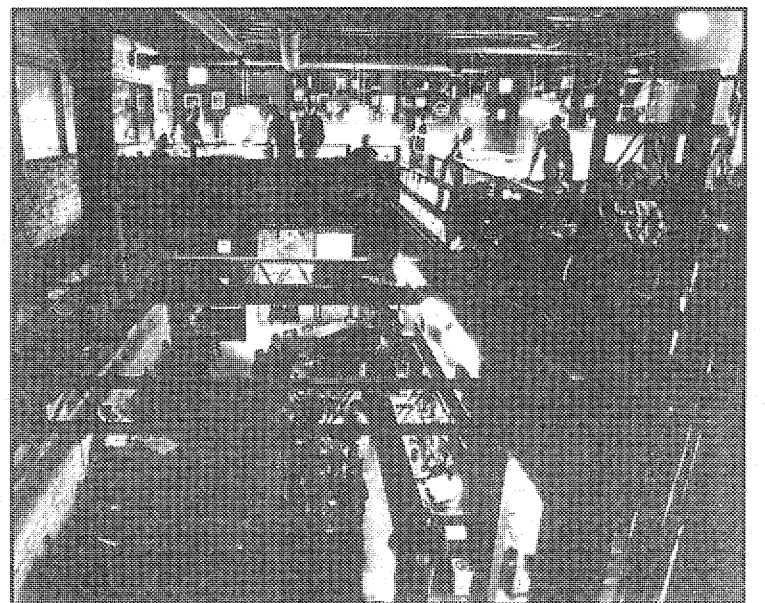

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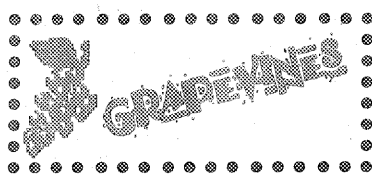
