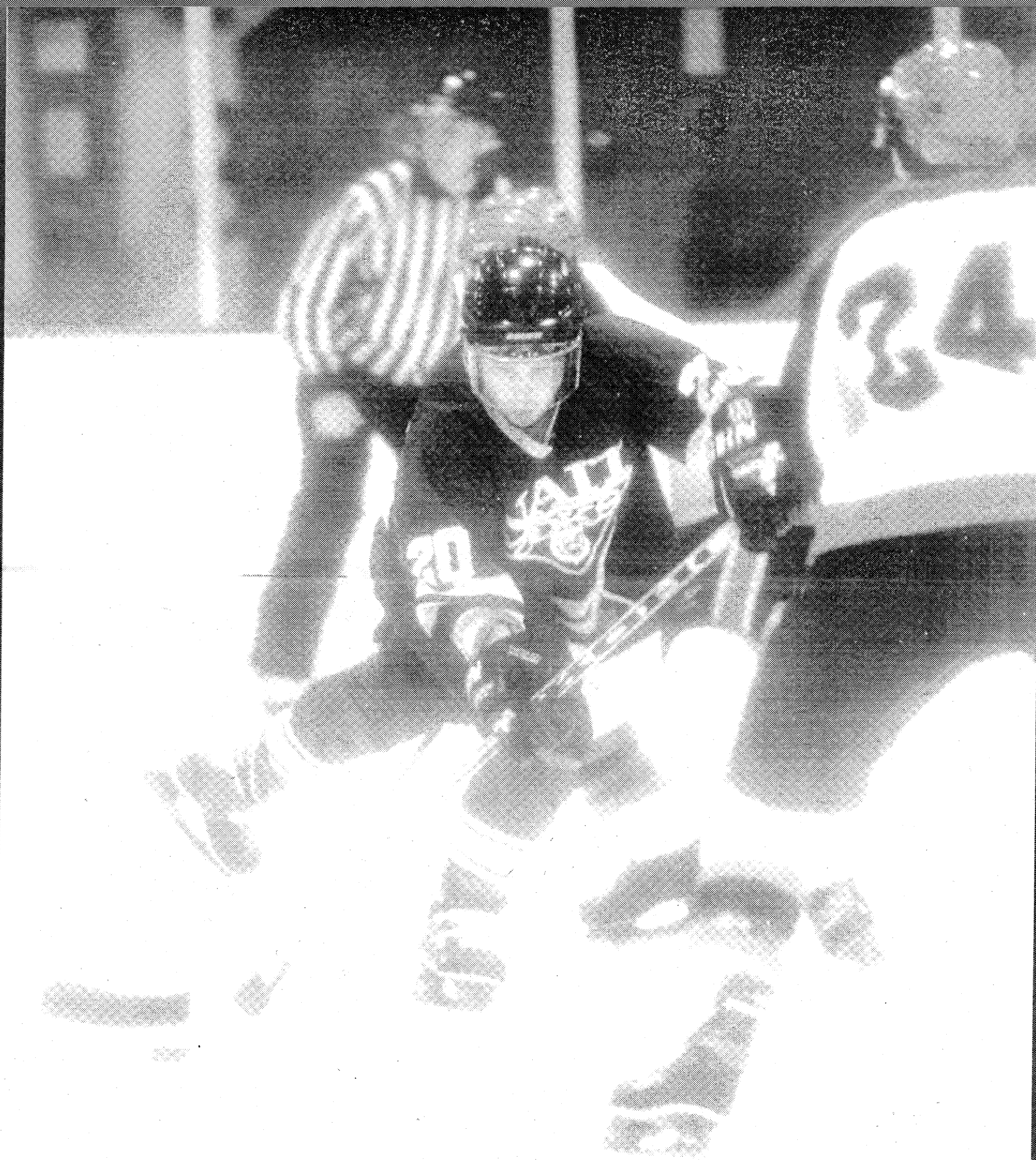
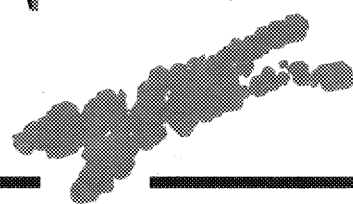

How do you participate? Just show up at one of the scheduled debate meetings and begin.

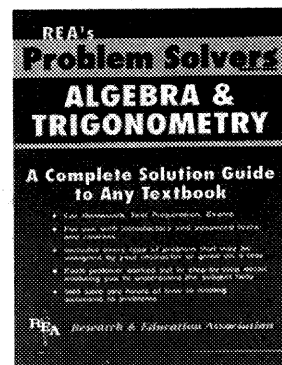
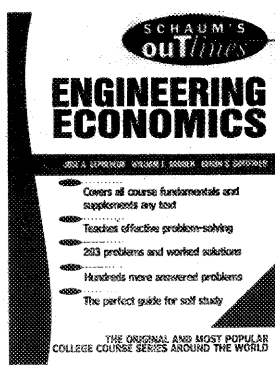

News in a Nutshell

• The Queen Mum and her knickers

A New Zealand university recently sent Queen Elizabeth II a pair of knickers. The knickers, with semi-hard shells inserted into them to protect the wearer's hips, were returned to the university with a note stating that the gift was too personal in its nature, but that it was kind that the university thought of her. The 98-year-old Queen has had both of her hip joints replaced, the first in 1995 in a routine operation, and the second in emergency surgery after she fell while inspecting race horses.

• Hugh, Bill, and Sex

Actor Hugh Grant and President Bill Clinton now have something in common, they both think their sex lives should be private. In a recent interview with GQ Magazine, Grant scolded the media's coverage of his getting caught with a prostitute last year, as well as their coverage so far of the Bill Clinton sex scandal. Grant stated, "On the private level, I think there was a justification for a scolding, but on the public level, I don't think there was any at all. I think it's gross hypocrisy and I spit in the face of the media that made such a thing of it."

• Homer the voyeur

In an upcoming Simpsons episode, look for actress Kim Basinger and her actor-husband Alec Baldwin to make a guest appearance. Homer will drop in on the famous couple after he crashes through their skylight in a parasailing mishap.

• Young Offenders (Joke?) Act

The Federal Government is finally thinking of reforming the YOA. However, the changes they're thinking of imposing are nothing less than a joke. Among the changes Ottawa would like to implement are: 1) mandatory release of young offenders after half of their sentence is served; 2) reducing the maximum length of probation to one year; and 3) a pre-charge screening that would require police to seek permission of a Crown attorney before charging a young offender. Statistics Canada figures show a 61% increase in youth crime over the past five years and a 9% increase in homicide from 1996 to 1997. Youth drug-related crimes are up a startling 109%. "I see no positive movement," Ontario Attorney General Charles Harnick says, "Every step that they said they were taking forward, in the background they're going the other way. It just astounds me."

• Saskatchewan Youth Program gets a facelift

The Community Homes Review Team released a report last Friday suggesting how the government can make Saskatch-

ewan's youth community placement program safer. The report comes out two weeks after a 58-year-old woman was stabbed to death in her North Battleford home by two 15-year-old girls. Some of the recommendations made are: 1) making permanent, an interim policy that bars the placement of youth with a history of violence; 2) introducing better training for home operators before their first placement; and 3) establishing a protocol to ensure that the police, social service staff, and home operators know how to deal with emergencies. While the general consensus is content that the government has started to implement some of these recommendations, Liberal Jack Hillson (who represents North Battleford in the Saskatchewan legislature) isn't. "I'm satisfied there will be some improvement," he said, "but in my view we simply shouldn't be using private homes with only one person present as a facility for teenagers who should serve sentences for serious crimes."

• **Canadian Embassy mobbed**
In Budapest, Hungary, 34 refugees forced their way into the Canadian Embassy demanding asylum. The refugees have been identified as ethnic Albanians from Yugoslavia's war-torn Kosovo province where literally thousands of people have fled to escape what has now been an ongoing 19 month campaign by Serbian security forces to crush an independence movement. Embassy police have been placed on standby to clear the grounds if anymore refugees try to force their way in. Only if the negotiations falls, will the Canadian Embassy house the refugees and grant them their asylum.

• Murder shocker in New Brunswick

Noah Augustine, a controversial native leader in New Brunswick who is best known for his work against drug, alcohol, and sexual abuse, was arrested last Friday in Jacksonville, Florida for the murder of a Red Bank, New Brunswick man. Augustine, as well as accomplice Thomas Haddad (who is a first nation police officer), fled the country after they were named as potential shooting suspects in the murder, but turned themselves into a Jacksonville Highway Patrol office only days later. The arrests of Augustine and Haddad come as a shock to the Eel Ground First Nation reserve, where both men are from. Tim Paul, president of Thunder East Corp., stated that he just spoke to Augustine the week before, and that he "seemed like Noah", not a cold-blooded murder.

A REAL Leader Comes to Canada

Once in a while, a person will come along who doesn't command respect - they just deserve it. One of those people paid a visit to Canada last week. Nelson Mandela arrived in Ottawa on Wednesday, September 23rd to pick up another little trophy that none of us will ever see - let alone hold.

He received the Order of Canada medal from PM. Jean Chretien as part of his farewell tour to North America. After that he rushed off to Skydome in Toronto where 35,000 students and parents saw him set up a children's fund for a bunch of kids he's never met, and will probably never see again. After that he strolled over to Washington D.C. and picked up his Congressional Gold Medal (the USA's highest political honour) the way you and I pick up our dry cleaning. In case you've been in a coma for the last ten years or you're just

a little dense when it comes to current events, here's a brief history of a leader who has had a harder life than you and I can imagine.

Mandela grew up dirt poor in a backwards town in South Africa. His father died when he was still a teen so he fell under the care of white missionaries. He left college early although he did well in law and was active in student anti-government protests.

Despite living in the most racist country in the modern world, a country who's political policies made Alabama in the 60's look like a day at the beach for blacks, he became a relatively successful lawyer. He was charged with treason in 1956 because he was a member of the African National Congress, a non-violent political group. When those charges didn't stick, the government charged him with sabotage and packed him and most of his friends off to prison on an island the size of my back yard.

That was 1962.

He was released February 2nd, 1990. Twenty eight years of his life were gone and he never committed a crime. His vision was permanently damaged from the reflection of the sun everywhere he went. He was sixty three when he was appointed leader of the ANC a year later. He recieved the Nobel Peace Prize for his work in ending the racist policies of his government in 1993 and was elected President of South Africa the next year.

Apparently, good things do come to those who wait. I'd say almost three decades is enough. He is eighty years old now and a hero to discriminated people everywhere. There was no Ivy League college or campaign contributions from corporate sponsors. And there sure as hell was no sex scandal. Sounds like Billy Clinton and good old Jean could take a few pointers from this guy.

DATE RAPE

Are you really that aware?

When you're out on the town with a group of friends or just at a house party, there is always a chance on being sexually assaulted. With the drug Rohypnol, this risk is easier to come by. This drug is prescribed for people with extreme insomnia, so think of what can occur when slipped into your drink. However, in October 1997, blue dye was added to the tablets, making them easier to identify. This will add some color to your drink making it easier to notice a change in content. This is an issue that can not go unnoticed, as 1871 rapes occur each day. So with this in mind, everyone will have to watch their back.

1.3 women were raped per minute in 1990. 683,000 rapes occurred in 1990. So just think of how the numbers have increased since then! 29% of all rapes are done by acquaintances while, boyfriends make up another 10%, strangers come in at 22%, other relatives are the rapists 16% of the time, rapes by a father/stepfather occur about 11% of the time, husbands carry out 9% of total rape occurrences, and the other 3% weren't classified. Three out of five rapes are carried out to females before age 18. Three out of ten happen before they're 11 years of age. There are rapes that happen when you don't even know it. Do any of you watch 90210? Remember what happened to Valerie? Well, someone slipped Rohypnol in her drink and it occurred from someone she knew for a long time, or so she thought. Well, Rohypnol is a drug which makes you not remember what happened — so make sure you follow these rules!

1. Do not leave beverages unattended.
2. Do not take beverages from someone you don't trust.
3. At a bar, only take drinks from

the bartender or server.

4. At parties, do not accept open containers.

5. Be alert to the behavior of friends, ask them to watch your back for you.

There are several signs that you may be under the influence of Rohypnol. These include impaired judgment, dizziness and confusion, and loss of inhibition. If an individual appears extremely drunk after a non-alcoholic beer, they may have ingested one of these pills. Someone who has been sedated may experience sudden drowsiness that is unexplained. Brief periods of memory loss have also resulted from these pills.

Here are some extra points to look at:

1. If you feel dizzy or confused after a drink, make sure to get to a safe place or call 911. If you think you have been drugged go straight to the ER.
2. If you feel you have been assaulted make sure you do not shower or bath if you want to report it. They'll need the evidence.
3. Every hour matters! The sooner you go, the easier it is to detect evidence.
4. Try to keep a sample of beverage for analysis.

Some extra tips:

1. Limit alcohol consumption.
2. Be cautious about consuming different types of alcohol.
3. Eat food before consuming alcohol. A full stomach may throw off effects.
4. Make arrangements with friends to leave together.
5. It is not your fault if you get raped! Remember that!

8. The Parent Trap

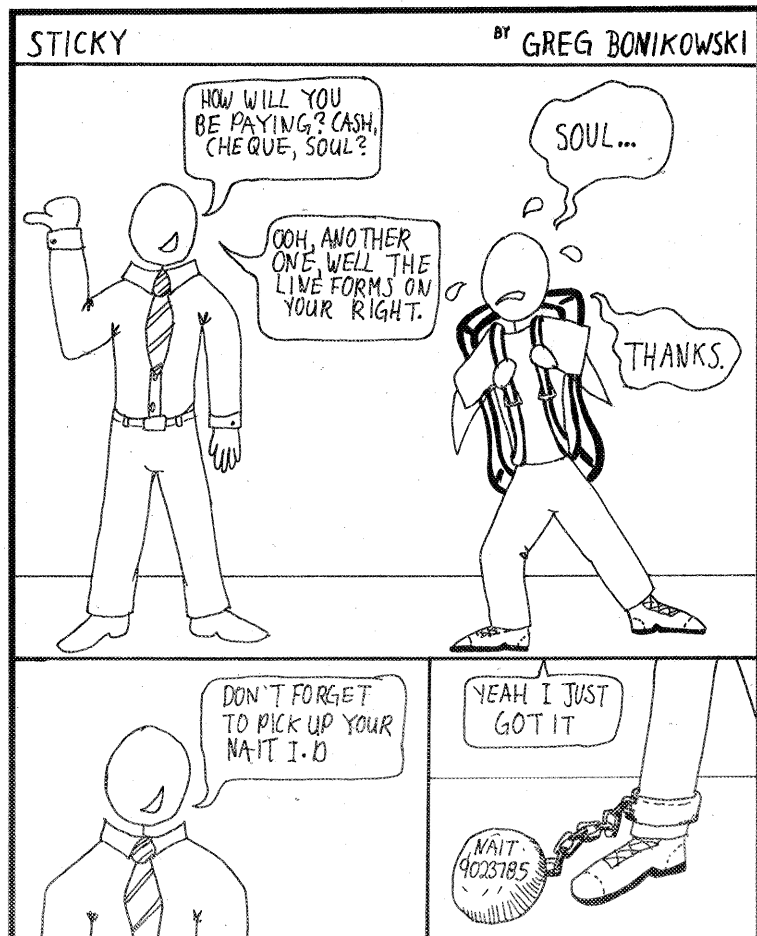
An up close and personal Disney view on the miracles of child-birthing in "My Parent's Trap".

(Im)maturity exposed

After writing a powerful article entitled "Are you too (im)mature for NAIT?", I decided to sit down with the author herself and find out if she, herself, is too (im)mature for NAIT.

Q: Jenny, last week you wrote an article entitled "Are you too (im)mature for NAIT?" What prompted you to write this article?

A: Well, even though we've only been back in school for a little over three weeks, already I've experienced "high school flashbacks" whereas people are not able to act their age and are, I feel, constantly disrupting the class with lack of forethought to anyone else. That wasn't the only reason why I wrote the article, but it was definitely a key factor in pushing me to do it.

Q: In the article, you cite what seems to be very realistic examples in what I gathered, are incidents you've drawn upon from your time here at NAIT and the program you're in. What prompted you to use the examples you did, as opposed to "typical" ones?

A: Well, to me, these are very typical. Some of the examples I cited are things that occurred last year in school, as well as this year already. I used these examples based on people I am with in my program because, to me, they are what hit home with me and made my article all that more powerful because they were such personal examples as opposed to generic ones. What I cited though, does happen in other programs. I just wanted to write on something I either saw or experienced first-hand, instead of pulling it out of my head and saying, "well, this probably does happen, so I'll just throw that in."

Q: Surely some people must have gotten offended by reading some of these examples and thought, "Hey, she's talking about me, or Jill, or that other girl." Did you receive any reaction at all from your peers?

A: Actually, yes. A girl in my program tried to stir up a big scene between us in front of the entire class. She was extremely upset by what I wrote, but I don't think she was prepared for me to say that I stand behind my article 100%. The way I look at it, the truth must have hurt an awful lot for her. I'm still smiling after what I wrote because I feel like a big weight has been lifted off of me because finally I'm

not shutting up and putting up with their antics anymore. The people that perhaps were most "affected" by my article and took every word to heart where they felt the need to bite my head off—I'm glad they did bite my head off. It tells me that I reached the people I was aiming to reach, negative reaction or not from them, and made them think. Maybe they're not thinking along the lines they should after reading the article, but it's a start.

Q: You just said, "maybe they're not thinking along the lines they should..." what do you mean by that?

A: What I mean, is, I used examples that were very personal and tailored to people in my program, but I never used those examples to inflict intentional hurt on them. I used the examples to make the article that much more personal coming from my point of view, and thus also give the readers my point of view to understand and relate to. I used instances that ate away at me that I think would eat away at anyone. In fact, I consulted with about 7 or 8 people in my class before I wrote the article to make sure I was writing or saying the right things. Without their input and outside opinions, I probably never would have felt confident enough to even release the article to be printed. The message I wanted everyone to get by reading my article was, "Don't Tread On Me", as in a collective "me", as in all of us who are working our butts off and trying to get a decent education. Don't stop "me" from getting my money's worth because you're not mature enough to both to get your money's worth. Don't deny "me" what you're denying yourselves.

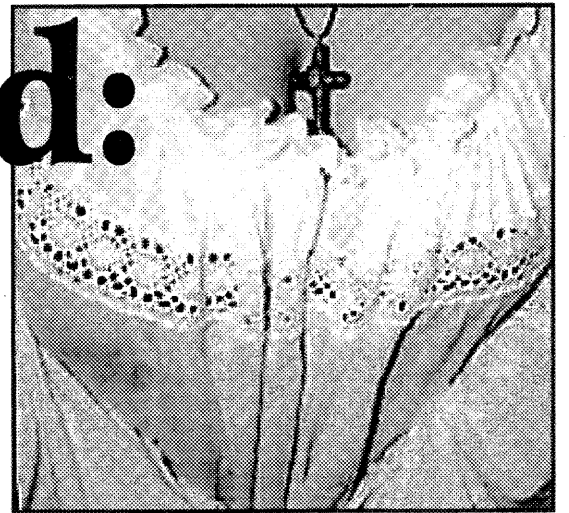
Q: In your article, you also made the comment that you feel you are above some people in your class. Aren't you worried about people looking at it as nothing but an ego complex on your part?

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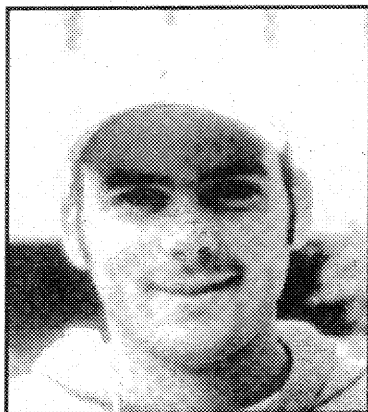

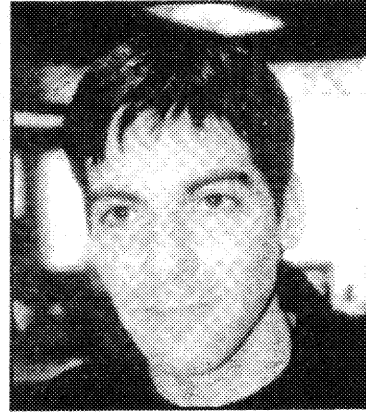

GET MOTIVATED

It is not uncommon for students to start the year full of energy, enthusiasm, and great intentions. However, a month or so into their program, many students start to feel less than motivated. Here are some tips that might help get you back on track:

- **Set realistic goals** that are challenging yet achievable. Try setting goals for each day and each week as well as longer-term goals. Written goals are the most effective.
- **Make a daily "to-do list"** — a checklist of what you can realistically accomplish. Prioritize the items from most to least crucial and always work on your most important tasks first, even if they are the most difficult or the longest.
- **Specify a clear-cut goal you want to achieve before you sit down to do homework or to study** (i.e. "by the end of this house I want to accomplish..."). This put you in a competitive mode and stimulates you to stay motivated and focused.
- **Get into a routine.** If you start setting aside the same time every afternoon or evening for studying, it will become a habit within a few weeks.
- **Know your body rhythms.** If you are a morning person, do your most important tasks in the morning— don't force yourself to do them at 11 p.m.
- **Evaluate how long you can realistically concentrate** (about 50 minutes for most people) and make sure you take breaks when you need them.

- **Get started on tasks early**, the day you receive your assignment if possible. Tasks that are put on hold cause guilt and de-energize you; getting started right away arouses your interest and gets your creative juices flowing.
- **Work on building a positive attitude.** Self-statements like, "I'm too lazy", "I'm a procrastinator", or "I can't do this" can become self-fulfilling prophecies. So can statements such as, "I am self-motivated" and "I love to learn."
- **Visualize yourself being successful.** A clear picture of what success means can keep you going when your workload seems overwhelming.
- **Don't waste energy being negative and blaming yourself or others for how much work you have, or for past failures.** Negative energy makes it difficult to learn and to be creative. Put your energy towards accomplishing your goals instead.
- **Concentrate on your successes and build on them.** Evaluate areas when you could have done better, learn from them, and change them into future successes.
- **Surround yourself with positive, motivated people.**
- **Set realistic standards.** Being a perfectionist can de-motivate even the brightest of students. Decide how much time and effort each assignment is worth and allocate accordingly.
- **If you can feeling overwhelmed by a project or assignment, break it into smaller parts and focus on one part at a time.**
- **Set rewards for accomplishing difficult tasks or getting**

through a study period when you aren't motivated. For some people it is also helpful to set penalties for failing to follow through with your tasks.

- **Give yourself pep talks**— remind yourself why you have chosen to continue your education and the long and short-term benefits this will have.
- **And finally, take care of yourself by getting through enough**

sleep, eating properly, exercising, and having some fun. **Motivated, energetic people have balance in their lives.**

What Would Baden-Powell Say?

Putting pressure on the Scouts to accept females

In 1899, at the age of 43, Robert Stephenson Baden-Powell became famous and the hero of boys in the British Commonwealth for his work in the military. During the Mafeking episode in his career, he used boys for responsible jobs in the siege and realized their positive response to challenge. In 1903 he returned to England only to learn that a book titled "Aids to Scouting", which he had written a few years before, was being used by teachers and youth leaders all over the country. Boys' Brigade gatherings began to develop, and a whole generation of young boys began to form clubs and groups following his word. This was the humble beginnings of the Boy Scouts.

Since then, there have been numerous wars and societal

changes that B-P may not have envisioned. He died at the age of 83 in January of 1941, leaving behind a great legacy, that has undergone numerous changes since. One can now work towards their "Computer Literacy" badge. Now, there's little girls who are in Beaver's and Cubs. As of 1992, any group could accept girls into Beavers or Cubs if they chose. That was over five years ago. Since that time, a small group of clubs has allowed female membership, with the males still making up 90% of the 240,000 members in Scouting Canada.

This November, there will be a national vote within Sir Baden-Powell's institution that will decide whether or not to eliminate the optional female membership. The Girl Guides, which have 180,000 members and no boys, have made suggestions that the Scouts did it

just to boost recruitment. Prior to the 1992 ruling, the numbers of new members in Scouts was dwindling. With the addition of girls to some troops, numbers have doubled or even tripled. Elaine Paterson, chief commissioner of the Girl Guides, says that her organization offers the same experience as Scouts, except "the opportunity to work with boys."

Come November, we will know what the current leaders of Scouts feel about female membership. What would Baden-Powell have done? His wife, Olave, was known world-wide as World Chief Guide until her death in 1977. He obviously felt that young women needed a positive youth group to belong to as well. He was the father of two daughters and one son, so if there was a vote around the supper table, one could be sure that the girls would be allowed to join.

Unfortunately, B-P himself may have been a little vague in his pre-planned, after-death statement released in 1941, for in that letter he talks to the boys about preparing themselves for manhood. He goes on to say, "But the real way to get happiness is by giving out happiness to other people," so perhaps he hoped that the boys would get along and bring some happiness to the girls, or whomever.

I'm sure he's up there in Scout Heaven, smiling down on Scouts Canada, looking forward to the sure-to-be-eventful weekend camping trips. November will be a big month for the Canadian Scouts, maybe setting an example for the scout groups around the world. That's the way it should be—Canada setting the example for the world. Until next week, don't forget to floss.
