Goodbye North Cafetorium, South Cafeteria Hello Fresh Express, The Common Market

Construction is underway at the North Cafetorium as part of the redesign of NAIT's food service facilities. Work has begun on the South Cafeteria also. By the fall both cafeterias will have a new look, new menus and new names.

The North Cafetorium will be converted into a modern convenience store featuring the student short order lab plus brand name coffee and bagels, soups, and snack foods. This new food service facility will be called Fresh Express, a name submitted by Donna Woznow who won dinner for two in the NAIT Dining Room. The

other winner of the contest to name the new food facilities is Doris Graham. Her name was drawn from the more than 50 people who entered the contest.

The Common Market, a food fair with a deli franchise, a pizza franchise and made-at-NAIT products, will replace the South Cafeteria. The adjacent seating area will be called The Commons. Kathryn Howden, Manager of Food Services, says negotiations are continuing with franchises interested in working with NAIT. The selection criteria includes experience, quality, services and price.

All in all round 2 was as good as round 1, but I'm looking forward to round 3...ding ding.

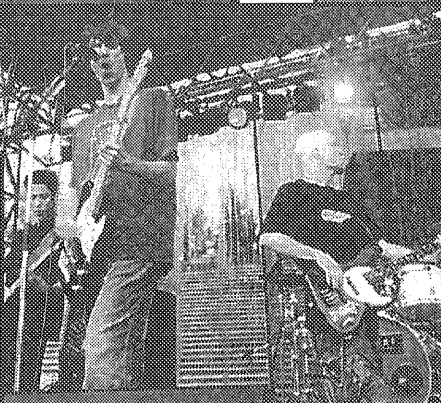

The Trade That Changed Hockey Forever

Where Were You August 9, 1988?

August 9, 1998. I think we all remember exactly where we were the day Wayne Gretzky was sold to the Los Angeles Kings. August 9, 1988 - Kimball Lake, Saskatchewan - my cousin and I were throwing the old yellow mini-Eskimo football around when a small girl ran by us and belted out, "Gretzky got traded, Gretzky got traded!!" The statement left nothing but laughter running through my 12 year old body. I later told

my folks about the absurd comment my cousin and I heard. All my parents had to say was, "Whatever, like 99 would ever get traded, EH?!" (True Canadian Parents!) The trip back home was an interesting one with thoughts of the impossible flying left and right, "Imagine what would happen if Gretz got dealt, EH?!" Finally we arrived home to a stack of newspapers our neighbors had left on our doorstep... What I saw and read next would change my life and thousands of Edmontonian's lives forever. On the front of The Jour-

nal the biggest type used for a front-page headline since the Second World War ended... "GRETZKY GONE." There was nothing to say, my folks and I stood there stunned like a deer in a headlights. I raced to my room and slammed the door. Then, without any warning tears began to flow for hours on end. I couldn't stop crying, it was like losing a best friend. Wayne Gretzky sold to the Los Angeles Kings? Somebody please wake me up from this terrible nightmare.

Ten years later I don't cry

anymore, but I still can't stop cheering for the man who made hockey so beautiful to watch. I try not to blame anybody for what happened that August day; although, most people would snap Peter Puck's back if they had the chance. The trade was the first of its kind in the wonderful world of hockey. A superstar, a franchise player, being sold or traded to another team. Now in the late '90's, it's a regular

occurrence. I just hope these players who want to live and play in the big market cities, remember their roots, and remember what got them there. I was heart broken that dark August day, and it still hurts to see Wayne in an opposition uniform. But, I can guarantee you one thing, all those ex-Oilers who played and past through this great city of champions, still bleed the blue and orange.

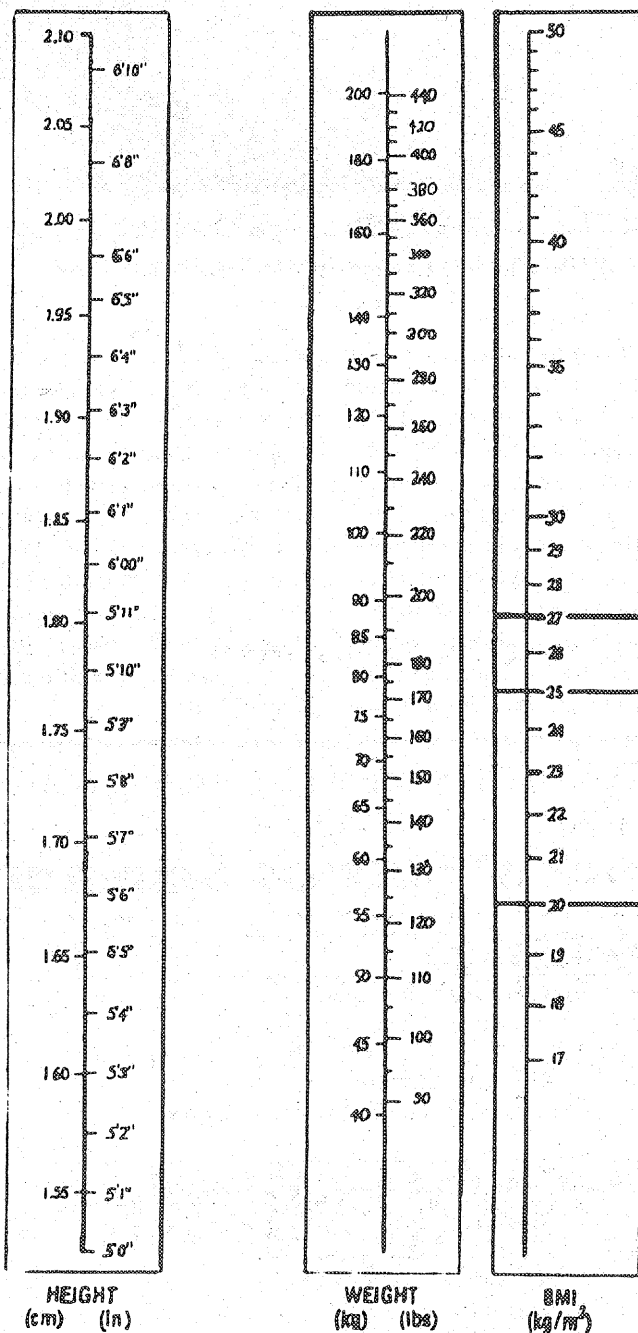

Gauging your health — not your weight

Being conscious of what you are eating is very important, but its is not the only component to a healthy lifestyle. Regular exercise is another part of being healthy. Not everybody has to be a tri-athlete, it could mean something as little as walking to work or taking the stairs over an elevator. The important thing is that you enjoy what you are doing. Don't join a step class if you hate aerobics - do something that fits you as an individual.

Within the healthy range there are a variety of weights — so you have a choice of where you feel most comfortable.

Body Mass Index



How to find your BMI — It's Easy!

1. Mark an X at your height on line A.
2. Mark an X at your weight on line B.
3. Take a ruler and joining the two Xs.
4. To find your BMI, extend the line to line C.

Once you have counted your calories, watched your fat and your fibre - where do you stand? Do you fall into a healthy weight zone?

The Body Mass Index (or BMI) is one way to find out. It indicates whether you are in developing health problems. Within the healthy range there are a variety of weights - so you have a choice of where you feel most comfortable.

One important benefit of BMI is that it allows us to talk about the health of a person and not their weight.

BMI is not for everyone.

BMI should not be used on:

- with adults over 65
- with pregnant women
- or with very muscular individuals

Under 20 - could be associated with health problems for some individuals. (Should consult a physician or dietitian)

20-25 - This zone is associated with the lowest risk of illness for most people you want to aim for this range.

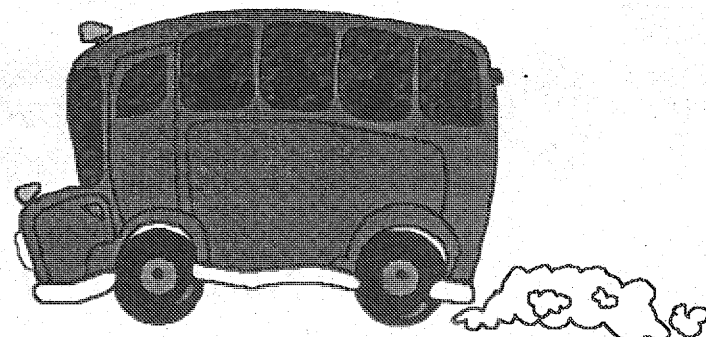
25-27 - A BMI over 25 may be associated with health problems. Caution is suggested if you are in this zone.

Over 27 - This zone is associated with increased risk of health problems such as heart disease, high blood pressure and diabetes.

If you find that you fall below 20 or above 27, it is important to question your lifestyle and eating habits. To reduce the risk of serious health problems, you must look at adapting the way you live.

It's not that difficult to maintain healthy eating habits. And you don't have to suffer in doing so. There are many alternatives to fatty foods that you may crave, but the important thing to remember is that if you do want a chocolate bar or a bag of chips - you just simply cut the fat for the remainder of that day. And, try not to make it a daily ritual.
