



Alexandria's lighthouse, one of the seven wonders of the world, will soon stand again. Originally built in 281 BC in Egypt, it stood for 16 centuries before meeting its demise in an earthquake in 1349. Taking on the project of reconstructing the wonder, is famous French fashion designer, Pierre Cardin. His goals are to reconstruct the lighthouse on the exact spot where it was first built, standing 480 feet in height and constructed of glass-coasted concrete. "It will reflect sunshine during the day and beam light 60 kilometers ocross the soner at night," the Cardin Foundation said. It was only two years ago that the rains of the lighthouse were found underwater by ercheologists at Alexandria harbor.

 Romembering past tragedies in Nova Scatia

While the ocean has sustained the peaple of Atlantic Canada for many centuries, it has also extracted a huge tall in lives. In this century alone, the waters of Canada's East Coast been the scone for already 8 disasters, including the recent tragedy of Swissair Flight 111. The largest disaster to ever occur in these waters took place on December 6, 1917. In the crowded war-set barbor of Halifax, a French ship called the Mont Blanc exploded with 2,500 tonnes of TMT on board called calliding with the Belgian ratiof ship, Imo. The explosion to this day, is the second-largest manmade blast, with the a-bomb and Hiroshimo toking first. However, it still remains the worst disaster ever seen in Canada. 9,000 people were injured; 6,000 were left homeless; and 1,600 lost their lives.


tions in the University of Alberta library system to NAIT Library's patrons who have a Book Card.



for having attained at least an 80% average in the 1997-98 term. NAIT finished well ahead of its nearest ACAC competitor, SAIT, who had 25 award winners.



# Rocking at OokFest






