

Sunday, six major power generator units were shut down due to equipment failure. There's talk of rotating half - hour power outages throughout the province for the peak month of December. I'm sure we're all aware that half an hour without electricity makes for a really crappy Christmas party (all body warmth aside).

Although none of the power companies will admit it, rumour has it that several of them are shopping around for some big boy generators in case their own can't meet the demand.

A healthy Alberta economy has pushed our power hunger up about five percent already from last year. An El - Nino free winter with normal minus twenty - thirty temperatures will increase it another four to five percent. That combined with a seasonal increase for the month of December puts us well over the amount of electricity we can actually pump out even with reserve assistance from B.C. and Saskatchewan.

Although none of the power companies will admit it, rumour has it that several of them are shopping around for some big boy generators in case their own can't meet the demand. It won't be like the ice storms that crippled Quebec last year, but it might make for a few more candle lit dinners than usual. Alberta Mom Involved in Gruesome Murder in Utah

ast Wednesday, a mother from Alberta killed her three year old girl, Rebecca Bluff, by beating her to death. She is now charged with murder.

Based on investigators' statements, Ferosa Bluff, formerly from Mountain View, Alberta, murdered her daughter by tying her up and beating her to death. She will be charged with aggravated murder, said Captain Larry Marx. Also to

be charged with murder are Andrew Fedorowicz and his wife, Suzanne Fedorowicz. They lived in the same apartment complex as Bluff and were also from the same part of Alberta. From Marx's statement, it was said that they had left Alberta around eight years ago. All three were arrested and booked into Salt Lake County Jail last Thursday for investigation of child abuse/homicide.

Further medical evidence has convinced authorities that aggravated murder was the cause of death. The murder charges for all three may possibly be the death penalty. An autopsy found evidence that the victim was facing down, legs separated and naked when she was beaten. Deputies found a whip, ropes, a leather strap, child pornography, and a nylon cord in the apartment.

The injuries were applied to the girl's back, legs, buttocks, geni-

tals, neck and face. Also uncovered at the search were pictures of sexual acts involving bondage, six videotapes that involved sexual orientated acts along with other magazines that contained pornographic material.

Investigators interviewed did not believe that there was evidence that child pornography or sexual abuse played a role in the toddler's death.

In the beginning, police were told that the three year old girl had fallen down a flight of 14 stairs the week before this happened and was placed in a tub of cold water the following afternoon because she didn't look right. Paramedics found the child near death. Rebecca died about an hour later. A doctor at the hospital said that she died from trauma caused by a blunt object. Rebecca also has a two year old sister, Sarah. She has been placed in protective custody.





Transgender

What does it mean?

ransgender is a term that is used when a person feels discomfort with their birth sex. It can be manifested in many different forms. Some common examples are crossdressing and cross-identification. Cross-dressing is wearing the clothes, often the undergarments, of the other sex. Cross-identification is when a person identifies with the other sex.

A very important distinction must be made. Sexual orientation is separate and distinct from transgenderism.

Together, transgender plus orientation create a very diverse group.

There are two main groups within the transgender community. Transvestites are typically heterosexual males who cross-dress and feel comfortable with being male. Transsexuals are typically males who feel that they should have been born women. These two groups have a lot of diversity within them and often the definitions, and feelings, cannot be clearly placed in one, or the other, group.

Transgender feelings often start at a very early age. Many can report specific situations when these feelings became apparent. According to the DSM-IV, many people experience these feelings as early as 2 years and rarely past age 12. Many children will experiment with gender in similar ways, but are not transgendered unless they experience these feelings for prolonged periods.

Current estimates of the frequency of transgender feelings are that about 1 in 30,000 individuals are seeking surgery. Numbers for the frequency of transvestisim is even harder to determine, but figures in the range of 1/10,000 has been mentioned.

How do I Address a Transgendered Individual?

One common question relates to how we should refer to that person. Politeness and respect dictate that we all should address these people as they appear at that time. For example, a transvestite who is currently presenting as female should be addressed as ma'am. When that same individual is presenting as male, sir is appropriate. Often, in this situation, the transvestite will have two distinct names, one male and one female.

Transsexuals simplify matters somewhat. A MtoF (male to female) should always be addressed in a feminine form. Even when pre-

In given that is used when a clear and a non-issue, if we consider the inner identification to be the accurate one. Similarly, a FtoM should be addressed as male, whatever his appearance. You may find it easier to think "transsexeual woman" instead of "Male to Female transsexual"

'Outing'

Anyone who has a secret that they feel is shaming goes through a period where they want or need to share it. The process is referred to as 'outing.' Understandably, it is a very traumatic experience; the fear of reprisals is very great. Think of what you experienced when you took dad's car without permission before you got caught. Now multiply that fear a thousand fold.

So maybe you suspect that an individual is transgendered. Keep in mind these fears if you try to talk

with them about their feelings. Be prepared to hear anything. And if you are the transgendered individual and starting to reach out, go slowly enough to give others time to assimilate what you are saying.

Above all, we must all remember that we are human beings. Do not make assumptions. If you have known a person for years before they reveal he/she secret, he/she are still the same person. Even closer now that they have shared their secret.

Cause and effect

While doctors are not yet sure of what 'causes' transgenderism, many believe that there is no cause. Often, it is compared to things like hair color, height and build. A direct correlation between transgenderism and any event has not been found. Therefore these feelings are not pathological. There is

no pill that can cure these feelings.

Also, there is rarely a physical symptom. One can not go to their family physician and point to a location and say "it hurts." Because of the lack of physicality, it is very difficult for the medical profession to recognize the attributes of transgenderism.

Human beings are a very diverse group. Transgenderism is not to be feared. It is not contagious. It is not a perversion. Both parties need to maintain an open mind, respect the other and be compassionate.

And if you are transgendered, you are not alone. You can resolve these feelings.




Men's Volleyball still has some question marks




Lady Ooks start slow but finish strong

Nait Student Invents Board Game

fter many years of play ing board games together, Kelly Exner's family came home one day to find him surrounded by cardboard in the spring of 1996. "We were getting bored by the games that were available. They all seemed so similar. We always joked that we should invent one ourselves. One day, I got inspired and started working on a prototype," says Kelly Exner, President of Exner Enterprises and inventor of Twin Cities.

Kelly came up with the initial idea by amalgamating elements of other games with his imagination. Once the cardboard prototype was done, he realized that the board could be cut up into pieces. This discovery turned out to be the unique feature of Twin Cities the game that's never the same twice. "There is a better chance of winning the Lotto 6/49 than getting the exact same board layout," he says. Another prototype was then made out of fiberboard, with the whole family pitching in to perfect the design. The game board is made up of durable, plastic, interlocking pieces that allow the board to be changed while still being a cohesive unit.

With a rough outline of rules and strategies, the Exner family


played the game many times to see where improvements could be made. Test groups were then used to fine tune the rules and create a one-of-a-kind game that all ages would enjoy.

The entire process of getting the final product took two years. From the game's inception, the Exner family went from beginners to experts on manufacturing and patents—at times, guided only by the belief that their game was something unique and had the potential to be the next big thing.

In the last few months, this belief has been supported many times over — people love this game. Children and adults alike are addicted to it. Everyone who has played Twin Cities raves about the combination of luck and strategy, and the fact that the game board is new each time they play it and how much rivalry and laughter occurs while playing. Many have already bought Twin Cities for Christmas gifts.

People are always looking for something new and unique to play. Something where friends and family of all ages can get together and have a great time. Twin Cities is that perfect something.







The museum honours members of the Royal Canadian Air Force and the Royal Air Force who engaged in bombing missions to World War II. My husband wanted to look at one of the few remaining Lancaster bombers in the world, and I wanted to stretch my legs.

As we walked about, looking at exhibits, I couldn't help but become extremely saddened by the images I saw. We walked over to the bomber on display, and marveled at it's size: it seemed so small to hold the requisite crew and bombs needed to complete a mission. 




