A little tiny story:

Martin Entrop was a senior operator on the control board at Imperial Oil's Sarnia refinery, a position designated as safety-sensitive. Although Entrop had a past history of alcohol abuse, he had maintained total abstinence since 1984. In 1992, Imperial Oil implemented its Alcohol and Drug Policy and, in accordance with this Policy, removed Entrop from his position and re-assigned him to a less de-

sirable position with no loss in pay. Entrop was eventually reinstated with conditions, but filed a complaint with the Human Rights Commission, alleging discrimination on the basis of handicap.

FastFacts

- in 1991 Imperial Oil instituted a zero tolerance drug testing program that requires pre-employment



drug testing; employment being conditional upon a negative test

- this policy also calls for testing after any type of incident or even if alchohol or drug abuse is suspected
- employees are also subject to random testing, which means that you

- employees with a history of drug or alchohol abuse are required to inform the company and are then reassigned; they are able to resume their former positions only after a seven-year waiting period and even then are subject to a whole whack of "conditions of reinstatement"
- under the Human Rights Act, alchoholism is a form of handicap

In the end of the Entrop v. Imperial Oil Ltd. case, a Board of Inquiry under the Ontario Human Rights Code found that Imperial Oil was discriminating against employees because of percieved sub-

stance abuse problems. That is, the strict and prejudicical nature of their drug testing program and the fact that Imperial Oil has the internal au-

thority to discipline their employees in such harsh ways, is not legal under the Ontario Human Rights Code.

The board ruled that Imperial Oil should limit it's testing program to include, "...drug testing "for cause", "post-incident", "upon

certification for safety-sensitive positions", and "post- reinstatement"... but only if the employer can establish that the testing is necessary as one part of a wider drug abuse assessment process." (Emond.)

"These are the types of stereotypical assumptions that are precisely the kind that human rights legislation is intended to prohibit. ...It is entirely improper for an employer to fashion work rules which discriminate against such individuals on the basis of unpredictable risks."

-Entrop v. Imperial Oil Ltd. (12/09/96)

But Imperial Oil has not responded to the Boards decision and has continued to implement the same strict testing program. In fact, the company has introduced an even harsher program in the "less supervised "safety sensitive" jobs" which applies to nearly 700 people.



NO TO NUCLEAR POWER IN GERMANY- A German anti-nuclear protester secured his legs under a railroad track in an attempt to stop the transport of spent nuclear fuel to a temporary storage facility; protesters believe the waste containers are not leak proof, and contend the cargo could cause an environmental disaster comparable to Chernobyl

ONE IN SEVEN FRENCH WOMEN CHEAT- According to a poll for *Quo* magazine, one in seven French women cheat on their husbands; 14% of women acknowledged having sex outside their marriage (7% of those women had several affairs, and the other 7% admitted to just one)

NewAds on Campus

ave any of you noticed those big "NEWAD" wall displays around campus? You know, the one's that display Club Monoco, or Kate Moss selling "CK One." Well, you probably have because they are pretty hard to miss. Do you like them around campus? Because, they raise a few questions here on campus regarding advertising and the sanctity of our institution.

Should we allow mass advertising to be placed everywhere we can be found? Advertising is already found on every poster board that has been placed by the institute. These poster boards have been installed so that posters would have assigned a place. Posters are not allowed to be placed anywhere except for these reserved spots. However, these NewAds have been placed strategically in the bathrooms around corners where they can't be missed.

How does this affect the student? NAIT students are being targeted as the potential market for a variety of products that appeal to our age group. The advertisements allow for an efficient means of reaching hundreds of students and informing them of the various products and services available in the market.

Reactions? When students were asked what they thought or felt about the advertisement, results were quite mixed. Here's what some students had to say:

"We are here to study, not to shop."
"Doesn't matter to me, I'm not affected."

"I don't care about the ad, I just care about where the money is going."

"It's very clear that advertisers are trying to reach us specifically and I like that."

"It belongs in the mall. It's silly to be here."

"I hope the money goes to NAIT."
"Looks out of place."


"I'm concerned about the invasion of commercial companies coming on to campus. NAIT has accepted a lot of donations from companies and I wonder when these companies are going to start dictating decisions in the institutions."

"I don't like the Kate Moss advertisement because they portray these 'heroine' chic junkies' losing 25 pounds just to look good is something I think shouldn't be promoted."

"I think they are fine, as a matter of fact, I think the guy in jeans looks pretty sexy."

The person in charge of placing the ads, Dean Andres, a member of the NAIT foundation, was asked for information on the new ad displays. He said that the big ads bring in about \$100 per month and the small ones bring in \$15 per month. "The placing of these ads do not cost NAIT a penny. In effect, we just have to cash the cheques. These revenues go directly into NAIT's general revenue, and as a result, are indirectly cirDean commented that the ads are all approved by The NAIT Foundation and said, "We wouldn't put in anything that wouldn't otherwise be found in the Edmonton Journal, nothing out of the ordinary."

But actually, this could be a good thing. NAIT receives pro-

culated back to the students. Not only that, but commercial involvement is not totally foreign to NAIT. We have the Shaw Theatre that was purchased courtesy of the Shaw Communications. Also, the Alberta Stock Exchange paid for computers for students to use in the business tower computer lab."

Some students were concerned about the content of such ads but

ceeds from the advertising. Think of it. Because if we allow more advertising to go around campus and more commercial involvement, the supporting companies could bring in enough revenue to lower our tuition costs. If anyone did not want to buy into the advertisement they could simply choose to ignore the message that the advertisement is trying to convey.

- NewAd is big on promotional events such as movie premieres, products launches and resort promotions.
- NewAd media had approximately 9000 poster boards across Canada
 - The founder of the NewAd company has been quoted to have said, "One of our key features is that we offer our clients specific target demographics...The 18-34 age group (which represents 30 percent of the population or 3.3 million Canadians) is very hard to reach. They want to know, 'what's in it for me?', and that's why you have to offer them something different."


Some people may say the reasoning behind going under the tattoo gun is because of rebellion. Parents saying "it will not be done


The day continued I got really muddy and felt like a kid again. I






WHY THEY ARE THIS **WEEK'S TOY?**
