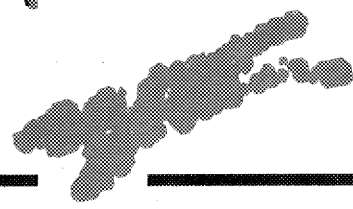

A Hallowe'en History

It's the most widely participated holiday in North America. It's bigger than the 4th of July, Christmas, and Easter Sunday. No government in the world recognizes it. More homicides occur on this day than any other holiday—and we love it! It's Hallowe'en. The one night of the year where all

of us so-called normal people have a completely legitimate excuse for acting like a total putz while pretending to be someone we're not. Where did this butt kickin' little festival come from? Here's what we came up with:

Hallowe'en is a centuries old tradition that began with the Celts in what is now Britain and Scotland. It marked the Celtic New Year and ushered in the season of darkness. 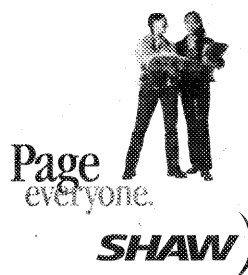

Finally, a break through!! In Part Two, I decided to call the Head Office of the restaurant I was working for to find out what the uniform policy was and if bodypiercing fit into it at all. Well, according to the head office, there is NO SET POLICY on bodypiercings afterall. There isn't even one for tattoos. Infact, the only thing the policy says about piercings is that if the females wear earrings, they have to less than an inch in length — well, my eyebrow ring isn't even a centimeter in length. As for the guys, they were S.O.L. They weren't allowed to wear earrings on their shift at all. But that was it! That is the current policy my work has. Since I now knew that, I had decided that when my time off came along in July for me to fly back east and visit my family, I would re-pierce my eyebrow.

August 1 I was back at work and back to working at the same restaurant as my boss again. On August 10, he approached me on my shift while I was training two new employees and began to yell at me about my eyebrow ring being back in. He accused me of putting it back in when I worked at the other restaurant back in June (which I didn't), and he said by me coming on my shift with it that I was ridiculing his authority and making a mockery of my job. I then pointed out to him that it never was in the restaurant policy, and that I had even gone as far as calling the head office downtown before even considering putting it back in. I also pointed out to him that we had a cook in the back who had tattoos up and down his arms, and it didn't seem to matter. However, he called me a liar on that, too, yet he's the one that hired the guy. A month later, I ended up quitting my job. So what happened with my boss, you ask? Well, we ended up talking on the phone two days after his blow up on the floor. I had called head office downtown inbetween that, too, and talked to the area supervisor about the situation.

I had the thumbs-up to keep my ring in and keep my job, simply because I was hired with it. 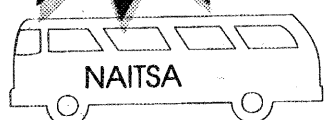

A relaxed NAIT team almost then slid into a comfort zone which almost cut Concordia a little too much slack. A well struck free kick was miraculously touched onto the post by goalie *Rob Tomlinson*, and his shut out was maintained. The save came as a wake up call to NAIT, and it was answered by substitute *Thomas Krepela*, whose fine work in the opposition penalty area forced confused defenders to concede yet another penalty. Scoring his second and NAIT's 5th goal, *Reuf Fazlic* coolly slotted the ball home. Striker *Marc Hall*, coming on for *John Currie*, made his mark on the game when he combined with *Reuf Fazlic* to blast home an unstoppable 6th goal. With 5 minutes remaining in the game, *Reuf Fazlic* then completed his hat trick to make the final score 7-0 for NAIT.

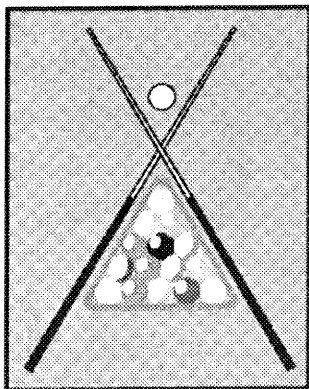

Kitty Litter Cake



(Kat)rina Benson

Ingredients:

- 1 box of German Chocolate cake mix or Spice cake mix
- 1 box of White cake mix
- 1 pkg of white sandwich cookies (any brand)
- 1 large pkg of Instant Vanilla Pudding mix
- 1 bottle of green food coloring
- 13 small Tootsie Rolls
- 1 new kitty litter box
- 1 new kitty litter box liner
- 1 new kitty pooper scooper

* You'll want to buy the last three items new if you don't want any sort of "aftertaste".

1. Prepare cake mixes per their package directions. Bake them in any size of pan you like. You'll be breaking the cakes up into little pieces later, so it really doesn't matter.
2. Prepare the pudding and put it in the fridge to chill. You may or may not use all of the pudding, but all the more leftovers for you to eat, right?
3. Put small batches of the sandwich cookies into the blender and set it on "pulse", scraping the sides of the blender often. Then remove the cookie crumbs from the blender and divide it into three cups.
4. To 1 cup of the cookie crumbs, add a few drops of green

food coloring. (it's supposed to look like the chlorophyll in the kitty litter). Then mix up the cookie crumbs with the food coloring. (I find sticking the cup of crumbs into a jar and then shaking it to mix it up with the food coloring works best) Now set this aside.

5. When the cakes have reached room temperature, crumble them up into a very large bowl. Now mix this with a cup of cookie crumbs that you didn't decimate

with the food coloring, along with some of the pudding you made already. Add enough pudding to make this mixture feel moist, not soggy.

6. Place the kitty litter box liner into the kitty litter box and pour in the mixture you just made.

7. Unwrap three Tootsie Rolls and heat them in the microwave until they're soft and bendable. Then shape the blunt ends of the Tootsie rolls into slightly curved points. (Use your imagination) Repeat this with three more Tootsie Rolls, and then bury all of them decoratively into the cake mixture, making sure some of them are sticking out of the mixture at random intervals.

8. Sprinkle some of the third cup of white cookie crumbs over the mixture, and then scatter the green

crumbs lightly on top. (Save some of the green crumbs though. You'll need them at the very end.)

9. Heat six more of the Tootsie Rolls as you did in step #7 (cooking three at a time), but instead of softening these ones to the point where they're bendable, you're instead going to cook these to the point where they're almost completely melted. Once you do this, scrape them on top of the cake and sprinkle the rest of cup three's cookie crumbs over them.

10. Now, for the perfect touch, take the last remaining Tootsie Roll, put it in the microwave and follow the cooking instructions in step #7. After you've molded this last Tootsie Roll, then roll it in a mixture of white and green cookie crumbs and hang it over the side of the pan.

You're now done making Kitty Litter Box Cake! Just place the litter box on a couple of sheets of newspaper and serve it with the kitty litter pooper scooper for affect.

This is EXACTLY the kind of hip-hop that I like to listen to - easy on the ears, slow beat, intelligently written and fluidly sung. I originally wanted to compare *Masquerades & Silhouettes* to Verdi's *Aida* because it's so visual and dramatic. Powerful. Outstanding. Original. Brilliant.

There. Now that I've gotten the blurb quotes out of the way, let's talk about Parker and his music. All I know about him is what I got from his brief biographical information on the website listed above. He does nothing but talk about the mythical, mystical, magical, mega-

influence that Star Wars has on his life. A quote: "I love science fiction. I love that mystical ill-shit. Star Wars is the old school for me... when I'm talking about being a Jedi, I'm really talking about being a B-Boy."

Yikes! That might explain why the cover art is reminiscent of a desert planet and a young man looking into the sunset, daydreaming about one day setting out to fulfill his prophecy and restore goodness and order to the universe...
