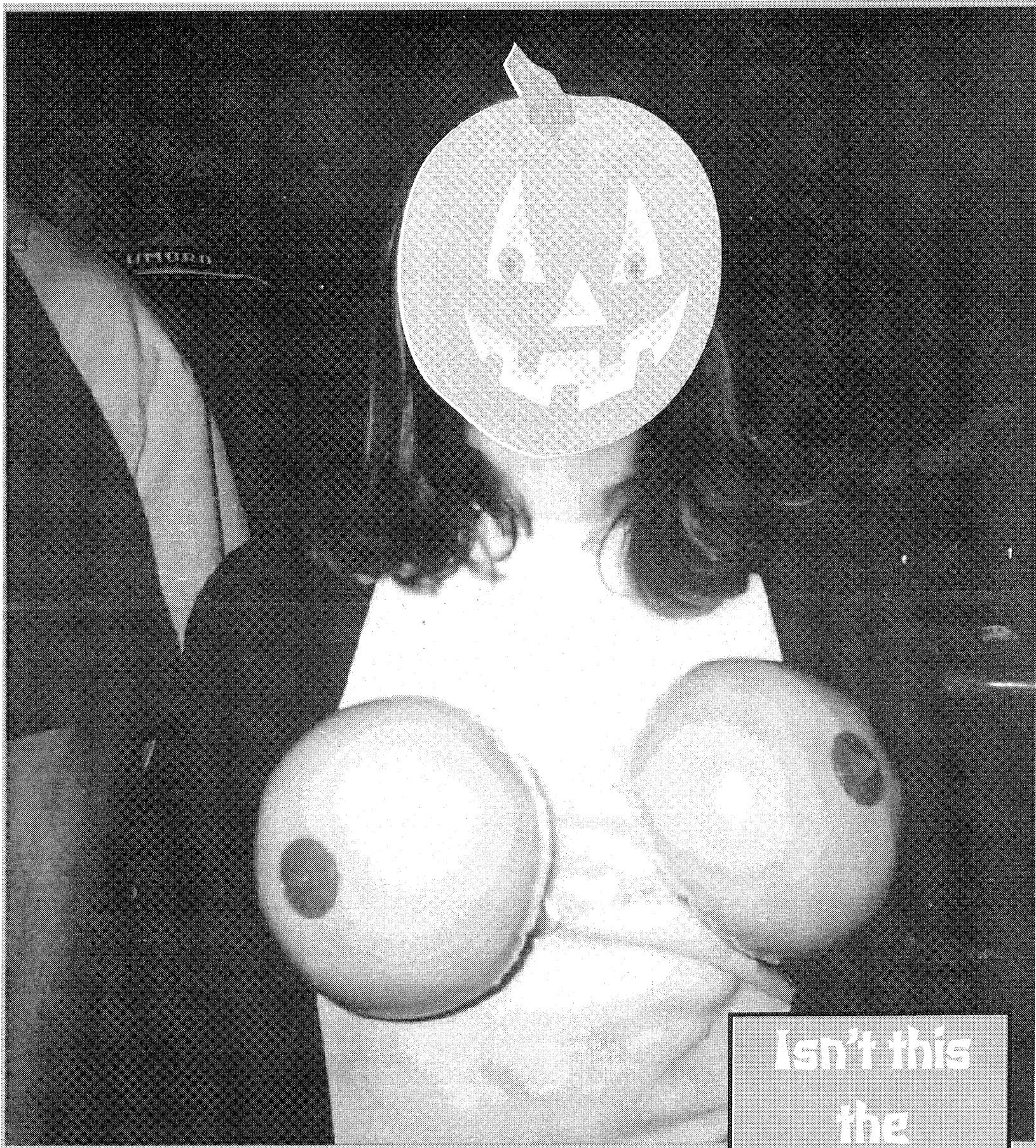

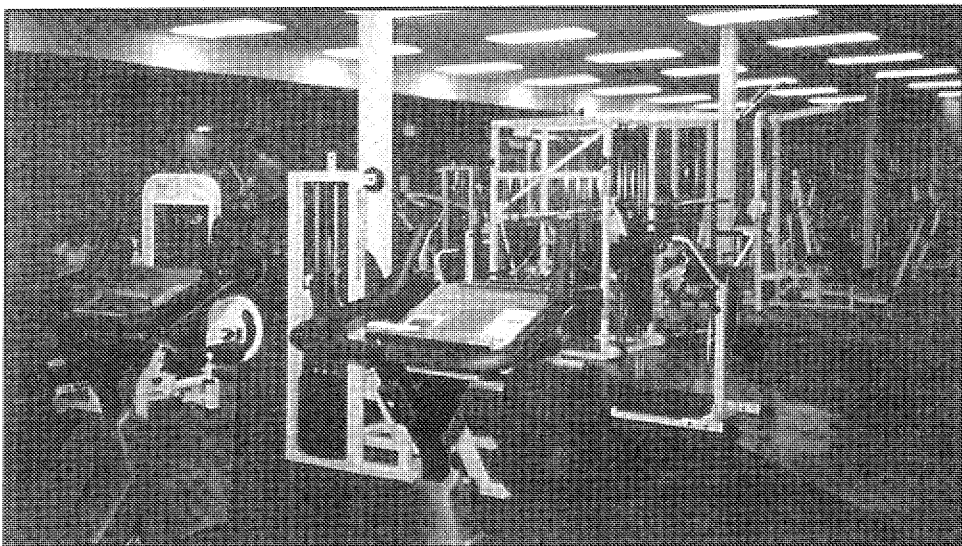

## Support Your Instructor!

## NAIT Instrumentation Students Take on the World

A team of NAIT Instrumentation students brought home two silver medals from the ISA International Student Competition held on October 2 in Anaheim, California. (The ISA is the International Society for Measurement and Control.) A total of ten teams representing nine ISA districts from Canada, the U.S., and Russia competed this year. The competition consists of two parts: the ISA Bowl is a Reach For the Top style contest which tests the competitors' theoretical knowledge and the ISA Practical tests the competitors' practical skills and teamwork with a programming or control setup problem. Although NAIT's showing fell short of the performance of last year's team, who won gold medals in both the ISA Bowl and ISA Practical, this year's team has the distinction of being the only team to win two medals.

The NAIT team of: Richard Mathison; Jason McCuaig; Jason Waselenko; Jason Burgardt; and Darren Barbarich, qualified last April to compete in

Anaheim by overcoming stiff competition from SAIT, BCIT, and the Southern Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology to win the ISA District 10 Student Competition. John St. George, an instrumentation instructor who is also faculty advisor to the NAIT ISA Student Section, coached the team. The team members completed the two-year Instrumentation Engineering Technology program this spring.

The ISA has been holding a student competition as part of its annual international exhibition for the past five years. As well as representing different countries, competing students are from a variety of different educational backgrounds, including apprenticeship-style programs, two-year college and tech school programs similar to NAIT's, and four-year engineering programs. NAIT students have traditionally made a very strong showing, earning first or second place in both parts of the competition for each of the four years we have sent a team. St. George sums it up: "NAIT has the world's best two-year instrumentation program."

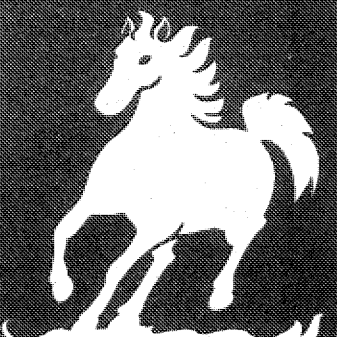
### Our Crime of the Month:

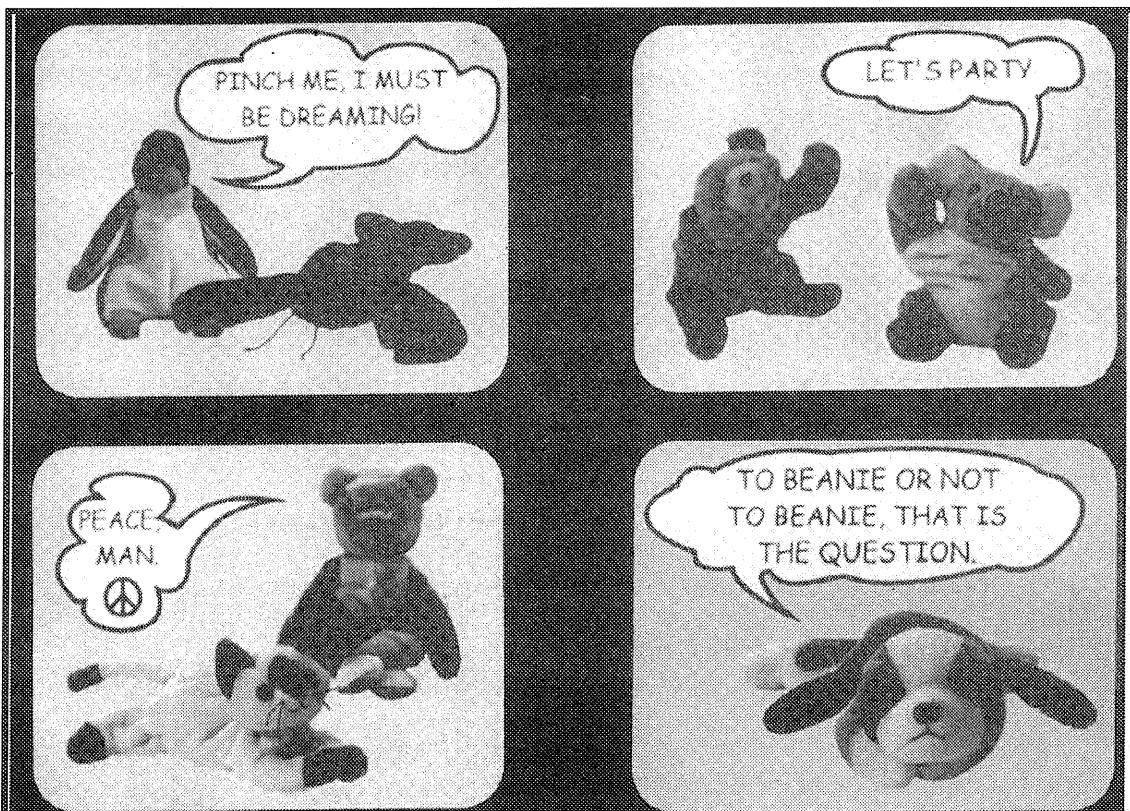

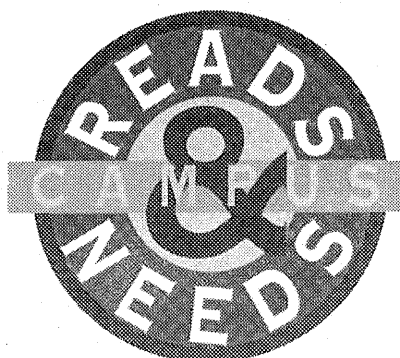

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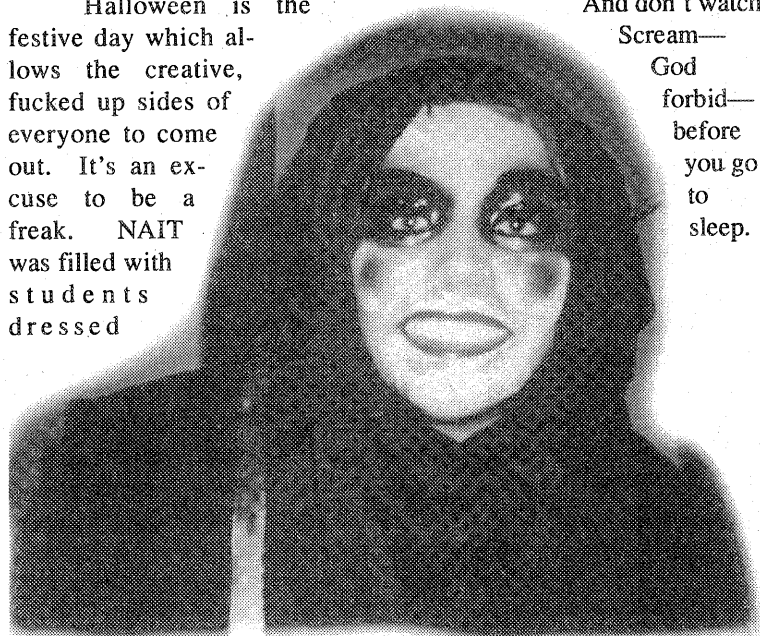


# SCREAM!

## Prescription for problems

### Misuse of Drugs

#### Fresh

Prescription drug abuse is a society-wide problem that claims the lives of many each year. The issue is only different for natives because prescription drugs are relatively easier to obtain because they are free of charge. The Alberta chief medical examiner, Dr. Dowling, doesn't think prescription drug abuse on reserves should be singled out. Dr. Dowling believes that when the general population is looked at as a whole, natives are not over-represented. Prescription drug abuse on Alberta's Indian reserves is not any worse than anywhere else. The statistics show that the problem is much greater when the abuse for all people is examined. In 1995, there were 21 deaths in Edmonton alone that were related to prescription drugs. Six of those who died were native, and the rest were predominantly Caucasian.

The main problem is the over prescribing of drugs. The most frequently used drugs in-

clude codeine, acetaminophen and benzodiazepines. Although the overall numbers in deaths related to prescription drug abuse has fallen over the last few years, from 21 in 1995, to four deaths so far this year, many people in the medical community, including doctors and pharmacists agree that this is still a very serious problem. The federal government has known about the widespread abuse for years, but have failed to do anything about it. Recently the government has taken steps to try to correct this problem. By the end of 1997, the federal government will have a system in place to track prescription drugs sales, which will alert pharmacists to possible abuse.

People should definitely view this issue as societal not racial. Prescription drug abuse is a serious problem that should no longer be ignored or isolated. It is preventable by the help of the government, the medical community, and society.

forms, the goals, a lot more was happening in this arena than we can disclose. Highlights from a NAIT Hockey game:

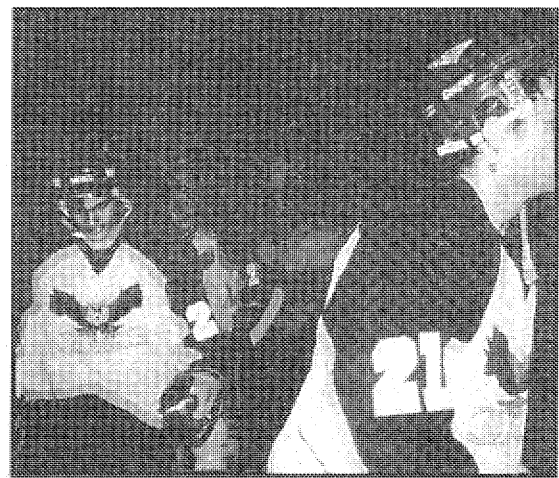

already playing as I got there. They were a good band. Kinda reminded me of a blues\jazz\Tragically Hip kinda band.

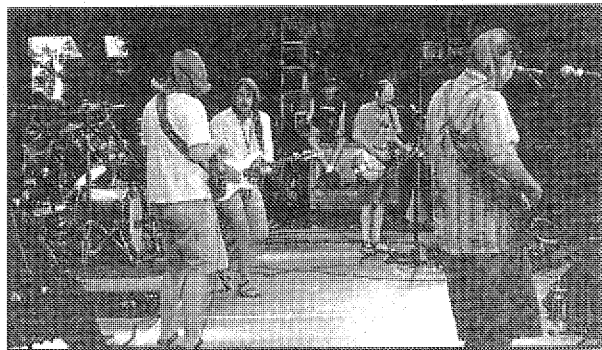

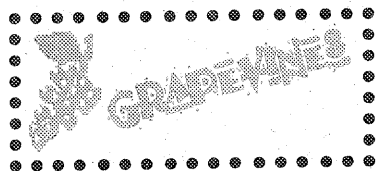
