
Did you remember?

A Perfect Murder?

Gang Violence in Edmonton

t sounds more like a movie script than a news story. A murder is committed in the biggest mall in the world on Boxing day — the busiest day of the year. There are at least fifty people who see the victim being attacked, and not one of them can positively I.D. the killer (who wasn't even wearing a mask).

The story is all too real for the family and friends of Dominic Mah. Mah was with two friends when all were attacked from behind by teenage males with knives and hatchets. Mah was brutally stabbed ten times and died just beside the Ice Palace.

Hours later, police arrested Quang Tran and charged him with second-degree murder; attempted murder; and possession of a weapon.

The problem begins within twelve hours of Tran's arrest. Another teenager, who cannot be named but who was attacked along

with Mah, was brought in to make a positive I.D. on Tran. However, the teen could not pick Tran out of the police line up.

Tran's alibi in court was that he was sleeping at the time of the killing. Apparently, he had been selling drugs that night and went home after completing the transaction. The teenager who was brought in to identify Tran, has told police that he is associated with a local gang known as MR2. He also pointed out that one of the attackers was a member of the Yellowheads, a rival gang of the victims.

A possible reprieve could come when Thi Hoang Le faces trial. Because of his age (18), he is ordered to be tried as an adult. This is the last chance police will have to solve a case that seemingly should have been easy to close. There has been no talk of gang intimidation from witnesses, although it is a realistic possibility.

Newfie Loses Four Years

Likely to get Millions

ey, here's a thought! How about tomorrow, we send the cops to your house, charge you with a phony crime, put you through hell trying to prove you did it, and then toss you into a maximum security prison for four years! Sounds fun, don't it?

That's exactly what Gregory Parsons of St. John's, Newfoundland has gone through. He was charged and convicted in 1994 of murdering his own mother and sent to prison until last week when the Crown prosecutor said, "we f*cked up real good"—in slightly different terms.

Parsons was well on his way to rotting in prison when a Court of Appeals finally overturned the wrongful conviction and ordered a re-trial. Last February, DNA evidence taken from a towel, as well as the deceased's finger nails, was presented at the new trial. The DNA taken from the scene did not match Parson's DNA; therefore, it was scientifically and physically impossible for Gregory Parsons to have murdered his mother.

Parson's wife broke down in tears when the verdict was read at the conclusion of his re-trial. She was quoted as saying, "He's my best friend and it's been a long, hard road, but I feel great." Parsons will also have considerably more time to spend with his four year-old son, Zachary, now that he's out of the slammer.

We seem to be on a roll in the last few years as far as screwing up our citizens' lives. It was only a few years ago that David Millgard's was exonerated due to DNA evidence just like Parsons'. Millgard received over \$20 million for spending many years of his life

in prison for a crime he didn't commit. Call me crazy, but I'd take the sentence myself. He could have been out sooner, but he would never admit to the killing. Oddly enough, if you admit that you did it they will let you out on parole but if you maintain your innocence you have to stay in jail.

Justice Minister Chris Decker has appointed a former Newfoundland Supreme Court Justice to review Parsons' investigation and prosecution. The Justice will then make recommendations as to whether or not (more likely how much), compensation will be given. The government will then act on the report's findings. As for Mr. Parsons, I'll bet he's never been this glad to walk around Newfoundland before.

Nope, the real reason is to aid in controlling the human population on the planet Earth. At this point you might be thinking, "Drugs, X-Files, and Internet



Students Denied Access to Higher Education

Association of Baha'i Studies

he association of Baha'i Studies views with grave concern, recent events that have occurred in the Republic of Iran. Between September 29th and October 3rd, the government of Iran has shut down the Baha'i Institute of Higher Education (BIHE), arrested 36 faculty members, and raided 532 homes and looted files, equipment, and personal property. These actions sanctioned by the government were carried out by elements of the Iranian Ministry of Information.

Since 1980, as part of a government-directed attempt to destroy the intellectual and cultural process of Iran's 300,000 member Baha'i community, young people who declare their Baha'i identity have been expelled from universities and blocked from acquiring or pursuing a higher education. Deeply concerned that an entire generation of Iran's best and brightest have been denied access to higher education, the Baha'i community of Iran launched a creative and wholly non-violent response: the establishment of its own independent, full-fledged, yet centralized university system the BIHE. BIHE, which is an open university, has been in existence since 1987. It has an enrollment of more than 900 students. The institute offers bachelor's degree programs in 10 subject areas. Among some of those subject areas are computer science, civil engineering, chemistry, and accounting. Number 150, its faculty members, all volunteers, comprise of doctors, dentists, engineers, and lawyers; some of whom have degrees from MIT, University of California, Berkeley, and Sorbonne.

On July 21st, a Baha'i by the name of Ruhollah Rowhani — a 52-year-old medical salesman and father of four — was summarily executed in Mashhad after a revolutionary court upheld his death sentence. His crime — being a Baha'i. Two other Baha'is who have also been sentenced to death, are languishing in prison in Iran.

A secret government memorandum, drawn up by the Supreme Revolutionary Cultural Council in February 1991 and signed by Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, was made public in 1993 by the United Nations' Special Representative on Human Rights in Iran. This memorandum establishes a policy by the Iranian government to systematically destroy Iran's 300,000 member Baha'i community by block-


ing their progress and development intellectually, culturally, and economically.

Iran is party to the International Covenant On Economic, Social, and Cultural Rights, which was adopted by the United Nations' General Assembly in 1966. Parties of the covenant "recognize the right of education" and, more specifically than that, "higher education shall be made equally accessible to all on the basis of capacity by every appropriate means." These latest developments in Iran constitute a gross violation by the Iranian government of that covenant.

More than 200 Baha'is have been executed since 1980 because of their religious beliefs. Often, they are accused of fictitious crimes. Thousands have suffered arbitrary detention. These include men and women of all ages, as well as professionals, educators, and laymen; who have committed no crime often than their non-violent and peaceful belief in such principles as oneness of mankind, oneness of God, and equality of men and women. So, as you walk into your next class, let us remember those for whom that very act is but



Dave Does Edmonton THE COUPLE





These guys are SOLID. It was a non-stop jam session that gave everyone in the crowd at the newly renamed Skyreach Centre something to dance to. These guys just never stopped, their musical talent is absolutely amazing. I came in to the concert only knowing "Crash into Me" and "Don't Drink the Water", but left as a through-andthrough fan. I was surprised at the diversity of the crowd, as it seems that people young and old enjoy these high-energy musicians.

Some people haven't heard of the Dave Matthews Band, and if you are one of the few, here is a little history: In 1991, Dave Matthews decided to record the songs he'd been writing in his spare time. Not wanting to record only his voice and guitar, he gathered up some fellow musicians from his hometown of Charlottesville. As a bartender at the jazz bar called Miller's, Dave had heard and conversed with some of the area's best upand-coming jazz musicians; mainly Carter Beauford and LeRoi Moone. Dave told them about his plans to record songs, and they agreed to help. Stefan Lessand, a 16year-old upright and electric bass player, was also chosen for the project. The band then found that they needed a string musician for a few songs, and Boyd

Tinsley with his high-energy violin was invited. After sitting in with the band on a few different occasions, Boyd was asked to join full-



time, and The Dave Matthews Band was born. The DMB's first album was "Remember Two Things", released in 1993. In 1994, DMB's popularity grew and they released their major label debut, "Under the Table and Dreaming." "Crash" came in 1996, and they have just recently released "Before These Crowded Streets." The DMB are a musically eclectic and diverse band, and are growing into one of today's more refreshing musical alternatives.

Opening for DMB were The New Meanies. The New Meanies are an excellent group with talent to spare. They warmed up the crowd and left more than a few wishing that they had played more than an hour. Watch for these guys in the future. All in all, it was an excellent night of quality music presented at the good ol' Skyreach Centre, and I'll be sure to catch the DMB when they come rolling by again. You should, too.



However, Your Honor, I would like to make it perfectly clear that my instincts and my professionalism prodded me to a second listening. It is at this point exactly where my opinion changed. With a little latitude I would now like to prove to the court, the jury, the audience and the world at large that the music of An Acoustic Sin is worthy or acclaim and recognition, strong sales and extensive contract offers followed by several worldwide tours.

Thank you, Your Honor. It is my meagre estimation that the true signs of artistic integrity are the ability to adapt and the ability to craft a subtly multifaceted piece that requires concentration and endurance to fully and completely understand and appreciate. The defendants exhibit both of these traits as far as I'm concerned. Please allow to demonstrate.

As far as the first point is concerned, AAS creates music that does not fall entirely within one genre. Not even two genres. I could not pin a number down but I would



conservatively say 'several.' Folk rock, blues, flamenco, Gothic hard rock, Russian stump, Celtic fiddle swing... this list obviates a diverse heritage and an eclectic musical playlist. Also, Your Honor, I have done extensive research into this New Brunswick-based band and studied dutifully its lyric sheets. I submit evidence that listening to the melodious, harmonious, mellifluous, and indeed sonorous sounds of An Acoustic Sin produces a mood of alternating ambient tranquillity and cacophonic noise. Everything on "Almost Here" seems to me to work towards building a specific mood, one of sobre reflection, an introspective journey into the nature of self and the quirky relationships that us messy humans engage ourselves in. 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
