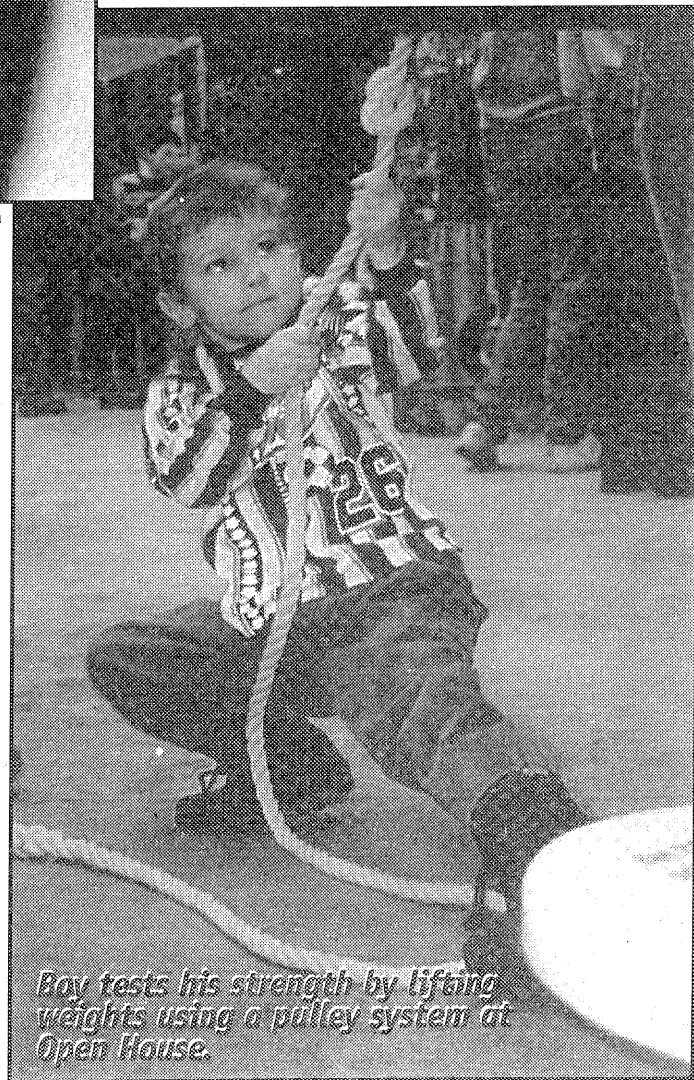

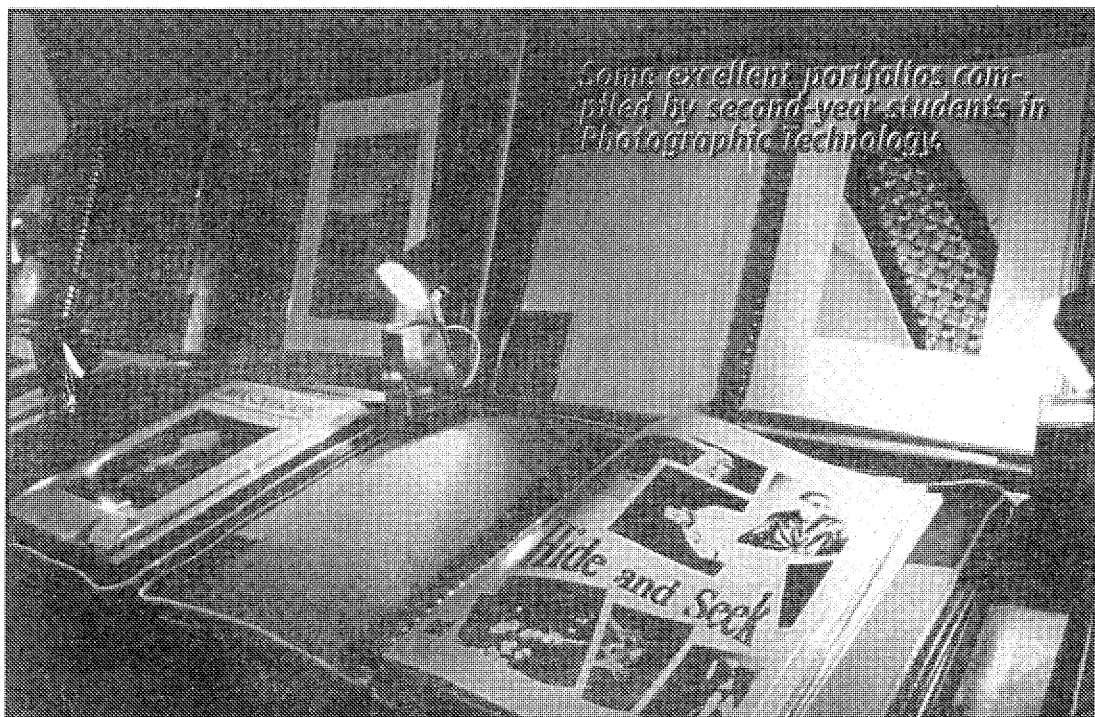

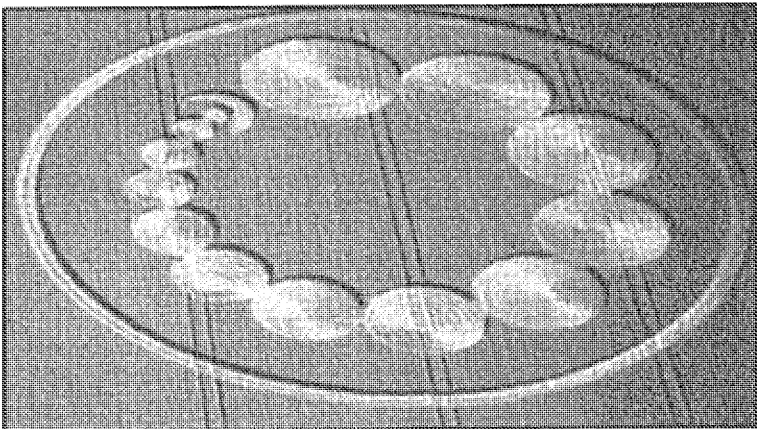
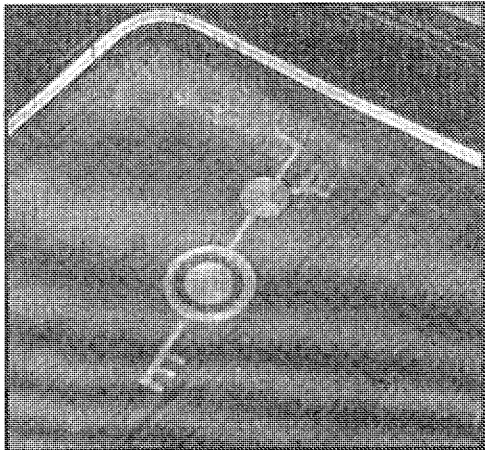
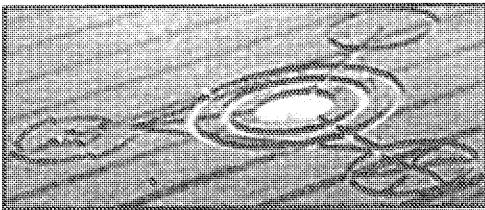
Despite our notable lack of interest in the unexplained (except for the X-files) here in North America, serious

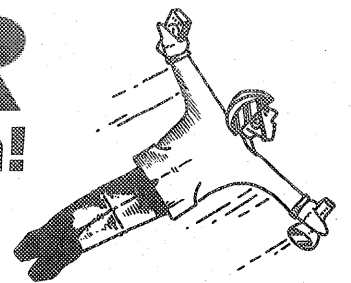

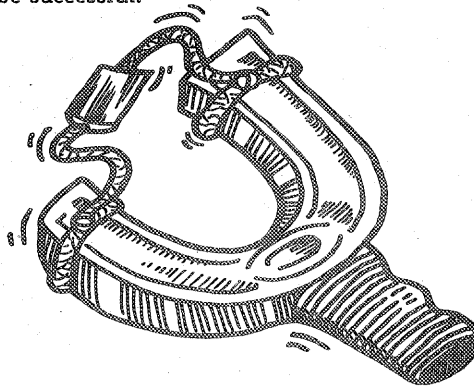
It is important to have not just one, but two informative weeks throughout the year promoting awareness on this issue.

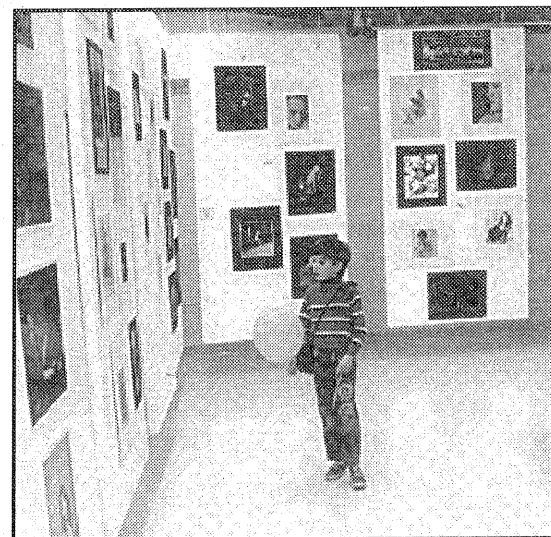

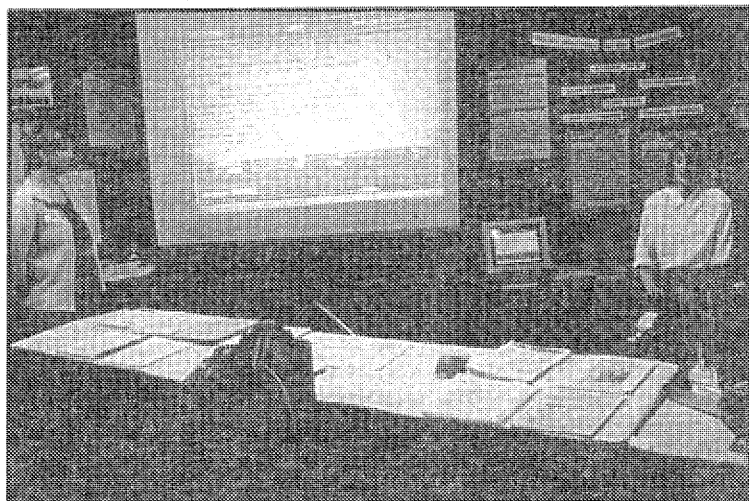

Vatican Apologizes

After more than 50 years of silence, the Vatican apologized for the conduct of Catholic Church members in regards to the Holocaust, Monday.

The apology came in the form of a 14-page document entitled, "We Remember, a Reflection on the Shoah."

In it the Vatican attempts to explain and clarify its role in the Holocaust, namely one of passive acceptance. And while the papacy does admit that it could have certainly done more to protect Jews, it also clarifies that the Nazi's were not, in the eyes of the Vatican, a part of the Catholic Church.

"The Shoah was the work of a

thoroughly modern neo-pagan regime. Its anti-Semitism had its roots outside of Christianity and, in pursuing its aims, it did not hesitate to oppose the Church and persecute her members also," the document said.

The show of goodwill is because of efforts by Pope John Paul to improve relations with the Jewish people, which has been the major aim of his papacy over the last twenty years.



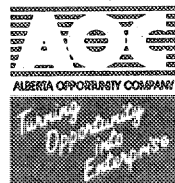

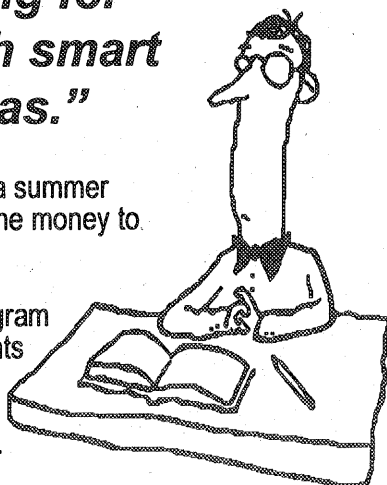

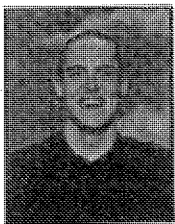

Athletics VP

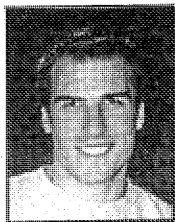


My name is Dave Elliot. I am a first year Industrial Heavy Equipment Technology student running for Athletics Vice President.

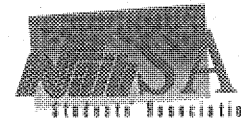

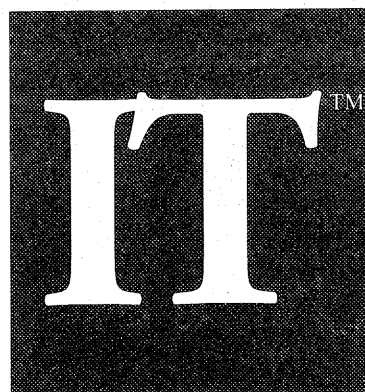

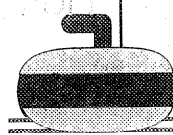

Golf Show 98 Was a Hit

The First Annual Edmonton Golf Show was held at the Northlands Sportex February 20-22. Various local pro shops were present to peddle their wares, as well as, representatives from club manufacturers and area golf courses. Also, part of the festivities were two putting contests, the Hole from Hell (sponsored by the Bear), and the longest putt (for the chance to win a brand spankin' new Dodge Intrepid). There was also a mini-putt course set up.

Dave Mayes, Alberta Professional Golf Association Member, told us that the event was the first ever-consumer-oriented show organized by the APGA, after numerous other attempts by local pro shops to hold shows failed. Mayes said he was impressed with the turn out (estimated to be about 7000 for the weekend), and sited changes for next year's show to include: moving to a better venue at the Agricom, as well as, a Friday-Saturday-Sunday schedule, which will help draw even more people.

The event is scheduled to be held annually from now on.

Alberta Junior Golf was one of the major focuses of the weekend's special events. The proceeds raised from both the longest putt and the miniature golf course events will go straight to junior golf programs, and the \$2450 raised in Calgary from February 14-16 was expected to be surpassed. Also, a special service was provided by local APGA pros and (Ugh!) Grant MacEwan Golf Management students. Their "Clubs for Kids" program invited parents to bring their children (under 7) for a free club custom-fit to their wee swings. The clubs, donated by manufacturers such as Top-Flite and Taylor Made, were doled out to more than 700 kids over the weekend.

ence) gave passerby's two chances at prizes, including a \$2000 set of golf clubs.

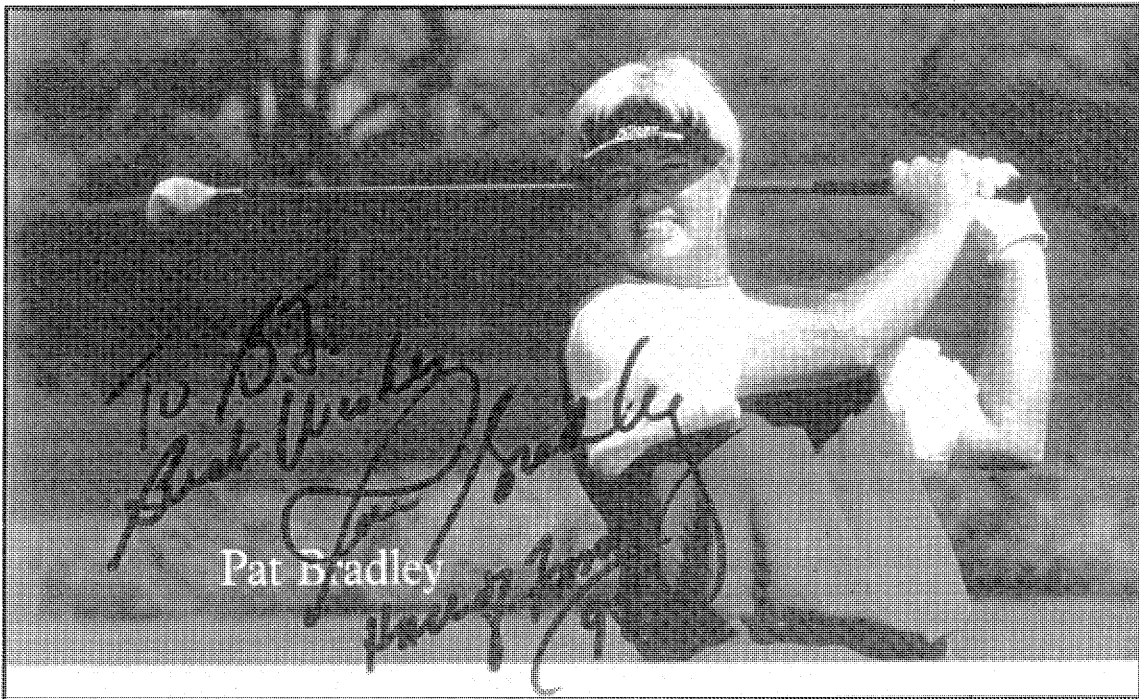
A variety of club manufacturers had booths set up, allowing visitors to hit their choice of clubs. According to Goldwin Golf Rep

Bob Soutar, these booths were popular. He said that each booth was seeing more than 200 people per day, and that a lot of interest was shown in the clubs.

A couple of golfing greats were brought in for autograph sessions and seminars. Jason Zuback, 2-time North American Long-Distance Champion, and Pat Bradley, LPGA Hall-of-famer. We were given the opportunity to speak with Ms. Bradley, questioning why in the world she'd come to Canada. As a winner of 31 tournaments, she noted that three of her victories came in Canada at the DuMaurier

Classic (a major championship on the LPGA tour), and that she always enjoys coming here. Also, the Edmonton Journal, who brought in the celebs, felt the stars would increase interest in the show and lend some credibility. I'd say it worked.

Overall, the Golf Show seemed successful in its first attempt, and the slated improvements for next year should help it get even better. One problem, though, was the price paid to see the show. With \$5 for parking, \$6 for admission, this makes an expensive date! Only two months 'til the season to swing!

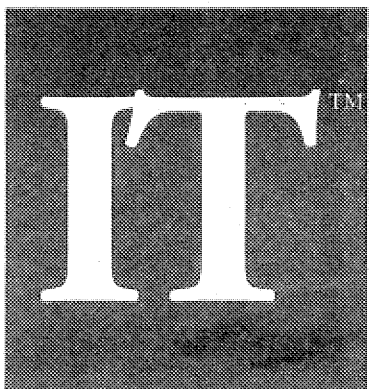

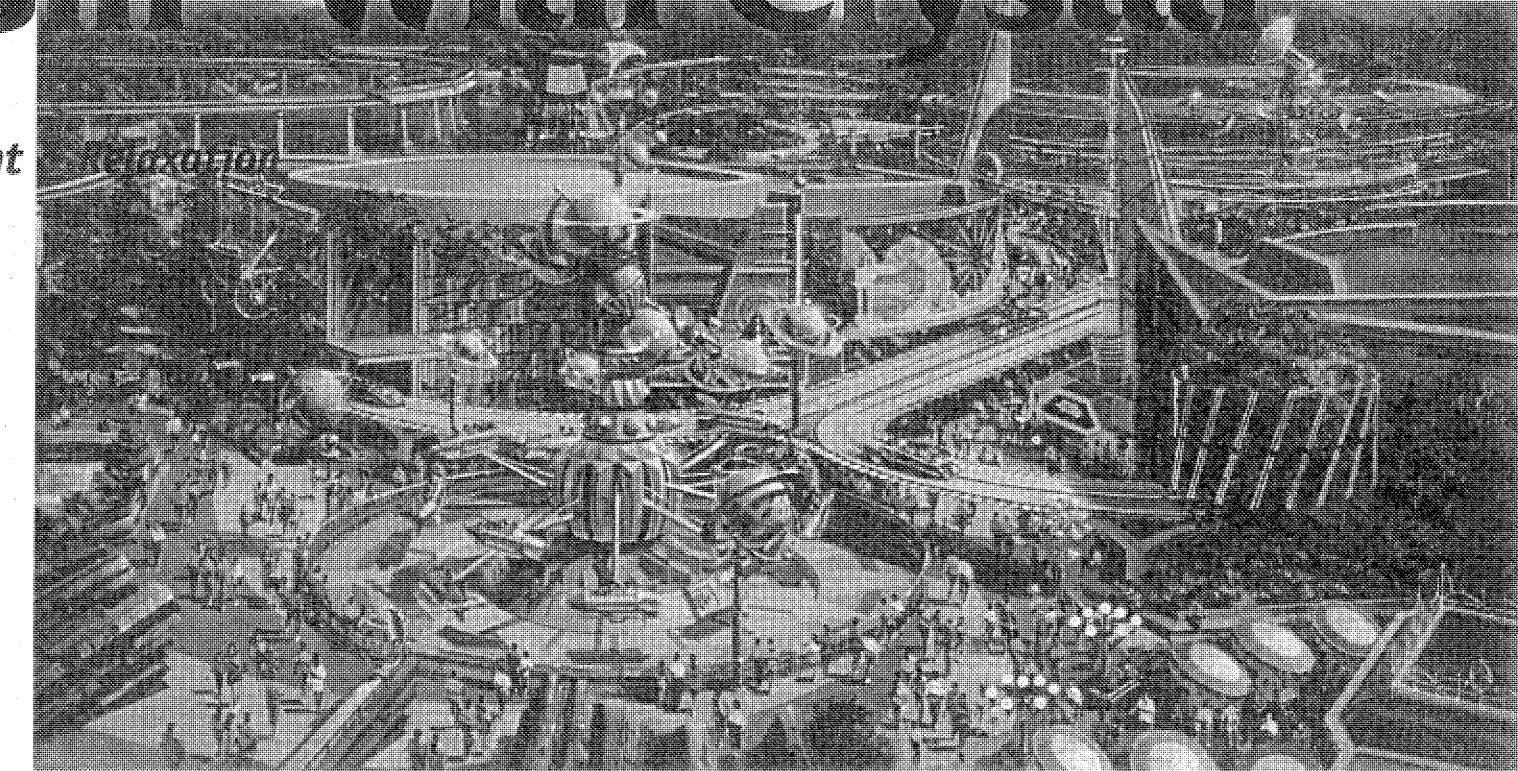

(e.g. at Halloween—more pumpkins) "Disney is optimistic about the future, therefore, wants to send a good message about the environment," says Gordon.

And most importantly, the intense, new, high-speed exciting park rides. Some of which include the 'Astro Orbiter' where one can pilot a colorful rocket, circling series of planets and constellations.

The 'Rocket Rods XPR' are rocket vehicles of the future where one journeys throughout the land at high-speed. And the latest in 3-D film techniques 'Honey I Shrunk the Audience' which has state-of-

the-art theatrical effects like a floor that moves in coordination with the film.

"Throughout innovations and landscape we do believe the future will be great" says Gordon.

After the press conference someone complimented the delicious food, and the others responded "That's Disney Style"

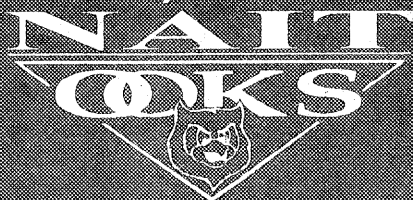

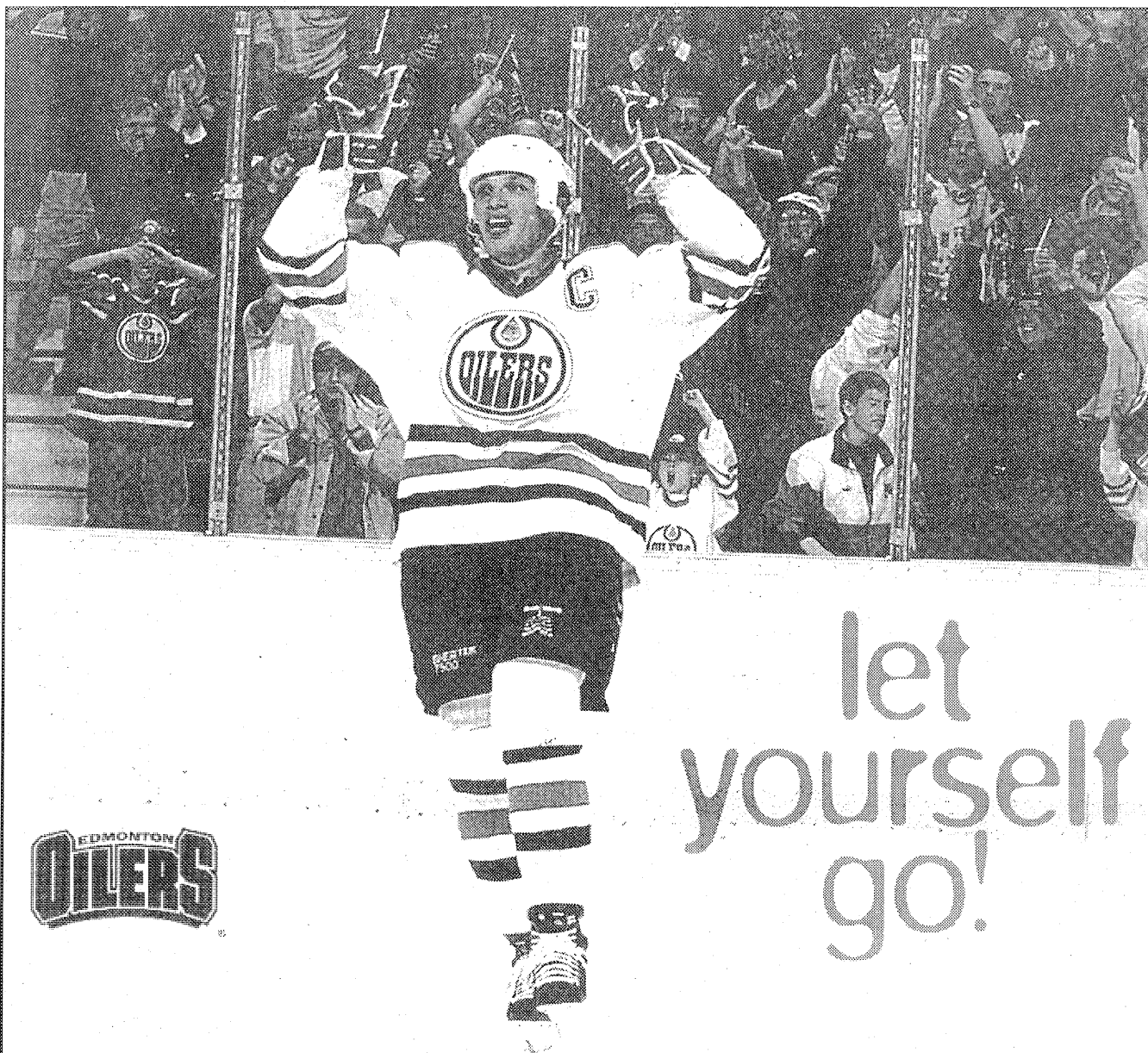
