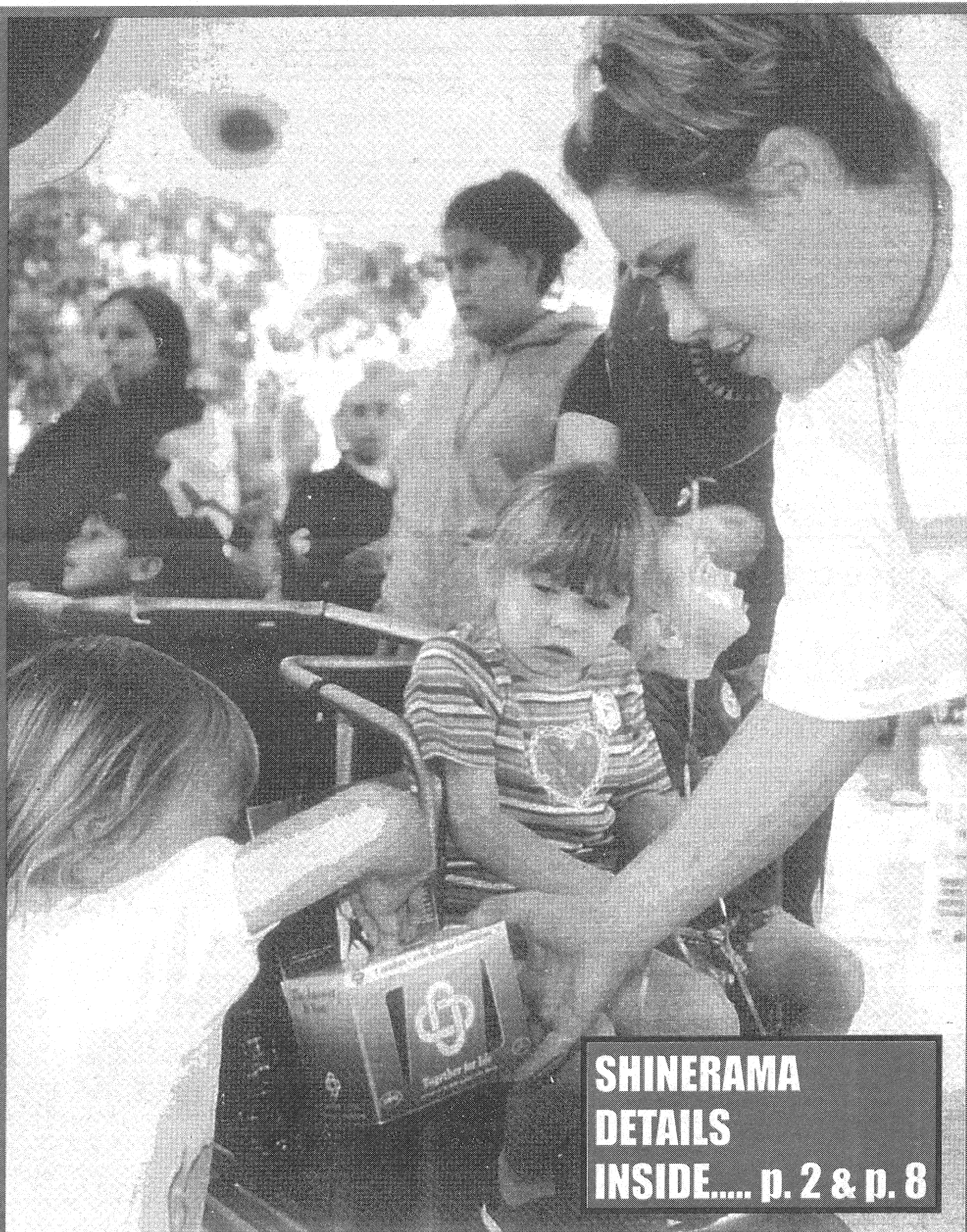

# Swissair Flight 111

The cockpit recorder has been found

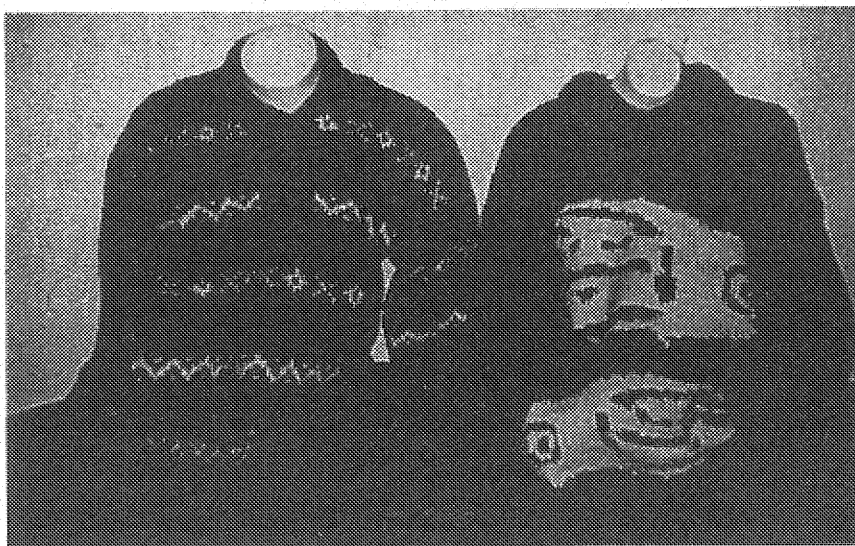
**O**ne of the last hopes to find any evidence was located a week ago. The voice recorder from the plane was found, providing data regarding the final 30 minutes of the failed flight. The recovery operation had persistence, and the time Navy divers spent looking in the icy waters has paid off. The best prepared counsellors were not prepared enough for this crash, but finding this recorder may provide some answers to the mourning families as to why the plane went down on September 2nd. What they don't know is if the recorder continued to operate during the last few minutes of the flight.

Officials now have a clear indication that the pilots faced a fire in the cockpit. This is known because a piece of the overheard panel had melted off onto one of

the pilot's seats. After one hour pilots had shown some concern, and after this they had smoke in the cockpit which made them decide to land in Halifax. Officials are now saying wiring was not the problem. They have 30 minutes of tape and sounds before the crash, but it will take at least 2 weeks to analyze it. A hotline has been set up for the public because everyone around the world is wondering what did happen. Human remains are still being washed up on shore, but the conditions of the remains are grim.

The Chief Medical Examiner can't maintain his composure as his work has become so gruesome. He said that he can't go back to that without someone to lean on. No one can imagine what it is like to deal with this tremendous grief. The tragedy only took a moment, but it will affect the lives of those involved forever.

It was only two years ago that the ruins of the lighthouse were found underwater by archeologists at Alexandria harbor.

## Remembering past tragedies in Nova Scotia

While the ocean has sustained the people of Atlantic Canada for many centuries, it has also extracted a huge toll in lives. In this century alone, the waters of Canada's East Coast have been the scene for already 8 disasters, including the recent tragedy of Swissair Flight 111. The largest disaster to ever occur in these waters took place on December 6, 1917. In the crowded war-torn harbor of Halifax, a French ship called the Mont Blanc exploded with 2,500 tonnes of TNT on board colliding with the Belgian relief ship, Imo. The explosion to this day, is the second-largest manmade blast, with the a-bomb and Hiroshima taking first. However, it still remains the worst disaster ever seen in Canada. 9,000 people were injured; 6,000 were left homeless; and 1,600 lost their lives.

## Mommy Dearest

In St. Paul, Minnesota, three boys and three girls, all siblings, and aged 5 to 11 years old, were found strangled to death inside their apartment home. Confessing to the murder was 24-year-old Khoun Her, the mother of the children. Speculations as to why the mother killed her own children, neighbours say that she was depressed about the recent breaking up of an arranged marriage that she forced into when she was teenager living in Laos, Hmong.

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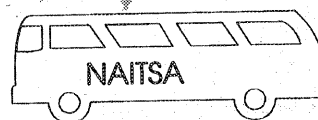
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## Dean's Honour Roll 1997 - 1998

## The Alberta Library Book Card

NAIT students can now borrow books directly from any of the libraries at the University of Alberta by using *The Alberta Library Book Card*. The Alberta Library is a consortium of libraries in Alberta which will foster barrier-free access and facilitate resource sharing amongst member libraries. The first step in this venture is the opening of the vast collections in the University of Alberta library system to NAIT Library's patrons who have a *Book Card*.

You can search the U of A catalogue from NAIT Library's on-line catalogue though its Gateways access or browse the U of A Web-based catalogue via Internet.

### How do you get a Book Card?

- Go to the Lending Services desk at the NAIT library.
- Make sure you have your student I.D. card with you.
- Staff will make sure you are a patron in good standing with the Library (no money owing or overdue material) and issue you a *Book Card*.
- The *Book Card* is FREE!!!!

### What can you do with a *Book Card*?

- Go to any of the libraries at the U of A and take out up to 5 books during one visit per month. This means that if you choose to take out only 3 books today, you cannot return them tomorrow and take out 3 more. Once you have made your initial checkout

on or before the date that they are due at the U of A.

This exciting new service is a "work in progress" as The Alberta Library consortium members move toward the age of not only electronic access but of sharing collections and services with each other, and make it possible for pa-

trons to check out personally what they need. The NAIT Library is pleased to be part of this first step in resource sharing. We invite you to come to the Library to pick up a *Book Card* from the Lending Services desk, or to ask staff any questions about *The Alberta Library Book Card*.

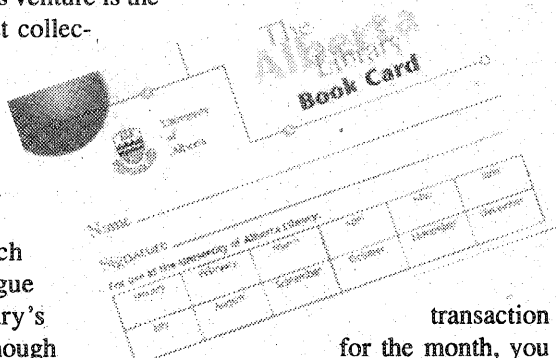

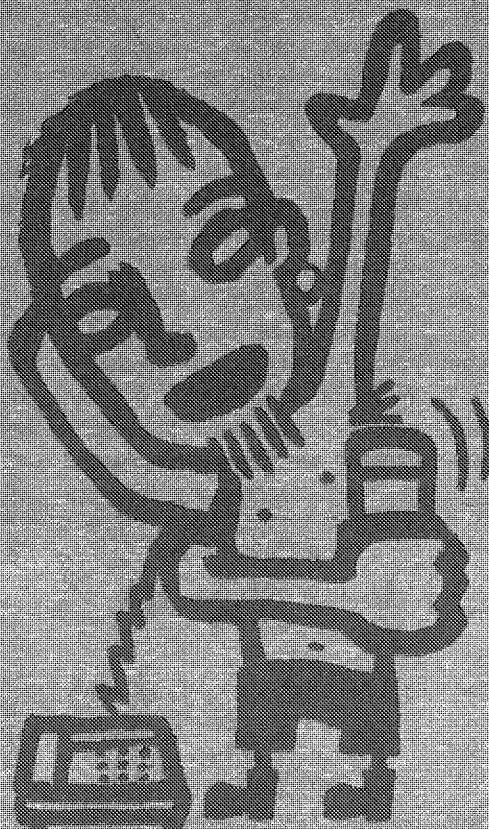

"Dawn of a New Era"

The NAIT Athletic Program is one of the flagships of the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference (ACAC). As a founding member of the ACAC, NAIT helped to forge this organization into one of the strongest in Canada. Under the guidance of Athletic Director *Irwin Strifler*, NAIT teams captured many National Championships in Hockey, Soccer, Curling, Badminton, and Basketball. Irwin's retirement in July and a large turnover of coaches will make this a year of transition for a program which had enjoyed a lot of continuity in the past. Every change also presents an opportunity and, the NAIT Athletic Program is looking at this transition as a chance to reorganize, re-energize, and revitalize the department to meet the challenges that lie ahead.

*Gregg Meropoulos* will assume the Athletic Director's position and oversee the coaching staff. Gregg has been the Women's Bas-

ketball Coach for the past 20 years.

*Marc Dobell* has been hired as the new Men's Basketball Coach and the Athletic Promotions Coordinator. Marc joins the NAIT staff from Mount Royal College where he assisted with the basketball team and worked extensively promoting Cougar Athletics.

*Jamie Peers* steps in as the new Women's Basketball Coach after two years as an assistant with the Lady Oaks. Jamie has been a driving force behind the formation of the Alberta Junior Oaks Program, which has proven to be a great success.

New Badminton Coach, *Jordan Richey*, comes to us from Grande Prairie, where he played three years with the "Wolves" prior to a year of assistant coaching at Concordia University College.

Women's Volleyball Coach, *Craig Wourms*, will have his work cut out for him as he takes on the Head Coaching responsibilities of

both the Women's and Men's teams.

The Cross-Country Running Team will be coordinated by *Patty Cameron* and *Karen Shulhan*. Patty is a staff member of Forestry Technology and Karen is a second year student in the Personal Fitness Trainer Program.

New initiatives in the Athletic Program will see the formation of a Women's Hockey team, coordinated by *Lorraine Glass*.

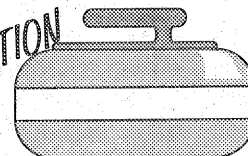

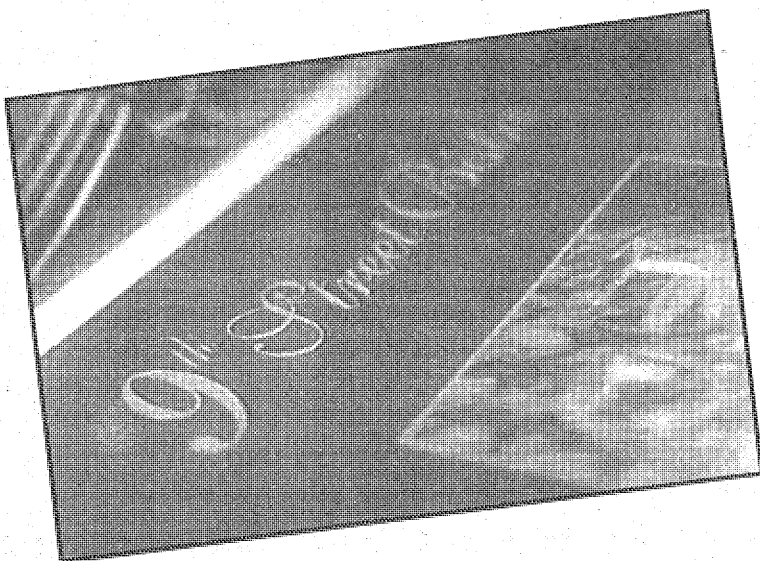
Don't burp. Don't fart.

### Friday- Wide Mouth Mason Acoustic Show

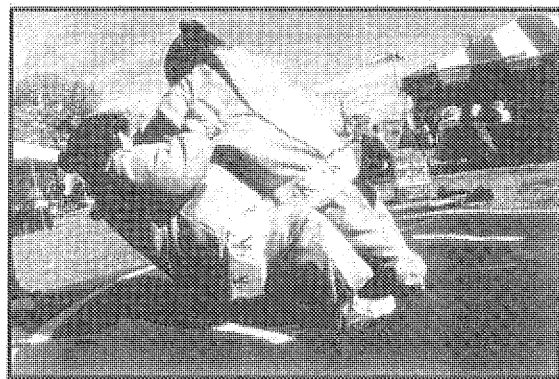
