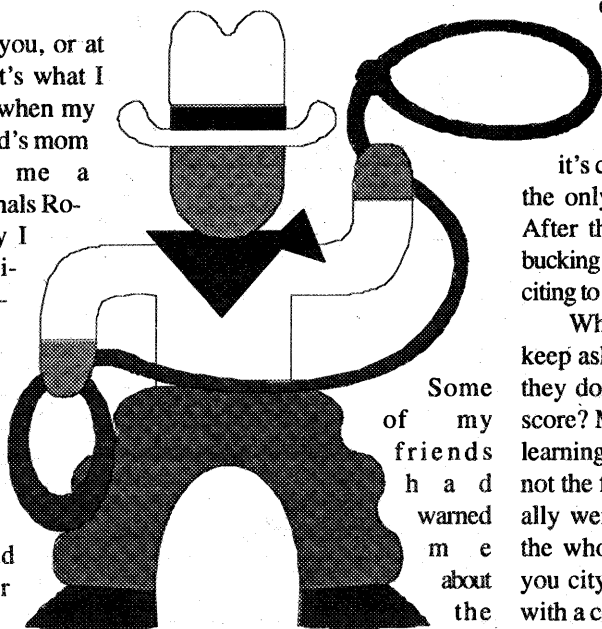

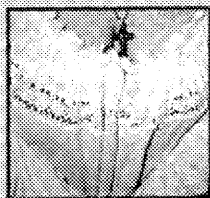

In other words, the Canadian Finals Rodeo is wrapped up for another year; however, not before breaking the 1994 attendance record by just under 5000 cowboys and cowgirls. 91,150 wannabe bronco riders and barrel racers went through the gates at the Skyreach Centre in a week's time, which is like 5 1/2 consecutive sell-outs in a week for Oilers fans.

This means more than just the smell of manure and a lot of pickups in town for Edmontonians. The CFR brings in over \$50 million to the city each year! For many people from rural Alberta and elsewhere, this is a perfect time to buy Christmas presents or big-ticket items that can't be purchased outside of a major city.

According to Jane Batty, Northlands Park volunteer director, more than 300 volunteers helped make this CFR a success. Also, the EDE (Economic Development

Edmonton), the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce, the Downtown Business Association, and 48 hotels and motels in the city, added to the western motif seen throughout the city.

Events like chili cook-offs, pancake breakfasts, and country vocalist contests raised almost 100,000 dollars for the Cowboy Benevolent Fund. This money is given to the families of cowboys (and cowgirls) who are seriously injured in rodeos, or preparing for one, and can no longer provide for their families.

The most popular event seems to be the cowboy poker game, where four or five cowboys sit around with their hands on top of a table while a bull charges into the ring. The last cowboy remaining seated wins the money (\$300 to be exact). Let me think, getting disemboweled by a 2000 lb. bull or \$300... It's a tough call, but I think I'll keep my gonads intact, thanks.

# Building Plan Takes Hold

The NAIT Student Association has released a five year business plan entitled "Heartbeat of the Campus," to media and other fairly important people around campus. The major topic of the report involves a solid plan as to the construction of a new student association building scheduled to begin in 2003.

The idea is to put a building on campus where students from every faculty can get together and kill time between or after classes. The funding for the building is being socked away slowly but surely, after a cool million went to the South Learning Centre in 1995/96. Right now, we're sitting at roughly \$500,000.

Another topic in the report was the amount of coin NAITSA gets out of our fees. NAIT gives out \$97 to the student association from every student's fees. This

seems to be the lowest in the land. In a survey completed by five other SA's, the average amount of money per student given to the SA was about \$125. The lowest amount from the survey was \$111, and the highest (apparently they surveyed Yale) was \$195 per student.

There also seems to be a wee bit of tension between the SA and NAIT itself. Although there was nothing substantial in the report, the SA executive does state that the SA staff and NAIT administration "Do not always appear to fully support the executive's activities," which to me, sounds like the SA saying, 'cut us some slack and give us more money' in a very polite manner.

Parts of this report seem to make real sense. Number one on the list, is the idea that the five year plan carries forward to future SA executives. This means that next year's executive will carry on from where this year's leaves off. That

way there's no chance that all the work is going to be scrapped and re-written once next year's executives get voted in. Another point made in the report, is for an independent board consisting of 8-12 members throughout NAIT, to oversee the development of the new building. This means that future executives won't have to spend all their time worrying about how much money is in the pot for the new building.

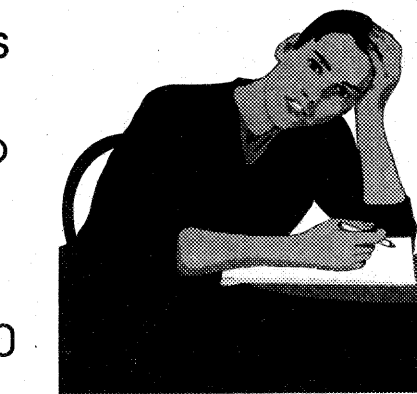
Finally, the SA executive plans on including we, the students, in the construction of the building. Rumor has it that architectural and engineering students will help in the actual planning of the building, while marketing students are scheduled to help research the project. # The Rolex Awards for Enterprise

Dr. Amanda Vincent was first drawn to study seahorses because of their unusual method of reproduction — it is the male seahorse that becomes pregnant and gives birth. She now has become the world's foremost authority on seahorses. As she studied the seahorses, she became aware of their threatened extinction due to their use in traditional Chinese medicine as aphrodisiacs, curios, or in domestic aquariums. This led her to begin in innovative seahorse conservation project in the Philippines, where the seahorses are at risk from overfishing by villagers who rely on them for their livelihood. As an example of sustainable development, this program has already succeeded in stemming the decline of seahorse populations and developing new means of employment for the lo-

cals who fish them. This project is a prototype for more villages in the area, and a global model of how to address the global problems of declining subsistence fishing and threatened marine species.

Dr. Amanda Vincent is a Canadian, and she is a 1998 laureate of the Rolex Awards for Enterprise in the Environment. Good job, Amanda!

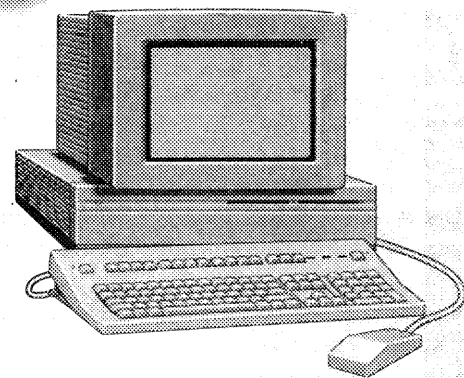
So, to whoever is responsible for the conditions of the basement, here are our concerns. Please address them!

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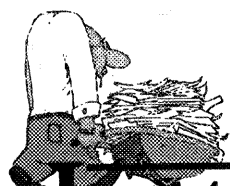

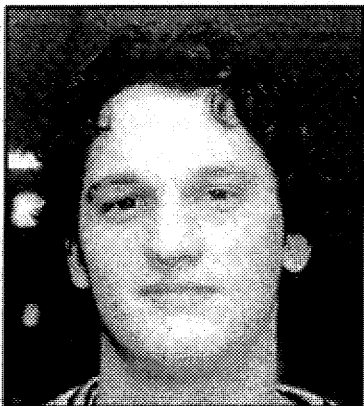

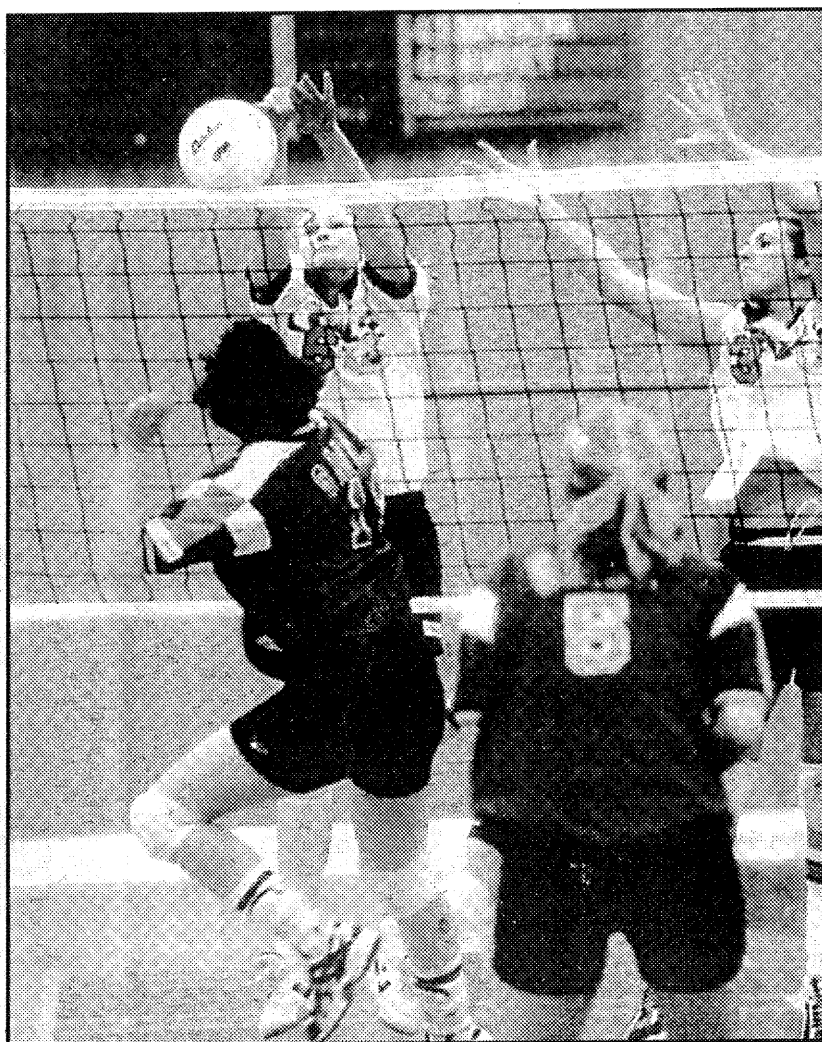
GPRC: A team full of first year players is a scary thing to be when you have to start the season in Grande Prairie's home gym. The first match of the year was over pretty quick, even though the team

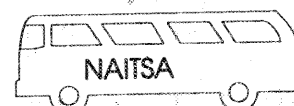

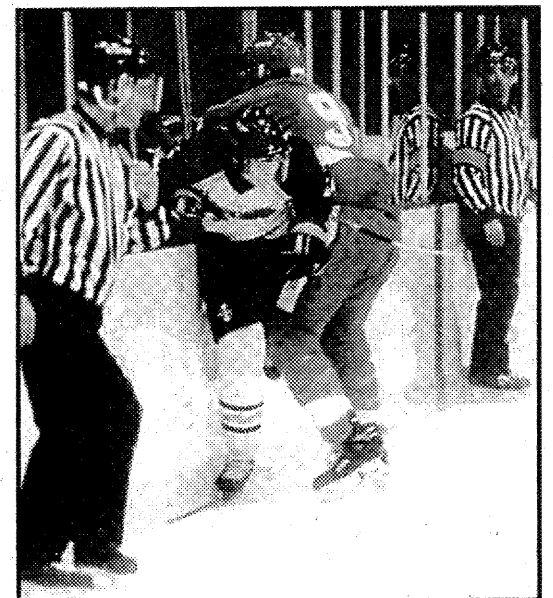

when Tyler's not looking.

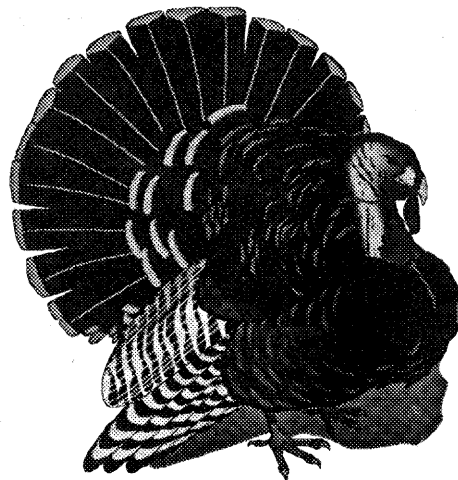





Because You demanded it...

# Teachin' to two-step

**S**o you feel like going to Ezzie's... There's only one problem, you can't 2-step if your life depended on it. Well, fret no further, because good ol' Daveyboy is here to help. The 2-Step is probably the most widely known and performed country dance. It is fairly easy to capture the basics, but true competency can only be acquired through practice.

The 2-Step is danced in 4 steps to 6 beats of music. 2 quick steps (Quick-Quick) each getting 1 beat of music, and 2 slow steps (Slow-Slow), each slow step gets 2 beats. Dancers begin on the Quick-quick. Men begin their steps on the LEFT foot and ladies on their RIGHT. Regardless of direction of the actual steps involved, the first quick and first slow are always on the man's left and lady's right. Got that?

In what is known as the "cowboy hold," the man places his right hand on the lady's left shoulder and she places her left hand along his right arm. In the "ballroom hold," the man passes his right hand under the lady's left arm (or over if there is a problem with height difference), placing his right hand on her left shoulder blade. The lady then places her left arm along his right, making as much contact as possible. Build enough firmness to keep your arms in this position when the man turns his shoulders. Men: Don't let your left hand drift downward — although quite tempting sometimes — as your frame will fall apart. In both forms of the position, the man's left hand is raised approximately level with his right arm with the palm towards the lady. The lady then simply lays her right hand in the man's palm. Don't grip your partner's hand! Keep the fingers open. Build enough resistance so that the joined hands remain centered between the partners. With the "cowboy hold," the man must rely on his right hand on the lady's shoulder, and the

movement of his left hand to lead the lady into the turns he wants to do. With the "ballroom hold," once the frame is established, a simple turn of the man's shoulder is enough to lead the lady.

To turn the lady right, lead on the 2nd slow step by pressing with the heel of the right hand on her shoulder blade and turning your shoulders to your right. To turn the lady left, lead on the 1st slow step by pressing with the fingertips of the right hand and turning the shoulders to the left.

Hey Ladies: The man has got to be allowed to lead the dance. If you lead, he will never learn. Unless led, the lady should not change her direction of dance. Don't turn till we tell you to, and keep turning till we tell you to stop. The easiest way to stop turning is to lower the man's left arm. If it stays up over the lady's head, it's a signal that he wants her to continue turning. Also remember that the man has a lot to learn. He must learn to recognize the rhythm and tempo of the music, he must build a good form so you step out as a couple. He must watch all the other dancers on the floor so they don't run you over. He must think about what move he wants to do next, then he has to remember and give the lead. All he asks of you is to stay in step, follow his lead, and have patience, "because after all, he's just a man."

Men: Whenever we do turns, we lead the lady, then let her turn under her own power. Don't crank her around with your left or pull sharply on her shoulder. If she doesn't get all the way around on the quick, quick, give her time to finish the turn. The turn will get done if you don't force it, you'll only throw her off balance and out of step if you do. Moving your hand in either direction will cause her to finish the turn to the left or right of where you intended her to be.

The above is a bargain basement account on how to 2-step. If you really want to learn, go out to the bar and get your ass on the floor. Besides, most experienced dancers will pity you and give you a break. I honestly didn't even have a clue on how to 2-step a year ago, and now I'm teaching the basics to some lucky girls. (Lucky as in they are dancing with me. Hee Hee.) So don't be afraid to get out there and enjoy yourself. You'll never have to sit out wedding dances again! Yee-hah!

It's totally unforgettable, what with Pras, ODB and Mya together blessing the listener with their silky words and golden voices; along with the tune that they lifted directly from that Kenny Rogers/Dolly Parton hit from about a googol years ago called "Islands in the Stream" (which, incidentally, was written by the Bee Gees!) But I digress. Let bygones be bygones, I say. Whatever Kenny and Dolly had wasn't nearly even half of the juice that Pras has, and every review of this album that I've read indicates that Pras did it while under the influence... of many artists from many genres.

Besides the Bee Gees, there's Sting and Elvis Costello, some Grease thrown in, and, of course, World Gospel. He starts the album off with a church choir and organ grinding out "Hallelujah!" which leads right into "Supastar"



smooth and totally cool, and then leaves the album in a kind of grande finale way with "Amazing Grace."

In the interviews, Pras indicated that he was also kind of pressured to do this album because fellow members of the Refugee Camp — Wyclef Jean and Lauryn Hill — did their own albums and he felt like the odd man out; So, to prove his talent, he had to represent.

Now, this is a good album but nothing massive like Lauryn's 'Miseducation.' Out of the 18 tracks on the disk, there's the two gospel numbers, 4 brief recorded telephone conversations, and 12 'original' songs. "Supastar" is definitely the highlight, but it's first out of the gates. "What'cha Wanna Do," "Can't Stop the Shining," and "Get Your Groove On" all are potential hits, but they ain't hardcore. All in all, you'd probably best listen to it first if you can, to make sure it's what you want. You been warned.

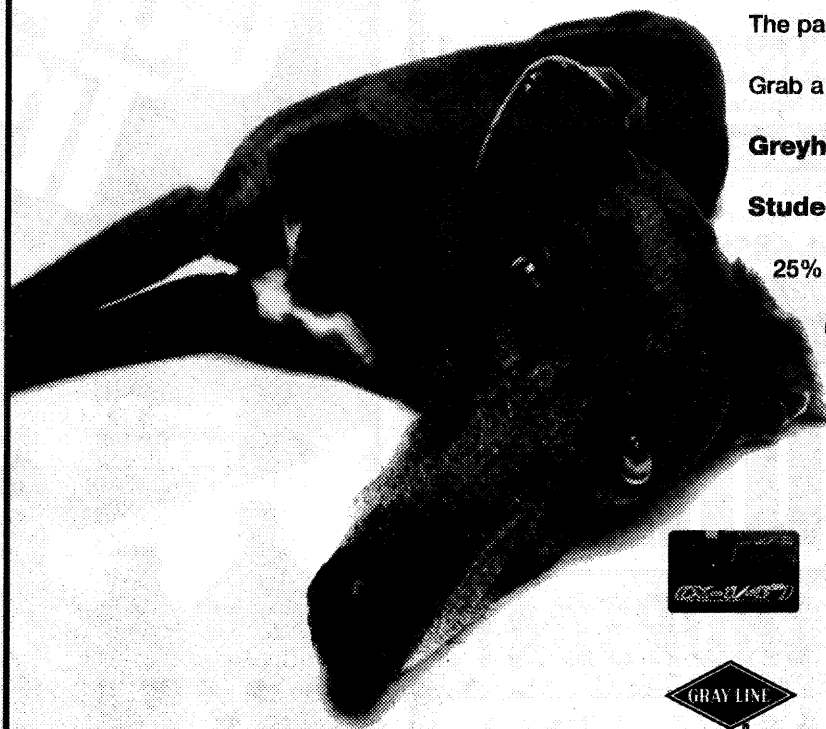

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# The Red Violin

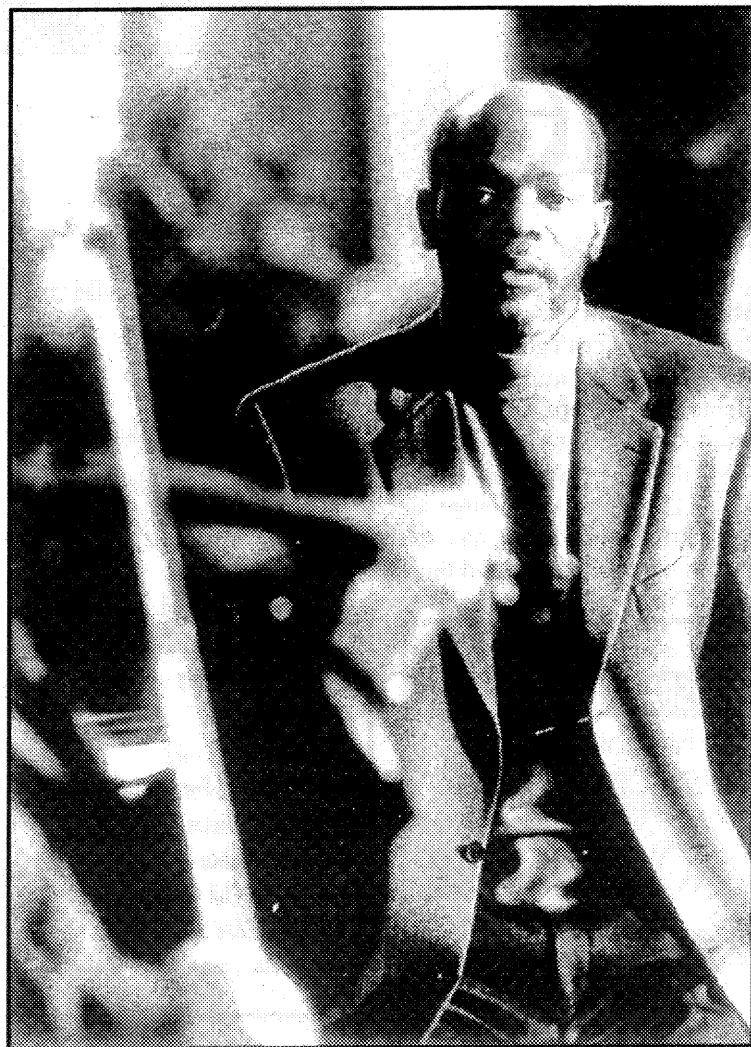

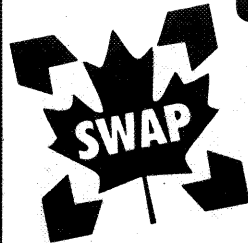

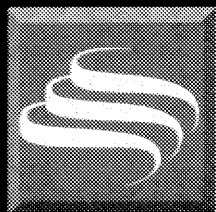
