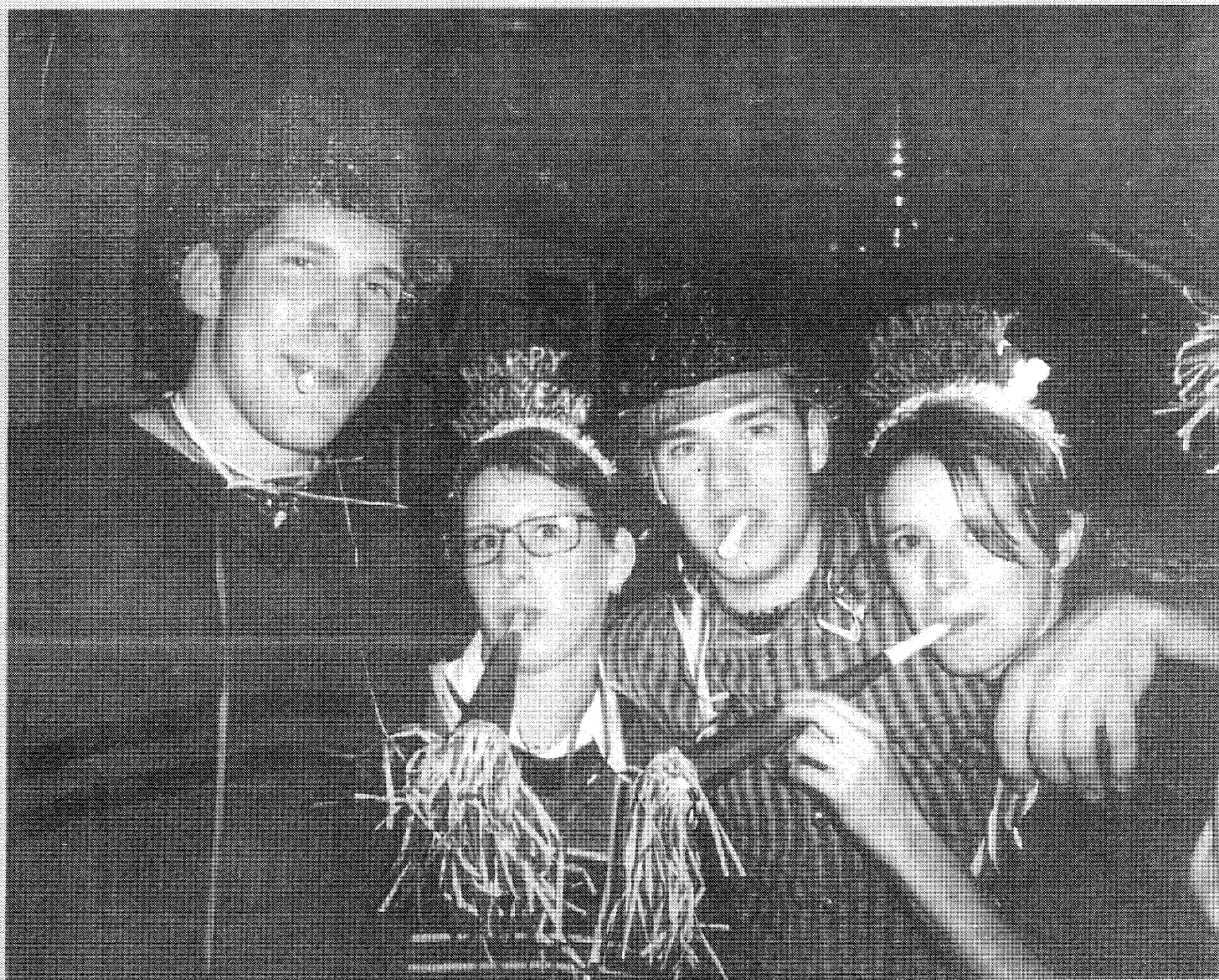

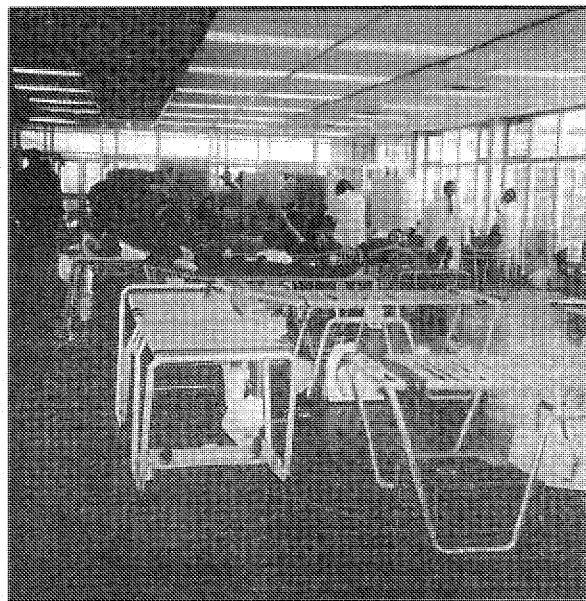

currently needed due to a shortage of blood supply. The clinic received a moderate response with many previous donors dropping by.

It is important that the Mobile Unit comes to NAIT because it gives students an opportunity to donate without going down to the clinic. Michelle Ledrew, a student here at NAIT currently enrolled in Respiratory Therapy, was a previous donor. When asked why it is

said, "I know that there is a demand for it. This is my second time that I have donated here at NAIT."

The Red Cross Mobile Unit consists of nurses, clinic assistants, and volunteers. During the allotted three hour donation period each day, personal information is taken, blood tests, types and iron levels are observed, health questions are asked by nurses in the screening process, and the donation of blood



(approx. 5-15 min.) occurs with each donor.

Volunteers hand out questionnaire forms at the front door, as well as, tend to the students that have just donated by applying bandages after a ten minute resting period and giving out food and drinks. Rose Chan, a volunteer and 2nd Year Business student, believes in giving her time, "I volunteered here and at the U of A before. Its a lot of fun, and

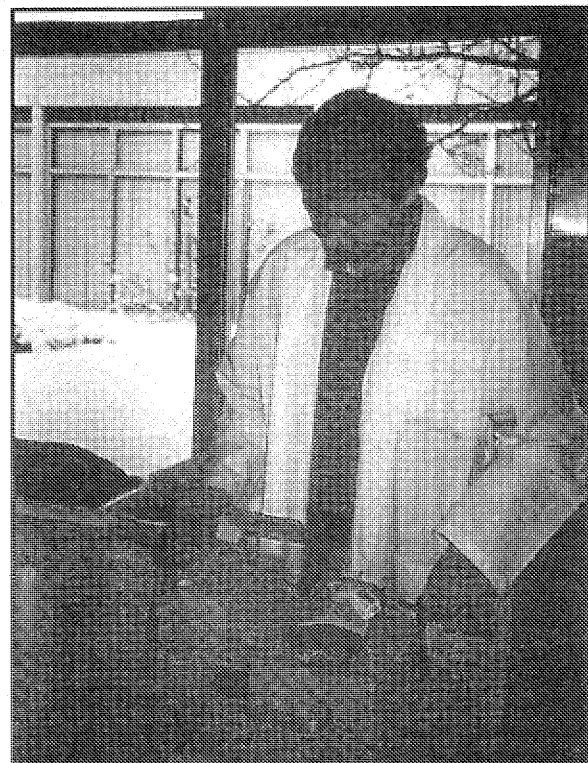
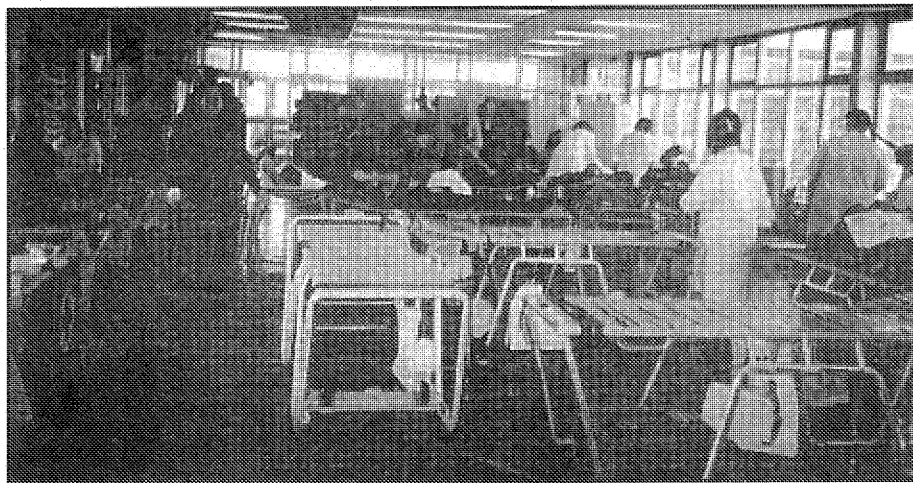
you get to meet lots of people. I feel that it's important for people to donate. This is what I do because I am not able to donate myself."

set aside the time to come down and donate, "It saves lives. It is sad to see a shortage of blood." To all of the students who came by to donate but couldn't due to tattoos or piercings, Sarah said that after a year of getting it done to come by. "It is a precaution because there are places where the proper sterility is not used. Hepatitis exposure can usually only be detected in the blood after a full year. Don't let this discourage you."

Thank you to those who donated last week and hopefully new faces will be seen at the next Blood Donor Clinic.

YOU SHOULD NOT DONATE IF:

- not eaten a full meal (potential to faint)
- don't have proper identification (Student I.D.)
- been to the dentist in past three days
- under the age of 17

- weigh less than 110 pounds
- not feeling well (taking antibiotics)
- using Accutane or Tegison for acne treatment
- have had a tattoo or ear/body piercing in last year
- participated in activities putting you at risk

for transmissible diseases (intravenous drugs, sex in past 12 months with sexual background unknown)
• flu vaccine (flu shot) within last two days
• active cold sores

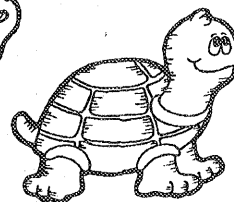

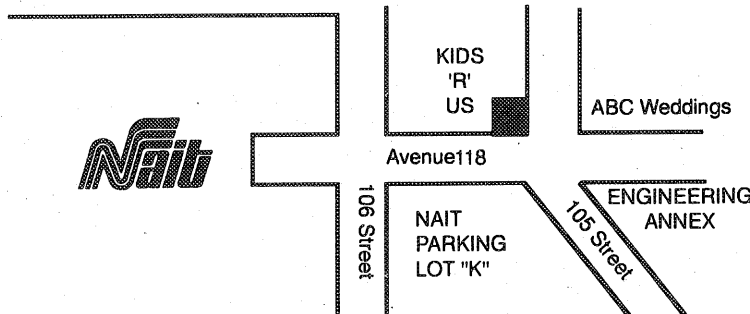
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Photographic Technology Annual Print Show & Sale A Great Success!!!

December 4 & 5 saw the main campus' south lobby transformed to a busy art gallery for the Photographic Technology students' annual print exhibition and sale.

With over 250 impressive pieces on display, the show was a great success, visually and a wonderful commercial success as well, with sales far surpassing those recorded any other year since the event's inception in 1992.

Sales figures reached the \$2400 mark, with 30 percent split

Campus Crime Stoppers

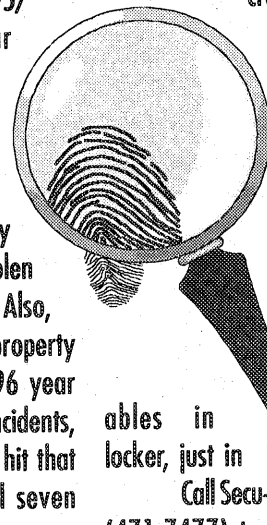
Crime has been increasing dramatically here at NAIT. In the 1995/96 year only two vehicles were stolen. In the 1996/97 year nine vehicles were stolen in total. For this 1997/1998 year, already five vehicles have been stolen at the end of November. Also, electronics and personal property has increased. In 1995/96 year there was a reported 23 incidents, already this year we have hit that number and there is still seven months to go.

To try and prevent these incidents, always make sure your doors are locked. For personal property, like portable stereos, CD's, text

books, phones, etc., lock them up in the trunk or make sure they are not visible in your car.

As the temperatures decrease, thieves tend to move inside, which means locker break-ins will increase. Always, make sure your locker is locked and if possible do not keep valuables in your case.

Call Security (471-7477) to report a crime or if something looks suspicious. Also, there are yellow emergency phones all around campus, which are direct links to Security.



Joyous holiday turned tragic

Over the Christmas break, rescuers battled treacherous weather conditions in a search in the Hasler Creek area in northeastern British Columbia. Nineteen-year-old Andy Jeglum of Clive was snowmobiling with three friends when an avalanche began. The snowmobilers were climbing a steep slope on a dare when the avalanche struck. They tried to outrace the wall of snow but Jeglum and Andy's roommate Kelly Siemens were both caught. Kelly was only buried up to his neck, but Andy could not be seen.

The remote Hasler Creek area is described as a place for "professional riders". Strong winds, a metre of fresh snow and extreme avalanche conditions hampered the search for rescue specialists and RCMP during the days before Christmas. Kathy Jeglum, a cousin to Andy, described him as responsible, well-liked and an experienced snowmobiler.

Kelly Siemens met Andy last year here at NAIT, and were both enrolled in the Instrumentation program together. Andy Jeglum will be profoundly missed by those who knew him, and NAIT recognizes this unfortunate accident that claimed this young man's life.

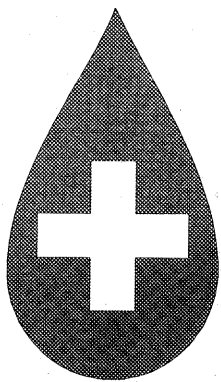
Red Cross Drives at NAIT But Not Many Takers

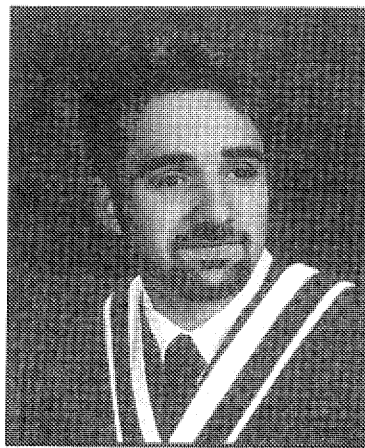


LAVIGNE, Denis Roger

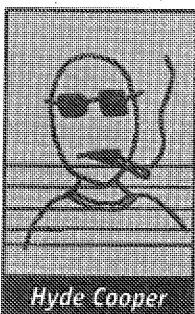

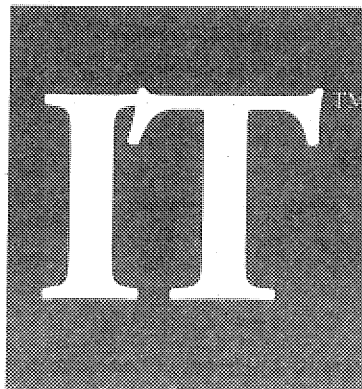
If you're reading this paper, congratulations on bull-shitting your way into another semester of broken promises, drunkenness

and television. You've made it, so give yourself a pat on the back.

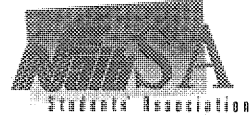

The last few months of the fall semester were ones I will remember for years.

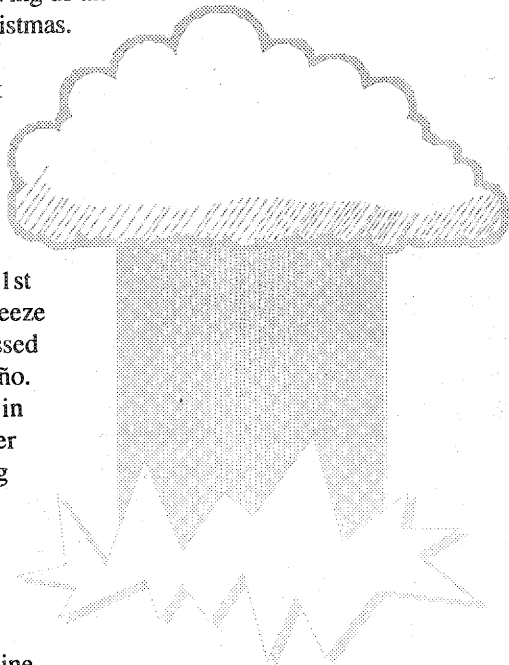

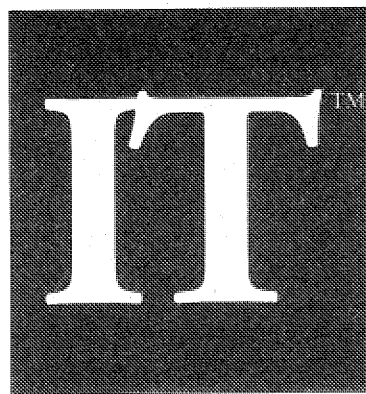

Then I went ahead and authorized myself to get extremely mad.

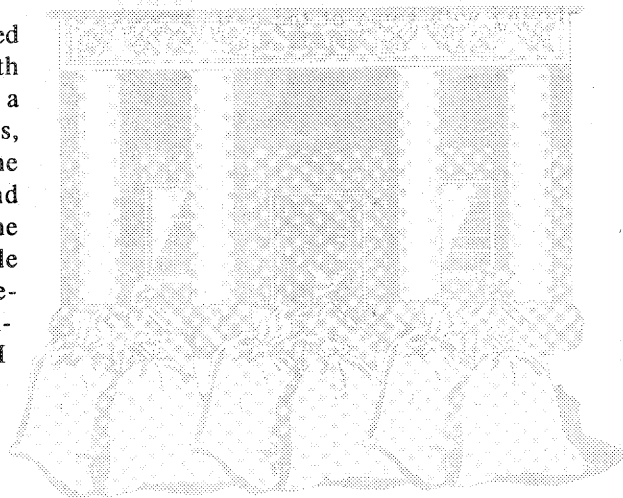
I called them both names for a few minutes, kicked the ATM and swore at the other people walking behind me. Finally, I stormed out and drove home going about

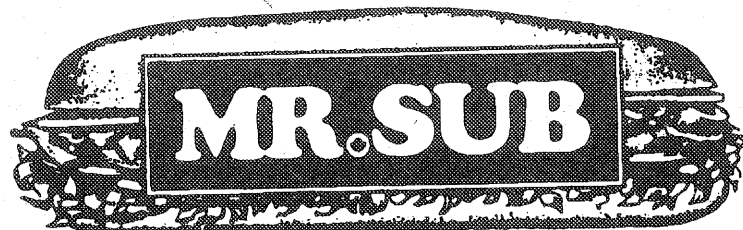

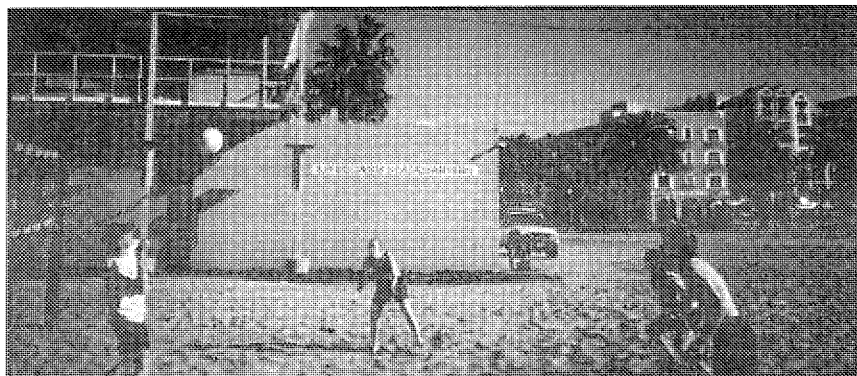

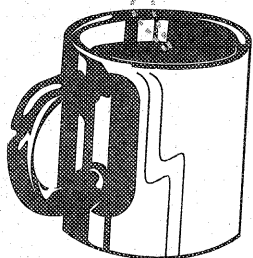
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Don't Tell Me You "Like" It

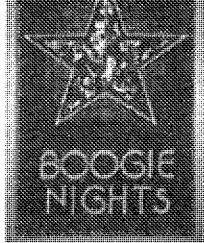

There weren't very many movies put out in 1997 that I would say are unbelievably great. This past year has proven to be one of the most disappointing for film entertainment with stories being remade, stories that are too predictable, and scripts that are weak—and let's not forget about all of the hyped action-flicks. L.A. Confidential: Exceptional cast and performances, complex story, and very thrilling. Somewhat predictable, and sometimes slow for a film that is supposed to be riveting. Adore Kevin Spacey and Danny Devito. Great movie adaptation from a James Ellroy novel about L.A. corruption in the 50's.

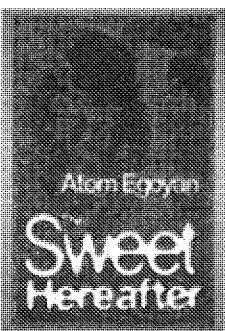
Boogie Nights: Shut up! It is not that good and I don't care if Mark Wahlberg does reveal a dong bigger than an oak tree.

The Sweet Hereafter: Interesting, simple concept, but I wasn't totally sold on it. Beautiful portrayal, characters strong; deals a lot with relationships with very little communication, many underlying meanings, unpredictable. Love the ending because it's so true



to life (not necessarily having closure). Don't expect to leave the theatre happy, not a picker-upper.

Face/Off: I'd like to tell John "best action director" Woo to pick another four lettered word that starts with "F"—Off for sucking me in and wasting my cash. Action—no kidding there's action—too damn much action!—and sequences that make me say, "Bullshit! He would not live!" Titanic: Perfect, even with an obvious storyline. Leonardo!—one of Hollywood's finest actors, slightly shadows fine actress Kate Winslet in *Titanic*. Beautiful fantasy story, fulfills the perfect Hollywood formula containing all of the elements that entertain all audiences, which is rare. High budget—worth it. Three and a half hours long—won't even notice. Superb.

as satisfying as *Titanic*. Hits a lot of areas, gives the audience a lot to think about. Simple movie without a lot of hype, but offers a variety of solutions to an obvious problem with complex emotional scars. Extremely well-written by Matt



Damon and Ben Affleck using not-so-clean, true-to-life dialogue. (Took them five years to wrap up). Smart punch-lines, unbelievably well delivered performances by Matt Damon, Minnie Driver, and Robin Williams. Classically entertaining with subject matter that has been covered in the past, but delivered in such a fashion that you'd think it was new. Fits formula. Have you "HUNTING" for tissue.

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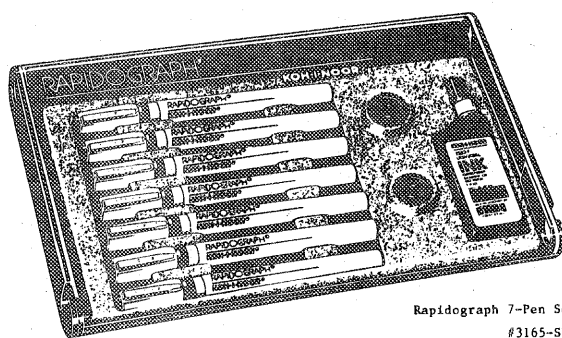
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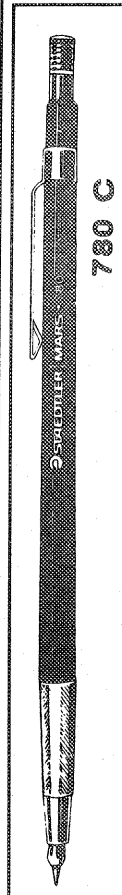
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
