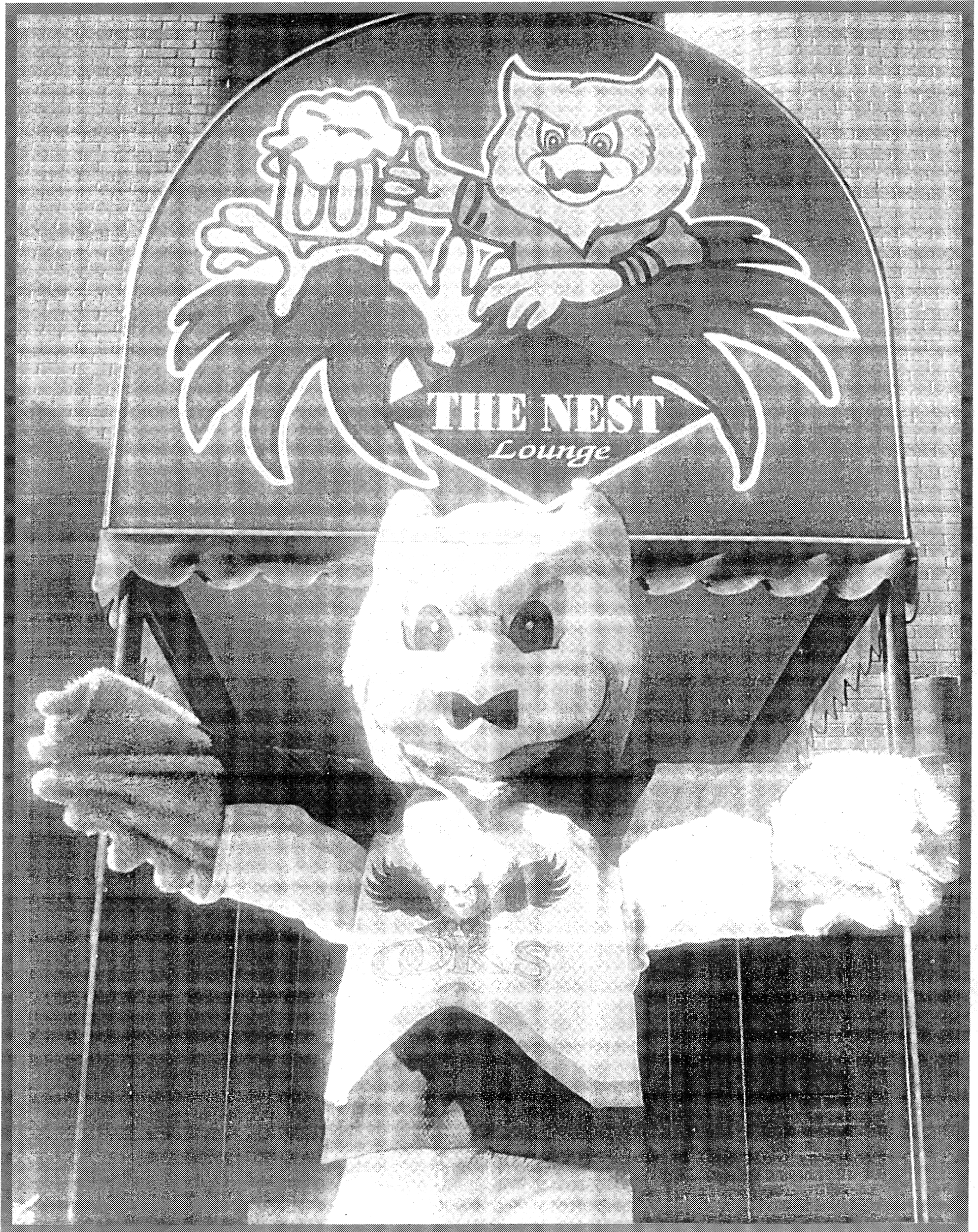

Changes at the Owl House

During an annual audit of NAITSA's books, Deloitte and Touche determined that some of the Nest's practices and procedures don't follow standard business practices. Considering that the Nest is a campus bar that pays no rent, it shouldn't be a money pit. Originally opened with the intent of breaking even, the last two or three years have been costly.

Under the strong leadership of Scott Williams, new procedures and practices are being implemented that will allow NAITSA to monitor the Nest more closely. A new computer system, complete with new tills, will be installed. This new system will allow the business manager to go in, any day of the week, and get a

daily, weekly, monthly, or yearly report on the business conducted within. New draught taps are also being installed, to ensure accurate measurement for book-keeping. Two temporary managers, recommended by Deloitte and Touche, have been brought in to educate and train staff with regard to the new policies and procedures. The accounting for the Nest and NAITSA have been contracted out to Deloitte and Touche for the remainder of the fiscal year.

These new implementations will decrease the workload of the business manager for NAITSA. The role of this business manager will no longer be the responsibility of the Assistant to the Dean of Student Services. This creates more au-

tonomy for NAITSA, as the inner workings of NAITSA will not be as closely monitored by the NAIT executive. The current responsibilities for the business manager will be taken over by the President of NAITSA, until someone is hired for the position at a later date.

Not to fear, though. The temporary managers see no reason why the Nest can't turn a profit this year, paying for the auditor's services and then some. Certainly, there will be some changes, but it will be for the better. After all, it is our money they're playing with. There won't be any price changes, but there will be an increase in productivity, which will reflect in more money being put into the NAITSA Building Fund. The cost of restructuring isn't great and will be made back in a very short time. A pat on the back goes out to the NAITSA Executive this year, who have been working hard on this audit since August, trying to find ways to solve these problems. They care about our money, and they are moving forward with plans that will stretch our Students' Association fees further. Moving ahead, leaving the past mistakes behind. Until next week, don't forget to floss.

Meeting Brings Big News

The recent general council meeting brought about some major news as several announcements were made about ongoing events and future plans for NAIT.

The biggest announcement of the day was the release of a tentative plan to build an eight million dollar fund geared towards a new student's building. The plan is to raise half of the money by the proposed date of 2003 with the other half coming through a mortgage of some type. Neither the purpose of the new building or its exact price tag has been determined yet, but focus groups will be used to de-

cide on proposed uses for the space. General council will then make a judgment based on the focus groups' responses.

Although current students won't be around to utilize the new building, it definitely stands as something to look forward to for future NAIT students.

The other major announcement came from the NAITSA office in regards to The Nest. According to the NAITSA representatives, there have been some serious financial problems at The Nest for several years now despite the fact that there is no rent paid and almost zero utilities and overhead. Details of this an-

nouncement are available in the Editor's column.

The recycling program is picking up slowly but surely with bins being placed all over campus. The bins are for cans and bottles only although paper recycling is coming soon. Students are encouraged to use the recycling bins as the money generated from this goes towards various campus activities.

OOK Fest was ruled a general success with all of the various techs giving favourable reviews. The games beside the beer gardens were a big hit along with all the entertainment.

Get clued in on the facts

Do you think because you're young you cannot contract the HIV virus? Well, get that "It can't happen to me" bogus out of your head! It can happen to anyone! Any culture, any age, any person! As a matter of fact, HIV is now happening at a younger age more often. In the early 1980's the average age of infection was over 30. Now, the average age from 1987 to 1991 is 25, so the age is lowering, watch out! One in every four new HIV infections occurred in people under 25. If HIV enters your body, you may become infected with it. A person who is infected can infect others even if no symptoms are present. An infected person can seem completely healthy. Even when these symptoms are not visible, these are some of the signs to look for: extreme weight loss, severe pneumonia, forms of cancer, and damage to the nervous system. Starting November 1, 1998, officials from the Narcotics Control Act will be touring classrooms across NAIT campuses, taking hair samples for mandatory drug tests. 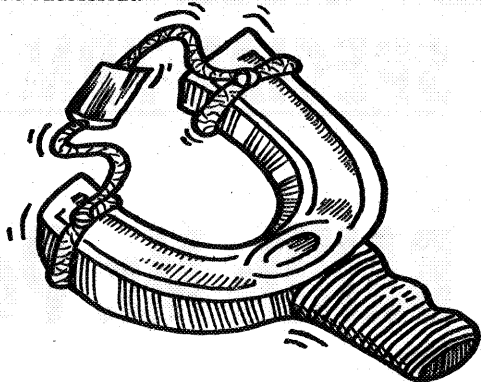

• **Family bites a bear's bullet**

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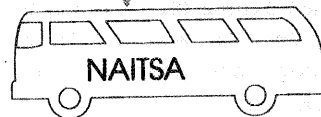
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Letters

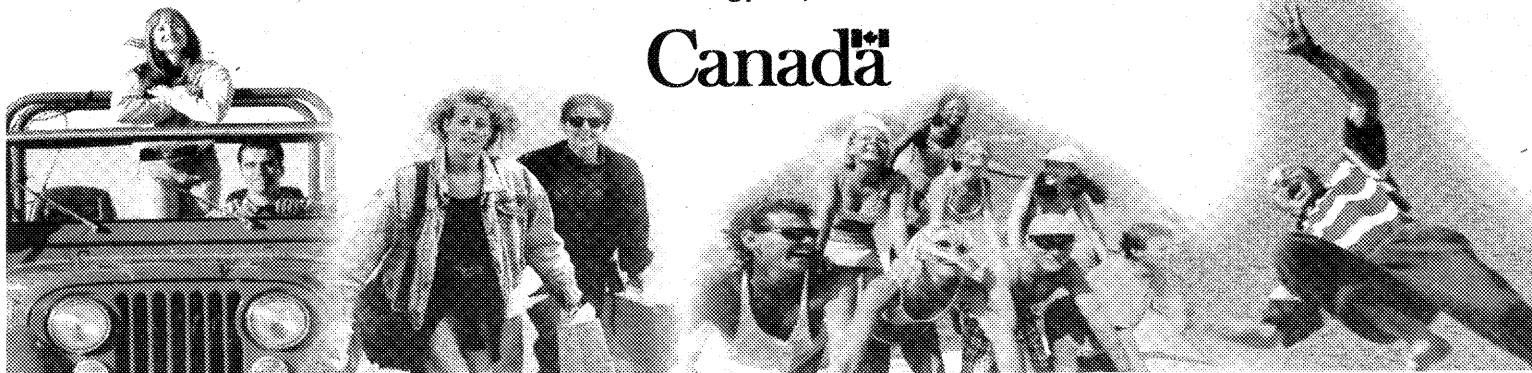

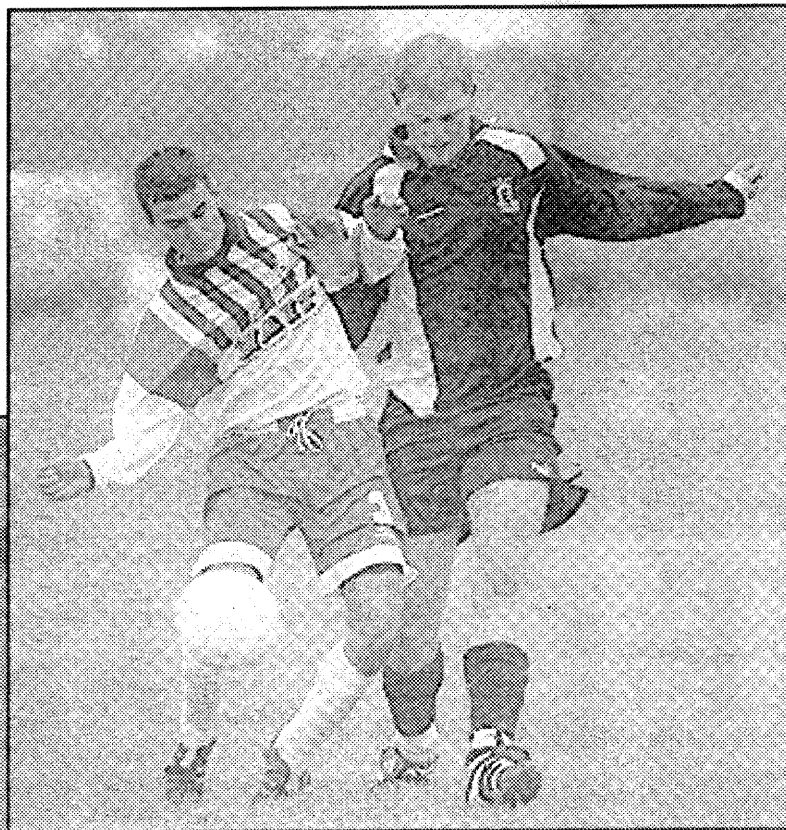
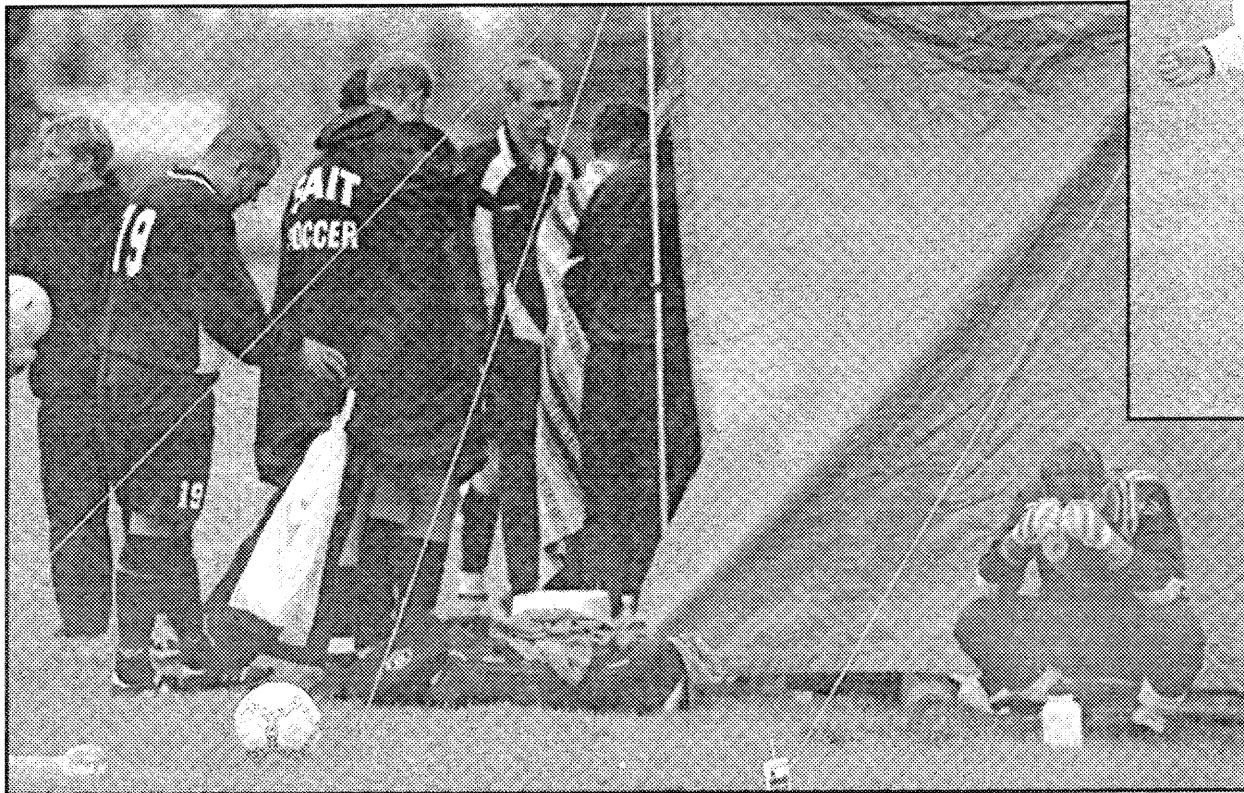
Men's Soccer

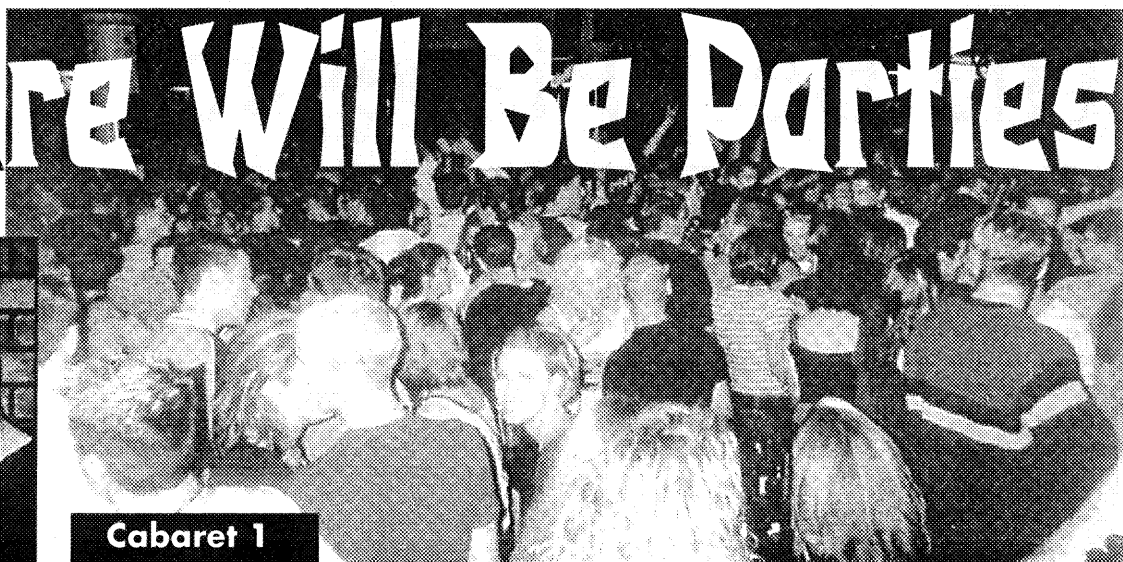
1. Drinking

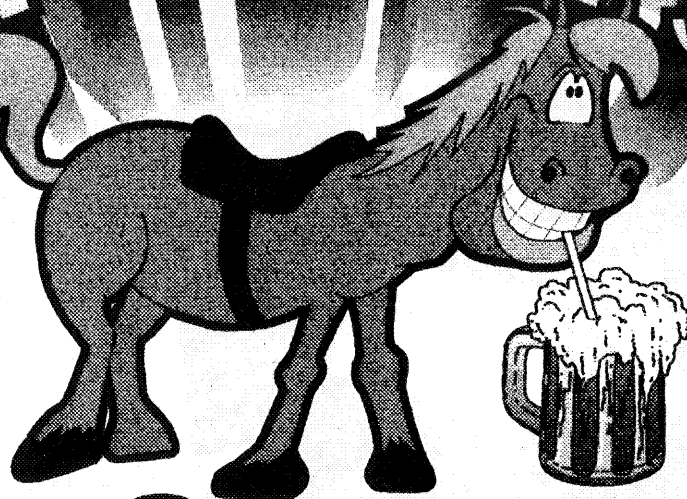

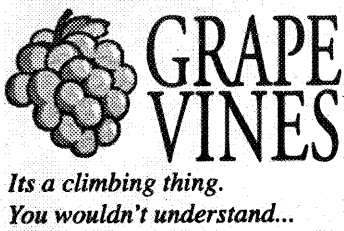

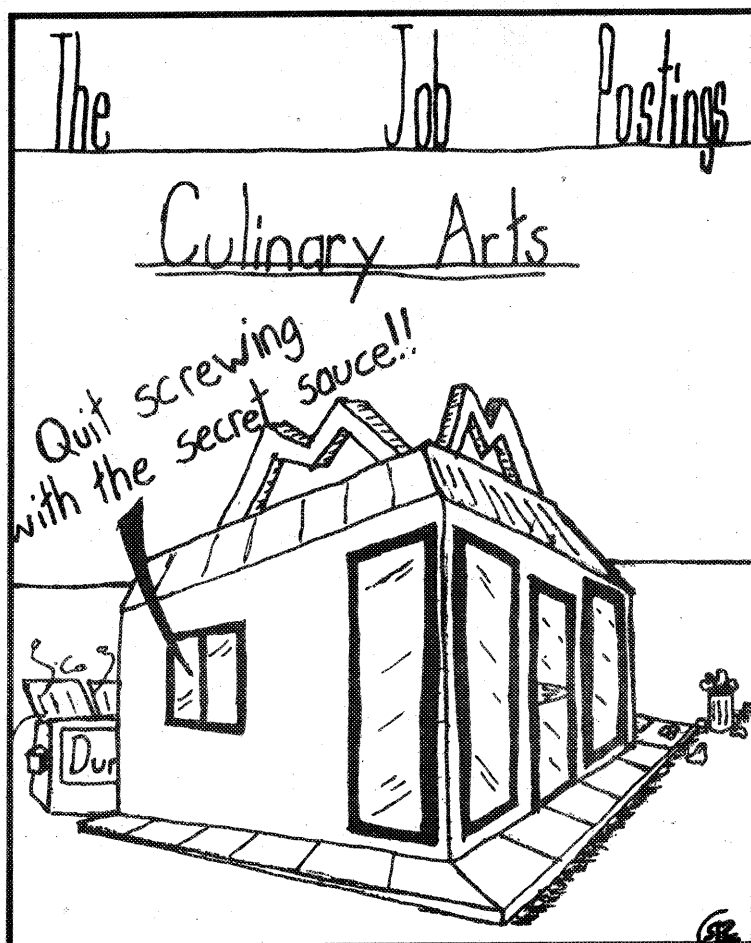
