The Figures are Released:

The Budget Explained at the Annual General Meeting

This past year's statement of NAITSA's financial position looks pretty good at first glance. There is an increase of around \$200,000 in last year's assets over the previous year's, as of June 30th, 1998. Sorry if this is dry reading, but it gets exciting near the end. There is a total of \$1,215,046 available this year, plus around \$407,637 in capital assets. The cash and short-term investments increased due to the SA fees charged to the Apprenticeship students, and the money saved by not being members of ACTISEC this year. The capital assets increased because of a \$275,000 lounge expansion, but there was an increase in the amount of funds that NAITSA owed NAIT for the addition to the weight room.

Last year there was an increase in income in Student fees because of higher student enrollment here. In addition to this extra money in the general fund, there was also an increase in sales by the lounge and by the numerous games spread throughout campuses. This extra money went toward the increase in Executive Salaries as well as the lounge employee wages paid when the Nest was closed. The volume of sales in the Nest increased as well, caus-

ing an increase in product costs in proportion to the sales. Student Activities costs and Games Room Staff costs increased the cost of sales as well.

Those darn athletes have nothing but increases in their budget. The gate receipts are up because of the increase in attendance. The salaries increased because of the new position of Athletics Promotional Manager being filled, and the Equipment Repairs increased because of the pool renovations. The athletics department made more money, and reinvested it to improve the quality of our top notch programs.

The news was all good, although there were a few surprises. The Nest failed to turn a profit the past two years, actually losing \$150,000 over a two year period. Considering the lack of rent paid, a lounge with that location and such little overhead should be turning a profit. The problems are being fixed, though, and already in the first two weeks after the changeover, September 17th-October 1st, the Nest has returned over \$9,200 in profits. This will help pay for the implementation of the new systems there, totaling \$57,600, if this rate of return keeps up as an-

• Free as a crypto

The Canadian government has officially released a cryptography policy that will further encourage the proliferation of data-scrambling technologies. While domestically, the new policy is looked upon with praise in the sense that Canadians can pretty much do whatever they want with cryptography, the US government is pissed. Up until this policy was released, the Canadian government had been under pressure from American intelligence and law enforcement committees to make it mandatory that Canadians submit a key recovery for access to all scrambled communications — something the US government is currently in the middle of debating enforcing, or not enforcing themselves. People earning minimum wage just got a pay raise. Alberta's minimum wage recently went up from \$5/hour to \$5.40/hour. The news just gets better from there as well: This is just the first of three schedule wage increases to hit Alberta. Within the next year, the minimum wage will be sitting at a com-

Mediation talks are back on again in the social worker contract dispute. • Swearing on the Internet

The soon-to-be newly elected Edmonton City Council will have their swearing-in broadcasted live on the Internet. "This is a great opportunity for schools to follow the ceremony, especially those who are studying Municipal government," says David Edey, Returning Officer for Election '98. Telus will be providing the site hook up, allowing 250 systems to link in to the Swearing-In Ceremony. The broadcast will also be taped for anyone who wants to view it on the Internet afterward. The Swearing-In Ceremony will be taking place on Tuesday, October 27 from 1:30 - 2 p.m. at City Hall. • Olds man killed by old farmer

An executive with a small Calgary-based Oil company was shot and killed in Olds on Saturday. The victim, who is both a husband and a father of four, was on the property of an Olds man performing some kind of regular maintenance when the owner of the property produced a firearm and shot him. With the victim at the time of the shooting were six other co-workers, but no one else was harmed. Police have no record of any past animosity between the victim and the shooter, and are holding a 54-year-old farmer in custody for the murder. The name of the murderer has not yet been released, but it was his wife that made the 911 call to the police. It is speculated that first-degree murder charges will be laid.

• The girl you wanna score on

The Smith Falls Bears in Ontario finally met a girl they don't want anyone to score on. Who is she? She's 16-year-old Rachel Barrie, and the first-ever female to play during the regular season in the Canadian Junior Hockey League. Although her debut to the world wasn't a smooth one — giving up a goal that she should have stopped, the female goaltender soon proved that she's quite capable of holding her own pucks in a league dominated by men. In her debut game against the Cumberland Grads, she made a total of 37 saves — with 3 of those saves being in

the dying minutes of the game to preserve a 9-8 win for her team. "I should've played better, it happens sometimes," Barrie said of her performance. Well, if this is one girl that is capable of playing better, then the rest of the CJHL will have their hands full trying to score on her this season.

In what almost became another mishap involving ears in the sports industry, a Canadian golfer was rewarded this past week for having a close encounter with a meteorite that nearly took his off. Orville Delong, a 57-year-old maintenance worker from Cambridge, Ontario, was given a free season's golf pass worth over \$600 at the golf course where his close encounter happened. It was later estimated that the meteorite was moving at about 124 miles/hour when it hit the ground. While Delong is sure to enjoy his golf pass, he may be in for more rewards yet. It turns out in 1977 he was struck by lightning on the exact same golf course! And for that, he got a free haircut — what cheap-skates!

One patient, a 64-year-old peasant farmer, has been blind for 27 years before he had the surgery done. Blood Drive coming to NAIT

The Red Cross mobile blood donor clinic is making a pit stop at NAIT on Friday, October 16th. They'll be draining students dry in the North Lobby between 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.

To be perfectly honest, I've never given blood before, and I really didn't know squat about the whole process until I was given a media kit by my editor/boss. You always think of major accidents where someone slices themselves on the job or gets in a car accident when you think of donating blood. This is true, of course, but the Red Cross needs blood for a lot more than traumatic accidents.

In the binder of goodies they send, there's a story about a middle-aged man who was diagnosed with cancer. He used to work in hospitals, but now receives chemotherapy in them. Roughly a 1/4 of the patients who undergo chemotherapy develop anemia (low red blood cell count) as a side effect. This means they may need up to five units of blood every time they

are treated. If you're looking for a reason to do this, chances are we all know of someone who has or had cancer. Donations are needed in everything from heart surgery to aneurysms to simple knee replacement surgery.

This is not a hard thing to do, by the way. All you do is show up and the people from the Red Cross will tell you exactly what to do. You only get stuck with the needle for about ten minutes, which is short enough that even wimps like me have no excuse. It's also totally safe. They pull out a needle, they stick you with it, and boom, in their special garbages it goes. There is absolutely zero threat of contracting a disease from a dirty needle, as they're all new needles.

If you're 17 + and over 110 lbs (which is about 98% of us), and you've got an hour to spare in your designated time slot, why not spurt some blood, get some free refreshments, and feel like a Boy Scout or Girl Guide doing your good deed for the day (or in my case — year).

What's that, you say? You'd love to give blood, but you just have to catch your favorite soap in the Natrium? No problem. The Red Cross donor clinic at 8249 - 114 Street is open to walk-ins Tuesday to Saturday starting at 10:30 a.m. Something tells me if you were on the receiving end of an eight car pile up on the way home, you'd be pretty damn glad your fellow students decided to take that hour and donate.

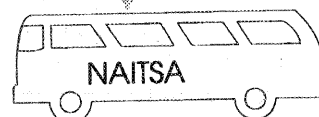

NAIT Foundation reaches agreement with hockey players' association

The NAIT/SAIT Regular Season Hockey Draft is underway. The National Hockey League Players' Association has granted Alberta's two technical institutes a royalty-free license to use NHL players' names and statistics for the 1998/99 regular season and playoff hockey pools.

"It's great that the NHLPA isn't charging us a licensing fee," says Dean Andres of the NAIT Foundation, a charity that raises money for the specialized equipment, bursaries, and campus development projects. "I'm happy we were able to come to an agreement with the players' association and

that the NHLPA has agreed to lend their support to our fundraising efforts."

The NAIT/SAIT Regular Season Draft and the World's Richest Playoff Draft raise about \$100,000 annually for NAIT, money that the institute uses to update and replace equipment uses by students in classrooms, labs, and shops.

Participants in the NAIT/SAIT Regular Season Draft will vie for \$147,000 cash along with other prizes. In addition, everyone who enters the draft has a chance to win a trip for two to see the Leafs play their last game at Maple Leaf Gardens — the team is moving to a new arena this season.

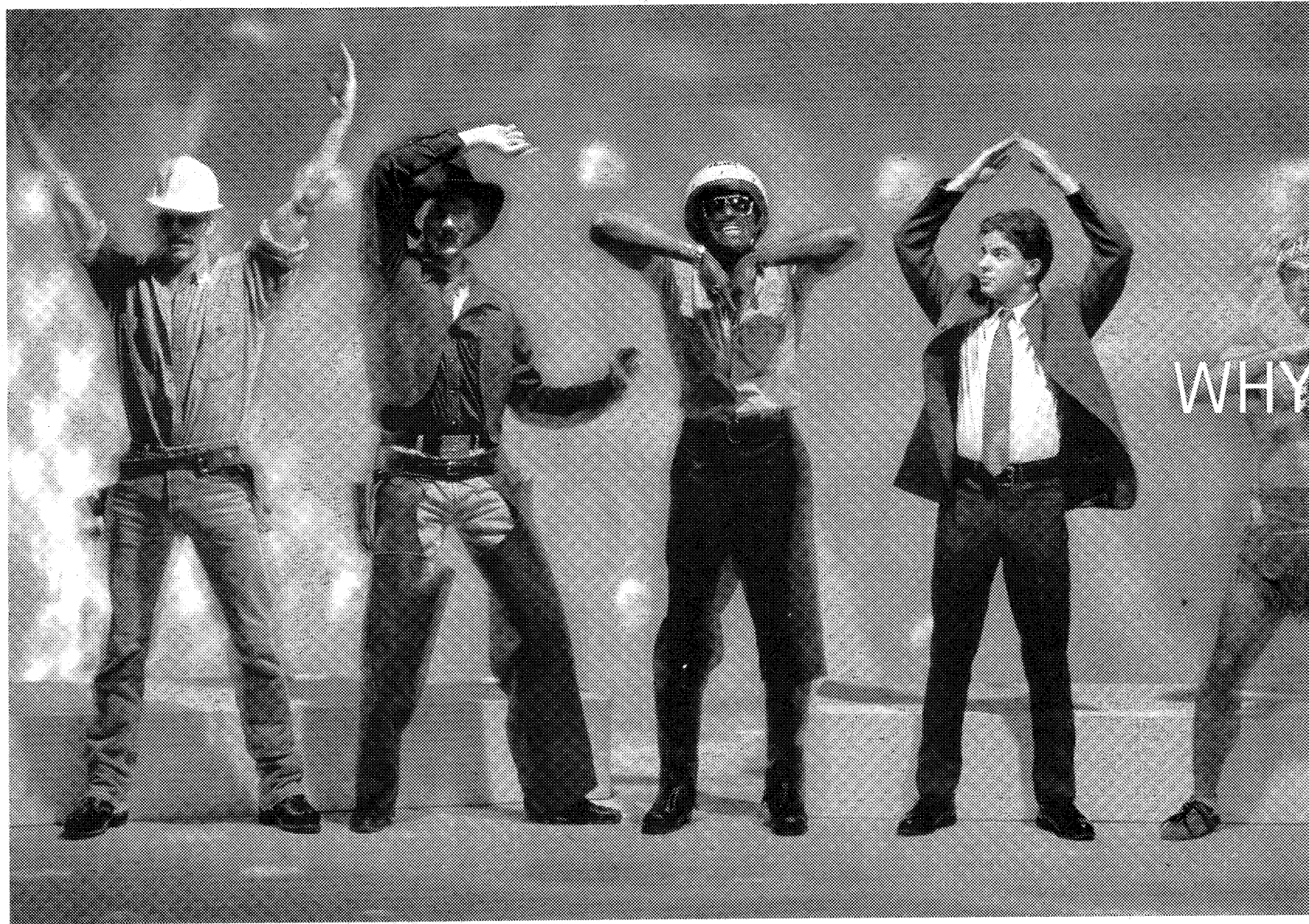
The *Universe* is begging to be explored, as you can tell by the

Space... it is a place. Go on a virtual tour of the universe, you'll be glad you did.

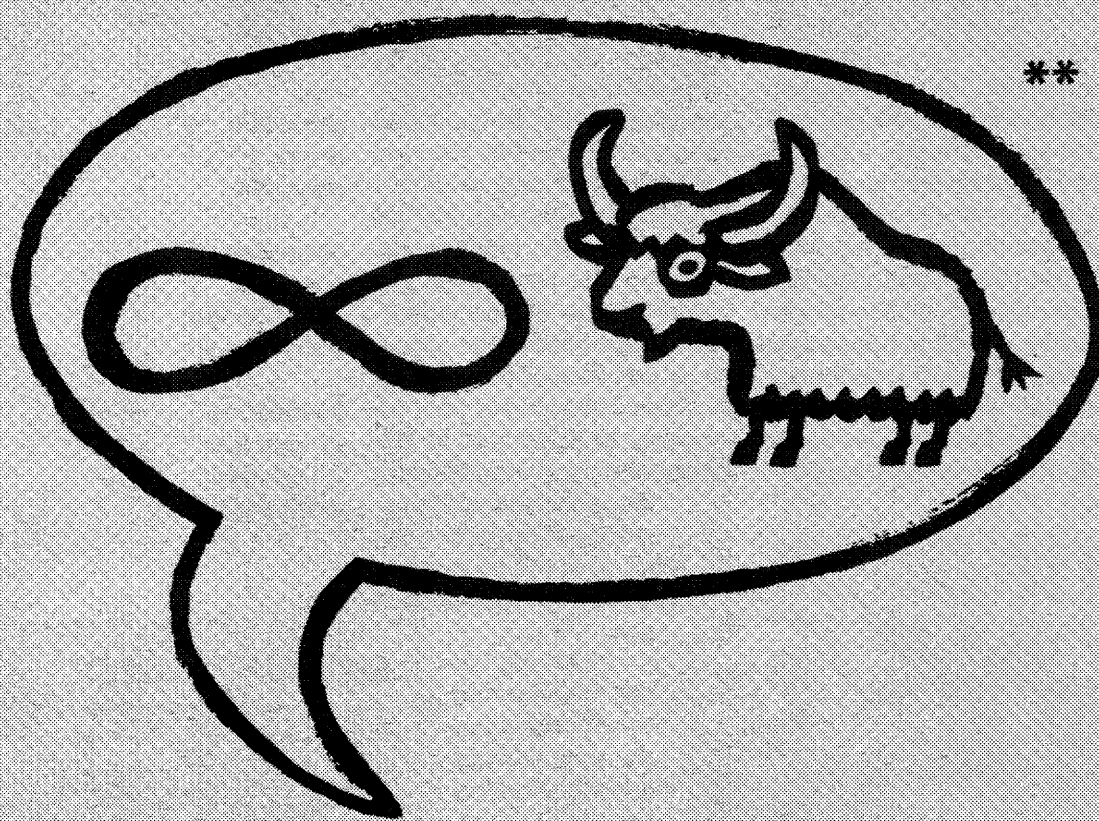

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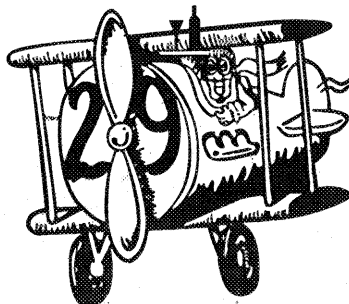

Book review

The Debt-Free Graduate:

How To Survive College or University Without Going Broke

The size of a dollar depends entirely upon how many more you have. — Robert C. Edwards

Just about all students are feeling the crunch of financial pressure. Students have paid tuition fees of nearly \$2,000 plus many other expenses that exceed this amount. This dilemma causes a lot of stress and anxiety for students, especially when they graduate. Graduates find that they have not only earned a diploma or degree, but they have also acquired a massive debt that makes the federal deficit feel like pocket change.

However, there is hope, and that hope comes in the form of a book called, "The Debt-Free Graduate". This book is the creation of Murray Baker, an academic counsellor employed by the University of Western Ontario. When Murray himself was a graduate, he had seen the effects of financial mismanagement on his fellow graduates. Like us today, they were young people who could not afford material luxuries, get married, have kids, or enjoy the fruits of wealth deserving and promised to them after a diploma or a degree. All this is because of student debt, so he wrote this guide to help students who are susceptible to their own financial chaos.

This book outlines many hints, methods, techniques, and strategies required for reducing the debt we end up with at the end of our education. The three main ways in which students are encouraged to do so are by earning more money, saving more cash, and spending smart.

The author touches upon almost every conceivable area in which a student could possibly improve their financial situation. To earn more, the book suggests many ways of increasing income through prosperous summer jobs, part-time employment, investing, and smart financing to acquire cash to pay for school.

When students have money or income being received, it must be saved through the use of banking services and cost-cutting tips. However, most of the book's context consists of strategies for spending wisely (that's where we lose our money and get into debt). It is stressed in the book that if we can live below our means, then we can have money left over at the end of our education to help finance our new expenditures or pay off our debt. Some of the areas in which he suggests spending wisely are housing, furnishing and decorating, clothes, food, drinks, supplies, entertainment, and transportation.

The information presented in this book is also designed to help students after graduation with advice on travelling, filing income taxes and paying off their student loans. Plus, the book is also filled with comical and amusing humor that every student can relate to. I wouldn't be surprised to see Keb' Mo' appear one day at Folk Fest, that is, if he hasn't already.

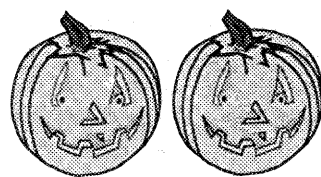
