



Boston Won't Go Psycho

Posters promoting the remark of Alfred Hitchcock's "Psycho" are being pulled from subway stations and buses after more than dozen people complained that the posters gave them the willies. The poster shows the silhouette of a woman behind a shower door with blood pooled near the bottom. It is meant to depict the nightmarish scene of the original 1960 movie of a woman being repeatedly stabbed in the shower at a secluded hotel. The remake, starring Anne Heche, is set to be released on December 4.

A Royal Intrusion Of Privacy

Prince Charles wants an apology from the British newspaper "The Mirror" after they ran a front-page headline daiming that his son Harry suffered a minor sports injury at school and had to be taken to hospital. While Prince Charles does not deny the claim, he feels that the paper breached the Royal Family's request to grant both Prince Harry and Prince William complete privacy in their school lives and that "The Mirror" should apologize publicly to Prince Harry for intruding on this. The paper argues, however, that the public is entitled to know if an heir to the throne is involved in an accident; and that the allegation made by Prince Charles is only a thinly disguised attempt to bully and censor the press.

While in the midst of passing sentence on a convicted sex affender, Justice Borke Smith had an overhead lighting fixture break loose above him and land on his head. "Was that from God?" Justice Smith joked, but no one laughed as they watched the blood drip from his forehead. The Justice stumbled slightly as he left the bench and was tended to in his chambers by ambulance personnel. He did, however, return to court an hour later to finish sentencing, along with a quite visible cut and a large bump on his head.

The Sailor Who Did It Salo

A Russian sailor had to perform surgery on himself using instructions via an Email. Victor Yazykov, a competitor in the Around Alone boating race, set out

to sea more than two months ago on the first leg of the grueling solo race. While still over 1,500 kilometres from shore, he started to lose the use of his right arm and Emailed the race doctor. Three days later, his arm became infected and he was told he would have to drain an abscess on his right elbow before it ruptured internally and became gangrenous. Yazykov was successful overall in performing the selfsurgery, barring a few complications. He arrived safely at his first destination a week later, taking the 5th spot going into the second leg of the race. "It was like following a recipe for brownies," Yazykov commented once safely on shore.

Standardized Testing Giving All The Wrong Answers

B.C. teachers are calling for a full review of all standardized government exams currently in use in that province. According to Kit Krieger, president of the B.C. Teachers' Federation, the tests are an inaccurate way of evaluating both students and schools.

For the last 20 years in B.C., Provincial Learning Assessment Programs (PLAP tee hee!) have been used to evaluate different course content in B.C. schools; however, this year they are being used to evaluate individual student performances as well.

138,000 B.C. students wrote what seem to be very messed up exams last May. For instance, the readability level of one Grade Four booklet was rated at a Grade Ten

level while a Grade Seven reading booklet was rated at Grade Four. That hardly seems like a fair test to me.

The May 1998 test even raised major ethical concerns among teachers. One written response question asked students to write about their homes. Because it never clarified whether it was to be fictional or not, there were 26 cases of child-abuse called in to the Ministry of Children and Families. Even worse, none of the teachers knew whether the situations were made up or not.

While this info no longer has an affect on us, any students with little brothers or sisters should know that the same tests are used at each stage of schooling in Alberta as well; beginning with Grade Three and ending with the dreaded Departmental exams in Grade Twelve.

These exams are a major evaluation for entering any kind of post-secondary institute. Apparently, they need to either put much less emphasis on these exams or find a way to make them more accurate in evaluating the writer. Oh well, now I don't feel as bad about that 51% on my Grade 12 Math final.

World Track and Field coming to Edmonton in 2001!

n November 19 in Monaco, the Edmonton 2001 Bid Committee won the right to host the World Track and Field Championship. Twenty-seven voting delegates of the In-

ternational Amateur Athletics Federation chose Edmonton as the site of the first world championships in athletics to be held in North America. The Edmonton bid was picked over bids by Stanford (U.S.A.), New Delhi (India), and Paris (France). The Edmonton Bid Committee making the official presentation was Alberta Premier Ralph Klein; Edmonton Mayor Bill Smith; Canadian Minister of Justice Anne McLellan, the Attornev General of Canada, Athletics Canada Chairman Rolf Lund, and Bid Committee Co-Chairs Jack Agrios and Dr. Bob Steadward.

Everyone from the Mayor to

the Premier is excited. They probably should be from how this will affect our economy alone. The people of Edmonton have to be excited also.

The World Championships in Athletics are the third largest sporting event in the world, after the Summer Olympics and World Cup Soccer. This event will attract 3,000 athletes and coaches from all over the world, along with 4,000 media representatives. The expected impact on the economy from hosting the Championships is currently being estimated at \$386 million.

I like Bob Latimer. He's a man who has enjoyed a life of simplicity until about five years ago. He has a family farm near Wilkie, SK, and he has plenty of friends down at the local curling rink (one can be sure). He's going to be in jail for a lot longer than anticipated, however, and it bothers me.

I may be opening a can of worms here, but I don't think that what he did was worth a life sentence (25 years) in prison. He's an honest man. He said that he killed his daughter out of love in a bid to end her suffering. That's the compassionate father speaking. Some see that as the barnyard executioner speaking. When a horse is in pain, you kill it. You end the suffering. I'm on Bob's side. He was a loving father. He was a quiet farmer with enough character witnesses to fill the SkyReach Center. He shouldn't be imprisoned for anything more than his previous sentence.

Robert Latimer and

Barnyard Justice

I should explain the history behind this situation. Tracy Latimer, age 12, was killed by Robert Latimer using exhaust fumes in 1993. She had a severe form of cerebral palsy. She couldn't walk, talk or feed herself, and she functioned at the level of a three-month-old. She had lived a life of pain and underwent many painful surgeries. His current sentence is life imprisonment with no chance of parole for 10 years. The sentence before that was two years less a day, with one year being served on the family farm. This was appealed by the Crown because they felt that the judge had not followed the law. The sentence before that, handed out in 1994,

was overturned by the Supreme Court of Canada because the RCMP, acting on Crown orders. improperly questioned potential jurors in the original trial. Jurors were asked their feelings on euthanasia and other issues that related to the nature of the case.

The case sparked a national debate on mercy killing. Disabled groups worried that if Latimer was let off lightly, it would give the impression that his actions were justified. The most vulnerable in our society would be offed one at a time, with the murderers being let off in a similar, slap on the wrist sort of sentencing.

Latimer felt that he did something out of compassion for his little girl who was living a life of pain. Some feel that he was sick of caring for her. His family believes that the world's greatest dad is now going to prison. I believe that if rapists can be sentenced to 2 years in prison, less a day (to avoid Federal Penitentiary time), why shouldn't compassionate fathers be? Until next week, don't forget


the connections being made.

sound too generous.


But the fact is... I really liked this stuff. And if Mick didn't specifically say that I had to return this disc (and also if it didn't already have the band members' signatures


on it) then it would be no skin off my nose, you know. The writing was real but not too heavy, the musicianship

Also, for you total A is A fanatics out there, make sure you check out the cool website listed earlier. Solid graphic design AND concept, a rarity among many music-oriented sites.






